

# THE LIFE-BOAT,

OR

## JOURNAL OF THE NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION.

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AT the ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING of the ROYAL NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION, held at the London Tavern on Tuesday, the 15th day of March, 1870, His Grace THE DUKE OF NORTHUMBERLAND, P.C., President of the Institution, in the Chair, the following Report of the Committee was read by the Secretary :—

### ANNUAL REPORT.

AT the close of one of the stormiest seasons that have ever tested the value of Britain's Life-boats and tried the mettle of her Life-boat men; the Committee of the NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION present to their countrymen, who have so nobly supported them, their Annual Report.

The continued confidence that has been reposed in the Committee, and the success that has rewarded their labours, have not only encouraged them to persevere in their great work, but have also filled their minds with gratitude, to God who has so greatly blessed it, and to those who have afforded them their co-operation and their pecuniary aid.

One of the principal incidents which the Committee have to record in the history of the Institution during the past year is their voluntary relinquishment of the annual subsidy which for the previous fifteen years they had received from the Mercantile Marine Fund.

Finding that the generous support of their countrymen was sufficient to maintain and work their Life-boat Fleet, and to meet all other requirements, and feeling con-

fidant that they could rely on a continuance of the same; they felt it a public duty to decline any further assistance from funds raised by taxation; and they embrace the present opportunity publicly to thank the Board of Trade for the hearty co-operation which it has always afforded to the Institution.

The year's transactions may be summarized as follows :—

*Life-boats.*—Since the last Report twenty-one new Life-boats have been, or are about to be, placed on the coasts of the United Kingdom and the Channel Islands; eighteen of them being for new stations, and two taking the place of decayed boats.

Carriages and boat-houses have been likewise provided at nearly all the above Stations.

The Institution has now two hundred and twenty Life-boats on the coasts of Great Britain and Ireland, and the Channel Islands. During the past year those boats have rescued no less than *eight hundred and seventy-one persons from a watery grave*, nearly the whole of whom have been saved under circumstances which would have precluded their being rescued by any ordinary boat.

Without the hearty and courageous assistance of the fishermen, and other boatmen on our coasts, the Committee feel that the provision of the most perfect description of Life-boat would be comparatively valueless. They are happy to say, however, that the crews of the Life-boats continue to feel such great confidence in them, that it is occasionally difficult to repress the eagerness with which men rush forward to man the boats.

*Shipwrecks.*—The year 1869 will be memorable in many respects in the history of the NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION; but in no way more so than in the gratifying fact that it contributed, during the twelve months, to the saving of *one thousand two hundred and thirty-one lives*. The storms of the year were unusually violent, and Shipwrecks, as an inevitable result, very numerous; yet the noble and successful efforts to save life on these occasions stand forth as beacons on the way, guiding the Institution to pursue with unabated assiduity the path which Providence has clearly marked out for it, leading, as it does, to results which have excited the admiration of the world at large.

The Life-boat services have, as usual, varied much in character. Some have been performed during fierce gales of wind in the day; others amidst thunder and lightning and the midnight storm. But the same glorious result has usually followed them all—a freightage of living men saved from an appalling death by Shipwreck. Moreover, all these great services were accomplished last year without the sacrifice of a single life amongst the brave and determined men who work our Life-boat Fleet, and who have resolutely gone forth on their mission of mercy, often at such apparently fearful risk, that probably no impulse less stirring than the sight of perishing fellow-creatures would have nerved them to its performance.

The Institution has, in addition, as recorded below, during the same period, contributed *to the saving of an immense amount of valuable property*. No less than thirty-three ships have been saved from destruction by the Life-boats, which have been signalled off to them, and which have sometimes remained for hours together by the distressed vessels, thereby encouraging their crews to renewed efforts and skill to contend successfully with the tempest.

Looking to the circumstances under which a large number of vessels are lost—such as by collision with each other, by foundering at a distance from the land, by being driven ashore amidst unapproachable rocks, and by grounding on out-lying banks or on parts of the coast far from any Life-boat station, and frequently in the dark hours of the night—there is no room for hope that any winter will pass without the loss of many lives on and around our shores. Nevertheless, there can be but little doubt that the present average number may be much further diminished, by more stringent measures being adopted to prevent the sailing of unseaworthy, ill-found, and half-manned ships—and by other preventive measures.

The Committee would wish to direct attention to the continued efforts of the Board of Trade, in maintaining, and extending the Rocket Apparatus on the Coasts of the United Kingdom. This agency contributes every year, under the zealous management of the officers and men of the Coast-

guard service, to the saving of hundreds of lives from Shipwreck in places where, from the presence of rocks and other impediments, it would be absolutely impracticable for

Life-boats to be rendered equally available. The number of lives saved during the forty-six years from the establishment of

Who can contemplate this large number—nineteen thousand persons—saved from death by Shipwreck, without feeling that a great work has been done, and without desiring to perpetuate and extend services which have resulted in such incalculable benefit to thousands of our fellow-creatures!

*Rewards.*—In the Appendix a summary is given of the cases in which honorary and other rewards have been voted. During the past year, 14 Silver Medals, 24 Votes of Thanks inscribed on vellum, and 2,705*l.*, have been granted for saving the lives of 1,231 persons by Life-boats, shore and fishing-boats, and other means, on the coasts and outlying banks of the United Kingdom.

These cases of Rewards continue to receive the careful and anxious consideration of the Committee. They are each previously most minutely inquired into, through the co-operation of the Officers of Coast-guard and Customs, the local Honorary Secretaries of the several Branches of the Institution, or other responsible persons;

and afterwards it is thoroughly sifted and considered by the preparatory Committee, previous to their being sanctioned by the General Committee at their monthly meeting.

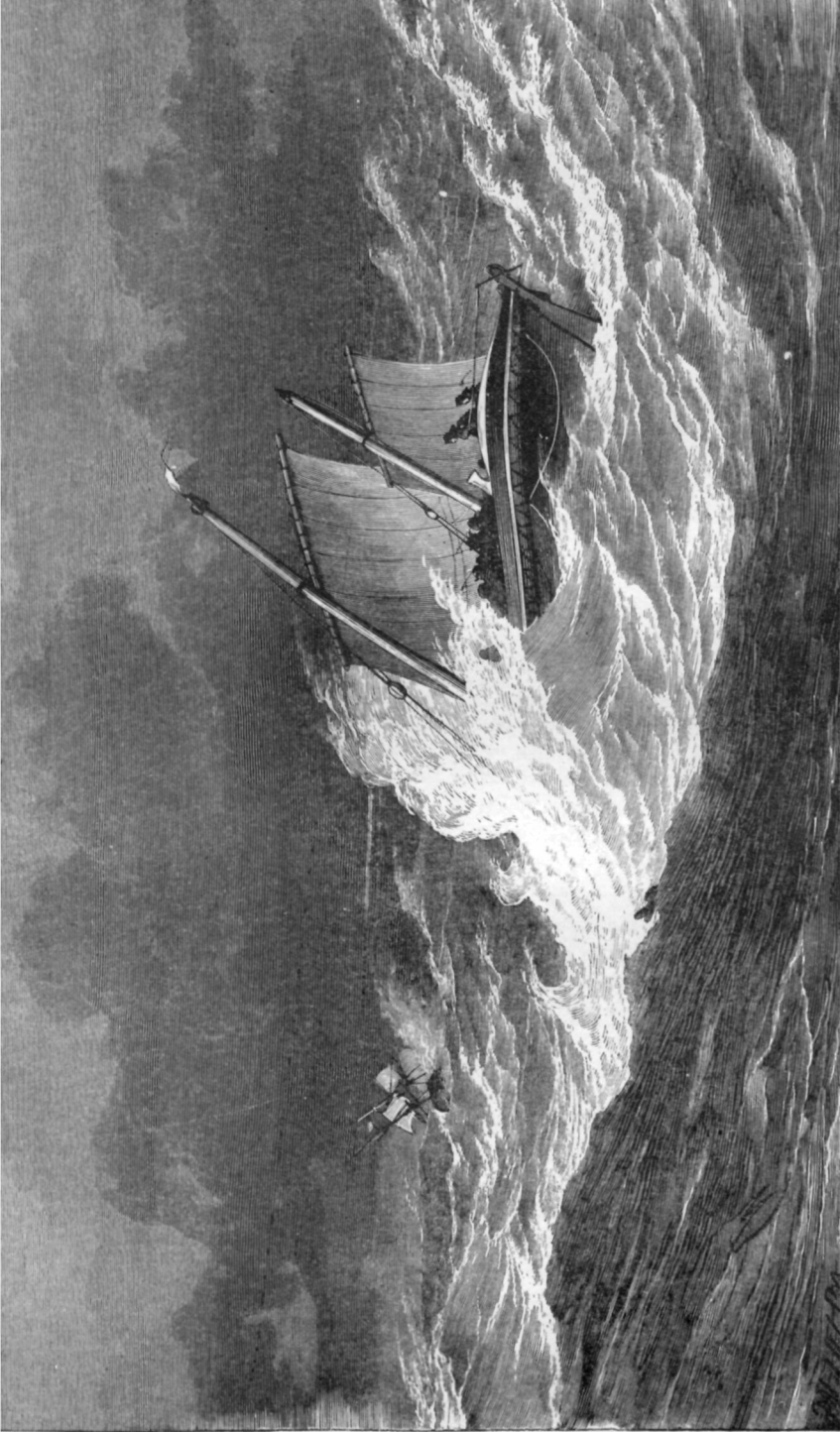
The Committee have received the prompt and cordial co-operation of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, Captain G. O. WILLES, R.N., C.B., and of the Officers and men of the Coastguard Service, to whom the best thanks of the Institution are thus again cordially rendered.

Since the formation of the Society, it has expended on Life-boat establishments, and other means for saving life from Shipwreck, 240,000*l.*, and voted 90 Gold and 814 Silver Medals for saving life, and pecuniary rewards to the amount of 32,500*l.*

*Local Committees.*—The Committee have again the satisfaction to acknowledge the valuable co-operation they continue to receive from the Local Branch Committees, which constitute so important a portion of the machinery of the Institution for the supervision of its several Life-boat establishments, and they acknowledge the valuable and gratuitous services of the zealous Honorary Secretaries of those Committees.

*Finances.*—The total amount of receipts during the year 1869 has been 40,409*l.* 15*s.* 3*d.*; and the Committee are grateful to be able again to announce, that of this sum no less than 12,117*l.* 0*s.* 4*d.* were special gifts to defray the cost of the following 19 Life-boats:—

During the past year 13,469*l.* 7*s.* 1*d.* were expended on additional Life-boats, transporting-carriages, boat-houses, and necessary gear; 6,809*l.* 2*s.* 0*d.* on the expenses of repairs, painting, refitting, &c.; and 7,123*l.* 9*s.* 3*d.* in rewards for services to shipwrecked crews, coxswains' salaries, and quarterly practice of the Life-boats' crews; making altogether, including liabilities amounting to 4,089*l.* 12*s.* 10*d.* for Life-boat Stations now in course of formation, and other expenses, a total of 34,303*l.* 0*s.* 9*d.*

The items of receipt and expenditure are detailed in the financial statement annexed to this Report, audited by Mr. BEGBIE, public accountant.

Again, the Committee would remind the friends of the Institution of the noble life-saving fleet of 220 Life-boats which it has now under its charge, requiring as it does constant supervision to accomplish successfully its great mission, and needing accordingly the continued sympathy and support of the public. The Committee confidently believe that this support will not be withheld from them so long as they are enabled to give a satisfactory account of their stewardship.

" The Life-boat to be taken afloat, fully manned and equipped, once during each quarter, so that the Crew may be familiar with her qualities and proper management. On every occasion of exercise, the men are to be paid 4s. each; and on every occasion of going off to a Wreck to save Life, each man of the Crew to receive 10s. by day and £1 by night. These payments may be doubled on occasions either of extraordinary risk or of long exposure.

## LIST OF THE REWARDS

FOR SAVING LIFE FROM WRECKS,

## VOTED BY THE ROYAL NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION

TO THE CREWS OF ITS LIFE-BOATS, TO SHORE AND FISHING-BOATS' CREWS, AND OTHER PERSONS,

FROM THE 1ST JANUARY TO THE 31ST DECEMBER, 1869.

