AT the ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING of the ROYAL NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION, held at Willis's Rooms, King Street, St. James's Square, on Tuesday, the 16th day of March 1880, His Grace THE DUKE OF NORTHUMBERLAND, Lord Privy Seal, *President of the Institution*, in the Chair, the following Report of the Committee was read by the Secretary:—

ANNUAL REPORT.

THE Committee of Management of the ROYAL NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION have much satisfaction in being able to report its continued prosperity, and to record the successful prosecution, during the past twelve months, of the important and onerous National duty, the direction of which has been entrusted to them.

That such should have been the case during a period of almost unprecedented pecuniary reverses and consequent great depression, is, they trust, an indication both of the general confidence which has been reposed in them, and of the firm root which the Society has taken amongst the permanent institutions of our land.

As has been hitherto their wont, they desire to express their gratitude to the Divine Disposer of Events for the blessing which has attended their labours in carrying out the sacred objects of the NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION.

Their best acknowledgments are also due to all those who have given them their co-operation or pecuniary aid, and they now confidently appeal for a continuance of that support, which they feel sure will never be withdrawn, so long as the

work of the Institution is conscientiously and successfully performed.

The Committee have the satisfaction to state that Rear-Admiral H.R.H. THE DUKE OF EDINBURGH, K.G., has kindly consented, at their request, to become, in his official capacity as Admiral Superintendent of Naval Reserves, a Member of the Committee of Management, in succession to his predecessors holding the same appointment.

The transactions of the year may be summarised under the usual heads, as follows:—

Life-boats.—Since the last Annual Report twelve new Life-boats have been placed on the coast, one of them to a new Station and eleven to replace other boats.

Nine of the above Life-boats have been supplied with transporting-carriages, and for two of them new boat-houses have been built.

The coasts of the United Kingdom, which extend over several thousand miles, being now nearly provided with Life-boats wherever their services would be useful and it would be practicable to work them, the Committee are able to turn their attention to the gradual replacement of old and inferior boats by those of the latest construction.

During the year 1879 the Life-boats of the Institution rescued 637 persons from wrecked or endangered vessels, nearly the whole of them under perilous circumstances, when ordinary boats could not with safety have been employed.

The Committee are thankfully able to record that those invaluable services were performed without loss of life to any of the brave men who formed the Life-boats' crews during the year 1879 or in the preceding year, notwithstanding the fact that during the two years the boats were manned on all occasions of service and quarterly exercise by about twenty-five thousand men.

Unhappily, however, as if to remind them of the honourably perilous nature of the work in which they are engaged, two fatal accidents have happened since the commencement of the present year. On the 20th of January last the Life-boat at Bacton, in Norfolk, was upset by an overwhelming hollow sea breaking on her broadside when boarding a wrecked vessel. On that occasion two of her crew unhappily perished, and of the remainder, 11 in number, 4 went round in the boat, which quickly self righted, 4 were again taken into her, and the remaining 3 were carried safely to the shore supported by their life-belts, although they wore heavy sea-boots and none of them could swim.

Again, on the 1st March the Ardrossan Life-boat, when returning to the harbour in tow of a steamer, with the crew of a wrecked ship on board, was struck by a series of heavy seas, one of which upset her.

There were 25 persons on board her at the time, viz., 13 forming her own crew and 12 rescued men, of which number 2 of the former and 2 of the latter were unfortunately drowned.

Feeling satisfied that the permanent efficiency of a large proportion of the Life-boat Establishments must greatly depend on their frequent inspection by qualified and experienced Officers, and looking to the increased magnitude of the Society's operations, the Committee have, on the recommendation of a Special Committee, increased their staff of inspectors. They have divided the coasts of the United Kingdom into five districts, have appointed one to each, and decided that instead of, as hitherto, living in London, they should each reside in their own districts, with the exception of the Inspector of the Home District, who together with the Chief Inspector will have duties to perform in London as well as on the Coast.

By this arrangement every Life-boat Station will be more frequently inspected. It will necessarily occasion an increased expenditure, but if the result should promote corresponding increased efficiency—which the Committee have reason to believe it has already done—they feel sure that the same will meet with the approval of their supporters throughout the kingdom.

Shipwrecks.—Taking into account the violence of the storms which periodically visit the coasts of the United Kingdom, and the enormous shipping interests of the country, the number of shipwrecks every year on our coasts and in our narrow seas must inevitably be very large.

Accordingly, from the last official returns the number of shipwrecks in one year on our shores amounted to four thousand four hundred and thirty-six, accompanied by the loss of eight hundred and ninety-two lives.

The services of the Life-boats of the

In addition to these Life-boat services, 218 lives were saved from shipwreck by shore-boats and other means, making a total of 855 lives preserved in 1879, for which honorary or pecuniary rewards were made by the Institution.

The Committee would venture, to draw special attention to the number of lives thus saved and reported at each successive Annual Meeting—proving the absolute necessity in a great Maritime Country like ours of a National Institution for the Preservation of Life from Shipwreck.

It is also gratifying to mention that hundreds of lives are saved every year by means of the Rocket Apparatus belonging to the BOARD OF TRADE, and worked so efficiently by the Coastguard and the Rocket Volunteer Brigades.

The number of lives saved during the fifty-six years from the establishment of the Institution, to the end of the year 1879, either by its Life-boats or by special exertions for which it has granted rewards, is 26,906, as shown in the following Table.

It is hardly necessary to dwell on the amount of happiness which the saving of nearly twenty-seven thousand lives must have conferred on the shipwrecked persons themselves and their families; but the community at large has also benefited by the services of the Life-boat Institution in contributing to preserve the lives of so many of that deserving class of men—our sailors,—whose ceaseless toil,

risks, and exposure bring constantly the riches of the world to our shores.

Rewards.—A summary is given in the Appendix of the cases where honorary and other rewards have been voted last year. In that period 12 Silver Medals, 13 Votes of Thanks inscribed on vellum, and 2,250*l.* were granted for saving the lives of 855 persons by Life-boats, shore and fishing boats, and by other means, on the coasts and outlying sandbanks of the United Kingdom.

The Committee continue to devote much time and consideration to the investigation and granting of these rewards; and as a rule their decisions give general satisfaction, and encourage our coast population to put forth their utmost exertions to save the lives of others—often at the peril of their own.

Since the establishment of the Institution, it has expended on Life-boat Stations, and other means for saving life from shipwreck, on the coasts of the United Kingdom, upwards of 508,000*l.*, and has voted 93 Gold Medals, 902 Silver Medals, and 60,200*l.* in pecuniary rewards for saving life from shipwreck.

Local Committees.—The Committee again tender their best acknowledgments for the valuable and earnest co-operation afforded them by the Local Branch Committees and their Honorary Secretaries, which constitute so important a part of the work and supervision of the Institution's numerous Life-boat Establishments, and the collection of funds for their support. The Book of *Instructions*, which the Institution has recently issued, on the *Management of a Life-boat Station*, cannot fail to prompt afresh the assiduity and co-operation of the Local Committees and the Life-boat Crews.

Finances.—The donations, subscriptions, and dividends during the year 1879 have been 30,125*l.* 7*s.* 5*d.*, of which sum 5,081*l.* 15*s.* 7*d.* were special gifts to defray the cost of the following eleven Life-boats:—

There were expended during the past year 9,388*l.* 2*s.* 11*d.* on additional Life-boats, Transporting-carriages, Boat-houses, and necessary gear; 14,156*l.* 9*s.* 8*d.* in repairs, painting, refitting, and sundry

charges on Life-boat Establishments, and on the Store-yard at Poplar; and 7,856*l.* 7*s.* 6*d.* in rewards for services to shipwrecked crews, coxswains' salaries, and quarterly practice of the Life-boats' crews; making altogether—including liabilities on Life-boat Houses now in course of construction, and other expenses—a total of 36,546*l.* 3*s.* 6*d.* against receipts amounting to 30,125*l.* 7*s.* 5*d.*

The items of receipt and expenditure are fully detailed in the financial statement, which has been audited as usual by Mr. LOVELOCK, public accountant.

For more than thirty years the Committee have had the satisfaction, year after year, to report that the sphere of operations of the Institution was extending, and that, in proportion to that extension, the support of the Public had liberally corresponded.

They are fortunately in the position to renew that statement this year; and while the Committee and their Officers feel it to be a privilege to be associated with an Institution whose beneficent labours are so generously recognised and appreciated, not only in the United Kingdom but all over the world, they appeal with renewed assurance and confidence to their fellow-countrymen at large to help them, not only to maintain the great Life-saving Fleet which the toil and anxiety of many years have produced, but also to assist them to perpetuate the great work, and to extend it as opportunities are presented.

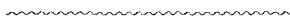

The object of this Institution, as declared in its title, and in its Charter of Incorporation, is to afford assistance to every shipwrecked person around the Coasts of the United Kingdom.

The chief means by which the Society hopes to carry this object into effect are:—

To build, station, and maintain in repair, Life-boats of the most perfect description; to furnish them with all necessary Appurtenances, including Houses to preserve them in, and Carriages for their conveyance to the spots where their Services are called for; and further, to provide, through the instrumentality of Local Committees, for their proper Management and the occasional Exercise of their Crews.

To confer Honorary Rewards in the form of Medals and Votes of Thanks, and also to make liberal grants of money to all persons who, at the risk of their own lives, save, or attempt to save, those of others on board vessels wrecked, or in distress, upon any part of the Coasts of the United Kingdom.

As an index of the necessity for the provision of such a machinery as the above, it may be stated that the average loss of lives from shipwreck annually on the shores of the United Kingdom is 700.

VOTED BY THE ROYAL NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION

TO THE CREWS OF ITS LIFE-BOATS, TO SHORE AND FISHING-BOATS' CREWS, AND TO OTHER PERSONS,

FROM THE 1ST JANUARY TO THE 31ST DECEMBER, 1879.

Jan. 3.—A dismasted vessel having been seen off Newhaven harbour, the Life-boat *Michael Henry* proceeded to her. The wind was blowing moderately from W.S.W. and a heavy sea was running. On arriving at the vessel it was found that she had been abandoned by her crew, and the Life-boat, with the assistance of a steam-tug, took her into Newhaven Harbour. She was the schooner *Marie*, of Rostock, bound from Stettin to Exeter, with a cargo of potatoes.

Jan. 4.—Voted the Second Service Clasp of the Institution to the Rev. OWEN LLOYD WILLIAMS, in recognition of his continued intrepid services in the Abersoch and Porthdinllaen Life-boats of the Institution.

Jan. 7.—The *Laura Platt* Life-boat, stationed at Skerries, co. Dublin, was launched during a strong S.E. gale and heavy sea, and saved the crew of three men from the schooner *Elsmore*, of Runcorn, and six men from the brig *Lady Lilford*, of Ardrrossan. Both vessels were on a lee shore, and had exhibited signals of distress; the schooner had lost her boom and gaff, while her bulwarks had been washed away by the heavy seas; the brig's crew had to be hauled into the Life-boat with the aid of a life-buoy, the sea running too high to allow the Boat to go alongside; the vessel afterwards drove ashore to the northward of the Life-boat station, and became a wreck.—Expense of service, 16*l.* 11*s.* 6*d.*

Jan. 7.—A messenger arrived at Swanage from Studland stating that a vessel was in distress near the entrance to Poole Harbour. The Swanage Life-boat *Charlotte Mary* was at once launched and proceeded to the spot, when it was found that the ketch *Effort*, of Portsmouth, had parted from her anchors and gone ashore, the sea making a complete breach over her. The Life-boat, with great difficulty and danger, succeeded in rescuing the crew of two men and landed them at Poole.—Expense of service, 14*l.* 5*s.*

Jan. 8.—The Swansea Life-boat *Wolverhampton* saved the crew of ten men from the barque *Sarah Ann*, of Sunderland, which had sunk in Swansea Bay during a gale from E.S.E. She was on a voyage from Swansea to Monte Video, with a cargo of coal.—Expense of service, 14*l.* 12*s.*

Jan. 10.—The *Hannah Somerset* Life-boat, stationed at Staithes, Yorkshire, put off and rendered assistance to several fishing cobbles which were in danger during a very strong E.N.E. wind and heavy sea. With the help of the Life-boat all the boats were taken into port.

Jan. 11.—At 10.30 p.m. the passenger-ship *Lough Sunart*, of Glasgow, struck on Skulmartin Reef. The night was clear, with light N.W. wind and smooth sea. Signals of distress were shown from the vessel, and the Ballywalter Life-boat *Admiral Henry Meynell*, a coast-guard galley, and other boats

at once put off to her assistance. The women and children, twenty in number, were taken into the Life-boat, and the remaining twenty-five passengers were brought ashore by the other boats. As there was no immediate danger, the master and crew remained on board the ship.

At about 6 o'clock on the following evening, however, signals of distress were again shown from the vessel, the weather by that time having changed, the wind blowing very hard from the S.W., accompanied by heavy rain and sleet squalls, and a very heavy sea. The Life-boat promptly put off, and, in two trips, brought off the crew and workers, thirty-five in number, leaving the master and three men in charge of the ship.—Expense of services, 22l.

Jan. 12.—At about 11 A.M., information was received at Courtmacherry, co. Cork, that a large barque was embayed. On arriving at the Harbour point she grounded on the bar in about 18 feet of water. The wind was blowing from S.W. at the time, and a heavy sea was running. The Life-boat *City of Dublin* was quickly manned and launched and brought ashore the crew of eighteen men from the vessel, which proved to be the *General Caulfield*, of Newcastle, bound from New York to Dunkirk, with wheat. She became a total wreck.—Expense of service, 9l. 5s.

Jan. 13.—At 4.15 A.M. the barque *Cleopas*, of South Shields, bound from Liverpool to South Shields with a cargo of salt, was observed on the Barnard Sand during a S.W. wind and rough sea. In reply to her signals of distress the Kessingland No. 2 Life-boat proceeded to her, and with great difficulty rescued the crew of ten men, and landed them on the beach at Kessingland. The vessel became a total wreck.—Expense of service, 16l.

Jan. 13.—At about 7 P.M., it having been reported that a vessel was ashore at Portobello, about 4 miles distant from Newhaven, the Life-boat went to her assistance. A light S.S.W. wind was blowing at the time, and the weather was foggy. She was found to be in considerable danger, being close to the cliffs, and the Life-boat therefore remained by her. She proved to be the brigantine *True*, of Faversham, bound to Newhaven with coal. At about 2.45 A.M. the sea was breaking heavily over her, and as she was filling with water, the crew, consisting of seven men, were taken on board the Life-boat and safely landed at Newhaven.—Expense of service, 21l. 10s.

