At the ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING of the ROYAL NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION, held at Willis's Rooms, King Street, St. James's, on Saturday, 15th day of March, 1884, HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, K.G., in the Chair, the following Report of the Committee was read by the Secretary:—

ANNUAL REPORT.

1884.

THE Committee of the ROYAL NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION, in submitting their Sixtieth Annual Report to their supporters and sympathisers, thankfully acknowledge the very valuable and important monetary assistance which they have received during the past year, without which it would have been impossible to carry on and sustain the great work which has been entrusted to them.

In no previous year, perhaps, has the necessity for the existence of such a Society been more plainly demonstrated than in that lately completed. The revolving seasons have brought with them to our rock-bound shores the same dangerous winds and terrible gales as heretofore, imperilling the safety of thousands of vessels and their living freights. It is therefore a matter for deep gratitude to Almighty God that the strenuous efforts made by the ROYAL NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION have been instrumental in mitigating to a very considerable extent the dire evils entailed by the terrible disasters at sea which have been so

frequently brought under our notice in the public press.

Since the issue of the last Report, H.R.H. the PRINCESS OF WALES, ever ready to co-operate in any good work for the benefit of her fellow creatures, has honoured the Institution by becoming associated with it as Vice-patroness, thereby strengthening the hands of the Committee in their arduous undertaking.

The Committee have to record, with a deep sense of their grave importance, the following changes which have taken place in its administrative staff during the year 1883. About the time of the last Annual Meeting they were deprived of the invaluable services of the late Chairman, Mr. THOMAS CHAPMAN, by that gentleman's resignation of his high office, in which he has been succeeded by the present Chairman, Mr. EDWARD BIRKBECK, M.P., in whose place Colonel FITZROY CLAYTON was elected Deputy-Chairman of the Committee. Shortly afterwards Sir EDWARD PREROTT, Bart., Chairman of the Preparatory Committees, resigning that office after a continuous service of

above thirty years, was succeeded therein by the present Chairman, Mr. L. T. CAVE. The Committee have also to deplore the loss of their late Secretary, Mr. RICHARD LEWIS, whose death was notified in the last Annual Report, and the resignation of the late Chief Inspector of Life-boats, Vice-Admiral WARD, the benefit of whose services will long be felt; and the Committee are assured that the mark which they have left on the Institution and its work will never be effaced.

The operations of the Institution during the past year will be found classified as usual.

The high appreciation shown by the masters and owners of fishing vessels of the benefit first afforded them by the Committee in 1882, in furnishing them, on application, with reliable Aneroid Barometers at one-third the retail price, has induced the Committee to extend the boon to needy masters and owners of coasters under 100 tons burden, no less than ninety-one of whom have, in the course of a few months, availed themselves of the opportunity thus afforded them. The total number of these valuable instruments supplied to both the classes mentioned, has been 1,567, and there is every reason to believe that by this means many wrecks have been averted, and the loss of life which annually takes place on our coasts among the crews of small vessels, lessened.

Life-boats.—During 1883 four new Life-boat stations were established at the following places, and were provided with Life-boats:—

In addition to this, twelve new stations are in the course of formation, and nine new boats will shortly be provided for places in need of them.

A suitable boat-house has been erected in each case where a new station has been established, and transporting-carriages have been furnished for several boats.

The number of Life-boats under the management of the Institution last year was 274, which were the means of saving, between the 1st of January and the 31st of December, no less than 725 lives and 30 vessels. Besides this, 230 lives were saved from shipwreck by shore boats and other means, all of which services were rewarded by the Institution, making up a grand total of 955 lives rescued during the year.

It is with the deepest regret that the Committee have to record the sad loss, while on service, of two of their gallant Life-boatmen since the publication of the last Report. The particulars of the disaster are as follows:—During the terrible gale which swept over our shores during the night of the 23rd January last, and the four following days, the Clacton-on-Sea Life boat *Albert Edward* was proceeding to the assistance of the crew of a vessel in distress when she was struck by three very heavy seas and capsized, and although the Boat righted speedily it was found that two of the crew had been swept away in the darkness of the night. One of them, JAMES CROSS, the 2nd Coxswain, had been out in the Life-boat 33 times, and had assisted in saving 116 lives, and the other, THOMAS CATTERMOLE, 33 lives.