Jan. 2, 1869.—The brig *Belle*, of Sunderland, was totally wrecked on the Sizewell Bank, off the Suffolk coast, during a S.W. gale. The Thorpness life-boat went out and saved the vessel's crew of 9 men.—Expense of service, 6*l.* 16*s.*

Jan. 2.—A foreign barque was observed in a dangerous position near the Goodwin Knoll Buoy, during a gale from S.S.W., with signals of distress flying. The Broadstairs life-boat proceeded off in tow of the steamer *Renown*, of London, and remained by the vessel until she was anchored in safety. She had been previously boarded by a fishing-boat.—Expense of service, 15*l.*

Jan. 2.—The schooner *Admiral Jarvis*, of Gravesend, was totally wrecked on the south end of the Newcome Sand, Suffolk, during a S.S.W.

gale. The Kessingland Beachmen's Salvage life-boat went off, and succeeded in saving the vessel's crew of 5 men.—Reward, 10*l.*

Jan. 2.—The brigantine *Thomas*, of Cork, was stranded and afterwards totally wrecked, off Carnsore Point, on the Irish coast, during a gale of wind. DANIEL COURTNEY, a boatman at the Carnsore Coastguard Station, waded into the surf and rescued 3 of the vessel's crew.—Reward, 2*l.*

Jan. 3.—The Caister large life-boat put off in reply to signals of distress from a foreign vessel which was observed in a dangerous position. Encouraged by the presence of the boat, the vessel's crew persevered and eventually succeeded in getting her safely out of her perilous position, and she

proceeded on her voyage. As the life-boat was returning to the shore, the crew observed a vessel on the south part of the Cross Sand with a signal of distress flying. Approaching her, they saw the ship's boat in the midst of the breakers on the sand, and, making all speed, they found the crew of the vessel in her, and rescued them, 8 in number, from their imminent peril. Some of the poor fellows were only half clothed, and their boat was almost swamped, for it had nearly filled three times, and must soon have sunk. The vessel was the brig *Elizabeth*, of Blyth, which became a total wreck. The weather was hazy, with a very heavy S.S.W. gale blowing.—Expense of service, 15*l*.

Jan. 3.—The barque *Fieremosca*, of Genoa, was observed in Yarmouth Roads with signals of distress flying during a gale of wind. The Yarmouth large life-boat put off, and on arriving alongside, found her in a sinking state. Her anchors and chains were then shipped, and she was run on to the beach. She was subsequently got safely into Lowestoft with her crew of 13 men.

Jan. 3.—The schooner *Gaspard*, of St. Malo, was wrecked on the Goodwin Sands during a heavy gale of wind. The Ramsgate life-boat went off in tow of the steam-tug *Aid*, and rescued, with much difficulty, the master of the schooner. The crew had taken to their boat and drifted out to sea, and it was feared they were all drowned.

Jan. 4.—The trawler *Start*, of Brixham, was seen in distress while trying to beat to windward to obtain the shelter of Babbicombe Bay. A heavy gale was blowing at the time from the S.W., with a considerable sea. Whilst the spectators on shore were watching her, a sudden squall struck her, and carried away the mast. The Teignmouth life-boat was quickly launched, and while making for the wreck, the crew were seen to leave her in their boat. After great exertions the life-boat succeeded in overtaking and rescuing them in a very exhausted state. The life-boat then made for home, and after an hour's hard pull, the crew, finding it impossible to make headway against the gale and sea, made for Dawlish, where they landed the four shipwrecked men, amidst the cheers of hundreds of people.—Expense of service, 7*l*. 5*s*.

Jan. 5.—The schooner *Forth*, of Aberdeen, was wrecked during squally weather off Pittenween. A fisherman, named JOHN ANDERSON, ran along the rocks and threw a line, which having been secured to a boat, was the means of rescuing the vessel's crew of 4 men.—Reward, 10*s*.

Jan. 15.—The Padstow life-boat put off, during a gale of wind from W.N.W., and in a very heavy sea, and rescued 6 men belonging to the brigantine *Thomas*, of Poole; also 8 men from a small boat which had capsized in endeavouring to save them, and the crew of 6 men of the French schooner *Alexandrine*, of Pornic, all of which were wrecked on the Doom Bar Sands, off Padstow.—Expense of service, 15*l*. 7*s*.

Jan. 15.—The schooner *Lord Coke*, of Middlesborough, sunk on the Sizewell Bank during squally and thick weather. The Southwold large life-boat put off and rescued the master and crew of 3 men.—Expense of service, 15*l*. 9*s*.

Jan. 15.—The schooner *Chaften Winkel*, of Aalborg, was wrecked during a strong gale from the S.E. on the Goodwin Sands. The Ramsgate life-boat went out in tow of the steam-tug *Aid*, and saved the crew of 7 men.

Jan. 24.—The brig *Carl*, of Rostock, was observed in distress on the Goodwin Sands during a gale of wind. The Ramsgate life-boat put off in tow of the steam-tug *Aid*, and rescued the crew of 7 men.

Jan. 26.—A fishing-boat with 2 men on board was driven into a strong current and capsized off

Launasting Whalsay Sound, Shetland. The poor fellows were picked up in a very exhausted state, by two other boats.—Reward to salvors, 1*l*.

Jan. 29.—The ship *Queen of the Tyne* was totally wrecked on the Corton Sands, off the Suffolk coast, during a gale from S.W. and heavy sea. The Lowestoft life-boat put off and found the vessel on her beam-ends, with the crew in the rigging. From the position in which she lay it was a work of great risk to board her, she being on the most dangerous part of the sand, and the seas being very heavy. However, the rescue was nobly and safely accomplished, the eight men being taken into the boat from the main-top-gallant-yard, which at times it was feared would have gone through her, as she and the vessel rose and fell together. It was a most narrow escape for the poor shipwrecked men, for they would probably all have been lost as the flood-tide made, had not the life-boat gone out to them.—Expense of service, 25*l*. 10*s*.

Jan. 29.—The brig *Veritas*, of Antwerp, was observed, with signals of distress flying, near the Manacles Rocks, on the Cornish Coast, during a whole gale from W.N.W. The Cadgwith life-boat at once put off, and on arriving alongside found the vessel in possession of 3 French fishermen, who had found her abandoned off Scilly the previous day. Some of the life-boat men boarded the vessel, and, with the assistance of two steamers, she was eventually got safely into Falmouth Harbour.

Jan. 31.—The barque *Liebertas*, of Genoa, was totally wrecked on the Seroby Sands, on the Norfolk coast, during a gale of wind. The Yarmouth large life-boat went off, and after remaining by the wreck some time, took off the crew of 13 men and a pilot, and brought them safely ashore.—Expense of service, 15*l*.

Feb. 1.—The barque *Lady Westmoreland*, owing to the darkness and thick weather, grounded on a dangerous shoal near the Church Rock, inside the Nab Light. As the tide rose she bumped heavily and started her deck-planks, the masts being momentarily expected to go by the board. The Hayling Island life-boat went off, and found the crew prepared to quit the ship, expecting that she would soon break up. The life-boat men, however, boarded the vessel, and, after great exertion and fatigue, the anchor was shipped, and she was extricated from her perilous position. The life-boat was reported to have behaved admirably on the occasion. The vessel had a crew of 18 men.

Feb. 1.—The schooner *Horace E. Bell*, of Bideford, was observed on shore on the Corton Sands during a gale of wind. The Lowestoft life-boat went off, but on arriving alongside, it was discovered that the vessel had been abandoned by her crew. The men found a dog and a cat in the cabin, and they brought them ashore in the life-boat. The vessel's crew fortunately succeeded in reaching Yarmouth in safety in their own boat.—Expense of service, 16*l*.

Feb. 4.—Voted 122*l*. 17*s*. 6*d*. to pay the expenses of the Ramsey, North Deal, Thorpeness, Anstruther, Dungeness, Walmer, Mundesley, Skegness, Ballycotton, Mullion, and Whitburn life-boats of the Institution for various services during the gales of January.

Also the Silver Medal of the Institution, and 3*l*. to Mr. JAMES CROWDEN, Chief Officer of Coast-guard at Muchals, N.B.; 2*l*. to ROBERT FIFE, and 1*l*. each to 5 other men, in acknowledgment of their gallant services in putting off in a coble, at great risk of life, during a gale of wind, and saving 4 men from the schooner *Kinloss*, of Aberdeen, which was wrecked off Scatraw Fishery Creek, on the 21st January.

Also a gratuity of 5*l.* to EVAN THOMAS, the second coxswain of the Aberystwith life-boat, whose hand had been crushed in assisting, in the life-boat, to save the crew of 3 men of the smack *Castle*, of Aberystwith, on the 24th Dec. 1868.

Also 1*l.* 10*s.* to 3 men, for saving the crew of 2 men of a shore-boat, which was capsized by a sudden squall of wind near the island of Muckle Roe, Shetland.

Feb. 7.—The brig *Robert Bruce*, of Belfast, while attempting to get into Maryport Harbour, fell to leeward and struck the ground to the northward, and although the anchors were let go, she beat up into the surf. The sea made a clean breach over her, and the crew, being afraid she would capsize, cut away the masts. The Maryport life-boat was soon launched, and taken alongside the vessel. The grapnel iron was thrown on board, but the surf was so heavy that it straightened the iron, as it tore the boat away. The second time the rope was broken in the same way, but eventually they succeeded in taking off the shipwrecked crew of 7 men, but not before the vessel had actually begun to break up, and the floating masts and yards had rendered it very dangerous for the boat to near the wreck.—Expense of service, 12*l.* 9*s.*

Feb. 8.—The barque *Selina*, of Falmouth, was totally wrecked near the Misner Haven Coast-guard station, during a strong S.W. gale and heavy sea. Attempts were made to rescue the crew by means of the rocket apparatus, but without success. The Thorpeless life-boat put off and saved the vessel's crew of 8 men.—Expense of service, 14*l.* 10*s.*

Feb. 12.—The schooner *Friends*, of West Hartlepool, was totally wrecked near Margate Jetty, during a hurricane from N.N.W. and in a very heavy sea. The Margate life-boat went off and rescued the crew of 5 men. The life-boat sustained some damage in performing this service.—Expense of service, 16*l.* 3*s.* 6*d.*

Feb. 13.—The schooners *William Thomson*, of Dumfries, and *Blossom*, of Thurso, were in distress during a W.N.W. gale in Scrabster Roads. The Thurso life-boat went off, and brought safely ashore the crews, consisting of 7 men. The crew of the *William Thomson* had previously left their vessel in their own boat, fearing she would founder, and had gone on board the *Blossom*.—Expense of service, 6*l.* 6*s.*

Feb. 14.—The brig *Pearl*, of Shoreham, was seen with signals of distress flying, off Rye, on the Sussex coast. There was a strong W.S.W. wind blowing, and a heavy sea running at the time. The Winchelsea life-boat put out, and succeeded in taking off the 8 men, afterwards landing them in safety. The vessel soon afterwards became a total wreck. Expense of service, 10*l.* 12*s.*

Feb. 16.—A shore-boat containing 5 persons was capsized during a fresh gale from the S.W., in Straddle Sound, Co. Galway. A small boat, with 3 women and 2 men on board, put off and saved at much risk 3 out of the 5 persons.—Reward, 5*l.*

Feb. 22.—The ship *Hannah Patterson*, of Bergen, parted from her cables, and drove on shore on Yarmouth Beach during a strong N.E. wind. The Caister large life-boat put off, and brought ashore the vessel's crew of 20 men.—Expense of service, 15*l.*

Feb. 24-5.—The ship *Ingrie*, of Amsterdam, was stranded near the Trinity Beacon, on the east part of the Goodwin Sands, during stormy weather. The Gull Lightship at once made signals of distress, which were promptly answered by the North Deal life-boat putting off to the rescue of the vessel's crew. On arriving alongside, the captain

requested the life-boat to remain by him, while the crews of three luggers made every exertion to save the ship, but without success. The life-boat subsequently took off 9 of the crew, and brought them ashore in safety.—Expense of service, 20*l.* 18*s.*

Feb. 26.—A shore-boat was observed in a sinking state off Foureen, Co. Galway, during squally weather, when another boat put off and saved the crew of 4 men.—Reward, 10*s.*

Feb. 26-7.—The schooners *Elizabeth Miller*, of Thurso, and *Matilda Caltier*, of Findhorn, were observed in distress, during a heavy gale. The Thurso life-boat brought ashore the crews, consisting of 12 men. Expense of service, 10*l.* 4*s.*

Feb. 26.—The ship *Canadian*, of Greenock, was totally wrecked during a heavy gale from W.N.W., opposite Brims, in Pentland Firth. Two shore-boats put off and succeeded in saving the vessel's crew of 22 men.—Reward, 11*l.* 15*s.*

Feb. 28.—The schooner *Seine*, of Barrow, was wrecked at the mouth of the river Dee during a heavy gale from W.N.W. A shore-boat, manned by 4 men, put off and saved the vessel's crew of 3 men and a pilot.—Reward, 4*l.*

March 3.—The Lowestoft life-boat went out, in reply to signals of distress during a heavy N.N.W. gale, and brought safely ashore from the schooner *Anna Louisa*, of Rye, the crew of 8 men of the schooner *Amelia*, of Torquay, the latter vessel having been wrecked on the Holm Sand, on the Suffolk coast.—Expense of service, 14*l.* 10*s.*

March 4.—The schooner *Doddington*, of Dumfries, was totally wrecked during a strong N.W. wind on the Nicholas Rock, near Ayr Harbour. The Ayr life-boat went off and saved the master of the vessel. The remainder of the crew managed to reach the shore in their own boat.—Expense of service, 12*l.* 15*s.*

March 4.—Reported the services of the Lowestoft life-boat, in putting off on the 13th February, in reply to signals of distress, during a heavy N.E. gale, from a vessel in the Roads, near Corton Gatway. The life-boat succeeded, with the assistance of a steamer, in getting the vessel and her crew safely into harbour. She proved to be the brig *Beatriz*, of Whithy.