Jan. 14.—The brig *Allison*, of Whitby, stranded near Jury's Gap, off the coast of Sussex, during a strong S.S.W. wind and heavy sea. The crew were then in no danger, and it was hoped that the vessel would get off with the rising tide; but in the course of the day the wind and sea increased, and they signalled for the Life-boat. The Rye Life-boat was therefore launched, and brought safely ashore the crew, consisting of four men. The vessel subsequently became a total wreck.—Expense of service, 11l. 6s.

Jan. 14.—The Life-boat *Mincing Lane*, stationed at Montrose, N.B., rendered assistance to some Ferryden fishing boats which had been overtaken by heavy seas and were in danger near the harbour mouth. The Life-boat also assisted several other vessels which were in dangerous positions.—Expense of service, 3l. 18s.

Jan. 15.—At 7.30 A.M., during squally weather, a vessel was observed ashore on the Hasborough Sand. The Palling No. 2 Life-boat *British Workman* was launched and proceeded to the distressed vessel, which proved to be the Russian barque *Marie*, maize laden, from New York to Hull. With the assistance of a steam-tug she was got off the sand and taken to Yarmouth. She had a crew of twelve men.

Jan. 16.—In the evening, during hazy weather,

the s.s. *H. B. Brightman* struck on the rocks north of Staithees. Although the sea was comparatively smooth on the rocks round the steamer, it was too rough for any of the cibles to go out, and it was, therefore, thought advisable to launch the Life-boat. The boat accordingly proceeded to the vessel, and, at the request of the master, remained by her until she floated, and for about an hour and a half afterwards, and then returned ashore. The steamer, which was bound from the Tyne to Alexandria, returned north, but foundered before reaching the Tyne; her crew were fortunately saved in their own boats.—Expense of service, 10l. 15s.

Jan. 16.—At 2 A.M. the barquentine *Annie*, of Salcombe, bound from Bahia with a cargo of sugar, struck on Salcombe Bar during stormy weather. The *Rescue* Life-boat, stationed at Salcombe, went to her assistance and brought ashore the master and mate, the crew of nine men having left in the ship's boat. The vessel became a total wreck.—Expense of service, 17l. 10s.

Jan. 16.—The Montrose Life-boat *Mincing Lane* rendered assistance to several fishing-boats which were in distress off Montrose during stormy weather.

Jan. 17.—The smack *Wisdom*, of Shoreham, in attempting to leave the harbour at about 6 P.M. got foul of the new extension works, and hung by her shrouds. The crew were unable to get the vessel clear, and even if they had, she must have gone ashore, being on the W. side of the pier, and as the sea was breaking against her, the crew, six in number, were in great danger. Several shore boats attempted to render assistance, but failed on account of the heavy sea. The Life-boat *Ramonet* then put off and succeeded in laying out at anchor, and so enabled the crew of the smack to leave their vessel off.—Expense of service, 6l. 5s.

Jan. 17.—The Caister No. 2 Life-boat *Godsend* put off and remained by the brig *John*, of Hartlepool, until the vessel, which had stranded on the Barber Sand, was, with the assistance of a yawl, extricated from her perilous position.

Jan. 19.—The schooner *Fanny Bailey*, of Dundalk, bound from Troon to that port with coal and iron, stranded on the bar during a gale from S.E. and heavy sea. The Dundalk Life-boat *Stockport Sunday School* put off to her and rescued the crew, consisting of five men. The vessel struck the bar at 9 A.M. and at 8 P.M. was a total wreck.—Expense of service, 7l. 17s. 6d.

Jan. 23.—The fishing smack *Excelsior*, of Grimsby, stranded about 150 yards N. of Withernsea Pier, having mistaken the pier light for that of a vessel at anchor. She burnt a large flare light as a signal of distress, in response to which the Life-boat *Admiral Rous* was launched at about 3.15 A.M., and reached the smack, but being caught by heavy breakers, which broke three oars, she was driven back broadside on to the beach. With much difficulty she was, however, again launched and then succeeded in getting alongside the smack, and rescued the crew of five men. The Life-boat-men were completely drenched in rendering these services, the smack being exactly in the breakers, and the seas going right over the Life-boat.—Expense of service, 25l. 10s.

Jan. 24.—In reply to signals from the Swin Middle Light-ship, the Clacton-on-Sea Life-boat *Albert Edward* was launched, and proceeding in a S. direction sighted a dismasted ship—the *Hebe*, of Frederickstadt—on the east end of the Swin Middle Sand, the sea making a complete breach over her. On nearing the wreck, the crew were seen standing in a group near the port quarter. The Life-boat dropped anchor and veered down to the vessel. After seven attempts to get the crew, the Boat having filled three times, she succeeded in

taking eleven men on board. The ship had by that time altered her position, and as it was impossible to approach her again on account of the wreckage alongside, the remaining three men had to be hauled through the breakers by means of life-lines. After getting the crew on board it was found that the wreck had fouled the Life-boat's cable; this, however, was slipped, and the Boat then made for the shore. The rescued men were much exhausted, more especially the captain, who had been injured on board the vessel before being hauled through the breakers. The Life-boat, on account of the water being low, had to be drawn some distance into the sea before she could be launched, the heavy seas breaking completely over the horses and men in charge.—Expense of service, 17l. 11s.

Jan. 27.—The s.s. *Edith Owen*, of London, bound from Bristol to Liverpool with a general cargo, struck on the Coal Rock, off the coast of Anglesey, during foggy weather, the wind blowing moderately from the E. at the time. Signals of distress being exhibited from the steamer, the Cemlyn Life-boat *Good Shepherd*, the Cemaes Life-boat *Ash-tonian*, and a steam-tug, proceeded to her assistance. The passengers, five in number, were taken into the Cemaes Boat and landed at that Life-boat station. The Cemlyn Boat remained some time by the steamer while the tug attempted to tow her off. Eventually the Life-boat returned ashore at about midnight, and soon after she had gone, the vessel's crew left in their own boats. The steamer eventually became a total wreck.—Expense of service, 14l. 13s.

Jan. 28.—At 3 A.M. signal lights were seen from Caister, Norfolk, in the direction of the Barber Sand. A yawl proceeded there and found the schooner *Hermann*, of Berwick, bound from Hull to London with deal boards, ashore. As it was feared that the sea would increase with the flood tide, the wind being easterly, signals were made for the Life-boat to come and remain by the vessel. The Caister No. 2 Life-boat *Godsend* accordingly proceeded out at about 4.30 A.M., and stayed by the schooner until 1 P.M., when the crew of six men were taken ashore by the Life-boat, the master and mate deciding to remain on board. The Boat returned to the vessel, which was then dismantled, and was got off on the next flood tide.

Feb. 1.—At 10.40 P.M., during a fresh breeze from S.E., signals were fired from the Gull Light-ship. On the Ramsgate Life-boat *Bradford* and steam-tug *Vulcan* proceeding to her, it was ascertained that a large flare light had been seen in a south-easterly direction. They then went round the North Sand Head and found a vessel ashore. On getting alongside, the master stated that he had engaged the services of some Deal boatmen to assist to get the vessel off; she was then beating heavily on the sand, her anchor was let go, but as the tide flowed she beat further up. The master then requested additional help, and a signal was made for the tug, which backed in towards the vessel, her large towing hawser was attached, and the steamer then attempted to tow her off, but after a short time the hawser broke. She again backed in, and the tow-rope having been made fast, she went ahead, and the vessel floated. The cable was then slipped, and she was towed round the North Sand Head and taken into harbour, the pumps being kept going all the time. The vessel proved to be the brig *Margaret*, of West Hartlepool, from Boulogne to Hartlepool, in ballast.

The Broadstairs Life-boat also put off to this vessel, and remained by her until she was got off the sand.—Expense of service, 16l. 10s.

Feb. 4.—At about 10 P.M., during a fresh breeze from S.S.W., the schooner *Sarah Ann Dickinson*,

of Fleetwood, in approaching Ardrossan Harbour, ran on the Eagle Rock. A steam-tug proceeded to her and made an unsuccessful attempt to get her off. As the breeze had increased to a fresh gale, it was impossible for the crew to land in their own boat, and the Life-boat *Fair Maid of Perth* was therefore towed out by the steamer, and brought ashore the crew, consisting of five men, and a labourer, who had gone on board before the vessel struck. Great difficulty was experienced in effecting this rescue, the shipwrecked men having to drop from the vessel's main boom over the starboard quarter into the Life-boat. The Boat struck twice heavily on the rock; but fortunately sustained no damage.—Expense of service, 15l. 2s. 6d.

Feb. 6.—Voted 228l. 15s. 8d. to pay the expenses of the Life-boats at Rhyl, Porthdinllaen, Weymouth, Penzance, Montrose, Bude, Clovelly, Deal, Padstow, Winchelsea, Carmarthen Bay, Hartlepool, Skegness, Courtmacsherry, Kessingland, Wexford, Swanage, Tenby, Montrose, and Filey, in assembling their crews or putting off in reply to signals of distress shown by vessels not ultimately needing assistance.

The Ramsgate Life-boat had also been taken out in reply to distress signals, but her services were not eventually needed.

Voted a binocular glass, with a suitable inscription, to Mr. M. MURPHY, late Coxswain of the New Romney Life-boat. He had held the office of coxswain more than ten years, and had always given every satisfaction to the Local Committee.

Also 10l. to Mr. JOHN GARVEY, late Coxswain of the Drogheda No. 2 Life-boat, in acknowledgment of his long services, and especially in consideration of the exposure he underwent through being washed overboard from the Life-boat while endeavouring to rescue the crew of the s.s. *Urania*, of Swansea, on the 18th January, 1877.

Feb. 9.—The Life-boat *Stanton Meyrick of Pimlico*, stationed at Pembrey, S. Wales, proceeded to the aid of the brigantine *Levette*, of St. Malo, which was lying at anchor near the Lynch Sands with a signal of distress flying. On arriving at the vessel she was found to have been abandoned by her crew, but some of the crew of a steam-tug had gone on board a few minutes previously, and four of the Life-boatmen also boarded her, and with their joint assistance the chain cables were hove in, a tow rope attached from the steamer, and the vessel was then taken into Llanelly Harbour.

Feb. 9.—The barque *Alpheus Marshall*, of Digby, N.S., bound from New York to London, with a general cargo, went ashore on Atherfield Ledge, Isle of Wight, during a fog. The wind was blowing from S.W., and the sea was very heavy. The Brightstone Grange Life-boat *Rescue* proceeded to her assistance, and with great difficulty got near her; she lay head-to-sea, and was submerged with the exception of the starboard side of poop; soon the hatches blew up, and she began to go to pieces. The crew of fourteen men were taken into the Life-boat one by one from the spanker boom, having to be hauled by means of ropes through the surf, and during the whole of the time the Life-boat was almost under water, and the men were nearly washed out of her. On her return the sea was so heavy and the shore so steep that those on the land could not hook the Boat's bow as she beached, so she swung round, and a huge sea striking her threw all the crew and the saved men, twenty-seven in all, into the surf. Some of them were nearly washed out to sea, but all were happily rescued with the aid of those on shore.—Expense of service, 28l. 4s.

Feb. 9.—At 4.45 A.M., during thick weather, blue lights were seen in the direction of the Scroby Sand. The Caister No. 2 Life-boat proceeded there; found the s.s. *Matin*, of Dundee, ashore, and, at the master's request, remained by her until she floated. She was bound from Boulogne to the Tyne, in ballast.

On the afternoon of the following day, the No. 2 Life-boat was again launched and rescued twelve men, including the crew of the dandy *William*, of London, which was wrecked on the North Scroby Sand, and six beachmen who had gone on board to try to save the vessel. Considerable difficulty was experienced by the Life-boatmen in effecting this rescue, it being very dark at the time, and the sea breaking completely over the wreck. The smack was lying on her starboard side, her lee rigging being in the water, and the crew and beachmen were clinging to the wreck; a few minutes later, and they must have been lost.—Expense of service, 18*l*.

Feb. 15.—During a fresh E. breeze the Ramsgate Life-boat *Bradford* and steam-tug *Aid* proceeded, in reply to signals from light-ships, and found the ketch *Richard Willson*, of London, bound from Goole to Exmouth with coal, ashore on the N.E. part of the Goodwin Sands. On arriving near the spot, the Life-boat was slipped and sailed towards the vessel, which was found to be striking heavily and fast sinking. The master, his wife and two children, and the crew of three men, were at once taken on board the Boat, which then made sail across the sand, through a rough sea, to the harbour. The tug being on the off side of the sand steered round the North Sand Head, and followed into the harbour.

Feb. 16.—At 6 P.M. information was brought to Harwich by a Ramsgate smack that a large vessel was ashore on the Long Sand, and that the crew were in great danger. The Life-boat *Springwell* immediately proceeded there, but, on account of the low state of the tide, she could not then get alongside the wreck. At high tide the steam-tug *Harwich* came up, and, with the aid of the Life-boat, managed to get a rope fast to the stranded ship; she was, however, unable to get her off. The wind subsequently freshened, and a heavy sea sprung up, breaking over the vessel amidships in consequence of her having heeled over, her ballast having been thrown overboard. Signals were then made by the men on board for the Life-boat to come to their aid, and accordingly she went alongside and succeeded in taking off thirteen of the crew and ten smacksmen who had gone on board to assist. Two of the men fell between the vessel and the Life-boat as they were trying to get into the Boat, but were fortunately rescued. The Life-boat then remained by the wreck until daylight, when it was found that the steward was missing, and on looking at the vessel he was seen in the mizzen rigging. The shipwrecked sailors were then put on board a smack, and on the Life-boat returning to the ship, the steward lowered himself by a rope from the mizzen boom into the Boat, and she was then towed back to Harwich. The vessel was the barque *Pasithea*, of Liverpool, bound from Hamburg to Cardiff, in ballast.

Feb. 17.—A sudden E.S.E. gale sprang up while the fishing cobles were out, and as they were in great danger on account of the tremendous sea breaking on the bar, the *Staites* Life-boat was launched, and was very useful in helping the boats safely ashore.

Feb. 18.—The schooner *Apollo*, of Bandholm, bound from London to Cette with a cargo of currants, drove on to the rocks near Rock-a-Nore in a N.W. wind and heavy swell. The Hastings Life-boat proceeded to her, and as it was found

impossible to get the vessel afloat, the crew, consisting of five men, were taken into the Boat and brought ashore.—Expense of service, 19*l*. 3*s*.

Feb. 18.—The fishing smack *Esmeralda*, of Grimsby, was, owing to there being no wind and a very heavy sea, driven helplessly towards the shore a little to the N. of Cayton Bay. Her signal of distress, made by burning a flambeau, was seen at Scarborough, and the Life-boat *Lady Leigh* at once went to her aid. It was found that she was in extreme peril, for she had anchored, and the cable having parted she was already amongst the broken water, the seas breaking right over her. The Life-boatmen ran out a kedge and a hundred fathoms of warp from the vessel, by which she was brought up. She was afterwards towed out of danger by the Life-boat, and brought into harbour in safety at midnight. She had a crew of five men. Had the Life-boat been a quarter of an hour later, the smack must have been wrecked, and her crew would doubtless have perished, the breakers being very heavy, and the place abounding with sunken rocks a long way from the shore.