The Committee at once contributed 450*l.* towards the fund raised in the locality for the widows and nine young children of the deceased.

Shipwrecks.—According to the most recent published statistics, shipwrecks have of late considerably increased in number around the British coast, necessarily resulting in a corresponding increase in the number of lives lost. It must be apparent to all, therefore, that it is more than ever incumbent on the public to do all that can be done to multiply and sustain the means, which science has placed at its disposal, to lessen the evils which it would seem cannot be averted, and it is most gratifying to find that in the past year so much has been done in this direction by the brave and intrepid crews of the Life-boats of the ROYAL NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION.

In 1883 the Life-boats were launched 283 times, frequently, of course, without any result as regards the saving of life, but still, whenever a signal of distress is shown, immediate and prompt action must be taken. The services of the Life-boats during each month of the year were as follows:—

The best thanks of the Committee are due to the officers and men of the Coast-guard for the important services they continue to render in their exertions to save life, and for the valuable co-operation received from them and the Volunteer Rocket Brigades.

Since the establishment of the Institution in 1824, sixty years ago, no less than 30,563 lives have been saved through

its instrumentality, as shown in the sub-joined table:—

This splendid list of services is the best and strongest argument which can be adduced in support of the maintenance and extension of the operations of the ROYAL NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION.

Rewards.—In 1883, 14 Silver Medals and Clasps, 25 Votes of Thanks on vellum, and 5,397*l.*, were granted by the Committee, including grants to widows and orphans of Life-boatmen killed on duty, for the saving of 955 lives on the shores of Great Britain and Ireland by means of Life-boats and shore-boats. Every one of these cases has been most carefully considered by the Committee, who have been ably assisted in their inquiries by the Honorary Secretaries of the various Branches, by Officers of the Coastguard and Customs, and by others in a position to help.

Altogether from its foundation the Institution has voted 97 Gold Medals, 964

Silver Medals, and 77,984*l.* in cash for saving life from shipwrecks on our coasts.

Local Committees.—The Committee have to tender their warm thanks to the Committees of the Local Branches, and more particularly to the Honorary Secretaries of those Branches, for the hearty and valuable co-operation which they have continued to give; and it is needless to say, that without such indispensable aid it would be impossible to carry on the work of the Institution.

The Committee take this opportunity of acknowledging the invaluable help they have again received during the past year from the Public Press, and from the Publishers of the principal Magazines, who have lost no opportunity to make known the work carried on by the Institution, either by giving publicity to the services of the Life-boats, or by inserting appeals free of charge.

The Committee have at the same time to thank the Religious Tract Society for having, in December last, distributed illuminated Christmas Cards among all the Life-boatmen in the United Kingdom.

Finances.—It will be observed that the appended financial statement, which has been audited and signed by Mr. LOVELOCK, Chartered Accountant, furnishes more details than usual of the items of receipt and expenditure. This has been done in order that the Subscribers and Donors may more fully understand the manner in which the money, entrusted by them to the Committee, has been expended.

The subscriptions, donations, dividends, &c., amounted during the past year to 40,250*l.* 16*s.*, which sum included 3,767*l.* 17*s.* 7*d.* in special gifts for expenses connected with the following seven Life-boats:—

During the past year the total expenditure was 45,817*l.* 1*s.* 4*d.*; but of this no less than 8,200*l.* represented abnormal charges altogether special to this particular year, viz., 3,900*l.* granted to the Widow and Orphans of the late Secretary, 3,800*l.* granted to ADMIRAL WARD on his retirement from the post of Chief Inspector of Life-boats, and 500*l.* granted to the International Fisheries Exhibition for life-saving apparatus.

Mr. LEWIS's services to the Institution during a period of thirty-three years are too well known to the Public to need further comment.

ADMIRAL WARD, whose inventions, improvements, and indefatigable services to the Life-boat cause have been instrumental in saving thousands of lives, had been for thirty-one and a half years the highly esteemed and invaluable Inspector of the Institution.

The other items of expenditure comprised 7,753*l.* 19*s.* 11*d.* laid out on building, altering and repairing Life-boats, Life-boat Houses, Slipways and Transporting-carriages; 13,997*l.* 7*s.* 1*d.* on Life-boat stores, Life-belts, subsidies to poor and outlying stations, Aneroids for fishermen and coasters, the Store-yard at Poplar and the Inspector's Department, the importance of which branch of the work cannot be overrated; 10,816*l.* 13*s.* 1*d.* was also paid to coxswains and Life-boat crews for exercising the Life-boats, for special rewards for services, for medals and vellums, and for the widows and orphans of Life-boatmen killed on duty.