Also the services of the Caister large life-boat, in going off, in reply to signals of distress, and rendering assistance to the stranded barque *Eliza Caroline*, of London, which had grounded on the West Scroby Sand, during stormy weather, on the night of the 15th February. The Yarmouth and Scratby life-boats also put off to the assistance of the same vessel.

Also the services of the Ramsgate life-boat, in conjunction with the steam-tug *Aid*, in putting off on the evening of the 12th February, in reply to numerous signals of distress from ships in the neighbourhood of the Goodwin Sands. The wind had shifted from a southerly to a north-westerly direction, and in a few minutes a terrific gale sprang up, which eventually became a perfect hurricane. The suddenness of the gale took the shipping in the roadstead quite unprepared. The fury of the hurricane lasted about three hours. The Ramsgate life-boat, after three attempts, succeeded in rescuing 11 men from the ship *Highland Chief*, of London, which had drifted on the Goodwin Sands. As the life-boat was returning to the shore before daybreak, she fell in with an abandoned schooner, the *Tavistock*, of Plymouth, which she succeeded in bringing safely into harbour.

Reported that the Cadwgan life-boat was launched early on the morning of the 9th Feb. in a very heavy gale, and proceeded under canvas to the assistance of a large ship which was observed with bowsprit and foremast gone, and in a disabled state, about seven miles to the S.S.E.

of that place. After some difficulty, on account of much loose wire-rigging, broken suspended spars, and a heavy sea, the boat came up under the quarter of the vessel. She was the ship *Calcutta*, of London, which, while proceeding to the Persian Gulf with telegraph cable, and when about 150 miles south-west of the Lizard, had been disabled by collision with the Prussian barque *Emma*, of Memel. The life-boat succeeded in taking off 8 men. The captain, mate, and the rest of the crew had been drowned in attempting to leave the vessel in their own boat, which was stove against the side of the ship. The 8 men welcomed with cheers the approach of the life-boat, having been beaten about so long with no means of escape. The vessel being in the trough of the sea, under no command, and rolling heavily, it required the strength of all hands to keep the life-boat clear of her. The vessel was subsequently brought into port by H.M.S. *Terrible*, and yielded a large amount of salvage to the officers and crew of that ship. The Lizard life-boat also went off with the view of rendering assistance to the ship. Both life-boats were obliged, in consequence of stress of weather, to put into Falmouth.

The ship-owners defrayed the expenses of these life-boat services, but it was decided that, as a mark of the Committee's high appreciation of the gallant and determined services of the crews of the two life-boats, the expenses incurred by the life-boat men at Falmouth, and in bringing the boats back to their stations, should be paid by the Institution.

Voted 144. 17s. 3d. to pay the expenses of the life-boats stationed at Portleven, Penzance, Yarmouth, Thorpeness, Rye, Drogheda, the Lizard, Braunton, Piel, and Girvan, in putting off during the fearful storms of February in reply to signals of distress from various vessels, with the view of rendering assistance, which, however, was fortunately not required.

March 6. — The schooner *James Cuckow*, of Ipswich, was totally wrecked on the Barnard Sand, on the Suffolk coast, during a fresh gale from E.N.E. The Pakefield life-boat put out and succeeded in saving the crew of 7 men. Expense of service, 16*l*.

March 19. — The brigantine *Hitena* was observed with signals of distress flying, and drifting towards the rocks off Brixham, during a heavy gale of wind. The Brixham life-boat was quickly manned and launched; she was pulled with a will through a nasty sea, and was soon alongside the vessel. One of the brigantine's crew, having broken his arm, was brought ashore in the life-boat, which then went off again and remained by the vessel until the gale abated. — Expense of service, 15*l*. 15s. 6d.

March 19, 20. — The schooner *Mary Lloyd*, and the brigantine *Rebecca*, both of Carnarvon, were observed in distress during a terrific gale from N.N.E. off Fishguard. The life-boat at the latter place went off twice and saved both crews, consisting of 10 men. On the occasion of the first service the crew found it impossible to make head-way against the fearful storm, and had to put back, when a fresh crew was obtained, and the oars being double-manned, the boat soon reached the vessel and rescued the men. It was reported that the boat and her brave crew behaved admirably on the occasion. — Expense of services, 18*l*. 19s.

March 20. — The brig *Lizzie*, of Newport, Monmouthshire, was stranded on the eastern spit of Hayle Bar, during a violent storm from the north, with showers of hail. The Hayle life-boat went out, in reply to signals of distress, and rescued the crew of 8 men. The brig had called at Queens-town for orders, and was bound for Shields, when

she was overtaken by the storm, and struck on the stones off Hayle. The master, finding the vessel making a good deal of water, beached her on the eastern spit of Hayle Bar, the tide being about three hours' ebb. The vessel showed a white light only, but between two and three o'clock the crew displayed a torch, which was answered by the Coastguard, between Hayle and St. Ives, who fired a blue light. Information was immediately sent to both places, that a vessel was apparently ashore near the Bar. The usual signals were made by firing two minute-guns, and sending up two signal rockets for the crew of the boat and the life brigade, and they soon mustered. The latter were at the spot first, and fired two rockets towards the vessel, but could not reach her; and seeing it was useless to make any further attempt, all attention was devoted to the life-boat, which was launched opposite the ferry. After a struggle which lasted for two hours, she reached the vessel, and received a rope from the crew, who were ready with it. One man also managed to get into the life-boat, but the boat was then carried away by the heavy sea. Again she neared the ship, when two others of the crew dropped into the boat from the jib-boom. After many gallant struggles in this manner, the whole of those on board the ship were saved. Sometimes the men fell into the water, but the brave life-boat men succeeded, with much difficulty, in rescuing them. With a good hearty cheer the boat then made for the shore with her precious cargo, and reached the harbour in safety, after about four hours' most noble and trying service. While the boat had been thus engaged, the St. Ives life-boat had come over by land on her carriage, and had been launched with the view of aiding in the rescue of the shipwrecked crew; but finding the other boat was able to perform the service without their assistance, the men contented themselves with remaining near, to be in readiness in case of any mishap. — Expense of services, 17*l*. 13s. 6d.

March 20. — The brigantine *Cherub*, of Yarmouth, foundered off that place during a heavy N.E. gale. The Yarmouth surf life-boat put out, in reply to signals of distress, and brought safely ashore the vessel's crew of 4 men. — Expense of service, 9*l*.

March 20. — The schooner *Francis Ann*, of Goole, was stranded off Sheringham, on the Norfolk coast, during a heavy E.N.E. gale. The Sheringham life-boat put off and rescued the crew of 2 men and a boy. — Expense of service, 12*l*. 5s.

March 20. — The schooner *Ariel*, of Truro, coal laden, was observed in distress off St. Ives, on the Cornish coast, during a heavy gale. The St. Ives life-boat was promptly manned and launched, and on arriving alongside found the vessel in a very leaky state, and likely to go on the rocks. She took off the crew of 5 men and landed them in safety. The vessel soon afterwards dragged her anchors, struck on the rocks, and became a total wreck. — Expense of service, 7*l*. 18s. 6d.

March 20. — The brig *Zosteria*, of Colchester, was stranded on Palling Beach during a strong gale from E.N.E. The Palling life-boat went out and took off the crew of 6 men, afterwards landing them in safety. — Expense of service, 24*l*. 5s.

March 20. — The barge *Earnest*, of Ipswich, became unmanageable, and stranded off Margate during a heavy gale from N.N.E. The Margate life-boat put off and saved the vessel's crew of 4 men. — Expense of service, 9*l*. 10s.

March 20. — The schooner *George*, of Goole, was wrecked, during a N.E. gale, near Runtun Gapway, on the Norfolk coast. A shore-boat put off and saved the vessel's crew of 3 men. — Reward, 2*l*.

March 29. — A shore-boat, containing 4 men, sunk off Burwollish, Ballinakill Bay, Ireland,

during squally weather. The crew of a boat, seeing the accident, went to the rescue, and succeeded in saving 2 out of the 4 men.—Pecuniary reward.

March 29.—A small boat, containing a woman and her son, was seen in great danger during squally weather and in a heavy sea off Whaddy Island, Co. Cork. The crew of a fishing-boat went to their rescue and saved them.—Reward, 2*l*.

March 30.—A seaweed-boat was capsized in a sudden squall in Donegal Bay. A fishing-boat went out and saved the crew of 3 men and a woman.—Reward, 2*l*, 10*s*.

April 8.—Voted 105*l*. 19*s*. 6*d*. to defray the expenses of the Padstow, Broadstairs, Cadgwith, Gt. Yarmouth, Hunstanton, Withernsea, Lizard, Rye, St. Ives, and Kingsgate life-boats of the Institution, in putting out to the aid of various vessels which were in distress during the heavy gales of March.

Also the thanks of the Institution, inscribed on vellum, to G. N. MAULE, Esq., its thanks to Lieut. F. WILLIAMS, R.N., and 16*l*. 2*s*. 6*d*. to pay the expenses of the Ilfracombe life-boat, in going off and saving the crew of 16 men from the Italian barque *Drago*, of Genoa, which was in a perilous position off Morte Stone—a dangerous reef some distance from Ilfracombe. On the afternoon of the 20th March, this coast was suddenly visited by a tremendous storm from the N.N.W., and shortly afterwards information arrived that a large vessel was in a most precarious position off Morte Stone. The Coastguard immediately proceeded to the spot, and about seven o'clock their officer sent word to Ilfracombe that a barque, with her masts cut away, was at anchor, and requested that a steam-tug and the life-boat should at once be despatched to her assistance. It happened that at the time a steamer was in the harbour, but she had only recently entered it, and had encountered so much danger in doing so, that her captain declared that a thousand pounds would not induce him to put to sea whilst the storm lasted. It was quite impossible for the boat to get out unassisted, and nothing remained but to wait. At two o'clock on the following morning an attempt was made to get the boat out, but at that early hour it was found impossible to get sufficient assistance to launch her, and the attempt had again to be deferred. However, at half-past ten o'clock the boat put to sea, and after a hard struggle, lasting four hours, succeeded in reaching the wreck, and in taking out of her the crew of 13 men and 2 boys, and the pilot, all of whom were safely landed at Ilfracombe. Great risk was run in taking the men out of the barque, occasioned by her proximity to that most dangerous reef, Morte Stone, the swinging of the ship, and the mass of spars floating around her. At one time the boat was nearly gone. She encountered great peril, too, on her way back, in tow of a steam-tug, laden as she was with 16 men, in addition to her own crew. The exertions of Mr. MAULE, barrister, a member of the Local Life-boat Committee, in getting the crew together, &c., were beyond praise; he himself made up a deficiency in the number of the crew by taking an oar in the life-boat. Lieut. WILLIAMS, R.N., the officer of Coastguard, was also very active in endeavouring to get the boat to sea at about half-past six, a.m.; but at that time she could not be got round the point. The boat lost her anchor under the keel of the barque, and had two oars broken in this service.

Voted also a sum of 20*l*. in aid of a fund that was being raised for the benefit of Mrs. WYATT, the widow of the late Mr. GEORGE WYATT, Master of the Harwich fishing smack *Alfred*, who unhappily perished while nobly assisting with his smack to save the crew of 7 men of the schooner *Alvida*, of

Holbeck, which was wrecked on the Long Sand during a very heavy gale, and in a high sea, on the 13th Feb. WYATT had received the Silver Medal of the Institution for his previous gallant services in saving life from shipwreck.