Feb. 24.—At about 6.30 P.M., while a strong breeze from E.N.E. was blowing, accompanied by a heavy sea, signals of distress were observed from the fishing lugger *Dolphin*, of Wexford, which had just struck on the leeward side of the bar in running for the harbour during a heavy snow squall. The Wexford Life-boat *Civil Service* was immediately launched, and on arriving alongside found the lugger full of water, and the sea breaking heavily over her. The crew, consisting of five men, were with some difficulty taken into the Life-boat and landed safely at Rosslare Fort. The vessel was totally wrecked.—Expense of service, 14*l*. 1*s*. 6*d*.

Feb. 27.—It having been reported that a vessel was in a very dangerous position at Morte, the *Broadwater* Life-boat, stationed at Iffracombe, was launched and proceeded to the place, a dense fog prevailing at the time. On arriving at the spot, the schooner *Bertha*, of Stettin, was found riding in the breakers at a single anchor, close under the cliffs, and showing lights as a signal of distress. She had been aground, and the crew, after having taken to their boat with a view of ascertaining where they were, had returned to the schooner when she floated again. At the master's request some of the Life-boatmen boarded her, weighed the anchor, and brought her safely into Iffracombe Harbour. She carried a crew of four men.—Expense of service, 3*l*. 16*s*.

March 2.—In reply to signal guns from the Gull Light-ship the Broadstairs Life-boat *Samuel Morrison Collins* proceeded to the Goodwin Sands, and found the three-masted schooner *Ocean Queen*, of Plymouth, ashore on the E. part of the Sand, with a London tug in attendance on her. The services of the Life-boat were also accepted; and eventually the vessel was got afloat and taken to Ramsgate Harbour. She had a crew of seven men.

March 2.—At 10.10 P.M. signal guns and rockets were fired by the Gull Light-ship. The *Vulcan* steam-tug and *Bradford* Life-boat went out from Ramsgate, and were informed that a large flare light had been seen on the sands. They steered in the direction indicated for some distance, when the vessel in distress was seen, and the Life-boat was slipped and sailed towards her. She was the brigantine *Fraternity*, of Krageroe, Norway, bound from Watchet to that port in ballast, with a crew of six men. The master engaged the Life-boatmen's assistance to get the vessel off the sand and into a place of safety; accordingly they went on board, clewed up and furled the sails, and then

signalled for the tug, which steamed up and attached her hawser, and after towing for a short time the vessel came afloat, and was taken into Ramsgate Harbour.

March 6.—Voted 14*l.* 7*s.* to defray the expenses of the Life-boats at Hythe, Abersoch, Deal, Montrose, Caister, Kingsdowne, Gorleston, Great Yarmouth, Carmarthen Bay, and New Brighton, in either assembling their crews or putting off to the assistance of vessels which did not ultimately require their help.

The Ramsgate Life-boat had also been taken out with the view of assisting a vessel in distress.

March 12.—At about 1 P.M., the s.s. *Lorentzen*, of London, was seen to become unmanageable, and to be fast drifting on to Whitby Rocks. As the crew were in great peril, the *Robert Whitworth* Life-boat proceeded to their aid. With great difficulty and danger the crew of seventeen men were taken off the steamer, which by that time had gone on the rocks. She was rapidly filling with water, and shortly after the crew were landed she parted amidships, and in a very few hours was a complete wreck.—Expense of service, 11*l.* 5*s.*

March 20.—The s.s. *Darlington*, of Stockton, bound from Dundee to Middlesborough in ballast, struck on the rocks at the N.E. corner of Holy Island, called False Emmanuel Head, during a dense fog. Fortunately, her signals of distress were observed, and the *Grace Darling* Life-boat, stationed at Holy Island, put off to her and brought safely ashore the crew of nine men. The steamer afterwards became a total wreck.—Expense of service, 17*l.* 10*s.*

March 23.—In the afternoon the brig *Die Manten*, of Arendal, Norway, bound thence to Leith with a cargo of pit props, arrived off Lunan Bay. The captain and two men put off from the vessel in a boat to try to ascertain where they were; but finding the sea very heavy they endeavoured to pull back again, but could not succeed. The Montrose *Mincing Lane* Life-boat thereupon put off under canvas, and rescued the three men, who were by that time about a hundred yards from the rocks at Usan, their boat being half full of water and the men much exhausted. As the vessel was then about seven miles distant, the men were taken to Montrose.—Expense of service, 12*l.* 0*s.* 6*d.*

March 24.—Intelligence having been received that a barque was ashore on the Kentish Knock Sand, and that a shipwrecked crew were on board the Knock Light-ship, which is about twenty-six miles from Ramsgate, the Ramsgate Life-boat *Bradford* and steam-tug *Aid* proceeded out to the Sand. A fresh E. gale was blowing, and the sea was heavy at the time. On arriving near, a barque was observed driving over the Long Sand. The Life-boat was slipped and sailed towards the vessel, which was found to be waterlogged and abandoned. She then sailed to the tug and was taken in tow to the lightship, steered alongside, and with great difficulty, on account of the heavy sea, succeeded in taking off a shipwrecked crew of eight men and a lad. The master stated that the barque which had been seen was their vessel, which had struck on the Galloper Sands at 8 P.M. on the previous day. They had left her at 11 o'clock on the same night, and after being four hours in the boat, made for the light-ship, but, unfortunately, in attempting to get on board, one man was drowned, their boat having been swamped alongside. The Life-boat and tug then proceeded back to the harbour, arriving at 10 P.M. The vessel was the barque *Lina*, of Tonsberg, Norway, bound from Porsgrund to London, with a cargo of deals and battens.

March 24.—The schooner *Ann*, of Colchester, was seen about 6 A.M. making for Hartlepool,

apparently in distress. When she was within about two miles of the harbour the No. 3 Life-boat *John Clay Barlow* put off to her, and found that she was leaking badly; she had by that time struck on the Beacon Shoal. The crew of five men were on the deck ready to leave when the Life-boat arrived alongside, and were taken on board the boat and safely landed at about 9 A.M. The schooner was bound from Seaham to Colchester, with coal.—Expense of service, 7*l.*

March 25.—The brig *Die Manten*, of Arendal, drove ashore on the Fife Coast, between Crail and Anstruther. On the wreck being observed among the breakers the *Admiral Fitzroy* Life-boat stationed at Anstruther put off and found there was only one man on board, clinging to the wreck. The other two men having become benumbed had lost their hold and dropped into the sea during the night. The survivor was at once taken into the Life-boat and brought safely ashore. There was a strong S.E. wind blowing, and the sea was heavy at the time.—Expense of service, 10*l.* 13*s.*

March 25.—At 7 A.M. a man arrived at Caister from Winterton, and reported that a dismasted vessel was lying just outside Hasborough Sand, and that the sea at Winterton was so heavy that the Life-boat there could not be launched. The Caister No. 1 Life-boat—the *Covent Garden*—was, with much risk and labour, more than forty men assisting, then hauled through the surf, and proceeded through a very heavy sea in the direction of Winterton. On arriving at the wreck a large steamer was found to be lying by her, but she was unable to render any assistance. The Life-boat, with great difficulty and risk, sailed alongside and succeeded in rescuing the crew, seven in number. The vessel was the brig *Cito*, of Arendal, bound thence to Calais with a cargo of deals. Her masts had been carried away, the spars, &c., hanging all about the vessel; her stern-post had been completely knocked out, and the sea was breaking heavily over her, the deck being level with, if not under, the surface of the water. On the following morning, the weather having moderated, the Life-boat again proceeded to her, and with the aid of a steam-tug, the wreck was taken to Caister and beached there.—Expense of service, 35*l.* 15*s.*

March 27.—At about 2 A.M. the Poole Life-boat was launched in reply to signals of distress shown by the ship *Mariaban*, of Greenock, which had stranded on the Hook Sand, and found that six of her crew had left her in one of their boats. The Life-boat remained by her until about 1 P.M., when the remainder of the men, eleven in number, were taken into the boat and landed at Poole at about 2.30 P.M.—Expense of service, 18*l.* 7*s.*

March 28.—At about 10 P.M. the Holyhead Life-boat *Thomas Fielden* went off in reply to signals, and found the schooner *Wellington*, of Carnarvon, in distress near the Breakwater. She had just been run into by another vessel, her bowsprit had been carried away, and her bows were considerably damaged. The Life-boat put four men on board to assist at the pumps and slip the cables, when, with the aid of a steam-tug, the vessel was taken into the Old Harbour. She had a crew of three men.—Expense of service, 10*l.* 5*s.*

April 3.—Voted 55*l.* 5*s.* to pay the expenses of the Life-boats at Ballyvaughan, New Brighton, St. Andrews, Broadstairs, Drogheda, Brancaster, Clacton-on-Sea, Queenstown, and Porthdinllaen, in either assembling their crews, or putting off in reply to signals of distress exhibited by vessels not ultimately requiring assistance.

The Ramsgate and Hartlepool Life-boats had also been taken out, but their services had not been needed.

Voted the Silver Medal of the Institution, and

a copy of the vote inscribed on vellum, to Mr. MATTHEW KYLE, Coxswain of the Holy Island Life-boats, and to Mr. GEORGE KYLE, assistant coxswain, in acknowledgment of their long and gallant services in saving life from shipwreck.

April 9.—At 10 P.M., during a strong N.E. wind and heavy sea, a large vessel was observed to be driving towards the beach at Great Yarmouth. The *Abraham Thomas* Life-boat proceeded to her, and found she was the barque *Guiseppina N.*, of Genoa, bound from Hull to Cardiff, in ballast. The Life-boat remained alongside of her until she eventually drove on to the beach, when the crew of seventeen men were taken into the boat and brought safely ashore, although in a very exhausted state. The seas were then breaking heavily over the barque, which afterwards became a total wreck.—Expense of service, 20*l.*

April 10.—At 9.30 P.M. during a heavy gale from E.S.E., the s.s. *Baroi*, of Newcastle, anchored outside the proper roadstead in Porthdinllaen Bay. The wind afterwards shifted to E.N.E., and a heavier sea sprang up, which caused her chain to part, and she then hoisted a signal of distress. The Porthdinllaen Life-boat *George Moore* promptly proceeded to her, and, after remaining by her for about two hours, brought the crew of six men ashore. The vessel, however, fortunately rode out the gale, and on the following morning the Life-boat put the men on board again.—Expense of service, 13*l.* 5*s.*

April 10.—The Cromer Life-boat was launched during an easterly gale and rough sea, and proceeded to the sloop *Hesperus*, of Copenhagen, which had shown signals of distress when about three miles from the Life-boat Station. On reaching the vessel, it was found that she was leaking badly, and that she had lost her main-boom. She was bound from Copenhagen to Hull with barley. Some of the Life-boatmen boarded her, and with their assistance she was safely taken into the Humber. In the absence of the services of the Life-boat, the vessel would in all probability have been lost.

April 11.—Signals of distress were observed in the direction of Scotstonhead, whereupon the *People's Journal* No. 1 Life-boat, stationed at Peterhead, N.B., proceeded out, and found the schooner *Sunshine*, of Wick, stranded on the rocks. The crew of three men, the master, one of the owners, and six passengers, were taken into the Life-boat and brought safely to Peterhead. When the Life-boat arrived, they were contemplating making an attempt to land in their own boat, a proceeding which, owing to the heavy surf breaking on the shore, would probably have been attended with serious loss of life. At high water a steam-tug and a pilot-boat proceeded to the vessel, and succeeded in getting her afloat, after which she was taken into Peterhead Harbour.—Expense of service, 13*l.* 18*s.*

April 11.—At 4.15 A.M. during a strong gale of wind from the east, with a heavy sea, a vessel was observed on the beach at Waxham. With all despatch the Palling No. 1 Life-boat, the *Parsee*, was launched and taken to the spot; with some difficulty she succeeded in getting alongside, and rescued the crew of twelve men from the vessel, which proved to be the Norwegian barque *Christiania*, bound from Fredericstadt to London, with a cargo of firewood. The ship broke up immediately after the crew had been rescued, and, but for the great promptitude displayed by the Life-boat men, the crew would in all probability have perished.—Expense of service, 20*l.* 17*s.*

April 19.—At 3 P.M. a schooner was seen entering Ballycotton Sound with a signal of distress flying. The pilot-boat was manned and put off,

but was driven back by the S.E. gale then blowing, without having been able to render any assistance. The Ballycotton Life-boat *St. Clair* then put off and brought the vessel to anchor, after which she returned ashore. At midnight the Life-boat again proceeded to the schooner, signals having again been shown, and placed five men on board to assist in pumping her, as she had taken the ground and was leaking. The vessel was ultimately enabled to proceed on her voyage. She was the schooner *Mary Lloyd*, of Portmadoc, bound from Rochester to Haulbowline, with cement.

May 1.—Voted 46*l.* 6*s.* 6*d.* to pay the expenses of the Montrose, Broughty Ferry, Exmouth, Piel, and Harwich Life-boats, in putting off in reply to signals of distress exhibited by vessels which did not ultimately require the services of the boats.

The Ramsgate Life-boat had also been taken out with the view of aiding a distressed vessel.