The balance of expenditure has been laid out in the publication of the *Life-boat*

Journal and Report, architect's charges, rent of offices, repairs, housekeeper, stationery, postage, &c., and secretarial and clerical salaries, which last item, owing to changes which have lately been made, is considerably lower than it has been for many years.

In conclusion, the Committee, in view of the splendid services which have been rendered by the Life-boats, and the efficiency which has been maintained in the service, strongly appeal once more to the public for help and sustained support, and they are confident that such an appeal, made in the interests of humanity, will not pass unheeded, but will meet with a prompt and ready response.

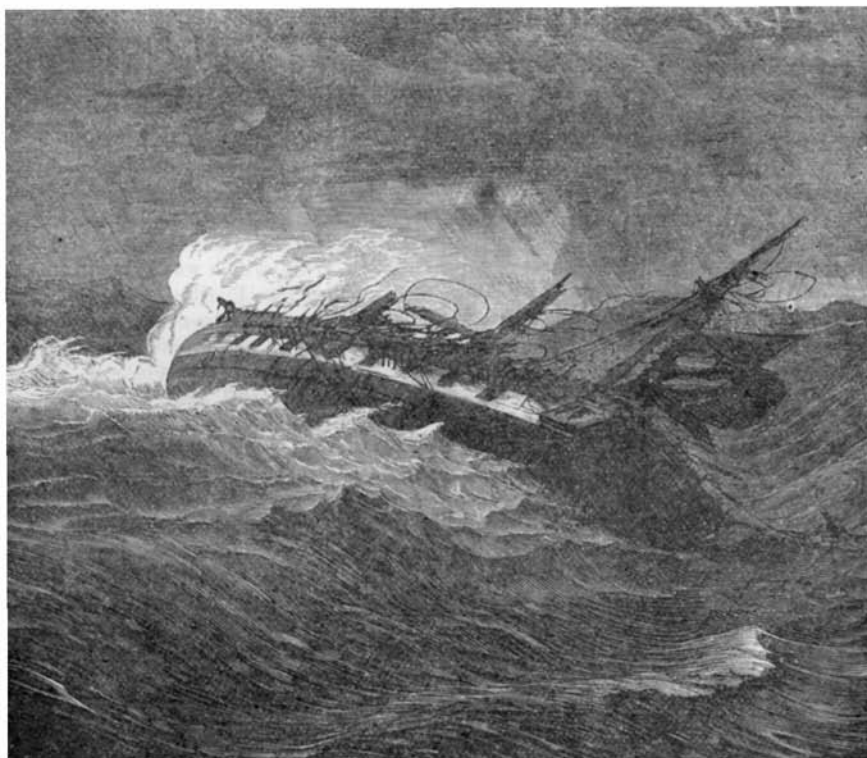

FOR SAVING LIFE FROM WRECKS

VOTED BY THE ROYAL NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION

TO THE CREWS OF ITS LIFE-BOATS, TO SHORE AND FISHING-BOATS' CREWS, AND TO OTHER PERSONS,

FROM THE 1ST JANUARY TO THE 31ST DECEMBER, 1883.

Jan. 1.—At about 6 P.M., during a S. wind and misty weather, the Cresswell fishermen observed signal rockets being sent up. Two of the men ran along the beach and found a steamer on the strand firing rockets and signal guns. The Life-boat *Old Potter*, stationed at Cresswell, was launched as soon as possible, proceeded to the stranded vessel, and, at the request of the master, remained alongside in case her services might be required. Ultimately, with the assistance of the Life-boat's crew, the vessel was got afloat:

she was the *Congo*, of Cardiff, bound from Calcutta to Dundee, with a cargo of jute, tea, &c.

COMMITTEE MEETING, Jan. 4th, 1883.

Voted 57*l.* 7*s.* 6*d.* to pay the expenses of the Withernsea, Grimsby, Carnsore, Winchelsea, Seaton Carew, Rye, Irvine, and Saltburn Life-boats, in assembling their crews, or putting off in reply to signals of distress.

The Ramsgate Life-boat had also been

taken out to the aid of a distressed vessel, but her services were not ultimately needed.