Also 10*l*. to the crews of 3 fishing luggers of Broadstairs, for putting off and rescuing 8 of the crew of the ship *Ingrie*, of Amsterdam, which was wrecked during a gale of wind from the W.S.W., on the S.E. spit of the Goodwin Sands, on the 24th Feb.

Reported the services of the Holyhead life-boat, in putting off twice, and rendering valuable assistance to the barque *Adelaide*, of Pernambuco, which was in distress, during a strong northerly gale and heavy sea, in Holyhead Bay, on the 2nd March.

Also the services of the Pakefield life-boat, in going off and rendering important services to the brig *Henrietta Grece*, of Granton, which, during a fresh gale from E.N.E., had grounded in Pakefield Gateway, on the 22nd March.

Also the services of the Ramsgate life-boat, in conjunction with the steam-tug *Aid*, in going out and succeeding, after several unsuccessful attempts, in bringing safely into Ramsgate Harbour the schooner *Fride of the West*, and her crew of 6 men. The vessel had gone on shore on the N.W. spit of the Goodwin Sands during a heavy N.E. gale, on the 11th March.

April 16.—A whale-boat belonging to Queens-town was capsized, during a strong N.W. gale, near the Convict Station at Spike Island. A shore-boat, manned by 3 warders and 3 convicts, put off and succeeded in saving 2 out of 5 of the crew of the whale-boat. The Government granted the convicts a free pardon for their services on the occasion.—Reward, 4*l*. 10*s*.

April 23.—A shore-boat, containing 4 men, was capsized during a strong breeze from E.N.E. and in a heavy sea outside Wicklow Bar, on the Irish coast. Two skiffs, manned by 6 men, put off and saved the 4 men.—Reward, 3*l*.

May 6.—Voted 77*l*. 13*s*., to pay the expenses of the life-boats stationed at Dungeness, Yarmouth, Sheringham, Tynemouth, Rhyl, Porthcawl, Cromer, Penmon, Rhoscolyn, Kingstown, and Courtown, for various services to distressed vessels.

Reported the services of the Rye life-boat in putting off, on the 7th April, and at the request of the master, accompanying into Dover harbour, the barque *Columbia*, of Stavanger, which, during a dense fog, had run ashore off Rye, soon after midnight.

Also the services of the Cemlyn life-boat in rendering valuable assistance, on the 30th April, to the schooner *Sally Green*, of Liverpool, which had stranded during a fresh gale from E.S.E., near the life-boat station, and would probably have become a total wreck, had it not been for the boat's crew working at the pumps.

Also the services of the Caister life-boat in going off, on the 29th April, to the assistance of the screw steam-ship *Lady Flora*, of Hull, which went ashore amongst the breakers south of Caister, during a strong wind from the N.E. and heavy sea. The life-boat remained by the vessel until the next day. One of the crew of the boat was much bruised by a broken oar.

May 6.—A boat containing 4 men foundered near the Margareta Shoal, Kilcolgan, Co. Galway, during squally weather. The crew were rescued through the exertions of 4 other men.—Reward, 1*l*.

May 8.—The schooner *Handy*, of Wexford, was stranded during a strong N.E. gale and in a very heavy sea, in the South Bay, Wexford, on the Irish coast. The Wexford No. 2 life-boat went off and rescued the vessel's crew of 4 men. Owing



to the violence of the sea, the crew of the life-boat found it impossible, after they had effected the rescue, to keep her off the shore, upon which she was driven with great force, but fortunately those on board escaped unhurt. The remainder of the vessel's crew, 2 in number, left in their own boat, which was also dashed ashore, the men narrowly escaping with their lives.—Expense of service, 6*l.* 14*s.* 3*d.*

May 18.—A shore-boat manned by 5 men went off and rescued the crew of 2 men from a small fishing-boat which had capsized off Cromer, on the Norfolk coast, during a sudden squall.—Reward, 2*l.*

May 20.—A shore-boat containing 7 persons was capsized in Yell Sound, during a strong wind and heavy sea. Another boat manned by 6 men put off and saved, at considerable risk, 3 out of the 7 persons.—Reward, 6*l.*

May 23.—A seaweed-boat manned by 4 men was capsized off Guidore Bar, Ireland, in a sudden squall and heavy swell. The men succeeded in reaching a rock, to which they clung until a shore-boat arrived and rescued them.—Reward, 1*l.*

May 26.—The smack *Sarah Jane*, of Arklow, was wrecked off the West Pier, Howth, during a gale of wind from E.N.E. A shore-boat put off and saved the vessel's crew of 3 men.—Reward, 1*l.* 10*s.*

June 3.—At midnight on the 28th Aug., the yacht *Fawn*, of Poole, struck on the Peveril Ledges. A small boat, manned by 2 men, went off, and succeeded in saving 11 persons. A Coast-guard boat also put off and assisted the other ashore.—Reward, 2*l.* 10*s.*

Voted 44*l.* 10*s.*, to pay the expenses of the life-boats stationed at Cahore, Wexford, Carnsore, and New Romney, in going off, in reply to signals of distress from vessels which were, however, either found abandoned, or otherwise did not ultimately need the services of the life-boats.

Also the thanks of the Institution, inscribed on vellum, and a further reward of 1*l.* to JAMES GALE, coxswain of the Buckie life-boat, in acknowledgment of his services in assisting in the life-boat to save the crews, consisting of 45 persons, from some fishing-boats which were in distress off Buckie on the 29th and 30th September last. GALE, it appeared, was severely injured by being dashed against the bow of the boat on the occasion.

Also 2*l.* to F. KERR, chief boatman of coast-guard at Buckie, whose foot had been bruised by the wheel of the life-boat carriage.

June 9.—A small ship's boat containing 4 boys was driven out to sea at Arbroath, during a fresh gale from N.N.E. A fishing-boat manned by 3 men put out and saved the lads.—Reward, 1*l.* 10*s.*

June 15.—The ship *Alceste*, of Greenock, stranded during a gale of wind from N.N.E., and thick weather, near Caldaff Bay, on the Irish coast. A fishing-boat manned by 6 men put off and saved 3 of the vessel's crew.—Reward, 2*l.*

June 15.—The brigantine *Isabella*, of Aberdeen, was observed in a dismasted state with signals of distress flying, in Aberdeen Bay, during a fresh gale from the N.E., and in a heavy ground swell. The Anstruther life-boat went off and put one of her crew on board the vessel to pilot her up the Firth.—Expense of service, 2*l.* 17*s.*

June 15.—The brig *J. C. Howitz*, of Rostock, was driven on the rocks and totally wrecked about half a mile from the shore at North Berwick, during a severe N.E. gale and in a heavy sea. The North Berwick life-boat put off and saved the vessel's crew of 8 men.—Expense of service, 7*l.* 6*s.*

June 16.—The fishing-coble *Mary*, of Hartlepool, was seen in a helpless condition drifting on the

Kettleness reefs, in the south part of Runswick Bay, soon after daylight. A heavy gale was blowing from the N.E. and a high sea running. The Runswick life-boat went out and rescued the crew of 3 men and a boy. After landing the coble's crew in safety, the life-boat again put off to the assistance of two other cobles—the *Kingfisher* and the *William and Alice*, both of Hartlepool. The life-boat assisted them clear of the reefs, but in taking the beach the *Kingfisher* had her bottom completely smashed in. The ten men in these two boats also, however, reached the shore in safety. All three boats had lost their nets and gear during the storm of the previous night.—Expense of service, 7*l.* 17*s.*

June 22.—A fishing-boat with 3 men on board was capsized, during stormy weather, off Benger Head, Co. Antrim. A shore-boat manned by 4 men, went off and saved 2 out of the 3 men.—Reward, 1*l.*

June 22.—The fishing-yawl *Rover*, of Portmahomack, while returning from fishing, was capsized in a sudden squall off Golspie, N.E. A fishing boat manned by 6 men rescued 3 out of 5 of the crew of the yawl. The salvors lost their anchor and cable.—Reward, 5*l.* 10*s.*

June 22.—A shore-boat was capsized by a sudden squall and in a heavy sea near Slyne Head, Co. Galway. Another boat manned by 2 men went off, and saved the 4 men.—Reward, 1*l.*

July 1.—Voted 25*l.* 14*s.* 6*d.* to pay the expense of the Brightstone Grange, Rhyl, Scarborough, and North Berwick life-boats for putting off, in reply to signals of distress from various vessels.

Also 2*l.* to Mr. JOHN PAMPHLETT, Chief Officer of Coastguard at Bridport, and 2 pilots, for putting off, in a shore-boat, and saving 2 women who had been capsized from a pleasure-boat off Bridport Harbour.

July 5.—A fishing-boat manned by 6 men was capsized in squally weather, at the west side of the Isle of Uyea, Shetland. Two boats, manned by 16 men, put off and rescued the 6 fishermen.—Reward, 6*l.*

July 25.—A shore-boat with 5 men on board was swamped during a heavy gale from the S.W., on Drogheda Bar. Another boat put off and succeeded in saving the 5 men in a very exhausted state.—Reward, 3*l.*

August 5.—Voted 19*l.* 11*s.* to pay the expenses of the life-boats stationed at Porthdinllaen, Wicklow, Stonehaven, and Rye, in putting off during stormy weather to render assistance to vessels in distress.

Also the Silver Medal, the Thanks of the Institution, and 5*l.*, to Mr. THOMAS DAWSON, of Hartlepool, and 15*l.* to the crews, of 9 men, of his three steam-tugs, for putting off in those steamers, and assisting safely into harbour fifty-one fishing-boats and their crews. The boats had been caught in a heavy gale from N.E., which suddenly sprang up, and were in danger of being wrecked off Hartlepool on the 16th of June, when Mr. DAWSON most promptly and liberally ordered out his steamers to the aid of the poor fishermen, most of whom, however, lost their nets on the occasion.

Aug. 8.—The schooner *William Wallace*, of Dundalk, was observed at daylight on shore at James's Bank, during a strong wind from W.N.W. The Southport life-boat put off and remained alongside until the tide rose, when the vessel floated and was taken into Lytham with the assistance of the life-boat's crew.—Expense of service, 8*l.* 3*s.*

Aug. 29.—The smack *Jane and Mary*, of Carnarvon, was wrecked at the mouth of the river Foryd, during a strong breeze from N.N.E. The

coxswain and 6 of the crew of the Rhyl life-boat put off in a whale-boat and succeeded in rescuing the crew of 3 men.—Reward, 3*l.* 10*s.*

Sept. 2.—Voted 25*l.* 8*s.* to pay the expenses of the life-boats stationed at Rye, Peterhead, Tenby, and Lytham in putting off, in reply to signals of distress from vessels which did not ultimately require their services.

Also the thanks of the Institution, inscribed on vellum, and 2*l.* each to Mr C. BELL, and Mr. M. IONS, Masters of the steam-tugs *William Charles* and *John Bull*, of Hartlepool; and 1*l.* each to the crews of the tugs, consisting of 5 men, in acknowledgment of their gallant services, in saving 37 fishing-boats and their crews. The boats had been caught in a heavy gale from N.N.E. while fishing off Hartlepool on the 16th June. The steamers also went out afterwards and succeeded in picking up 360 nets belonging to the boats, for which service the men declined to receive any remuneration from the poor fishermen. Two of the fishing-boats were towed in with the greatest difficulty and risk, the tow-rope having parted when close to the Longscarr Rocks. Another rope was, however, put on board, and the boats safely brought into Hartlepool.