May 14.—At about 11 P.M. signals of distress were shown from a vessel in Carnarvon Bay, apparently at a distance of seven or eight miles from Porthdinllaen. The wind was blowing a strong gale from the N.N.E., and a heavy sea was running at the time. The Porthdinllaen Life-boat's crew were at once assembled, and the boat taken out, but just as she was being launched, other signals of distress were shown from a vessel close at hand; she was the schooner *Jane Ann*, of Llanellhaearn, at anchor in Porthdinllaen Bay. The Life-boat went to her, and found that she was dragging her anchor. After taking off her crew of three men, and having landed them at Porthdinllaen, the Life-boat proceeded in search of the other vessel, and at daybreak the Life-boat men observed a large barque which had evidently been embayed, and which was unable to beat out of the bay without assistance. A fishing boat, however, was in attendance on her, and as the services of the Life-boat were not required, she returned to her station.—Expense of service, 15*l.* 5*s.*

May 17.—Soon after 10 A.M. a mounted messenger arrived at Penzance with the news that a brig was ashore at Perran, five miles eastward of that port. The wind was blowing strongly from S., and the sea was somewhat heavy at the time. The rocket apparatus at Marazion was at once got out and taken to Perran, and several rockets were fired over the vessel, which was from five hundred to six hundred yards from the shore, but the crew appeared unacquainted with the method of using it, for they merely hauled in the hawser, and fastened it on board without hauling in the block. One of the men, however, got ashore over the line. A barge manned by young fishermen put off from St. Michael's Mount and went to the vessel, but the crew refused to leave her. At Penzance it was feared that the rockets could not reach her, and therefore the Life-boat was launched and proceeded under sail to the spot; she went alongside, but no notice was taken of her, the master being unwilling for the crew to leave the ship. The sea, however, was gradually increasing, the wind veering to the west, and the vessel was in a most dangerous position, she being in the breakers, full of water, and surrounded by rocks. The Life-boat remained by her for some considerable time, and finally five of the sailors got into the boat, leaving the master alone on board. He positively declined to leave the vessel. The boat then rowed off some distance to seaward, and after waiting some time, the wind continuing to veer to the westward, and the sea increasing, they returned to the brig, and the captain was again urged to come on board. He still refused to do

so, and as the boat had been struck by several heavy seas which nearly filled her, and three oars had been broken, it was thought advisable to return ashore with the five Frenchmen. The five rescued men were accordingly safely landed at Penzance. Soon after the boat left the wreck, Commissioned Boatman GOULD, of H.M. Coast-guard, who was with the rocket apparatus, volunteered to undertake the perilous duty of going out along the rocket line with a letter from the French Vice-Consul urging the captain to leave the vessel. He succeeded in getting under the bows of the brig; but the master still determined to remain where he was, and GOULD, who had been washed away from the rope by the heavy seas and nearly lost, was hauled back to shore in a most exhausted state. Meanwhile the vessel was fast breaking up, the masts fell over the side, and the master, who had by that time taken refuge in the rigging, was hurled down and buried in the *débris*. For some minutes it was feared that he was lost, but he was then seen amongst the wreckage, and eventually got hold of the foreyard, the sail on which somewhat sheltered him. The coastguard then fired more rockets over the wreck; the captain seized the line attached to one of them, with great difficulty he then hauled off a life-buoy from the shore, and placing himself in it, he was hauled ashore. On his nearing the land the coast-guard men formed a line hand in hand, waded as far as they could into the surf, and when he got within reach they firmly grasped him and brought him safely ashore. After landing the five men the Life-boat was again on her way to the wreck to make another effort to induce the master to avail himself of the services of the boat, when she was recalled by signals indicating that he had been rescued.

The vessel proved to be the French brig *Ponthieu*, bound from Pomaron to Liverpool with a cargo of iron ore.—Expense of service, 22l. 3s. 10d.

June 5.—Voted 61l. to defray the expenses of recent launches of the Porthdinllaen, Watchet, Porthleven, Walmer, Deal, Kingsdowne, and Lizard Life-boats, with the view of helping vessels in distress, which, however, did not eventually need their services.

The Ramsgate Life-boat had also been taken out with the view of aiding a vessel in distress.

June 15.—The Lizard Life-boat proceeded to the aid of the brig *Scotseraig*, of Dundee, which had grounded directly below the Lizard light-houses during a thick fog. After some hours' labour the vessel was extricated from her perilous position and was enabled to resume her voyage. She was bound from Falmouth to Greenock with rum and sugar. She carried a crew of nine men.

June 21.—The Looe Life-boat was launched, it having been proposed to lay the foundation stone of the Eddystone new lighthouse on this day. As the weather was very stormy, it was feared that some accident might occur to vessels which would go to witness the proceedings; but the Life-boat's services were not eventually needed, as the ceremony had to be postponed.

July 1.—A gale from E.S.E. sprang up at Newbiggin-by-the-Sea, Northumberland, at about 4 A.M. Seven fishing cobles had left about four hours previously for the fishing-ground, which is about fifteen miles from the shore, and considerable anxiety was felt for their safety, a heavy ground sea having set in. The Newbiggin Life-boat *William Hopkinson of Brighouse* was launched at 9.30 A.M., before any of the cobles were in sight, and remained in a very heavy sea off the point, for three hours, assisting the boats as they came in one by one until all had got safely ashore.

July 7.—The Porthdinllaen Life-boat, *George*

Moore, went out in reply to signals of distress, during a W.N.W. wind and rough sea, and remained by the schooner *Weaver*, of Carnarvon, until she was out of danger, she having stranded near Llanaelhaiarn.—Expense of service, 15l. 6s.

July 13.—At about 11.30 P.M., during a strong N.E. wind and moderate sea, the pilot smack *Marion*, while cruising between Lamlash and Ailsa Craig, had her jib carried away; she afterwards stranded on the Carlin Rock, off Kildonan, Isle of Arran, N.B. The Life-boat *Hope*, stationed at Kildonan, put off to her assistance, and brought ashore her crew, consisting of two men.—Expense of service, 13l. 14s.

July 20.—At 7 P.M. the Porthdinllaen Life-boat was launched during a very heavy N.W. gale, in response to signals of distress shown from the schooner *Adroit*, of Aberystwith, at anchor in Porthdinllaen Bay. At the request of the master, his wife, who was very ill, and a little boy, were taken into the Life-boat, and landed at Porthdinllaen.—Expense of service, 6l. 8s. 6d.

July 20.—The Rhosneigr Life-boat *Thomas Lingham* proceeded to the assistance of the barque *Zephyrus*, of Plymouth, which had struck on the rocks at Cymyran, near Rhoscolyn, during a strong S.S.W. wind and heavy sea. The vessel's crew, fourteen in number, had placed their luggage in the long-boat, and intended coming ashore in her, but as this would have been attended with some risk, they were taken on board the Life-boat; their boat was taken in tow, and all were brought safely ashore.—Expense of service, 18l. 2s.

July 21.—The *Mincing Lane* Life-boat, stationed at Montrose, N.B., rendered some assistance to the Dutch fishing-smack *Nooit Polmak*, which had gone too far to the northward while running for the harbour, and had stranded on the Annat Bank during a fresh E.N.E. wind and heavy sea.—Expense of service, 8l. 2s. 6d.

Aug. 7.—Voted 57l. 11s. to pay the expenses of the Life-boats at Porthdinllaen, Appledore, Braurton, Porthoustock, Queensdown, and Broadstairs, in assembling their crews, or putting off to the aid of vessels which did not eventually require assistance.

Voted a binocular glass and 10l. to Mr. BENJAMIN HERRINGTON, who had lately resigned the office of Coxswain of the Southold Life-boats, in acknowledgment of his valuable services during the past forty years, in which period he had assisted to save one hundred and sixteen lives from various wrecks.

Aug. 13.—On the 13th August, during a fresh wind from the S.E., the *British Workman* Life-boat at Palling, Norfolk, was launched to the assistance of the barque *Zurich*, of North Shields, which had stranded on Hasborough Sands. The Life-boat remained alongside until the vessel began to break up, when the crew of fifteen men, and the master's wife, were taken into the boat and landed at Palling. The barque was on a voyage from North Shields to Spezzia, with a cargo of coal and coke.—Expense of service, 11l. 16s.

Aug. 19.—The Looe and Plymouth Life-boats were present at the ceremony of laying the foundation stone of the Eddystone new lighthouse by their Royal Highnesses the Prince of WALES and the Duke of EDINBURGH.

Aug. 21.—During a strong wind from the S.W. and a rough sea, the yacht *Y. Deryon*, of Carmarthen, was observed to be dashed and in dangerous proximity to the Langharne Sands, Carmarthen Bay. The Life-boat *City of Manchester*, stationed at the Ferryside, went out to her, and found that her mast was broken off

about twelve feet above the deck; the crew had, however, succeeded in setting a small sail to the remains of the mast, and had weathered the Sands. At the request of the crew of the yacht, the Life-boat then accompanied her, and indicated the best position to take the beach, and that having been safely accomplished, those on board were helped ashore.—Expense of service, 8*l.* 12*s.*

Aug. 25.—At about 3 A.M. signals were shown from the Gull Light-ship, and the Ramsgate Life-boat *Bradford*, in tow of the steam-tug *Aid*, and the *Van Kook* Life-boat, stationed at Deal, proceeded to the Goodwin Sands. The wind was blowing fresh at the time from the S.W., and a heavy sea was running. On arriving at the Sand, the barque *Mia Madre E.*, of Genoa, was found ashore there, with some London steamers and a Deal boat close at hand. The Life-boats remained by the vessel, their crews assisting to lighten her by discharging some of her cargo of wheat. On the tide flowing, the steamer *Aid*, which had returned to Ramsgate, again came out, and, in conjunction with the other steamers, made repeated attempts to tow the vessel off the Sands. The towing-hawsers frequently broke, but were again made fast to the barque, and every effort was used to save her; it was, however, found hopeless, and, as she was leaking badly, and all her pumps had been disabled, it was eventually decided to abandon her. The master and thirteen men, with the Italian Vice-Consul, were accordingly taken into the Ramsgate Life-boat, and the mate, one seaman, and four Deal boatmen into the Deal Life-boat, and all were safely landed. The barque was of 892 tons register, was bound from Baltimore to Hull, and ultimately became a total wreck.—Expense of service, 18*l.*

Aug. 27.—In the afternoon the coxswain of the Swansea Life-boat received a telegram stating that three vessels were ashore between Swansea and Neath. The wind was then blowing a gale from the W.S.W., and the sea was rough. The *Wolverhampton* Life-boat was promptly launched, and proceeded to the spot. She first reached the schooner *Glena*, which had stranded, but the master and crew decided to remain by their vessel, as the tide would allow them to walk ashore at low water. The boat then proceeded about half a mile further to leeward, and went alongside the brig *Queen of Britain*, of Carnarvon, and succeeded in taking off her crew, consisting of six men. By that time the third vessel had driven well in shore, and the crew were saved with some assistance from those on the beach. The Coastguard boat was launched from the Mumbles at the same time as the Life-boat, but was compelled to put back as she was unable to contend against the heavy sea running at the time. The gale was very severe, and the Life-boat crew did their work nobly. A large crowd of people assembled on the Swansea Sands to witness the return of the boat, by whom the crew were loudly cheered.—Expense of service, 10*l.* 19*s.*

Aug. 29.—At about 5 A.M. it was reported that a vessel was in distress on Bernard's Wharf, a sandbank situated about 2½ miles E.N.E. of Fleetwood, and the Life-boat *Edward Wasey*, which is stationed at Fleetwood, was accordingly launched. On reaching the spot she found the schooner *Elizabeth Ellen Fisher*, of Fleetwood, bound from Ardrossan to Fleetwood with a cargo of pig-iron, had stranded on the sand. It was hoped that the rising tide would float her off again, and the Life-boat therefore remained by her for nearly an hour. However, the schooner began to fill with water, and her crew, numbering four men, were then with some difficulty taken into the Life-boat and landed at Fleetwood. The wind was very squally from

the N.W., and the sea was running heavily.—Expense of service, 6*l.* 12*s.* 6*d.*

Sept. 4.—Voted 62*l.* 14*s.* 8*d.* to pay the expenses of the Southport, Rhyl, Cahore, Kingsdowne, Walmer, and Barmouth Life-boats, in either assembling their crews, or putting off in reply to signals of distress exhibited by vessels not ultimately needing their assistance.

Sept. 6.—The *Joseph Armstrong* Life-boat, stationed at Cadgwith, Cornwall, went out twice and rescued forty persons from the Cunard steamer *Brest*, of Glasgow, which, while on a voyage from Havre to Liverpool with a large number of passengers and a general cargo, went ashore between Cadgwith and the Lizard during a fog. Several shore boats also put off to the vessel and rescued the remainder of the passengers; the crew were saved by means of the ship's boats.—Expense of service, 14*l.* 2*s.*

Sept. 9.—The Cardigan Life-boat *John Stuart* with some difficulty brought ashore the crew, consisting of three men, of the schooner *Ellen*, of Beaumaris, which had parted her cables during a heavy N.W. gale and tremendous sea near Quay Bach, in Cardigan Bay. The vessel, however, rode out the gale, and on the following morning the crew went on board again.—Expense of service, 7*l.* 1*s.*

Sept. 23.—At about 1 A.M., a southerly gale suddenly sprang up at Blyth, Northumberland, increasing in violence until about 3 o'clock, when it became very severe. A large fleet of fishing-boats which had gone out during the night to follow the herring fishery, the weather being then very fine, and there being every prospect of a successful night's fishing, were caught by the storm, and at about 4.30 the whole coast was lighted up for two or three miles with signals of distress, and the wives and relatives of the fishermen were in a state of great tribulation. The Life-boat *Salford* was promptly launched, and proceeded first to a signal on the Seaton Sea Rock, and found the coble *Sons of the Wear*, of Sunderland, on the rock. Her crew of four men, who were in great danger, were taken into the Life-boat and landed. The Life-boat then again went out, rendered assistance to several other boats, and towed one disabled coble, with a crew of six men on board, safely into the harbour.—Expense of service, 6*l.*

Sept. 23.—In the morning a heavy gale sprang up at Newbiggin, accompanied by a very rough sea. About fifty-two of the herring-boats were then out at sea, but several of these landed; others, however, held on by their nets, hoping that the gale would abate. The storm still continued, and as the boats were in much danger, the Life-boat was launched and proceeded to their assistance, and remained by them until all, with one exception, were safely landed. This one boat dragged her anchors and drove on the rocks. In order to launch the Life-boat the women of the place had to lend a hand, on account of so many of the men being away at the time, and they waded up to their middle in order to get the boat well and speedily afloat from its carriage. About an hour afterwards the Life-boat again went out and rescued the crew, consisting of seven men, from the schooner *Union T.*, which struck on the Out Carr Rocks, north of Newbiggin Point. The master had cut away the foremast, and endeavoured to get the vessel off the rocks; but all efforts to do so failed, and as she began to leak he signalled for the Life-boat. The vessel, which was on a voyage from Calais to Warkworth Harbour in ballast, became a total wreck.—Expense of service, 10*l.* 10*s.*

Oct. 2.—Voted 99*l.* 3*s.* to pay the expenses of the Kingstown, Brightstone Grange, Flamborough, Clacton-on-Sea, Howth, Harwich, and Peterhead Life-boats in assembling their crews or putting off

in reply to signals of distress shown by vessels not ultimately needing the aid of the Boats.

The Ramsgate Life-boat had also been launched twice to the aid of distressed vessels, but her services had not been eventually required.

Oct. 7.—In the afternoon the s.s. *Arabian*, of Liverpool, bound from Liverpool to Gibraltar with a general cargo, went ashore about a mile and a half westward of the East Mouse, near Bull Bay, during a dense fog. The Bull Bay Life-boat *Eleanor* proceeded to the vessel and remained by her at the request of the captain until she was got afloat at about 1 o'clock on the following morning. After going out to sea with the steamer, the Life-boat had great difficulty in finding her way back to her station, on account of the density of the fog.—Expense of service, 14*l.* 6*s.*

Oct. 8.—The schooner *Haleswell*, of Bridgwater, went ashore outside the Harry Furlongs Rocks, off the Anglesey coast, during a fog. She was observed at 7 A.M., and a boat came ashore from her with two of her crew to ask for the assistance of the Life-boat. The Cemlyn Life-boat *Good Shepherd* went out to her aid, and rendered material assistance in carrying out the anchors and tugging at the vessel, and at about 3 o'clock in the afternoon the schooner was got afloat. She was on a voyage from Liverpool to Bridgwater with coal.