Jan. 8.—The smack *Spring*, of Guernsey, bound from Swansea to Dinan, with coal, when near the Land's End, was observed to be showing a signal of distress, at 1.30 P.M. The Life-boat *Denzil and Maria Onslow* stationed at Sennen Cove, at once went to her assistance and found that she had been run into by a schooner, carrying away her jibboom and part of her stem and causing her to leak very badly. The chief officer of Coast Guard, who had gone out in the Life-boat, and two of the Life-boat men got on board the smack and, having anchored her safely, brought her crew of three men ashore in the Life-boat.—Expense of service 10*l.* 12*s.*

Jan. 9.—At about 2.30 P.M., during a heavy gale from the E.S.E. and a high sea, signals being heard from the sandbanks in Studland Bay, the *Boys' Own*, No. 2, Life-boat stationed at Poole, Dorset, was launched, and towed by a steamer to the mouth of the harbour, when it was ascertained that a large brig was exhibiting signals of distress. The Life-boat made for the vessel, and found her to be the *Victor*, of Neustadt, Germany, heavily laden with a cargo of coal. She was riding in a very dangerous position, the sea making a clean breach over her, and her figure-head, cutwater and a portion of her port bow bulwarks had been knocked away. The crew refused to leave the vessel, and the Life-boat therefore remained by her for about an hour, when the wind moderating she returned to her station.—Expense of service, 14*l.* 14*s.*

Jan. 12.—The coxswain of the Cullercoats, Northumberland, Life-boat *Palmerston*, was called at 1 o'clock in the morning, and informed that a vessel was ashore on the north side of Tynemouth Sands. The Life-boat was manned and launched as quickly as possible, and on approaching the vessel—the s.s. *Libelle*, of Hamburg, bound from Bergen, Norway, to North Shields, in ballast, with a crew of twenty-one persons, and eight passengers—it was found that two of her boats had been lowered and swamped immediately. The crews were rescued by the Life-boat and landed on the beach. She then returned to the steamer, took

off fourteen men, and having brought them to land, went back once more and returned with the remainder of those on board. The wind was blowing a strong breeze from the S.E., accompanied by a very high sea, which filled the Life-boat twice and broke or damaged several of her oars.—Expense of service, 32*l.*

Jan. 20.—During a gale of wind from the W.S.W., and an exceedingly rough sea, the Huna, Caithness-shire Life-boat *W.M.C.* was launched, at 1 A.M., to the assistance of the fishing-boat *Margaret Gunn*, of Wick, which was in a dangerous position in the Pentland Firth, being close to tremendous breakers. On reaching the vessel it was found that her mast had been broken while she was in the German Ocean, and that she was in a sinking condition. Her crew, consisting of seven men, were therefore taken into the Life-boat and brought safely ashore.—Expense of service, 16*l.* 14*s.*

Jan. 23.—Signals of distress were seen in Holyhead Bay, during a whole gale of wind from the S.S.W., at 9.30 P.M. The *Thomas Fielden* Life-boat proceeded out, and found that the brig *Lewis*, of Carnarvon, had dragged her anchor and had come into collision with the three-mast schooner *Nellie*, of Bridgwater, which was lying at anchor. The Life-boat remained by the vessels until a steamer arrived and got them clear.—Expense of service, 15*l.* 5*s.*

Jan. 23.—About 2 P.M. a smack was observed far out in Fishguard Bay, Pembrokeshire, evidently endeavouring to make for the roadstead. The wind at the time was blowing a fresh gale from the S.S.E., with heavy squalls, in one of which the smack lost her bowsprit, jib and foresail, and was otherwise considerably damaged. She was then about three miles S.S.E. of Dinas Head, and being entirely disabled and drifting out, she let go two anchors and hoisted signals of distress. The Fishguard No. 2 Life-boat, *Helen of Foxley*, immediately went to her assistance, and on reaching her the master requested the coxswain to take entire charge of her, as he and his crew were completely exhausted. Some of the Life-boatmen boarded the smack, cleared away the wreckage, and having bent a spare jib as a foresail and close reefed the mainsail, took her safely into the harbour. She was the *Ina Lass*, of Newquay,

bound from Swansea to Newquay with a cargo of small coal.