Sept. 12.—The brig *Phyllis and Mary*, of Blyth, which had been dismasted during a fearful hurricane, the previous night, was observed at daylight with signals of distress flying, off the coast of Cornwall. The life-boats stationed at Cadgwith and the Lizard were both quickly launched to the rescue of the vessel's crew. The Cadgwith life-boat, having both wind and tide in her favour, got alongside the vessel first, and having placed one man on board, proceeded to Falmouth under canvas, and returned with a pilot. The brig was then worked into Falmouth and safely anchored. The life-boat afterwards put to sea again in the teeth of the gale, but finding it impossible to reach her station at Cadgwith, put into Porthoustock, where she remained until the following day. The Lizard life boat, when she put off, had an ebbing tide to contend with, and a very heavy sea, which was increased by the tide acting against the wind. The boat, however, was reported to have behaved splendidly, and was fast overhauling the vessel when the Cadgwith life-boat was seen to run alongside.—Expense of services, 26*l.* 17*s.* 11*d.*

Sept. 12.—The lugger *Isabelle*, of Dinan, France, struck on the Doom Bar Sand early in the morning. It had been blowing a most furious gale all night, and the wind changed from S. to N.W., blowing directly on shore. The Padstow life-boat put off, and brought safely ashore the vessel's crew of 4 men. The lugger afterwards drifted over the bar, and sunk in deep water.—Expense of service, 7*l.* 2*s.*

Sept. 12.—The brig *Sirena*, of Naples, was wrecked on the Tongue Sand, near Margate, during fresh, squally weather. The steam-tug *John Bull* succeeded in saving the vessel's crew of 11 men.—Reward, 5*l.*

Sept. 13.—The sloop *Aid*, of Newport, Pembrokehire, was wrecked in Ramsey Sound, St. David's Bay, during a very heavy gale. The crew of 2 men were rescued by 3 other men wading into the surf.—Reward, 2*l.*

Sept. 17.—A shore-boat was capsized near Sumbro' Head, Shetland Islands, during a sudden squall. Another boat manned by 4 men put off and saved the 2 drowning men.—Reward, 2*l.*

Sept. 19.—The smack *Active*, of Selsey, was reported to be in distress about five miles off the land at Worthing, during a strong S.W. wind and in a heavy sea. The Worthing life-boat was promptly manned and launched, but on arriving alongside, found the vessel had been abandoned by her crew;

she had evidently parted from her anchors during the night. Some of the life-boat's crew then boarded her, and brought her safely into harbour. While returning, the life-boat picked up a small boat, keel uppermost, marked on the stern, "*Brave Chillon*, Boulogne."—Expense of service, 6*l.* 10*s.*

Sept. 21.—The schooner *Prudence*, of Watchet, while attempting to make the Port of Burnham too soon on the tide, during a strong wind from W.N.W., and in a heavy sea, took the ground on the south side of the Channel, then dragged over the sands for about three miles, and finally brought up at the back of Sturt Island. The Burnham life-boat went out, and on arriving alongside, found the sea was making a complete breach over the vessel, and that the crew of 3 men, who were in great peril, had taken refuge on the bowsprit. They were in a very benumbed and exhausted state when taken into the life-boat, the night being cold and the men very wet.—Expense of service, 7*l.* 16*s.*

Sept. 23.—The lugger *St. Marie*, of Boulogne, was run down by a steamer off Mundesley, on the Norfolk coast. A shore-boat, manned by 10 men, put off in a stiff breeze, and brought safely ashore 19 men from the lugger.—Reward, 2*l.* 10*s.*

Sept. 25.—The barque *Empress*, of Prince Edward's Island, bound thence from Liverpool with a general cargo, struck on Taylor's Bank, in Liverpool Bay. There was a heavy N.W. wind blowing, and a strong tide running. The New Brighton tubular life-boat put off under canvas, in reply to the signals of distress from the ship, but owing to the strength of the tide and wind, was unable at first to fetch the vessel. The steam-tug *Rock*, however, took the life-boat in tow, and she was soon alongside the wreck. The life-boat then took off 18 persons, consisting of the master, crew of 14 men, 2 passengers, and 1 "stowaway." They were afterwards transferred to the steamer, and conveyed to Liverpool. The vessel subsequently became a total wreck.—Expense of service, 6*l.*

Sept. 30.—The schooner *Bonnie Lass*, of Wick, struck on the rocks off Saltburn, during foggy weather. The life-boat at the latter place went off and brought ashore the mate of the vessel. The rest of the crew refused to leave, and remained on board until the tide had receded, when they landed in their own boat.—Expense of service, 7*l.* 8*s.*

Oct. 3.—The Dutch schooner *Talkenia Meiskeina*, grounded on the Gore Sand in a heavy sea. The Burnham life-boat went off and assisted the vessel and her crew safely into harbour.

The schooner *Gipsy King*, of Glasgow, was totally wrecked, during a heavy gale of wind, on the Dulas Rocks, on the Anglesey coast. At day-break one of the crew was seen floating on a piece of timber close to the breakers, and within a few yards of the spot where the *Royal Charter* was wrecked in 1859. The Moelfre life-boat was quickly manned and launched, and just arrived in time to save the poor fellow from a watery grave. It was a race with Death, and the boat won. The man was the only survivor of the vessel's crew of 10 men.—Expense of service, 7*l.* 2*s.*

Oct. 7.—Voted the Third Service Clasp of the Institution, and a copy of the Vote inscribed on vellum, to Mr. RICHARD JOHNS, chief boatman of Her Majesty's Coastguard, in testimony of his long and gallant services in assisting, as coxswain of the Tramore life-boat, to save the lives of a large number of shipwrecked men.

Also the Thanks of the Institution, inscribed on vellum, to Mr. JOHN CUMMINGS, coxswain of the Arklow life-boat, and 19*l.* 5*s.* 6*d.* to pay the expenses of the life-boat in going off to the S.S. *Hellen's*, of London, bound from Naples and Lisbon to Dublin, which had grounded on the morning of the 15th

Sept., on the Arklow Bank, during a heavy gale from W. to W.S.W. The life-boat was quickly manned and launched, and proceeded to the stranded vessel through a very high sea and much broken water. The officers and crew of the wreck were then taken into the boat by means of a whip from the fore-yard arm. The life-boat having dropped to leeward about two miles and a half, had a long pull back to harbour against the heavy gale and tide, but she eventually landed in perfect safety all on board, 36 men, including her own crew, and was stated to have behaved very well. The captain of the wrecked vessel spoke in the highest terms of the admirable manner in which the coxswain and crew managed the life-boat under the difficult circumstances they had to encounter.

Also voted 38*l.* 4*s.* 10*d.* to defray the expenses of the life-boats stationed at Cahore, Courtown, and Wicklow, in putting off in reply to the signals of distress from the same vessel. Being a large steamer, it was feared there might be a larger number of passengers on board than the Arklow life-boat could carry at one trip.

Also 97*l.* 3*s.* 10*d.* to pay the expenses of the life-boats stationed at Broughty Ferry, Rhyl, Eastbourne, Appledore, St. David's, Lowestoft, Pakefield, Southwold, Cahore, and Ilfracombe, in putting off during the recent heavy gales, in reply to signals of distress from various vessels, which, however, fortunately succeeded in getting out of danger, or received assistance from other life-boats. Many of these services occurred in the night-time, and the crews, after many hours of hard exertion, were completely exhausted when they arrived back at their stations.

Reported the services of the Dungarvan life-boat, in putting off during a strong gale from S.W. in reply to signals of distress from the yacht *Emetic*, of Dunmore East, which was dragging her anchors on the 28th Sept. The life-boat succeeded in bringing the yacht and those on board, 3 in number, safely to Dungarvan.

Also the services of the life-boat stationed at Fraserburgh, N.E., in going off and rescuing 7 of the crew of the screw-steamer *Viking*, of Dundee, which had struck on the rocks off Broadsea during stormy weather on the 1st Oct. The remainder of the vessel's crew were rescued by a shore-boat and the rocket apparatus. 16*l.* 6*s.* were granted by the Institution to the crews of the two boats.

Also the services of the Wexford, Cahore, and Courtown life-boats, in putting off to the assistance of the ship *Electric Spark*, of Boston, U.S., which was observed off the coast with signals of distress flying, during a strong wind from W.S.W., on the morning of the 26th Sept. The Wexford life-boat was the first to reach the vessel, which had then gone ashore near Blackwater Head, and the services of the boat were readily accepted by the master, who stated that the ship had struck on a rock early that morning near the Saltees, and was in a sinking state, having fourteen feet of water in the hold. The crew of the life-boat worked all day in assisting to save cargo, stores, &c., and also took off 21 of the crew and the master's wife, and placed them in safety on board the steam-tug *Erin*. The remainder of those on the vessel were saved by other means. The vessel subsequently became a total wreck. The Institution granted rewards to the amount of 14*l.* 14*s.* to the crews of the Cahore and Courtown life-boats in this case, but the expenses of the Wexford life-boat were defrayed by the agent of the *Electric Spark*.

A boat manned by 5 men put off from the steam-tug *Ruby*, in a gale of wind and high sea, and saved the master of the *Electric Spark*.—Reward, 3*l.*

Reported also the services of the Margate life-boat, in going off to the assistance of a sloop which was observed with a signal of distress flying a short distance below the jetty, while a heavy gale from W.N.W. was blowing on the 12th Sept. Before the life-boat could reach her, however, she took the ground, and her crew were taken off by a coastguard-boat. The life-boat then proceeded out to the help of other vessels seen with signals of distress flying, and succeeded, with the assistance of a steam-tug, in saving the schooner *Lady Anne*, of West Hartlepool, and her crew of 5 men from destruction. She had lost both anchors, and had most of her sails blown away.

Oct. 16.—The schooner *Nymph*, of Carnarvon, was wrecked, during a whole gale of wind, at Bwlchbridin, near Porthdinllaen. A shore-boat from the latter place went off and saved 2 of the crew.—Reward, 1*l.* 10*s.*

Oct. 16.—The smack *Amelia*, of Castletown, Isle of Man, was observed in a very dangerous position at Languess, during a gale of wind from N.N.W. The Castletown life-boat put off, and brought ashore the smack's crew of 2 men.—Expense of service, 14*l.* 19*s.*

Oct. 16.—The brigantine *Gleaner*, of Carnarvon, went ashore during a strong gale on Henblas Beach, on the Welsh coast. The Porthdinllaen life-boat put off in reply to the signals of distress from the vessel, and rescued the crew of 3 men.—Expense of service, 16*l.* 4*s.*

Oct. 16.—The schooner *Astrea*, of Königsberg, Norway, was observed drifting towards the rocks near North Berwick, during a strong gale from the N.E. The life-boat at the latter place went off, and brought ashore the vessel's crew of 6 men.—Expense of service, 11*l.*

Oct. 17.—The billyboy *Swan*, of Hull, was observed drifting in a disabled condition off Sutton, on the Lincolnshire coast, during a violent gale from the north. She soon afterwards struck on the sands off Huttoft. The Sutton life-boat went out and succeeded in taking off the master, his wife, and 2 children, and 1 man and a boy, all of whom were safely landed. As the tide rose the vessel began to break up, and, in a few hours, was strewn in fragments along the beach. The life-boat was reported to have behaved extremely well in the heavy seas which she had to encounter.—Expense of service, 9*l.* 8*s.* 6*d.*

Oct. 19.—The New Brighton tubular life-boat went out, in tow of the steam-tug *Resolute*, and rescued 1 out of 2 of the crew of the schooner *Elephant*, of Ulverstone, which was totally wrecked during a gale from the N.E. and cloudy weather, on Taylor's Bank, in Liverpool Bay. The coxswain of the life-boat was in the act of ascending the rigging to rescue the second man, when the mast fell, and being held by the lee rigging, it would not float, and the poor fellow belonging to the schooner was unfortunately drowned.—Expense of service, 7*l.*

Oct. 19.—The schooner *Trusty*, of Boston, was stranded off Ranton, on the Norfolk coast. It was blowing a fearful gale from the N.N.E. at the time. The Sheringham life-boat put off, and found the crew in the rigging, the seas having completely cleared the vessel's deck, at times hiding her from view. The life-boat succeeded in taking off the crew of 3 men, and landing them in safety.—Expense of service, 11*l.* 12*s.* 6*d.*

Oct. 19.—The life-boat stationed at Ilfracombe, North Devon, went off twice and saved the sloop *Ann Elizabeth*, of Barnstaple, and the brigantine *Commodore*, of Waterford, and their crews, consisting of 8 men. During a strong gale from the north, and heavy sea, the sloop was seen in a very perilous position about a mile and a half to the N.W. of Capstan Hill. The life-boat went out to

her, and, having placed 2 men on board, she and her crew were brought safely into harbour. While entering she very nearly foundered, having shipped a quantity of water. About half an hour afterwards the brigantine was seen with signals of distress flying, about four miles off the shore; and the life-boat was again launched, and, having placed a portion of her crew on board, accompanied the vessel into harbour. Her mainsail, foresail, and jib-booms, were gone; and the master, who was ignorant of the coast, said he must have run his vessel on shore but for the assistance of the life-boat. His crew were much exhausted. Expense of service, 12*l.* 10*s.*

Oct. 19, 20.—The brigs *John and Mary*, of Shields, and *Ravensworth*, of Hartlepool, were reported in distress on the Norfolk coast. At daylight on the 19th, the first-named vessel was seen ashore on the West Sands with signals of distress flying in the main rigging. A terrific gale was blowing from the north at the time, bringing in a very heavy sea—one of the heaviest seen on this part of the coast for years. The Blakeney life-boat was promptly launched, proceeded to the wreck, took off the crew of 8 men and a boy, and landed them in safety. On the following morning the *Ravensworth* was observed stranded on the west side of Blakeney Harbour Way. She was lying on her beam ends. The wind and sea were still tremendous; but the life-boat was launched, and as she neared the wreck the crew made signals of distress, expecting their vessel to go to pieces every moment, her bows and quarters being stove in and other damage done. The crew of 6 men were with some difficulty got into the life-boat from the main rigging in a very exhausted state.—Expense of services, 17*l.* 15*s.*