Oct. 15.—At about 1 P.M. the *Augusta* Life-boat, stationed at St. David's, Pembrokeshire, was launched, it having been reported that the brigantine *Messenger*, of Exeter, bound from Teignmouth to Runcorn with a cargo of clay, had had all her sails blown away on the previous night, and was drifting down towards the north end of Ramsey Sound. The tide was very strong at the time, and a strong N.N.E. breeze was blowing. The brigantine struck on a rock called Wain Garrig, about two miles to the north of Ramsey Island. Three of her crew managed to get on the rock, but the vessel then slid off with the master and two men on board, and drifted down to the west of Ramsey Island. The Life-boat proceeded towards the rock, and, after a hard pull against wind and tide, succeeded in taking the men off and landed them at St. Justinian. The Life-boat then proceeded to Ramsey Island, but could not find the vessel. It was subsequently found that she had made for Milford Haven, but foundered when about half-way. The captain and two men landed safely at St. Anne's Head, at the entrance to Milford Haven.—Expense of service, 8*l.* 1*s.*

Oct. 27.—At about 10.15 A.M. a telegram was received at Queenstown from the Coastguard Station at Robert's Cove, stating that a yacht was in distress off Cork Head. The *Quiver* Life-boat was promptly launched, and proceeded, in tow of a steam-tug, through a heavy sea to the vessel, which proved to be the yacht *Gilded Age*. On reaching her it was found that she had lost her rudder and both anchors, and had been dismasted. Her crew of three men were taken into the Life-boat, which also assisted to save the yacht, she being towed into harbour.—Expense of service, 9*l.* 8*s.*

Nov. 1.—During a strong gale from E.N.E. signals were observed from a vessel which had stranded on the Dogger Bank. The Wexford Life-boat *Civil Service No. 1* was immediately launched, and proceeded to render assistance. On arriving alongside the vessel, she was found to be the lugger *Liberator*, of Wexford; she was riding to her anchor, with her rudder carried away, her crew having succeeded in getting her off the bank by means of the anchor and cable. She had a crew of six men, and had on board the gunner of the Tuskar Light-house, who was being taken ashore in consequence of being ill. He was taken

on board the Life-boat and landed at Wexford. The crew refused to leave their vessel, but she shortly afterwards dragged her anchor and went ashore.—Expense of service, 13*l.* 17*s.*

Nov. 6.—Voted 62*l.* 18*s.* to pay the expenses of the Life-boats at Carnsore, Wexford, Porthdinllaen, Wells, Maryport, Rhyl, Mullion, and Arklow, in assembling their crews or putting off with the view of assisting vessels which did not ultimately need the aid of the boats.

Nov. 11.—At about 5 P.M. the smack *Menai Packet*, of Carnarvon, bound from Swansea to Newry, with coal, which was riding at anchor in Porthdinllaen Bay, showed a signal of distress. As the wind was not blowing very strongly at the time, a shore-boat went off to her and found that she had lost the stock of one anchor, and required the loan of another anchor. The shore-boat then returned ashore to get one; but by the time it had been procured, a strong N.N.W. gale had sprung up, accompanied by a heavy sea. As it was then unsafe for the shore-boat to venture out alone, the Porthdinllaen Life-boat *George Moore* was launched, and took the boat in tow. On getting alongside, the captain requested the boat's crew to re-moor the vessel. Having done this, and the gale increasing, the crew, consisting of three men, begged to be brought ashore; they were consequently taken into the Life-boat and landed at Porthdinllaen. The smack, in the course of a few hours, parted her chains and came ashore.

After watching during the night, the coxswain of the Life-boat observed at 8 o'clock on the following morning a signal of distress, displayed from a schooner at anchor in the Bay. The wind was still blowing a heavy gale from N.N.W., and the sea was heavy. The Life-boat, which had been kept in the water, was at once manned, and again proceeded out, and found the schooner *Mary Roberts*, of Nefyn, had parted one chain, and was riding heavily to the other. The crew, consisting of five men, were afraid that the vessel would strike on the ebb, and therefore wished to be brought ashore. They were accordingly taken on board the Life-boat and safely landed.—Expense of service, 7*l.* 10*s.*

Nov. 11.—At 3 A.M. signal rockets were fired from the Gull Light-ship, and were answered by a rocket from Ramsgate pier-head. The Ramsgate Life-boat *Bradford* and steam-tug *Aid* were at once manned, left the harbour at 3.15, and proceeded towards a large flare light on the N.W. part of the Goodwin Sands. On arriving abreast, the Life-boat was slipped and made sail for the light, but took the ground about half a cable's length from the distressed vessel. The Life-boatmen then hailed the crew, and told them they would come alongside directly the tide flowed, and that the steamer would assist to get her off. On the Life-boat floating, she attempted to get alongside, but as the vessel was lying in a swatchway, and the tide was running very strong to S.W., it was some time before she succeeded in getting to her. In the meanwhile a Deal galley rowed alongside. At about daylight the Life-boat was able to put a man on board. As the tide flowed, the vessel floated and drove in more on the shoal part of the sand; her anchor was then let go, but the chain parted, and although her other anchor was let go, she still continued driving in and striking heavily. The master then seeing the dangerous position of his vessel, hailed the tug to come to his assistance. The *Aid* then backed in as near as possible to her, and took her tow-rope on board; the chain was slipped, and she was towed clear of the sand and into Ramsgate, arriving at about 8.30 A.M. The vessel was leaking very badly, and the pumps were kept constantly going in order to keep her afloat.

She was the schooner *Albion*, of Wells, bound from Llanely to Wells, with a cargo of coal. She had a crew of three men.

Nov. 12.—At about 11.40 A.M. the brig *Lavinia*, of Guernsey, bound thence to Sunderland, in ballast, was seen to be between the Scroby and Cross Sands with colours flying union downwards. The Caister Life-boat *Covent Garden* proceeded to her assistance, and found her riding with both anchors down, but one cable had parted; she had three feet of water in her hold, and her ballast had shifted to the lee side. The Life-boatmen dared not board the vessel while at anchor, the sea being too heavy, they therefore shouted to the crew to slip the cable, and boarded her while under weigh. The brig was taken between the Scroby and Cross Sands, a steam-tug was engaged, and she was towed into Yarmouth Harbour. She had stranded on the Hasborough Sands on the previous night.

Nov. 12.—At about 8 A.M. signals of distress were seen to be shown by a schooner at anchor in Scarborough Bay during a very strong N. gale. The Life-boat *Lady Leigh* was immediately launched and proceeded to the vessel, which proved to be the *Alert*, of Scarborough, which had left that port on the previous day in ballast to proceed to the North for coals. Her crew, consisting of two men, were very anxious to be taken off, and with considerable difficulty, as the tide was low, and the waves were very high, they were taken into the Life-boat and brought safely ashore.

After landing these men, the smack *Hester*, of Ipswich, was seen to be in extreme peril riding amongst the breakers, with a signal of distress flying. The Life-boat at once proceeded to her assistance, and having placed two men on board, managed to get two warps from the pier, and attached them to her, by which means she was then hauled into the harbour with assistance from those on the pier.

The Life-boat afterwards went out a third time, and proceeded again to the *Alert*, in tow of a steam-tug. The gale had by that time somewhat abated, and two of the Life-boatmen having been put on board, the anchor was slipped, and she was safely towed into harbour.—Expense of service, 10*l.* 10*s.*

Nov. 13.—At about 4 A.M. signals of distress were perceived on Skullmartin Reef. The Ballywalter Life-boat *Admiral Henry Meynell* was promptly manned and proceeded to the reef, where she found the schooner *Lady Land*, of Glasgow, which had struck there while under a press of canvas. There was a heavy sea rolling in from N.E., and as the vessel was striking heavily, the crew of six men were taken into the Life-boat and brought ashore.—Expense of service, 13*l.* 12*s.*

Nov. 13.—Signals of distress were seen in a N.E. direction, and rockets were fired from the St. Nicholas Light-ship, in response to which the Gorleston Life-boat *Leicester* was launched, and found the *Violet* trawling smack had been in collision with the schooner *Evelyn*, of Fraserburgh. The wind was blowing hard from N.N.E., with considerable sea, and the crew of the *Violet* had abandoned their vessel, thinking she would founder, and had gone on board the *Evelyn*. The smack had already, on the same night, met with an accident, and was leaking badly. The Life-boat slipped the schooner's chain, and after clearing the two vessels, put the *Violet's* crew on board their own craft, remained by her until daylight, and then assisted her into the harbour.

Nov. 14.—At about 2.30 A.M. two flares were seen on the Scroby Sand, and rockets were fired from the St. Nicholas Light. The Gorleston

Life-boat immediately put off, and on reaching the Sand a vessel was discovered sunk, with the crew on the mast and in the rigging. The Life-boat anchored and veered down until under the mast of the wreck, from which the crew, consisting of five men, lowered themselves into the boat. They had been three hours and a half in the rigging, and were much exhausted; in fact, it was feared that one of them would have died, but he happily recovered after reaching the land. On hauling the Life-boat off, after the last man was saved, the cable parted, the boat having been struck by a heavy sea. Fortunately she was then clear of the wreck; had this happened a few minutes sooner the consequences would probably have been very serious to the Life-boat, and no doubt fatal to any of the men left in the rigging of the wreck. The water was very shallow on the Sand, and the sea very heavy, the Life-boat being many times filled with water. The wrecked vessel was the *Ann Wilmot*, trawling smack, belonging to Lowestoft.—Expense of service, 15*l.*

Nov. 20.—The *Reliance* fishing-coble, which had gone out from Cullercoats at 4 A.M. for the purpose either of piloting or fishing, was returning to the harbour at about 9.30, by which time the sea had much increased, and it was considered dangerous for her to attempt to cross the bar. The Cullercoats Life-boat *Palmerston* was therefore launched, and accompanied her in.

Nov. 20.—During a heavy breeze from the E., rockets were observed in the direction of Foulness Shoal, or Cromer Rock, about two miles to the eastward of Cromer. The Cromer Life-boat was launched during a heavy snowstorm, at about 5.30 A.M., and proceeded in the direction of the ship's lights, which were then visible. The tide running to leeward it was some time before the boat could reach the vessel; but on arriving alongside she was found to be the s.s. *Moidart*, of Glasgow, bound from the North of England to Odessa with railway iron. The steamer was fast on the shoal, and the sea was making a clean breach over her at times. As the tide flowed, she fortunately floated off, and was brought up at anchor in deep water, but in a disabled state, having lost her rudder and part of her sternpost. The captain requested the Life-boat to remain by the steamer until a tug, or other assistance, came from Yarmouth, and the Boat therefore stayed by her until about 12.30, when she was compelled to leave and go ashore, on account of the state of the tide. A good look-out was kept from the shore during the night, as the gale increased, and at daylight the Life-boat again went off, and remained by her until steam-tugs arrived and towed her away.—Expense of service, 33*l.* 10*s.*

Nov. 25.—At about 7.15 A.M. the Ramsgate Life-boat and steamer again proceeded to sea in reply to signal guns fired from the Gull Light-ship. A large barque was seen to be ashore on the N.E. part of the Goodwin Sands, to which the Life-boat and tug steered, and, on arriving near, the Life-boat was slipped, and sailed towards her. On getting alongside, she was found to be the barque *Osprey*, of Arendal, bound from that port to Plymouth, with timber. The master at once engaged the services of the Life-boat and tug, and the steamer then backed in, put her tow-ropes on board, and commenced towing, the vessel striking very heavily on the sand. After towing for about half an hour, it being then nearly high water, the services of the *Ulysses* steam-tug were also engaged. After towing for about an hour the vessel was got afloat, assisted by her fore and aft sails, which had been set by the Life-boat crew. She was then towed round the North Sand Head, and through the Gull stream to an anchorage in the Downs.

Nov. 25.—A heavy gale of wind from E.S.E. sprang up in the morning at Scarborough, causing a very heavy sea. At about 10 o'clock eight Scotch fishing-vessels, on their way from Yarmouth fishing-grounds to Scotland, were seen running for Scarborough, seeking refuge; and as the sea was mostly broken water, and the vessels were open boats, containing a large number of men, the Life-boat was launched and proceeded to protect and guide them into the harbour, where they eventually arrived in safety by about 12.30 P.M.—Expense of service, 8*l.* 4*s.*

Dec. 1.—At 4 P.M. the *British Workman* Life-boat, stationed at Palling-by-the-Sea, Norfolk, proceeded out during a strong E.S.E. wind and heavy sea, to the aid of a vessel which was signalling for assistance. The vessel proved to be the barque *Onward*, of London, bound from Hartlepool to the East Indies, with coal. As she was in a very leaky condition, having been ashore on the Leman and Ower Sands, the Life-boat, at the request of the master, assisted to take her into Yarmouth Roads. She had a crew of sixteen men.

Dec. 2.—Four fishing-cobles were observed to be making for Whitby harbour, and as the wind and sea increased, the *Harriott Forreath* Life-boat went out, supplied the crews of the cobles with Life-belts, and attended each of the boats over the bar. By the time the cobles and Life-boat had got safely in, the wind and sea had risen to a great height.

Dec. 4.—Voted 12*l.* 3*s.* 2*d.* to pay the expenses of the Life-boats at Walmer, Donna Nook, North Sunderland, Great Yarmouth, Withernsea, Kingsdowne, Deal, and Southend (Essex), in assembling their crews or putting off with the view of rendering assistance to vessels not ultimately needing their aid.

The Ramsgate Life-boat also put off to the aid of a distressed vessel, but her services were not eventually required.

Voted the Silver Medal of the Institution to Mr. GEORGE MARKWELL, formerly Coxswain of the Holy Island Life-boat, in acknowledgment of his generally valuable and brave services in saving many lives from shipwreck.