Jan. 24.—A signal of distress was seen in Moelfre Bay, Anglesey, during a storm from the S., at about 2 p.m. The *Lady Vivian* Life-boat put off, and found that the signal was shown by the smack *Frens*, of Beaumaris, bound from Cemaes, Anglesey, to Lancaster, with a cargo of oats. Her crew of three men were in the utmost peril, and were on the point of leaving their vessel when the Life-boat arrived and took them safely to land.—Expense of service, 6*l.* 9*s.*

Jan. 25.—Two schooners were at anchor in St. Bride's Bay, Pembrokeshire, while a gale of wind was blowing from the S. It was thought advisable to warn the crew of the Life-boat *Friend*, stationed at Littlehaven, to be in readiness should their services be required, as the vessels would be in danger if the wind shifted to the W. or N.W., as it not unfrequently does on this coast after a S. gale. At about 10 p.m. this occurred, and a watch was kept for any signals that might be shown; but none were exhibited. At about 10.30 two of the Life-boatmen reported that they could see a light just outside the breakers on the shore. This proved to be from a boat of one of the vessels carrying her anchor-light, the crew trying to find a place where to land. They finally ran through the breakers and succeeded in getting safely ashore. On hearing from the captain that he thought the other vessel would soon be stranded, the Life-boat crew were summoned, one man immediately going to show a light at the store-room at Goldtop as a guide to the crew of the vessel, should they also attempt to land. The Life-boat then put off and met the crew just as they had taken to their boat. The men having been transferred to the Life-boat, their boat was taken in tow, and all were safely landed at Goldtop. The vessel was the schooner *Nanteos*, of Aberystwyth, bound from Portmadoc to Southampton, with slates. She had a crew of four men.—Expense of service, 12*l.*

Jan. 26.—The barque *Brothers*, of Yarmouth, N.S., anchored in shallow water off Penrhyn Point, Anglesey, during a whole gale from the N.W. and a very heavy sea. As she had parted one anchor and was dragging the other the Holyhead Life-boat, *Thomas Fielden*, went to her

assistance. The Life-boat finding two steam-tugs near the vessel made their hawsers fast to the barque, and she was taken safely into the old harbour. She had a crew of twelve men.

Jan. 26.—At 2.30 a.m., during a heavy gale from the S. to S.W., a steam vessel was seen to get on the North Barber Sand, off the Norfolk coast. The crew of the Caister Life-boat were called together, and the No. 1 Life-boat, the *Covent Garden*, was about to be launched, when a brigantine was observed to go on the south end of the Sand. It was then agreed to launch the No. 2 Life-boat *Godsend* also, the No. 1 to go to the steamer, and the No. 2 boat to the brigantine. The No. 1 boat, however, was compelled by the shallowness of the water to pass close to the brigantine, and finding that the sea was breaking clean over her, the Life-boatmen, fearing she would break up, could not risk passing her, so letting go their anchor, veered down, and with great difficulty took off the crew, consisting of six men. This vessel was the *Dare*, of Sunderland, bound from that port to Caen, with a cargo of coal. The Life-boat then proceeded to the steamer; but as she was not in the break of the sea, she declined assistance. The boat then set sail, beat back to the brigantine, and found the No. 2 Life-boat riding by her. At flood tide the vessel knocked off the Sand; some of the Life-boatmen and her own crew then boarded her, and a steam-tug coming up, the vessel and Life-boat were towed into harbour. The men when taken out of the vessel were in a most exhausted condition, and had not some rum which was in the Life-boat been given to them, in all probability some of them would have died in the boat.—Expense of service, 18*l.*

Jan. 27.—It was reported that a steamer was ashore on Sunderland Bank, off Fleetwood, at 6.30 p.m., during a gale of wind from the N.W. and a heavy sea. The Fleetwood Life-boat, *Child of Hale*, proceeded as soon as possible to the vessel, in tow of the tug *Fylde*, and found the sea making a clean breach over her. The boat stood by her, and at the request of the master, one of the Life-boatmen was put on board the vessel to take her to some port. After coming off the bank she, being light, would not steam against the wind, so she went before it to Glasson

Dock, where she arrived safely. On the 29th the weather moderated, and the Life-boatman, who was still on board, brought the vessel back to Fleetwood. She was the s.s. *Eden*, 933 tons register, bound from Fleetwood to Cardiff in ballast, and had a crew of 21 men, the captain, his wife and child, and one passenger on board.