Oct. 20.—The ship *Frank Shaw*, of North Shields, was totally wrecked, during a very heavy gale of wind, on the Goodwin Sands. She had sought shelter in the Downs, but was compelled to slip her cable and try fresh anchorage off the North Foreland. On the morning of the 19th Oct. she rode very heavily in the gale; the decks were full of water fore and aft, everything was being washed away, and she was settling down at her anchors. It was found necessary, therefore, to slip her second anchor and ninety fathoms of cable. The ship was then run before the wind, and the crew got another anchor ready; but about two o'clock the vessel struck on the North Sand Head: the sea began to make a clean breach over her, and in fifteen minutes she broke in two—the masts, sails, and rigging being gradually washed away. All hands crowded aft for safety, and signals of distress were made. The Broadstairs and Ramsgate life-boats were soon on the spot; but the waves dashed over the ship so heavily and incessantly that it was found impossible to reach her then, and as the tide fell, both the boats grounded on the Goodwin, to leeward of the vessel. The ship's crew now endeavoured to launch the gig, but it was at once dashed to pieces by the waves. Another boat was then launched, and 6 of the crew got into her, landed on the sands, and waded to the Broadstairs life-boat. Another of the crew was then sent, with a life-buoy, through the surf on to the sands. The rest followed, and waded through the fearful surf to the life-boats, 200 yards distant. The current across the sand was very strong, and 8 of the poor fellows were swept away and, unhappily, perished. One man succeeded in reaching the Ramsgate life-boat. The remaining 13 men rescued were on board the Broadstairs life-boat. Both boats had to wait until the tide flowed before they could beat off the sands to the steam-tug *Aid*, which had towed the Ramsgate life-boat out. It was ten o'clock at night before they were towed into harbour. The

utmost excitement prevailed amongst the crowds assembled on the pier, and the life-boats on their arrival were greeted with ringing cheers. The poor shipwrecked fellows were in a terribly exhausted condition. Shortly after the life-boats were brought into the harbour several rockets were fired from the *Gull* light-ship. The Ramsgate life-boat was quickly manned by a fresh crew, with the exception of the gallant coxswain (*JARMAN*), who again took command of the boat. She then put to sea in tow of the *Aid*; but, after cruising about for some hours, nothing could be seen of the vessel supposed to be in distress, and the life-boat returned to harbour about two o'clock in the morning, at which time it was blowing a perfect hurricane.

The Silver Medal of the Institution, and copy of the vote inscribed on vellum, were voted to Capt. JAMES ELYARD, the Hon. Secretary of the Broadstairs Branch, in testimony of his gallant services in being one of the first to volunteer to go off in the life-boat on the above occasion. The crew of the life-boat received altogether, including local subscriptions, about 3*l.* 10*s.* each man for their services on this occasion.

The North Deal life-boat also put off, with the view of rendering assistance, to the same ship. Expense of launch, 9*l.* 15*s.*

Oct. 25.—The ketch *Heckler*, of Cullen, was totally wrecked on the sands off Fraserburgh, during a fearful gale from the N.N.W., with snow showers. The Fraserburgh life-boat went out, and brought safely ashore the vessel's crew of 2 men. The life-boat was once completely filled by the heavy seas, but speedily cleared herself, and was reported to have behaved admirably.—Expense of service, 13*l.* 12*s.*

Oct. 26.—The life-boat stationed at Fishguard put off, during a heavy gale from the north, and in a high sea, in reply to signals of distress from two vessels in the roadstead. She went alongside the schooner *Two Sisters*, of Aberystwith, and having taken off her crew of 3 men, proceeded to the smack *David*, of Cardigan, and also rescued her crew of 3 men, afterwards landing all in safety. The schooner soon afterwards went down at her anchors.—Expense of service, 7*l.* 5*s.*

Oct. 26.—The brig *Supply*, of Stornoway, was seen in distress with signals for help flying, in Thurso Bay, during a heavy gale of wind from the N. The Thurso life-boat went out and succeeded in saving the vessel's crew of 7 men. While they were being taken off, the seas were breaking completely over the vessel.—Expense of service, 6*l.* 10*s.*

Nov. 4.—Voted the Silver Medal of the Institution—a copy of the vote inscribed on vellum—and 3*l.* to Mr. THOMAS DOBSON, coxswain of the *Donna Nook* life-boat, and 65*l.* 10*s.* to pay the expenses of the boat in putting off on several occasions and rendering the following gallant services to shipwrecked crews during the fearful storms of the 19th and 27th October. On the morning of the 19th the steam-whaler *Diana*, of Hull, was observed stranded on the Slate Run, and fast breaking up. The wind was blowing a perfect hurricane from the north at the time. The life-boat was quickly manned and launched, and succeeded in bringing safely ashore 25 of the crew, the remaining 6 men landing in one of their own boats, with the life-boat's assistance. The next tide the vessel went to pieces, and the valuable cargo of oil and whalebone was strewn along the shore.

Soon after the life-boat had returned, another vessel, the schooner *Blue Jacket*, of Newcastle, was seen endeavouring to ride out the storm, which, however, she did not succeed in doing, as she soon drove on shore. The life-boat was again launched and the crew made a gallant effort to reach the

wreck, but the force of the wind and sea was so great that the boat was beaten back. A second, third, and fourth attempt was made, but with the same result. The men were by this time nearly exhausted by their determined and gallant endeavours to reach the wreck; but a fifth attempt was being made to launch the life-boat, when the vessel began to break up and in a few minutes was a complete wreck, and all on board unhappily perished. The oldest inhabitants on that part of the coast stated that they never remembered so terrific a gale. The beach was literally strewn with pieces of wreck, and the cargoes of these vessels and of others wrecked on that part of the coast.

On the 27th October, another severe gale sprang up from the N.N.E., and the barque *Bertolomeo Cerruti*, of Genoa, which was riding at anchor, was observed to drift rapidly on shore, the sea soon making a complete breach over her. The life-boat was quickly launched; but the sea, wind, and tide drove her to the southward at a fearful rate, when she was got ashore again as soon as possible, and plenty of help being at hand, she was taken on her carriage to windward of the wreck and launched again; but with the same result, at first, all attempts to throw a line or buoy being of no avail. With heroic determination, however, the crew strenuously renewed their exertions, which were at last crowned with success, for, amid the most intense anxiety on the part of the crowds on shore, the boat, which was frequently seen to be thrown almost end-over-end by the heavy sea, was observed to linger, by which it was evident that she answered to her anchor, which had been thrown out. She was then allowed to drift right under the bows of the wreck. Some of the shipwrecked men were on the bowsprit ready with ropes and chains, which one of the life-boat men succeeded in grappling and in making fast to the boat. The sea at this time was running over the ship in a fearful manner, and two of the crew had a very narrow escape of being washed overboard. Now commenced the difficulty of getting the poor fellows into the life-boat. It was a difficult task, as they could only reach the life-boat when she was under the bowsprit, and then only by dropping down ropes. One fell into the sea, but was quickly hauled into the boat. One after another they dropped into the arms of the life-boat men until the whole of the vessel's crew, 14 in number, were got into the boat, which brought them safely to land. The vessel almost immediately began to break up, and soon afterwards not a vestige of her was to be seen; and had not the life-boat succeeded in reaching her at the time she did, all these poor foreigners would most probably have perished.

Voted also the thanks of the Institution, inscribed on vellum, to Mr. WILLIAM ROBINSON, the Honorary Secretary of the Donna Nook Branch of the Institution, in testimony of his benevolent and prolonged exertions on the occasion of 65 persons being saved by the life-boat and other means, from six of the vessels which were wrecked off that place on the 19th October.

Also 142l. 14s. to pay the expenses of the life-boats stationed at Withernsea, Skegness, Hunstanton, Sutton, Cromer, North Deal, Scarborough, Hasborough, Yarmouth, Porthdinlaen, Abersoch, and Hornsea, in going off with the view of rendering assistance to vessels in distress during the fearful storms of October.

Reported the services of the Aberdovey life-boat in putting out, on the morning of the 17th Oct., to the smack *John James*, of Chester, which was observed in a disabled state with her sails blown away. The life-boat went off in fine style, and while on her way the vessel drifted and stranded on the South Bank, on which the sea was breaking heavily. On arriving alongside several

of the life-boat men boarded her, and after five hours' hard toil succeeded in getting her off and taking her safely into harbour. Had it not been for the life-boat, the vessel and her crew would inevitably have been lost, as no other boat could have rendered them any assistance.

Also the services of the Scarborough life-boat, in putting off 3 times on the 3rd Nov. and assisting safely into port three fishing cobbles and their crews, consisting of 9 men, during a strong N.N.W. wind and a heavy sea. The cobbles were returning from their fishing-ground, and owing to the high seas running round the pier head, it was feared they would not be able to reach the harbour in safety. The life-boat's crew made no charge for this service to their comrades.

Also the services of the Caister large life-boat in going off and rendering valuable assistance to the barque *Alma*, of Malta, which was seen in distress within a cable's length of the Scroby Sands, during a heavy gale of wind, on the 28th Oct.

Also the services of the Cromer life-boat in putting off, in reply to signals of distress from the ship *William Fotheringham*, of New York, during a northerly gale and heavy swell, on the 22nd Oct. The life-boat and a boat from Sheringham assisted the vessel safely into Yarmouth Harbour. She had previously grounded, and had five feet of water in her hold when the life-boat got alongside.

Also the services of the Ramsgate life-boat in going off, on the night of the 27th Oct., in tow of the steam-tug *Aid*, in reply to signals of distress from the barque *Emilie*, of Swinemunde, which had drifted from her moorings off the North Foreland, close to the edge of the Goodwin Sands. She was on the point of striking when the life-boat arrived alongside, but the crew paying out more chain, she held by her anchors. The pilot at first refused to have anything to do with the life-boat, and fired off rockets for a steam-tug. The boatmen, however, knowing the vessel's danger, remained alongside until three o'clock in the morning, her crew being exposed all the time to the bitterly cold wind and raging sea, when they threatened to leave the vessel to her fate. The pilot then consented that the ship should be taken in tow by the steam-tug *Aid*, and her anchor being slipped, she was brought safely into harbour with the life-boat.

Voted the Silver Medal of the Institution, a copy of the vote inscribed on vellum, and 1l. to Mr. JOHN BUMBY, chief officer of Her Majesty's Coastguard at Clovelly, and 1l. each to 9 other men, in acknowledgment of their gallant and persevering services in putting off in a shore-boat, at much risk of life, and bringing safely to land a long-boat containing the crew of 12 men and a passenger of the barque *Odome*, of Genoa, which was wrecked at Portledge Mouth in a whole gale and heavy sea, on the 12th Sept.

Also 11l. 4s. to some men for assisting to rescue the crews, consisting of 45 men, from the following vessels which were stranded at and near Donna Nook, on the Lincolnshire coast during the fearful gales experienced there in Oct. last: smack *Harlequin*, of Grimsby, 8 men saved; brig *Amphitrite*, of Shields, 9; schooner *John*, of Exeter, 5; brig *Pavly Veitschow*, of Rostock, 10; brig *Hamsterley Hall*, of Blyth, 6; and schooner *Constitution*, of Stettin, 7. 2l. 15s. were also granted for the use of horses on the occasion of some of these services.

Nov. 4.—The Dutch brigantine *Catherine* was totally wrecked in Llandudno Bay during a heavy gale from N.N.W. The Orme's Head life-boat went out and brought safely ashore the vessel's crew of 5 men.—Expense of service, 9l. 15s.

Nov. 6.—The brig *Watermillock*, of Sunderland, was wrecked on Palling Beach during a gale of wind from the N.W. The life-boat stationed at Palling put out and saved the crew of 6 men.—Expense of service, 14l. 14s.

Nov. 11.—The barque *Hannah*, of Drobak, Norway, was stranded at Grainthorpe Haven during a gale of wind. The Donna Nook life-boat put off and succeeded in saving the vessel's crew of 9 men.—Expense of service, 11l. 15s.

Nov. 13.—The brigantine *St. Areta*, of Santander, was wrecked during very rough weather on the Laugharne Sands, in Carmarthen Bay. The life-boat, stationed at the Ferryside, was launched, and succeeded in rescuing the crew of 8 men from the ship's boat.—Expense of service, 10l. 2s. 6d.