Dec. 21.—At 2.15 A.M. a vessel was reported to be stranded in Churchtown Bay. The Carnsore Life-boat *Iris* proceeded there promptly, and found the barque *Cheverest*, of Havre, ashore there. The wind was blowing from the S.E., accompanied by a rough sea. The master at first refused to leave his ship, and requested the Life-boat to remain alongside; the Boat accordingly stayed by her for about two hours, but as the sea was then getting very heavy, the master, the crew, consisting of twelve men, and the pilot, decided to abandon her, and were brought safely ashore in the Life-boat. The barque, which was on a voyage from Africa to Glasgow with dye-wood, became a total wreck.—Expense of service, 20*l.* 15*s.*

Dec. 28.—About 1 o'clock a gun from the South Sand Light-ship, on the Goodwins, distant about seven miles from Deal, gave warning that a ship was on the dreaded sands. It was blowing a whole gale from the S.W., and vessels even in the comparative shelter of the Downs were riding at both anchors. Just then, in answer to the boom of the distant gun, the bell rang to man the Life-boat, and the Deal boatmen gallantly answered to the summons. There were three vessels on the Goodwins. The crew of one took to their boats, and not being on the worst part of the Sands, got safe round the North Foreland to Margate. Another schooner, supposed to be a Dane, disappeared and was lost with all hands. The third, a German barque, the *Leda*, with a crew of seventeen "all told," was stuck fast on the worst part of the Sands, viz., the South Spit, on which even on a fine day there is a dangerous and peculiar boil or tumble of seas.

The barque's main and mizzen masts by this time were gone, and the crew were clinging to the weather bulwarks, while the sea made a clean breach over them—so much so that from cold and long exposure the captain was almost exhausted. The Deal Life-boat fetched a little to windward of the devoted barque, and dropping anchor, veered down on her. One cable being too short, another was bent to it, and closer and closer came the Life-boat. If the cable parted and the Life-boat struck the ship with full force, not a man would probably have survived to tell the tale; or if they got to leeward of the barque the crew of the wreck would have been lost, as the Life-boat could not again have worked "to windward" to drop down as before. No friendly steam-tug was at hand to help the boat again to windward in case of failure in their first attempt, and both the crew in distress and their rescuers were well aware of the stake at issue, and that this was the last chance. But the Life-boat crew said, "We're bound to save them," and with coolness, yet "daring all that men dare do," they concentrated their energies on getting close enough to the wreck to throw their line, and yet to keep far enough off to ensure the boat's safety. They were now beaten and hustled by the tremendous seas breaking into and over them, and no other boat could have lived a moment in the cauldron of waters seething and raging around them. Notwithstanding the self-emptying powers of the Life-boat, the seas broke into her in such quick succession that she was and remained full up to her thwarts, while near the vessel, and as each cataract came on board the coxswain sang out, "Look out, men," and they grasped the thwarts and held on with both hands, breathless for dear life. One sea hurled the Life-boat against the ship, and stove in her fore air-case, so that the safety of all made it necessary to sheer off. Another sea prostrated two men under her thwarts. The Life-boat's heaving-line and grappel was at last got on board the barque, and communication being established, the crew were drawn on board the Life-boat through the raging waves by ones or twos, as the seas permitted. Thus saved from the jaws of death, so astonished were the rescued crew at the submerged condition of the Life-boat and the awful turmoil of water around them that some of them wished to get back to their perishing vessel, but the coxswain and crew knew the powers of their gallant boat. "Up foresail and cut the cable," and with its goodly freight of thirty-four souls, the Life-boat, hurled like a feather, sometimes dead before the wind, and the next moment "taken aback," plunged into the surf for home. One of the rescued crew had twice before been saved by the same boat, and encouraged his comrades with a recital of his previous deliverances. And so at last, exhausted, but gloriously successful, they landed the staggering and grateful Germans on the Deal beach, where, despite the storm, crowds met them with wondering and thankful hearts.—Expense of service, 17*l.* 2*s.* 6*d.*

Dec. 28.—At 4 A.M. large flares were seen in the direction of the Cross Sand. The Caister Life-boat *Covent Garden* was launched, and proceeded to the Cross Sand, on which a very heavy sea was running, and found a brig ashore on the Sand. The boat's anchor was let go, but she could not reach the vessel; the position of the anchor was then shifted, and the crew, consisting of eight men, were fortunately rescued, the sea breaking over the brig as high as the foretop, and over the boat the whole time. She proved to be the *Rival*, of Blyth, bound from Gravesend to Newcastle in ballast.—Expense of service, 25*l.*

Dec. 31.—Voted 194*l.* 6*s.* 6*d.* to pay the expenses of the Life-boats at Sunderland, Whitby,

Caister, Carnsore, Winterton, Brighstone Grange, Broadstairs, Kingsdowne, Great Yarmouth, Queens-town, Banff, Cullercoats, Porthdillacn, Mullion, and Portrush, in either assembling their crews or putting off in reply to signals of distress shown

by vessels which did not ultimately require the aid of the boats.

The Ramsgate Life-boat had also proceeded to the assistance of distressed vessels, but her services had not been eventually needed.

SHORE-BOAT SERVICES REWARDED IN 1879.

Jan. 2.—Voted the Silver Medal and 1*l.* to Mr. JAMES MACKAY for saving two boys by swimming at great risk to a boat, which had been swamped while attempting to cross the Bar of Tongue, Sutherland, in a fresh gale and heavy sea, on the 16th November; 2*l.* 10*s.* were also granted to five men who put off in a ferry-boat and tried to rescue the boys.

Jan. 10.—Mr. P. KENNEDY, Chief Boatman in charge of H.M. Coastguard at Warren Point, co. Down, and three others, put off in a boat and saved seven persons from the barque *Nelson*, of Maryport, which had capsized in Warren Point Roads, during a gale from the S.E.—Reward, 4*l.*

Jan. 16.—Two fishermen of Ilfracombe rescued two men, whose boat had upset off that place, during a fresh E. wind. One of the rescued men unfortunately died soon after being landed, from the effects of the immersion in the water.—Reward, 1*l.*

Jan. 17.—Five men put off in a boat and, at risk of life, saved five men from the lugger *Friends*, which had stranded at the mouth of North Bay Harbour, Inverness, during a strong S.E. gale.—Reward, 5*l.*

Jan. 21.—Mr. DENNIS CONNOR, Chief Officer of H.M. Coastguard at Rosslare, Ireland, and his crew of eight men, put off in their boat and saved the crew of twelve men from the barque *Hellen*, of Liverpool, which had stranded near Rosslare during a strong wind from the S.E.—Reward, 10*l.*

Feb. 6.—Voted the Silver Medal of the Institution, a copy of the vote inscribed on vellum, and 1*l.*, to Mr. WILLIAM WEST, Chief Boatman in charge of H.M. Coastguard, and 6*l.* 10*s.* to his crew, for saving, at considerable risk, five of the crew of the schooner *Marie Louise*, of Gothenburg, which was wrecked at Dymchurch, Kent, during a fresh E.S.E. gale, on the 8th January.

Also the Silver Medal of the Institution, a copy of the vote inscribed on vellum, and 1*l.*, to HENRY STEVENS, gunner, 10th Brigade Royal Artillery, for swimming out twice, at very great risk, to the brigantine *Princess Royal*, with the view of saving some of her crew, that vessel having been wrecked at Camden Fort, near Cork, on the night of the 24th December.

Also 2*l.* to the Master of the steam-tug *Nelson*, and 10*s.* each to his crew of nine men, for rescuing nineteen men from the barque *Charles Challoner*, of Fleetwood, Lancashire, which had stranded on Barnard's Wharf, near Fleetwood, during a fresh gale, on the 18th September.

Also 3*l.* to six men for putting off in a boat from Southwold, Suffolk, and saving ten men from the brig *Cowen*, of South Shields, which had struck on the Kentish Knock Sands, during a strong S.W. wind, on the 31st December.

Also 2*l.* 10*s.* to three men for saving three men from a ship's boat which had been capsized between Knightstone and Anchor Head, in Weston Bay, on the 21st December.

Also 2*l.* to eight men for putting off in a boat and saving the crew of seven men of the brig-

antine *Margaret*, of Rye, which was wrecked on Blakeney Sands, off the coast of Norfolk, on the 15th December.

Feb. 15.—Five men put off in a boat and saved three men from a fishing-boat which had been upset by a sudden squall near the Coastguard Station at Greencastle, co. Londonderry.—Reward, 2*l.*

March 6.—Voted the thanks of the Institution to Mr. F. S. PERRY, Mr. HORATIO E. PRITCHARD, Mr. W. LEIGH, and Mr. J. ELFORD SMYTHE, for wading into the sea, and, at considerable risk, assisting to save the crew of four men of the French lugger *Ange*, which was wrecked at Porthcurnow Sands, Cornwall, during a S.S.E. gale and heavy sea on the 1st February.

March 12.—Three Penmon pilots put off in a boat and saved the crew of five men from the brigantine *Hawendale*, of Aberystwith, which sunk on the Prince Regent Rocks during a strong N. wind and heavy sea.—Reward, 3*l.*

March 20.—Some Newbiggin men put off in a coble from that place, and rescued the crew of seven men from the wrecked schooner *Carl*, of Holmestrand, Norway, during a strong S.S.E. wind.—Reward, 3*l.* 5*s.*

March 28.—Five men saved a man from a boat which had been water-logged in Galway Bay, during squally weather.—Reward, 3*l.*

April 3.—Voted the thanks of the Institution to EDWARD HUMBY, of H.M. Coastguard at Southsea, for rescuing from the water and restoring a woman who was apparently drowned, she having rushed into the sea from Southsea beach on the night of the 14th March.

April 9.—JOHN and THOMAS BOUND saved a man whose boat had sunk after striking on the Munkston Rock in the Bristol Channel. He took refuge on the rock, but he was in great danger there, as the flowing tide was rapidly coming in, and the surf was breaking over the rock when he was rescued.—Reward, 2*l.*

April 10.—JAMES PARSONS, of Clevedon, put off in a small boat, at much risk, and saved the engineer of the steam-tug *Elf*, during very cold and stormy weather.—Reward, 2*l.*

June 5.—Voted 3*l.* to four of the Dover Life-boat men, forming the crew of the galley punt *Corsair's Bride*, of that port, for saving the crew of nine men and a pilot from the barque *Lyder Sagen*, of Bergen, Norway, which foundered after coming into collision with a steamer in Dover Roads, during a strong wind and heavy swell, on the 6th December.

June 24.—Three persons put off in a boat and rescued two other persons who, while crossing the ford at Inny river, co. Kerry, with a horse and cart, between two and three o'clock in the morning, had been carried away towards the sea, the river being at the time in a swollen state through heavy rain.—Reward, 3*l.*

July 1.—Eleven men put off in a fishing-boat and brought ashore three men from the smack *Margaret*, of Hillswick, Shetland, which was in a

perilous position off Stromness during a S.E. gale and hazy weather.—Reward, 5*l*.

July 12.—Four men saved another man from a boat which had been capsized off Warren-point, co. Down.—Reward, 1*l*, 5*s*.

July 24.—Three men put off in a boat, at some risk, and saved a man from the lugger *Nicholas*, of Wexford, which had struck upon a rock and while running for the shore foundered off Greenore Head, co. Wexford, during a strong S.W. breeze.—Reward, 2*l*.

Voted the thanks of the Institution to Capt. J. THOMAS, and 1*l*. each to the first mate, and two of the crew of the steamer *Prince of Wales*, of Liverpool, for saving two men from a canoe which had sunk in Rock Channel during a strong N.W. breeze on the 5th July. The two men, who were quite unconscious, were got into the steamer's boat, and with difficulty taken on board and landed at Menai Bridge.

Aug. 15.—Seven men and two boys put off in a boat and saved seven of the crew of the barque *Julie*, of Drammen, which had struck on a rock on the west side of Fair Isle, Shetland, and sank during a dense fog.—Reward, 5*l*.

Aug. 20.—Two men proceeded through the surf in a small Life-boat kept at Tramore, Ireland, for the purpose of rendering assistance to bathers in distress, and saved a man who was in danger of being drowned.—Reward, 1*l*.

Aug. 25.—Six men put off in a Coastguard boat from Ballydavid, Ireland, and, at some risk, saved six persons from the yacht *Vesta*, of Queenstown, which had parted one of her cables, and was in a dangerous position off Smerwick, co. Kerry, during a N.N.W. gale.—Reward, 6*l*.

Sept. 5.—Three men put off in a boat and rescued, at some risk, two other men from a boat which had been capsized off Harwich, in a heavy sea.—Reward, 3*l*.

Sept. 25.—Four men put off in a boat and saved, at considerable risk, in a rough sea, three persons who had taken refuge on a small island called Booster, Shetland, their boat having struck upon a rock, and been totally wrecked during hazy weather.—Reward, 4*l*.

Oct. 2.—Voted the Silver Medal of the Institution, and a copy of the vote inscribed on vellum, to Miss ELLEN FRANCES PRIDEAUX BRUNE, Miss GERTRUDE ROSE PRIDEAUX BRUNE, Miss MARY KATHERINE PRIDEAUX BRUNE, Miss BEATRICE MAY PRIDEAUX BRUNE, and Miss NORA O'SHAUGHNESSY, in acknowledgment of their intrepid and prompt services in proceeding,

through a heavy surf, in their rowing-boat and saving, at considerable risk of life, a sailor from a boat which had been capsized by a squall of wind off Bray Hill, Padstow Harbour, Cornwall, on the 9th August. When the accident occurred, the ladies' boat was being towed astern of a fishing-boat, and Miss ELLEN PRIDEAUX BRUNE, with great gallantry and determination, asked to be cast off, and, with her companions, she proceeded with all possible despatch to the rescue of the drowning sailor. All the ladies showed great courage, presence of mind, and marked ability in the management of their small boat, and ran great risk in getting the man into it, on account of the strong tide and sea on at the time.

Voted also the thanks of the Institution to the Hon. J. G. P. VEREKER, and to SAMUEL BATE, late Coxswain of the Institution's Padstow Life-boat, who were also instrumental in saving a boy who had been thrown out of the same boat.

Also the thanks of the Institution, inscribed on vellum, to GEORGE REYNOLDS, Commissioned Boatman of H.M. Coastguard, at Goodwick, Pembrokeshire, and 1*l*. each to three other men, for putting off in a Coastguard boat, at very great risk (their boat being filled twice by the heavy seas before getting to the vessel), and saving the crew of three men from the smack *Jane and Margaret*, of Newport, Pembrokeshire, which had been driven on the rocks while attempting to make Newport harbour during a fresh N.N.W. gale on the night of the 16th August.

Also the thanks of the Institution, inscribed on vellum, to the Rev. P. VYVYAN ROBINSON, and 25*l*. to forty-one fishermen and Coastguardmen at Cadgwith and the Lizard, Cornwall, for putting off in shore-boats and saving at some risk sixty-nine persons from the steamer *Brest*, of Glasgow, which was wrecked between Cadgwith and the Lizard, during a fog, on the 6th September.

Oct. 14.—Three men put off in a boat, during a gale of wind from the N.N.E., and saved eight of the crew of the ketch *Notre Dame*, of Boulogne, which had stranded on the East Sands, off Blakeney, on the Norfolk Coast.—Reward, 1*l*, 10*s*.

Oct. 17.—Three men also put off in a boat and saved the crew of two men from the flat *Sarah*, of Carnarvon, which was totally wrecked off Rhyll, North Wales, during a strong N.W. wind and heavy sea.—Reward, 1*l*, 10*s*.

Oct. 20.—Four men put off in a boat and saved two men from a boat which had been struck by a sudden squall and capsized in Poole Harbour, Dorset.—Reward, 1*l*, 10*s*.

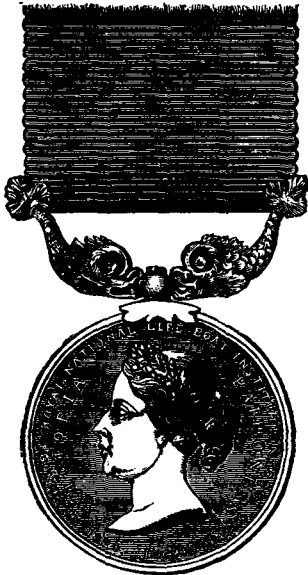

Reverse.—Three sailors in a Life-boat,—one of whom is in the act of rescuing an exhausted mariner from the waves on a fragment of the wreck. "W. Wyon, Mint." Inscription, "Let not the deep swallow me up."

THE beautiful obverse of this medal, executed by L. C. WYON, Esq., represents the bust of QUEEN VICTORIA, Her Majesty's locks gracefully waving and gathered in a knot behind, from which issues a wreath of oak clustering over the forehead. This life-like portrait of the QUEEN, in high relief, conveys a truly pleasing and faithful likeness of HER MAJESTY at that period (1862), combining the dignity of aspect and benevolence which have always characterised the Queen throughout her long and prosperous reign.

The reverse, representing the Life-boat, in which there are three Seamen, rescuing a fourth from the sea, is a work of great merit. Two of the men are steadying the boat, while the other, stooping, draws in the Shipwrecked Sailor, whose figure is given so as to show the form in the most natural manner; and the expression thrown into his countenance looking up to his preserver is supplicating in the extreme, while the easy flowing lines of this sailor are finely contrasted by those of his companions: the whole displaying a perfect knowledge of the human frame, and a command of the graver to embody what he had shadowed out to himself.

But there is another pleasing motive for admiration of this beautiful Medal, as the figure who is so humanely extending his relief to the drowning Mariner is a portrait of the Artist, the late WILLIAM WYON, Esq., R.A., himself.

The following is a List of the GOLD and SILVER MEDALS that have been voted by the Committee of the Institution, since its establishment in 1824, to persons whose humane and intrepid exertions in saving Life from Shipwreck on our Coasts have been deemed sufficiently conspicuous to merit that honourable distinction. The Cases will be found recorded in detail in the several Annual Reports of the Institution.

The total number of Medals granted by the Institution up to the present time is 995; 93 of which were in Gold, and 902 in Silver.

BYE-LAWS

OF THE

Royal National Life-boat Institution.

I. THE Annual General Meeting prescribed by the Charter shall be held on the 4th day of March, or as soon after as may be convenient, and the same and all other General Meetings shall be held at such time and place as the Committee of Management shall appoint.

II. A Special General Meeting of the Governors of the Institution may, at any time, be called by the Committee of Management.

III. Notice of every Annual Meeting, and of every Special General Meeting, shall be given by advertisement in three of the daily newspapers published in London ten days at least before the day for holding the same. And in case of a Special General Meeting, the object of it shall be stated in the Notice.

IV. Every Annual and every Special General Meeting shall have power to adjourn to a future day.

V. A statement of the receipts and disbursements of the Society for the preceding year shall be made out by the Committee of Management, and signed by the Secretary and by the Auditor, and shall be left in the Office for the inspection of the Governors for six days prior to the day appointed for the Annual General Meeting, and such account shall be submitted by the Committee of Management to the Meeting.

VI. At every Annual Meeting an election of the President, Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, and Committee of Management, and of an Auditor, shall take place; but the President, Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, Committee of Management, and Auditor, shall be considered as in office, not only until the Meeting shall break up or adjourn, but until others shall be respectively elected in their place.

VII. No other business shall be transacted at a Special General Meeting than the business for which it shall have been expressly called, and no other business shall be transacted at any adjourned Meeting than the business left unfinished at the Meeting from which such adjournment took place.

VIII. At the Annual General Meetings, the order of business shall be as follows:—

1. The Chair shall be taken by the President, if he shall be present, and if not, then by some other person to be chosen by the Committee.

2. The President, or Chairman, shall then state the names of the persons proposed to fill the offices of President, Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, Committee of Management, and Auditor for the year ensuing, and if no other persons shall have been named, the persons so proposed shall be deemed and declared to be elected.

3. The election shall be determined by a show of hands, unless a ballot shall be demanded by any ten Governors present; in which case the same shall take place immediately, and the President, Vice-President, or Chairman, shall appoint two or more scrutineers among the Governors present to superintend the ballot during its progress, and to report the result to the Meeting.

4. No ballot shall be kept open for more than two hours.

5. Immediately after the elections have taken place, or the ballot shall have commenced, the report of the receipts and disbursements of the Society, as signed by the Auditor, shall be read, and submitted to the Meeting for approval.

6. The Committee of Management shall then present a Report of their proceedings for the past year, and particularly (in all cases in which they may have voted a reward) a statement of the number of persons who may have been saved from shipwreck, with the names of the vessels to which they belonged; also a list of the persons to whom medals or rewards may have been voted, with the particulars of the services they rendered; also the particulars of the cases, if any, in which the Committee may have voted assistance to the wives or families of persons who may have perished in an attempt to save the lives of others. Also a return of all the Life-boats belonging to, or established by, or in connection with the Institution, their actual state and condition, and that of the Boat-houses, Carriages, and Stores appertaining to them.

7. Any business which the Committee of Management shall think proper to introduce shall then be entered upon and discussed, and the opinion of the Meeting shall, if necessary, be taken thereon.

8. After all business introduced by the Committee of Management shall have been disposed of, it shall be competent for any Governor to make any proposition which may legally be entertained at such Meeting, and to give any notice he may think fit of a proposition to be considered at a future Meeting.

9. In case the Meeting shall be adjourned, the business to be transacted at the adjourned Meeting shall be specified previously to the adjournment taking place, and shall be entered on the Minutes, and no business shall be transacted at the adjourned Meeting which shall not have been so specified and entered.

10. In all cases of dispute, or doubt, or difficulty, an appeal shall be made to the President, or Chairman, and his decision thereon shall be final and conclusive.

IX. At the Special General Meetings, the order of the proceedings shall be as follows:—

1. The Chair shall be taken as directed for the Annual General Meetings.

2. The object for which the Meeting has been called shall then be stated by the President, or Chairman.

3. The business to be transacted shall be taken in the order stated in the Notice calling the Meeting.

4. All elections, ballots, and debates, shall be conducted in the same manner as at the Annual General Meetings.

X. At all adjourned Meetings the business to be transacted shall be taken in the order in which it shall have been entered on the Minutes of the Meeting from which the adjournment took place.

XI. No motion by any Governor for the repeal or alteration of any existing bye-law, or for the

enactment of any new bye-law, shall be entertained at any General Meeting, unless the same shall have been previously approved by the Committee of Management, or unless notice in writing of such motion shall have been given at some previous General Meeting by the Governor intending to move the same; or unless notice in writing containing the substance of the intended alteration shall have been given to the Committee of Management by the Governor intending to move the same, twenty-one days at least before the day on which such General Meeting shall be held.

XII. If the repeal or alteration of any existing bye-laws, or the enactment of any new bye-law, shall be proposed by the Committee of Management, such repeal or alteration, or such new bye-law, if carried at the Meeting at which it shall have been proposed, shall be binding without confirmation; but if proposed by any Governor, the same shall not be binding unless it shall be confirmed at a subsequent General Meeting, to be held for the purpose, at a distance of not less than three weeks from the preceding General Meeting, which Meeting shall appoint the time for holding the second Meeting.

XIII. Notice of any motion for the repeal or alteration of any existing bye-law, or the enactment of any new bye-law, whether originating with the Committee of Management or otherwise, shall be given by advertisement in three of the daily newspapers published in London ten days at least before the Meeting at which such motion is intended to be made; and if it shall be necessary to confirm such repeal or alteration, or such new bye-law, a similar notice thereof shall be given.

XIV. Minutes of the proceedings at every General Meeting shall be entered in a book, to be provided for that purpose, and signed by the person in the Chair.

XV. In case any irregularity shall occur in the convening or holding of any General Meeting, or in any election or other proceedings at any such Meeting, and the same shall not be publicly noticed and objected to at such Meeting, all proceedings of such Meeting shall be of the same force and validity as if no such irregularity had occurred; but if any irregularity shall be publicly noticed and objected to, the Meeting shall decide thereon, and such decision shall be final and conclusive.

XVI. The President, Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, and Committee of Management, shall be chosen from among the Governors of the Institution. The Auditor shall be a professional Accountant, and his remuneration shall be fixed by the Committee of Management.

XVII. The Committee of Management shall consist of forty Members, but shall be competent to act until reduced by any means below the number of fifteen.

XVIII. The President, Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, Committee of Management, and Auditor going out of office on the day of the Annual Meeting, shall be immediately re-eligible.

XIX. The name of every person intended to be proposed by any Governor as President or Vice-President of the Institution, or Treasurer, or as a Member of the Committee of Management, or Auditor, shall be transmitted in writing to the Secretary seven days at least before the day of election, and a list of the persons so proposed, together with the name of the Governor proposing each such person, shall be fixed up in the Office of the Institution six days before the Meeting, and no person shall be capable of being elected Pre-

sident or Vice-President of the Society, or Treasurer, or a Member of the Committee of Management, or Auditor, whose name shall not have been so transmitted.

XX. The Committee of Management may make such regulations, not inconsistent with the charter or bye-laws, as may appear to them expedient for conducting the proceedings of their own Meetings.

XXI. The Committee of Management shall pay to the Secretary, Inspector of Life-boats, and all other officers, clerks, attendants, and servants of the Institution, such salaries and wages, or make them such recompense as they shall from time to time think proper.

XXII. The Committee of Management shall have the custody of the common seal of the Society. The funded property of the Institution shall be invested, either in the name of the Institution, in its corporate capacity, or in the names of three Trustees to be appointed by the Committee of Management, as the Committee of Management shall, from time to time, think fit; and if the investment shall be made in the names of Trustees, the order of the Committee of Management shall be their sufficient discharge in all cases.

XXIII. Minutes of the proceedings of every Meeting of the Committee of Management shall be taken by the Secretary, or in case of his absence by some other person whom the President, Vice-President, or Chairman shall appoint for the occasion, which Minutes shall afterwards be copied fairly into a minute-book, to be kept for that purpose, and, after having been read, shall be signed by the President, Vice-President, or Chairman of that or the next succeeding Meeting.

XXIV. If any vacancy shall occur in the office of Auditor by death or resignation, or by any other cause than that of going out of office on the day of the Annual Meeting, such vacancy shall be filled up by the election of a new Auditor at a Special General Meeting, to be called for that purpose by the Committee of Management within the space of three calendar months next after such vacancy shall occur, unless the Annual Meeting shall be held within that period, and in that case the new Auditor shall be appointed by the Committee of Management.

XXV. The Governors of the Institution shall consist of the persons who shall have subscribed to the funds either in one sum of ten guineas or upwards, or by an annual payment of one guinea or upwards, and of such other persons as shall be elected to be Governors by a General Meeting, as having rendered essential service to the Institution.

XXVI. Donors of ten guineas and Annual Subscribers of one guinea, to be entitled at all General Meetings to one vote each.

Donors of twenty guineas and Annual Subscribers of two guineas, to two votes each.

Donors of thirty guineas and Annual Subscribers of three guineas, to three votes each.

Donors of fifty guineas and Annual Subscribers of five guineas, to four votes each.

Donors of a hundred guineas and upwards, and Annual Subscribers of ten guineas and upwards, to six votes each.

Governors selected in respect of essential services to the Institution shall be entitled to one vote each.

XXVII. No person claiming to be a Governor, in respect of an annual subscription, shall be entitled to vote at any General Meeting unless he shall have paid his subscription for the current year.

LIFE-BOAT REGULATIONS.

THE following Regulations are intended for the guidance of the Local Committee to be formed at each place at which a Life-boat is stationed by the NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION, and to whose care and control the Life-boat, her Crew, and everything connected with her management and maintenance, will be entrusted.

1. The Local Committee to consist, if practicable, of not less than five persons usually resident, to be elected annually. The Inspecting-Commander of Coastguard of the division, or in his absence the nearest Coastguard Officer to the spot, to be invited to become a member of the Local Committee.

2. The Local Committee at each station are requested to meet at the expiration of each quarter, and then to forward the usual Quarterly Report to the Institution, on the printed sheet provided for the purpose, as to the behaviour of the Boat during exercise, &c., pointing out any defects that may require to be remedied, and offering any suggestions that may conduce to the efficiency of the service. Also generally to report on the state and condition of the Boat, the Carriage, the Boat-house, and all the Life-boat gear. Should occasion for immediate repairs arise, the Local Committee are authorised to make them to the extent of 5*l.*: more extensive repairs to be referred, with an estimate, to the Parent Institution.

3. An entry is to be made, in the journal supplied for the purpose, of the particulars of all services performed by the Life-boat in saving or attempting to save life, being a duplicate of the official reports of the same forwarded to the Institution, which journal will be retained at the station as a complete record of all the services which have been performed by the Life-boat.

4. There should be three keys to the Boat-house, kept in different places, with the *address of each painted on the door*; one in the possession of the Coxswain, and the others as the Local Committee may decide.

5. A signal shall be agreed on by which the Life-boat crew can be called together when required, such as a flag hoisted by day, and the firing of a carronade (or other alarm signal) by night.

6. As at each Life-boat station there will be a Local Committee, the Coxswain will act under their immediate directions, and the Boat, except in case of wreck or other disaster, is never to be taken afloat without their sanction. It is desirable that each Local Committee should appoint one of their members, resident on the spot, to specially represent them, in conjunction with the Honorary Secretary, on such emergencies.

7. The Coxswain-superintendent will be held responsible for the efficiency and general good order of the Boat-house, the Boat, and her gear; and it is hoped that a sense of the trust confided to them in the cause of humanity will lead the Coxswains and Crews to be most careful on these points, and to distinguish themselves by their zeal and readiness, and by the seaman-like manner in which their Boats are handled.

8. The Life-boat's Crew to consist of a Coxswain-superintendent, an Assistant Coxswain, a Bowman, and as many Boatmen in addition as the Boat pulls oars. On service a Bowman should always go in the Boat, but he is not required on occasions of exercise.

9. For every Boat, at least double the number of men required (if they can be found at or near the spot) should be invited to become members of her Crew.