Nov. 14.—The brigantine *Elizabeth*, of Drogheda, was observed in distress with signals for help flying, off Whitehaven. The life-boat stationed at the latter place put off and rendered assistance to the vessel.—Expense of service, 14l. 4s.

Nov. 19.—The barque *Medoc*, of Bordeaux, struck on St. Patrick's Causeway, off Barmouth, during a fresh wind and heavy sea. The life-boat stationed at the latter place went off and assisted ashore the vessel's crew of 17 men.—Expense of service, 6l. 10s.

Nov. 23.—The brig, *Dawson*, of Newcastle, was wrecked on the Long Scarr Rocks off Redcar during a gale of wind and in a heavy sea. The Redcar life-boat put off and succeeded in rescuing 6 of the vessel's crew.—Expense of service, 22l. 11s.

Dec. 1.—The barque *Helsingoe*, of Elsinore, was totally wrecked on the Hasborough Sands, off the Norfolk coast, during a strong wind from N. by E. with squalls. At daylight the beach men saw what appeared to be a dimasted vessel at the back of the Scroby Sands with signals of distress in the rigging. The Caister large life-boat was at once launched, and on arriving alongside it was found to be the upper part of the above-named vessel. It consisted of the bulwarks (which on the lee side were under water), deck, and a few planks below, and was little more than a raft, but it had on it the whole of the crew, numbering 14 men, of the wrecked barque. The poor fellows had been nine hours adrift on it in a terrible sea and with the weather very cold. The difficulty of getting them off, in the midst of the heavy seas, was great, and the life-boat was a good deal damaged, for, on account of the ship's broken mainmast, spars, &c., the boat could not approach the wreck to leeward, and had to be taken to windward, and to get at the crew she had to drive alongside, and time after time she grated with much violence against the wreck, from which the ship's bolts were projecting. Some of the life-boatmen said the boat would be dashed to pieces; but others replied, "We must save the poor fellows!" And ultimately, after gallantly exerting themselves for nearly an hour, the crew of the life-boat had the great satisfaction of saving the whole of them. None but daring and experienced men could have accomplished this rescue. The boat was subsequently towed into Yarmouth harbour by a steamer, each side of the pier-head being lined with spectators. The rescued men were then landed and taken to the Sailors' Home. They were respectable and well-behaved men. The mate had his shoulder injured, and was taken to the hospital, where he was afterwards seen very cheerful and happy. The master, when offered a little rum by one of the beachmen, declined it, saying, "There was too much poison in it for him." The hull of the ship, which had been left behind, afterwards floated off the sand, and finally came ashore southward of Gorleston

Pier.—Expense of service, including a double reward to the crew of the life-boat for their gallant services, 25l.

Dec. 2.—The sloop *Frances Mary*, of Inverkeithing, was totally wrecked off Redcar during a heavy gale of wind. The Redcar life-boat went off and succeeded in saving the vessel's crew of 3 men.—Expense of service, 20l. 8s.

Dec. 2.—Voted 137l. 6s. 2d. to pay the expenses of the Southport, Wexford, Peterhead, Newhaven, Margate, Rhyl, Girvan, Holyhead, Theddlethorpe, Aberdovey, Lossiemouth, and Selsey life-boats for various services to vessels in distress during the storms of November.

Also the thanks of the Institution and 1l. each to ROBERT MARTIN and ROBERT CUNNINGHAM for helping, by means of ropes, to rescue the crew of 11 men of the brig *Thia Elpis*, of Athens, which was wrecked off Ballantrae, on the coast of Ayrshire, during a whole gale from N.N.W., on the 16th Nov.

Dec. 4.—The brig *Schiedam*, of Middlesborough, bound from Seaham to Southampton with coals, foundered at sea off the Yorkshire coast soon after midnight. The master and crew of 5 men had taken to their longboat a few minutes previous to the vessel going down. While making for the land, the master and mate were washed out of the boat: the latter succeeded in regaining her, but the captain was unfortunately lost. The boat was seen from Scarborough when 4 miles distant from the shore, and as a heavy sea was running out of the Pier Head, it was very doubtful whether the crew could reach the harbour in safety. The Scarborough life-boat was thereupon manned and launched, and reached the boat when it was upwards of 3 miles from the land. When taken into the life-boat, the poor fellows were very much exhausted, and their boat was half full of water.—Expense of service, 10l.

Dec. 4.—The schooner *Brenton*, of Fowey, was observed with signals of distress flying, on the Skull Martin Rock, near Ballywalter, on the Irish coast. The wind was blowing very fresh from N. to N.E., and a heavy sea was running at the time. The Ballywalter life-boat was promptly launched, and brought safely ashore the vessel's crew of 5 men. The poor fellows had to descend a rope from the jibboom to reach the life-boat. The weather subsequently moderating, the vessel was brought safely into harbour.—Expense of service, 11l. 13s.

Dec. 5.—The schooner *Columbine*, of Wexford, in running for Hantoon Channel, the entrance to Wexford Harbour, while the wind was blowing hard from the east, and the sea running high, struck the ground and showed signals of distress. The Wexford No. 2 life-boat went off and found the sea breaking over the wreck, which was rolling heavily, the masts being likely to fall every moment. After many attempts and much exertion, the life-boat running great danger of being smashed alongside, the vessel's crew of 5 men were happily rescued and brought safely ashore.—Expense of service, 7l. 5s.

Dec. 5.—The Spanish schooner *Loretta*, bound from Liverpool to Cuba, with a general cargo, was seen drifting toward the sands eastward of Porthcawl, on the coast of South Wales. There was a strong gale blowing from W.S.W. at the time. The Porthcawl life-boat put off, and brought ashore the master's wife, the captain and crew refusing at first to quit their ship. Soon afterwards, however, the position of the vessel became so perilous that signals of distress were shown, and the life-boat again put off, through a heavy sea, and rescued the crew of 11 men and a pilot, bringing them ashore in safety.—Expense of service, 11l. 9s.

Dec. 7.—The steam-ship *Anglim*, of Dublin, was stranded during heavy weather on the "Main," under the North Foreland lighthouse. The Kingsgate life-boat put off, but her services were at first declined. Afterwards, however, the master requested the crew to board his vessel and assist in getting her from her dangerous position. This was done, and the vessel was afterwards towed into Ramsgate Harbour by the steam-tug *Aid*.

Dec. 13.—The Holyhead life-boat went off to the assistance of a vessel reported as being in distress in the harbour of refuge at that place. It was quite dark, and the wind was blowing a heavy gale from the S.W., and it was raining hard. With the assistance of a steamer the life-boat succeeded in saving the vessel, which proved to be the schooner *Merlin*, of Llanelly, having a crew of 4 men. She was in a very dangerous position near the breakwater.

Dec. 14.—The schooner *Adina*, of London, was totally wrecked during a strong gale from the S.W. and heavy sea, near the East Holm Buoy, on the Corton Sand, off Lowestoft. The life-boat at the latter place was launched and succeeded in saving the whole of the vessel's crew, 8 in number. The sea broke very heavily over the wreck, and she soon afterwards went to pieces. The neighbouring life-boat at Pakefield also went off with the view of rendering assistance to the same vessel.—Expense of service, 48*l*.

Dec. 17.—Soon after midnight a vessel was reported from shore at Eccles, about a mile and a half from Palling, on the Norfolk coast. It was blowing a heavy gale of wind from the N.W. at the time, and a high sea running. The Palling life-boat was promptly conveyed on its carriage to the scene of the wreck, and she was launched about three hundred yards to leeward of the vessel. An attempt was then made to track her to windward, but the line was carried away, and the men took to the oars, and pulled in the direction of the wreck, against a strong wind and tide. In the meantime the mast went by the board, carrying with it the crew of 6 men, 4 of whom were unfortunately swept away, and met with a watery grave. After a hard struggle the life-boat arrived abreast the wreck and let go the anchor, with the view of veering alongside. Just then the vessel parted in two, and the life-boat men had to shift the anchor several times in consequence of so much wreckage. After several trials, however, they succeeded in saving the master and mate, who were hauled into the boat in a very exhausted condition, and afterwards safely landed at Palling. This service was a very hazardous one, and the life-boat men received much praise for their brave and skilful handling of the boat. The vessel proved to be the brig *Echo*, of London.—Expense of service, 22*l*. 17*s*.

Dec. 20.—At daybreak the Austrian barque *Suez* was observed riding at anchor with signals of distress flying, about three miles and a half east of New Quay, Cornwall. The life-boat at that place was quickly launched, and found the vessel in a very critical position, with nearly all her sails blown away. The crew had attempted to leave in their long-boat, but as soon as it was launched over the side it got stove in, and was entirely useless. The crew, 10 in number, were very glad to avail themselves of the services of the life-boat, and were brought safely ashore.—Expense of service, 10*l*. 12*s*.

Dec. 22.—The schooner *Jessie*, of Liverpool, was stranded off Rhyl, on the coast of North Wales, during a gale of wind from N.N.E. She had been observed running before the wind with masts gone and sails flying about in all directions. The Rhyl tubular life-boat went out, and brought

safely ashore the crew of 3 men. The sea was making a clean breach over the wreck when the life-boat arrived alongside.—Expense of service, 8*l*. 2*s*. 6*d*.

Dec. 22.—The schooner *Vigilant*, of Hayle, Cornwall, was seen in distress during bad weather, and in a heavy sea, on the western spit of Hayle Bar. The life-boat stationed at that port was launched, and succeeded in rescuing the vessel's crew of 5 men. The schooner soon afterwards became a total wreck. Great skill and courage were shown by the gallant coxswain and crew of the life-boat in rendering this service, which was performed while the weather was intensely dark, and while a heavy sea was rolling on the bar.—Expense of service, including double reward to the crew of the life-boat, 29*l*. 16*s*.

Dec. 22.—During a heavy N.E. gale, and just before daybreak, the brig *Mary Young*, of West Hartlepool, grounded on the North Gare Sandbank at the entrance of the Tees, a mile and a half south of Seaton Carew. The life-boat at the latter place was conveyed to the spot, launched, and brought ashore the vessel's crew of 8 men. A strong gale from E.N.E. was blowing at the time. On the afternoon of the same day the life-boat again went out to the schooner *Daisy*, of Berwick, which was seen dragging her anchor, a tug making vain efforts to get near her. The vessel was found abandoned; and after some difficulty she was towed up the Tees to Middlesborough.—Expense of first service, 11*l*. 4*s*.

Dec. 23.—The brig *Englishman*, of Workington, and the schooner *Louisa Jane*, of Drogheda, while running for the River Boyne, became unmanageable through a sudden change of wind, and drove on the *South Bull* in a heavy sea. The Drogheda life-boat went off and rescued the crew of 6 men from the brig, but the crew of the schooner refused to leave their vessel as she was not leaking, and the tide was ebbing.—Expense of service, 14*l*. 19*s*.

Dec. 23.—The steamer *M. E. Clarke*, of London, during a heavy N.E. gale, went on the Mole Rocks, near Dover Harbour. The life-boat at the latter place put off and rescued the vessel's crew of 12 men, afterwards landing them in safety.—Expense of service, 16*l*. 3*s*.

Dec. 24.—The schooner *Agathe Scheibert*, of Stettin, stranded on the Holm Sand during a strong N.E. gale with squalls and heavy sea. The Lowestoft life-boat went out in tow of the *Rainbow* steam-tug, and succeeded in rescuing the master and crew of 10 men from the wreck.—Expense of service, 25*l*. 10*s*.

Dec. 26.—The schooner *Viscount MacDuff*, of Macduff, N. B., while entering the harbour of Tynemouth during the night, was struck by a heavy sea, which washed overboard the captain and one of the crew, who were at the wheel at the time. She almost immediately afterwards grounded on the rocks off the Spanish Battery, where the steamship *Stanley* was lost a few years since. The Tynemouth No. 2 life-boat was quickly launched through a tremendous sea, and rescued the remaining 4 men of the crew, who were in a sad state of terror and exhaustion. It was a fearful night, with wind, snow, thunder and lightning combined.—Expense of service, 14*l*.

Dec. 27.—At daylight the brigantine *Lutha*, of Leith, was observed off Whitby with loss of masts and sails, and otherwise disabled, and with signals of distress in her rigging. The Whitby life-boat went off to her assistance and brought ashore the crew of 6 men.—Expense of service, 10*l*.