10. Such men to consist of Fishermen or other Boatmen who are usually resident and (with permission of the Admiralty) of any Coastguardmen of the station who may volunteer for the service.

11. As the efficiency of a Life-boat may often depend on the good training and discipline of her Crew, the strictest attention must be paid by them to the directions of the Coxswain on all occasions connected with the service. The Boat shall be taken afloat for exercise, fully manned, once during each quarter, sometimes in *rough weather*, unless the Boat has been out in that quarter, either on service or with one of the Inspectors.

12. The Boat is to be kept on her carriage in the Boat-house, with all her gear in her ready for use, except articles which may require to be secured from damp.

13. It being the sole object of the Institution to Save *Life*, the Life-boat is to be reserved for cases involving risk of life; and is not to be used for taking off an anchor; nor for the purpose of salvage; nor for taking off stores, a pilot, or orders to a ship, *so as to interfere with private enterprise*, except in cases of emergency, when valuable property would be lost without such aid.

14. Immediately on intimation of a wreck, or of a vessel in distress, the Coxswain is to use his utmost exertions to assemble his Crew, launch the Boat and proceed to her assistance; and in the event of a sufficient number of his Crew not being present, he is to select the best volunteers he can get to supply their places. The Coxswain is held responsible for every man who goes into the Life-boat on occasions of service and of quarterly exercise, without having on a Life-belt. In the absence of the Coxswain the Assistant Coxswain will take charge of the Boat.

15. No one besides the Coxswain and Crew is to be allowed to go out in the Life-boat when going to a wreck, except with the express sanction of the Local Committee.

16. If a wreck occur at some distance from the station, so as to require the Boat to be transported along the coast, the Coxswain is to send to procure sufficient horses (which, by the Wreck and Salvage Act, any Magistrate, Constable, or Revenue Officer may demand the use of), attach them to the Carriage, and lose no time in making the best of his way, with the Crew, to the scene of the wreck.

17. On boarding wrecks, the Preservation of Life is to be the Coxswain's *sole consideration*, and he is on no account to take in goods or merchandize which might endanger the safety of his Boat, and the lives of those entrusted to his charge. And should any be brought in, contrary to his remonstrance, he is fully authorized to throw them overboard.

18. On returning from service, the Boat is not to be left in the surf on the beach, but as soon as possible, is to be got on her carriage, and placed in the Boat-house.

19. The salary of the Coxswain-superintendent shall be 8*l.*, and that of the Assistant Coxswain 2*l.* annually. On every occasion of going afloat to save life, the Coxswains and each of the Crew will receive alike from the Parent Institution, 10*s.* by day, and 1*l.* by

night; and for every time of going afloat for exercise, 4*s.* The Committee, however, reserve to themselves the power to add to those amounts on any special occasions when unusual risk or exposure has been incurred, or to modify, or withhold the usual payment in cases where the launching of Life-boats was manifestly unnecessary before they were put afloat.

20. A reward of 7*s.* to be given to the man who first brings intelligence of a wreck at such a distance along the coast as not to be in sight from the Coastguard or other look-out.

21. In the event of money being received by the Life-boat for salvage of property, or similar service, a proportion equal to the shares of two of the Crew shall be paid to the Institution to cover risk of damage to the Boat; the remainder being equally shared amongst the Coxswain and Crew. For such service the Life-boat men are to look to the owners of the vessels, and not to the Institution, for payment.

22. If voluntary Local Subscriptions or other payments be raised or made to reward any special act of gallantry or exertion, the Institution recommends that the whole of the money be paid to the Crew, in equal shares. The Coxswain and Crews of Life-boats are strictly prohibited from making any claim on Owners of Vessels, or others, for Saving Life.

MEMORANDUM.

The rule of the NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION for the distribution of Salvage payments to the Life-boat men *when they have saved vessels with their crews on board*, having been at some places misunderstood, the Committee refer the several Honorary Secretaries to the last clause of the Circular on the salvage of property by Life-boats, May 1872, as follows:—

“In those cases when vessels and their crews are saved by the Life-boats, and when the salvage payments made by the owners are less in amount than the usual award of the Institution for saving lives, the Institution will make up the deficiency to the Life-boat men.”—See *Coxswain's Book of Instructions*, p. 17.

It should be distinctly understood that it is optional to the Coxswain and Crew of a

Life-boat, on boarding a wrecked vessel, to endeavour to save the vessel, as well as her crew, when practicable, or not to do so.

In the event, however, of their success in saving the vessel or cargo, and being thereby entitled to salvage payment, the Life-boat men will consider that the service has assumed a distinct character, and that they must look solely to the owners of the property to pay all expenses, including those for launching the Life-boat, subject to the proviso in the clause above quoted.

All claims on the Owners of Vessels for saving their property to be made in their own names, by the Coxswains and Crews of Life-boats, to whom the Life-boats are lent for such service, and on no account in the name of the Institution.

THE LIFE-BOAT STATION.



THE following brief description and diagrams illustrative of a complete Life-boat Establishment, including the House for the protection of the boat, will serve to convey an idea of the general character of one of the 270 Life-boat Stations of the NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION.

It will be seen that it is a work of a costly nature, and that not only in the first instance, but that a large permanent expense is entailed in keeping the whole machinery in an efficient state, in the re-supply of any part of it which may be destroyed or worn out, in the exercise of the boats' crews, in launching and working the boats, and in remunerating them for their services in saving their fellow-creatures. Yet, looking to the vast importance of the result effected, and the responsibility of calling on men to risk their lives in effecting the same, it is felt that few if any persons will be found who will consider that expense to be incurred in vain.

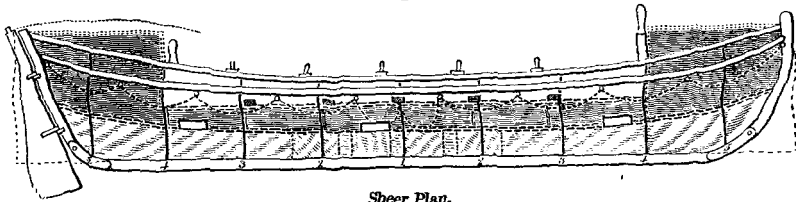
THE LIFE-BOAT.

(See Diagrams on next page.)

The following figures show the general form, the nature of the fittings and air-chambers of one of these boats, 33 feet in length and 8 feet in breadth. In figs. 1 and 2, the elevation and deck plans, the general exterior form of the boat is shown with the sheer of gunwale, length of keel, and rake of stem and stern-posts. The dotted lines of fig. 1 show the position and dimensions of the air-chambers within board, the relieving-tubes, and ballast. In fig 2, A represents the deck, B the relieving-tubes (6 inches in diameter), C the side air-cases, D the end air-chambers, E ballast, F scuttles to admit of a free current of air under the water-tight deck, G scuttle for air, and to receive pump. In fig. 3, the exterior form of transverse sections, at different distances from stem to stern, is shown. Fig. 4 represents a

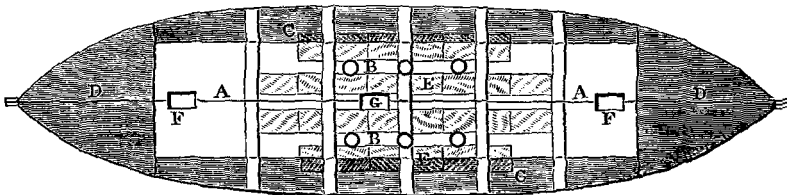
midship transverse section, A being sections of the side air-cases, B the relieving-tubes, of the same depth as the space between the deck and the boat's floor. C, C, C, C, are spaces beneath the deck, placed longitudinally, at the midship part of the boat, with cases packed with cork, forming a portion of the ballast; d scuttle for ventilation, having a pump fixed in it, by which any leakage beneath the deck can be pumped out by one of the crew whilst afloat. The festooned lines in fig. 1 represent exterior life-lines attached round the entire length of the boat, to which persons in the water may cling till they can be got into the boat; the two central lines are festooned lower than the others, to be used as stirrups, so that a person in the water, by stepping on them, may climb into the boat without assistance.

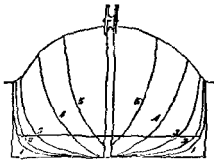
Sheer Plan.

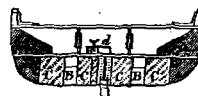
Deck Plan.

Midship Section.

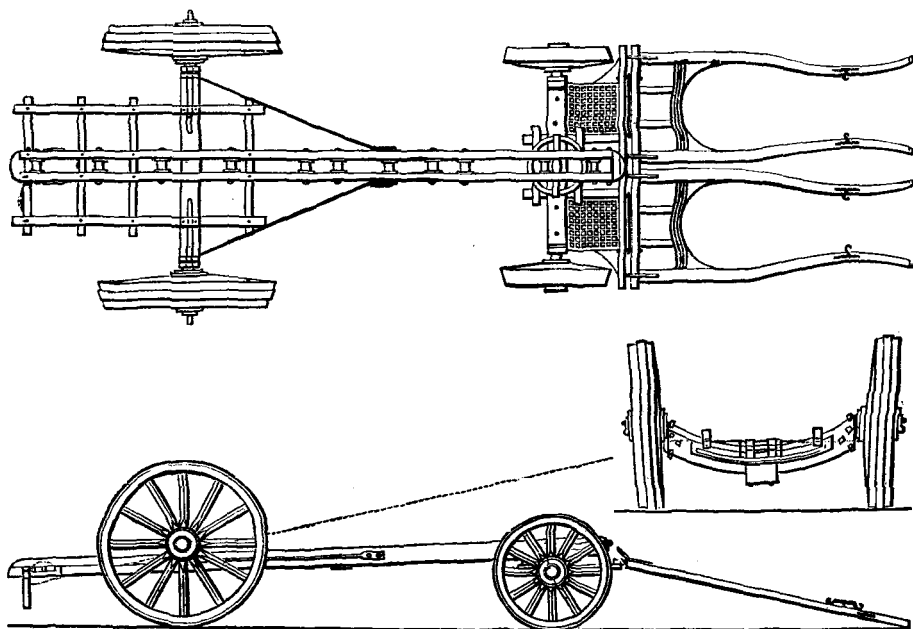
This Life-boat possesses in the highest degree all the qualities which it is desirable that a Life-boat should possess:—

1. Great lateral stability, or resistance to upsetting.
2. Speed against a heavy sea.
3. Facility for launching and taking the shore.
4. Immediate self-discharge of any water breaking into her.
5. The important advantage of self-righting if upset.
6. Strength.
7. Stowage room for a large number of passengers.

THE LIFE-BOAT TRANSPORTING-CARRIAGE.

The Life-boat transporting-carriage is a very important auxiliary to the boat. Every Life-boat, except a few of the larger size, is provided with a carriage, on which she is kept in the boat-house ready for immediate transportation to the most favourable position for launching to a wreck. A Life-boat is thus made available for a greater extent of coast than she otherwise would be; and even when launched from abreast of the boat-house, can be much quicker conveyed to the water's edge than she could be if not on a carriage. In addition to this ordinary use, a carriage is of immense service in launching a boat from a beach, to that extent, indeed, that one can be readily launched from a carriage through a high surf, when without one she could not be got off the beach.

The carriage consists of a fore and main body. The latter is formed of a keelway, and of side or bilgeways attached to the keelway, and resting on the main axle, the



boat's weight being entirely on the rollers of the keelway. Its leading characteristic is that, on the withdrawal of a forelock pin, the fore and main bodies can be detached from each other. The advantages of this arrangement are that, whilst on the one hand the weight of the boat when she is launched from the rear end forms an inclined plane by elevating the keelway and fore-carriage; on the other hand, to replace her on the carriage she can be hauled bow foremost up the fore end or longer incline, by disconnecting the fore-carriage, and letting the end of the keelway rest on the ground, thus forming an inclined plane up which the boat is easily drawn. The bilgeways are needed at the rear end, that the boat may be launched in an upright position, with her crew on board, but they are not required at the fore end of the carriage.

A very full equipment of stores is supplied to the Life-boats of the Institution—such as cork life-belts, anchors and cables, grappels and lines, life-buoys, lanterns, rockets, and many other articles, together with portable or launching-skids.

THE LIFE-BOAT HOUSE.



The boats of the NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION, and all belonging to them, are kept in roomy and substantial boat-houses, under lock and key, in charge of paid coxswains, under the general superintendence of local honorary committees of residents in the several localities. Each boat has its appointed coxswain at a salary of 8*l.*, and an assistant at 2*l.* a year. The crew consists, in addition, of a bowman, and as many boatmen as the boat pulls oars. The members of the volunteer crews are registered, and wherever practicable, at least double the number of men required are entered on the register. Such men are mostly resident boatmen, fishermen, or Coastguardmen. On every occasion of going afloat to save life, the coxswain and each of the crew receive alike from the funds of the Institution (whether successful or not) 10*s.*, if by day, and 1*l.*, if by night; and 4*s.* each for every time of going afloat for exercise.

A reward of 7*s.* is given to the man who first brings intelligence of a wreck at such a distance along the coast as not to be in sight of the Coastguard Station or other look-out.

A flag hoisted by day, and the firing of a carronade (or other alarm signal) by night, are the well-known signals for calling the crew together.

On boarding wrecks, the preservation of life is the sole consideration. Should any goods or merchandize be brought into the life-boat, contrary to the coxswain's remonstrance, he is authorised to throw them overboard.

The expense of a Life-boat Station averages 1,000*l.*, and is made up as follows:—

Life-boat and her equipment, including Life-belts for the Crew,	
Skids, and Transporting-carriage	£650
Boat-house (average cost)	350
Total	£1,000

The average Annual Expense of maintaining a Life-boat Station is 70*l.*

Such is a brief summary of the chief of the Regulations under which the Life-boats are worked. How faithfully and with what result they are carried out let the journals of each Life-boat Station and the annals of the Institution tell.

The NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION has now 270 Life-boats under its charge. Every one of these has been specially presented to it, and they save every year from 600 to 700 shipwrecked sailors. Altogether, the Institution has contributed to the saving of 26,906 lives.

Despite, however, this fleet of 270 Life-boats, and of 30 others locally provided and supported, and despite the numerous rocket and mortar stations on our coast, there remains the melancholy fact that an average of 700 lives are lost annually on and around our own shores alone, proclaiming solemnly, though silently, that, for humanity's sake, and for the national credit, no exertions should be spared in providing every possible means for the conveyance of succour to the shipwrecked.

The Institution needs a permanent income of about 40,000*l.* to maintain its great Life-saving Fleet; and the Committee feel assured that it will never lack it so long as it maintains its boats in the state of thorough efficiency that they are in at the present time, and manned as they are on every emergency by as fearless and noble a class of men as ever our Nelsons and Collingwoods led to battle to uphold our country's honour and glory.