Dec. 30.—The brig *Edwardino*, of Genoa, was stranded during a terrific gale from the S. on the Northern Strand of Ballycotton Bay, on the Irish coast. The life-boat stationed at Ballycotton went off twice, and on the second occasion rescued

the vessel's crew of 10 men, afterwards landing them in safety. The first time the life-boat was blown on shore, with the loss of 5 oars, after having been nearly upset. She was, however, quickly launched again, and went off in gallant style to the rescue. While this service was being performed another vessel went down, and her crew, unfortunately, perished.—Expense of service, 19*l*.

Dec. 30.—During a sudden gale from the south three fishing-cobles were observed in distress off North Sunderland. The life-boat at that place went out, and having got the boats in as safe a position as possible, took off the crews, consisting of 12 men, and brought them ashore.—Expense of service, 2*l*. 5*s*. 6*d*.

Dec. 30.—The brig *Delegate*, of London, struck on the Caister Shoal, or Inner Barber Sands, while the wind was blowing very hard from the south. A Caister yawl went off to her assistance, and, although one of the crew managed to get on board the vessel, the sea was too heavy for the yawl to stay by, and she returned for the Caister surf life-boat, which was soon launched and alongside the wreck. After some difficulty she succeeded in saving the vessel's crew of 9 men.—Expense of service, 10*l*. 5*s*.

Dec. 30.—The brigantine *Girondin*, of Bordeaux, stranded during a strong gale from the south and heavy sea, on the Par Sands, on the Cornish coast. The Mevagissey life-boat was launched, and succeeded in rescuing the crew of 6 men.—Expense of service, 17*l*. 5*s*. 9*d*.

Dec. 30.—Voted 274*l*. 11*s*. 6*d*. to pay the expenses of the North Deal, Broadstairs, Filey, Caister, Fraserburgh, Holyhead, Dover, Wexford, Great Yarmouth, Tynemouth, West Wittering, Falmouth, Swansea, St. David's, Abersoch, Ballycotton, Peterhead, Castletown, Montrose, Penzance, and Margate life-boats in putting off in reply to signals from various vessels in distress during the heavy gales of December. Fortunately the vessels succeeded in getting out of their dangerous positions, or rode out the gales in safety.

Dec. 30.—Reported the services of the Rams-gate life-boat, in conjunction with the steam-tug *Aid*, in putting out, on the 23rd Dec., during a strong N.E. gale, to the rescue of the crew of the ship *Providence*, of Waisa, which was totally wrecked on the South-East Calliper Sands. On arriving within fifty fathoms the anchor was let go, and the life-boat was veered down towards the vessel's port quarter, 3 or 4 of the crew being seen on that part of the wreck. A hawser was then got on board from the life-boat, and the captain made an attempt to slide down the rope,

but when half way a heavy sea swept him off. Fortunately, however, he was rescued, and got into the life-boat. The ship was now fast breaking up, the masts and spars falling overboard. One of the crew followed the master's example by sliding down the hawser; he also was swept away, but, happily, was afterwards saved by the life-boat. There now remained only 1 man and a boy on the wreck, and the former made a rope fast round his body, and plunged into the sea, but notwithstanding every exertion was made to save him, he was unfortunately drowned. The poor boy was now the only one left, and his screams to the life-boat men to save him were heartrending. For half an hour the brave fellows made every effort to do so, then a tremendous sea struck the ship, nearly broke her in two, and the lad was washed overboard. The cable of the life-boat was then cut, and she steered clear of the wreck, when providentially the boy floated near the boat, and was rescued and hauled in. He was apparently dead, but after some time the men succeeded in bringing him to. The life-boat then returned, in company with the steamer, to Ramsgate. Twelve of the vessel's crew had left her in their boat during the night, and it was feared had met with a watery grave, but fortunately they were saved by a passing vessel.

Also the services of the same life-boat and two steam-tugs, in rescuing from destruction the ship *Constantia*, of Bremen, and her crew of 26 men. This vessel grounded on the Goodwin Sands in a heavy gale of wind on the 26th Dec.

Dec. 30.—The barque *Spectator*, of Whitby, was observed to part from her cables, and after coming into collision with another vessel, to drive in the direction of the Scroby Sands. The Yarmouth large life-boat went off under sail, and after great difficulty succeeded in boarding the ship, and in assisting to bring her to a port of safety.

Dec. 30.—The ship *Lady Carter*, of Liverpool, was observed with signals of distress flying during a fearful hurricane and in a tremendous sea, off Tynemouth. She was being towed round the south pier buoy, when the tow-line broke, and she was in great danger of being driven on the advanced base of the north pier, but was fortunately brought up with two anchors. The Tynemouth life-boat put off, and at the earnest request of the captain, whose wife was on board, the boat remained by the vessel six hours, when the ship was taken in tow by two steamers after slipping both her cables. The launching and getting out the life-boat was attended with much danger, and there was great fear of her being driven on to the North Pier.—Expense of service, 14*l*.

ROYAL NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION,  
FOR THE  
PRESERVATION OF LIFE FROM SHIPWRECK.

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*Obverse.*—Bust of Her Majesty Queen Victoria; beneath, in minute letters, “L. C. Wyon.”  
Double legend, “Royal National Life-boat Institution. Founded in 1824.  
Incorporated 1860. Victoria, Patroness.”

*Reverse.*—Three sailors in a Life-boat,—one of whom is in the act of rescuing an exhausted mariner from the waves on a fragment of the wreck. “W. Wyon, Mint.”  
Inscription, “Let not the deep swallow me up.”

THE beautiful obverse of this medal, which has recently been executed by L. C. WYON, Esq., represents the bust of QUEEN VICTORIA, Her Majesty's locks gracefully waving and gathered in a knot behind, from which issues a wreath of oak clustering over the forehead. This life-like portrait of the QUEEN, in high relief, conveys a truly pleasing and faithful likeness of Her MAJESTY, combining dignity of aspect and benevolence of nature; and represented by Mr. WYON with the most exquisite finish, delicacy, and beauty of workmanship.

The reverse, representing the Life-boat, in which there are three Sailors, rescuing a fourth from the sea, is a work of superlative merit. Two of the Sailors are steadying the boat, while the other, stooping, draws in the Shipwrecked Sailor, whose figure is given so as to show the form in the most natural and beautiful manner; and the expression thrown into his countenance looking up to his preserver is unrivalled by anything that we have ever seen, while the easy flowing lines of this sailor are finely contrasted by those of his companions: the whole displaying the most perfect knowledge of the human frame, the finest taste to arrange it, and a command of the graver to embody to us what the artist's bright genius had shadowed out to himself.

But there is another pleasing motive for our admiration of this beautiful Medal, as the figure who is so humanely extending his relief to the drowning Mariner is a portrait of the Artist (the late WILLIAM WYON, Esq., R.A.) himself.

The following is a LIST of the GOLD and SILVER MEDALS that have been voted by the Committee of this Institution, since its establishment in 1824, to persons whose humane and intrepid exertions in saving Life from Shipwreck on our Coasts have been deemed sufficiently conspicuous to merit that honourable distinction. The Cases will be found recorded in detail in the several Annual Reports of the Institution.

# ROYAL NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION.

## THE LIFE-BOAT REGULATIONS.

THE following Regulations are intended for the guidance of the Local Committee to be formed at each place at which a life-boat is stationed by the NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION, and to whose care and control the life-boat, her crew, and everything connected with her management and maintenance, will be intrusted.

The local committee to consist, if practicable, of not less than five persons usually resident, to be elected annually. The Inspecting-Commander of Coastguard of the division, or in his absence the nearest Coastguard officer to the spot, to be *ex officio* a member of the local committee.

1. The life-boat's crew to consist of a coxswain-superintendent, an assistant coxswain, a bowman, and as many boatmen in addition as the boat pulls oars.

2. For every boat, at least double the number of men required (if they can be found at or near the spot) should be invited to become members of her crew.

3. Such men to consist of sailors and fishermen who are usually resident, and (with permission of the Admiralty) of any Coastguard men of the station who may volunteer for the service.

4. The salary of the coxswain-superintendent shall be 8*l.*, and that of the assistant coxswain 2*l.* annually. On every occasion of going afloat to save life, the coxswains and each of the crew shall receive alike, 10*s.* by day and 1*l.* by night; and for every time of going afloat for exercise, 4*s.* In the absence of the coxswain, the assistant coxswain will take charge of the boat.\*

5. In the event of money being received

by the life-boat for salvage of property, or similar service, a proportion equal to the shares of two of the crew shall be paid to the Institution to cover risk of damage to the boat, the remainder being equally shared amongst the coxswain and crew.

6. If local subscriptions or other payments be raised or made to reward any special act of gallantry or exertion, the Institution recommends that the whole of the money be paid to the crew, in equal shares.

7. As at each life-boat station there will be a local committee, the coxswain will act under their immediate directions, and the boat, except in case of wreck, or other disaster, is never to be taken afloat without their sanction.\*

8. As the efficiency of a life-boat depends on the good training and discipline of her crew, the strictest attention must be paid by them to the directions of the coxswain on all occasions connected with the service. The boat shall be taken afloat for exercise, fully manned, once during each quarter, sometimes in *rough weather*, unless the boat has been out in that quarter, either on service or with one of the Inspectors.

9. The local committee at each station are requested to meet at the expiration of each quarter, and then to forward the usual Quarterly Report to the Institution, on the printed sheet provided for the purpose, as to the behaviour of the boat during exercise, &c., pointing out any defects that may require to be remedied, and offering any suggestions that may conduce to the efficiency of the service. Also generally to report on the state and condition of the boat, the carriage,

\* The coxswain is held responsible for every man who goes into the life-boat, on occasions of service and of quarterly exercise, without having on a life-belt.

\* It is desirable that each local committee should appoint one of their members, resident on the spot, to specially represent them, in conjunction with the honorary secretary, on such emergencies.

the boat-house, and all the life-boat gear. Should occasion for immediate repairs arise, the local committee are authorized to make them to the extent of 5*l.*: more extensive repairs to be referred, with an estimate, to the Parent Institution.

10. The boat is to be kept on her carriage in the boat-house, with all her gear in her ready for use, except articles which may require to be secured from damp.

11. There should be three keys to the boat-house, kept in different places, with the *address of each painted on the door*; one in possession of the coxswain, and the others as the local committee may decide.

12. Immediately on intimation of a wreck, or of a vessel in distress, the coxswain is to use his utmost exertions to assemble his crew, launch his boat, and proceed to her assistance: and in the event of a sufficient number of his crew not being present, he is to select the best volunteers he can get to supply their places.

13. If a wreck occur at some distance from the station, so as to require the boat to be transported along the coast, the coxswain is to send to procure sufficient horses (which, by the Wreck and Salvage Act, any magistrate, constable, or revenue officer may demand the use of), attach them to the carriage, and lose no time in making the best of his way with the crew to the scene of wreck.

14. A reward of 7*s.* to be given to the man who first brings intelligence of a wreck at such a distance along the coast as not to be in sight from the Coastguard or other look-out.

15. A signal shall be agreed on by which the life-boat crew can be called together when required. A flag hoisted by day and the firing of a carronade (or other alarm signal) twice, quick, by night.

16. On approaching a wreck, the coxswain will use his judgment, according to the circumstances of the case, whether he will board the wreck end on, either on the bow, on the quarter, or on the broadside: or whether he will go to windward, drop

his anchor, and veer down to the wreck; or if he will lay her alongside.

17. On boarding wrecks, the preservation of life is to be the coxswain's *sole consideration*, and he is on no account to take in goods or merchandize which might endanger the safety of his boat, and the lives of those intrusted to his charge. And should any be brought in, contrary to his remonstrance, he is fully authorized to throw them overboard.

18. No one besides the coxswains and crew is on any account to be allowed to go out in the life-boat when going to a wreck, except with the express sanction of the local committee.

19. The life-boat is not to be used for taking off an anchor; nor for the purpose of salvage; nor for taking off stores, a pilot, or orders to a ship, *so as to interfere with private enterprise*, except in cases of emergency, but to be reserved for cases involving risk of life.

20. An entry is to be made, in the journal supplied for the purpose, of the particulars of all services performed by the life-boat in saving or attempting to save life, being a duplicate of the official reports of the same forwarded to the Institution, which journal will be retained at the station as a complete record of all the services which have been performed by the life-boat.

21. On returning from service, the boat is not to be left in the surf on the beach, but, as soon as possible, is to be got on her carriage, and placed in the boat-house.

22. The coxswain-superintendent will be held responsible for the efficiency and general good order of the boat-house, the boat, and her gear; and it is hoped that a sense of the trust confided to them in the cause of humanity will lead the coxswains and crew to be most careful on these points, and to distinguish themselves by their zeal and readiness, and by the seaman-like manner in which their boat is handled.