Jan. 28.—At about 4.30 P.M. the barque *Argo*, of Sunderland, was sighted off Ballycotton, making for Cork harbour, close-hauled, the wind then blowing very hard from the S.S.W., with heavy rain. On the wind changing to W.S.W., she had to run for Ballycotton, and anchored in six fathoms. While paying out, the cable snapped at 35 fathoms before the ship came head to wind, and she was driven ashore. The Life-boat *Oliver Goldsmith*, stationed at Ballycotton was launched at 8 P.M., in answer to signals of distress, but could not approach the ship nearer than a cable's length, on account of the heavy sea then running; she therefore stood by all night to render assistance when possible. At 4.30 on the following morning the boat returned to her station, communication having been established with the ship by means of a rocket. The crew, however, did not avail themselves of this, and the Life-boat therefore again proceeded to the vessel, the weather having moderated, put a pilot on board, and brought ashore the master's orders for tugs, &c. All efforts to get the barque afloat were unsuccessful, and she ultimately became a total wreck on the beach. Expense of service, 24*l*.

COMMITTEE MEETING, Feb. 1st, 1883.

Voted 22*l*. 10*s*. 6*d*. to pay the expenses of the Holyhead, Flamborough No. 2, Courtmacsherry, Bridlington, Lowestoft, Porthdinllaen, Palling No. 2, Southport, Lytham, Porthoustock, New Brighton, Duncannon, Tenby, and Porthcawl Life-boats, in assembling their crews or putting off to the assistance of vessels which did not eventually require the aid of the Boats.

Also 800*l*. in aid of the fund for the relief of the widows and children of the four Life-boatmen who unfortunately perished on the occasion of the accident to the Swansea Life-boat on the 27th Jan.

Also 50*l*. to the coxswain of the Life-

boat, in consideration of the severe injuries he received on the occasion, and 10*l*. each to two of the crew of the Life-boat who also sustained injuries.

Also 69*l*. to pay the expenses of the service, the crew of the Life-boat being awarded 5*l*. per man.

Also 2*l*. to Gunner Edward Hutchins, R.A., for services rendered to some of the crew of the boat.

Also the Silver Medal of the Institution to Mr. JENKIN JENKINS, coxswain of the Mumbles (Swansea) Life-boat, who had on many occasions rendered good service in saving life from shipwreck.

Also 200*l*. in aid of the fund for the relief of the widow and children of one of the crew of the New Brighton No. 2 Life-boat, who was washed out of the boat while out on service on the 26th Jan.

Feb. 1.—The coxswain of the Life-boat *Albert Edward*, stationed at Padstow, Cornwall, was informed at 9.30 P.M., that a vessel was showing signals of distress. The crew of the Life-boat were at once summoned, and proceeded to the boat-house, when they observed a vessel brought up in a dangerous position, about half a mile from Stepper Point. The Life-boat was launched, proceeded to the vessel, which proved to be the schooner *Mary Josephine*, of Padstow, bound from Padstow to Hayle with slate, and brought her crew of three men ashore. The weather afterwards moderated, and the vessel fortunately held to her anchors.—Expense of service, 13*l*. 6*s*.

Feb. 2.—At about 9 o'clock in the morning the schooner *Rosebud*, of Goole, was seen from St. Andrew's, but the weather becoming thick she was lost sight of. She was next observed at about 11 o'clock, when she seemed to be heading for the Eden mouth. The Life-boat *Ladies' Own* was despatched to her assistance, but before she could reach her the schooner had gone ashore on the North Bank of the Eden, and her crew, consisting of four men, were compelled to take to the rigging from which they were rescued by the Life-boat. The vessel, which was bound from Sunderland to Montrose with a cargo of coal, became a total wreck.—Expense of service, 25*l*. 14*s*. 6*d*.

Feb. 5.—At about 11 o'clock in the morning during a strong gale of wind from the S., and a heavy sea, signals of

distress were shown by the Blackwater Lightship off the Wexford Coast. The Cahore Life-boat, *John Brooke* was launched, proceeded to her, and found that she had on board the crew, consisting of six men, of the brigantine *Zephyr*, of Rye. Their vessel had struck on the Blackwater Bank at 8.30 the previous night, and immediately appeared to be breaking-up; the crew therefore launched their boat, and with much difficulty succeeded in getting on board the Lightship. They were taken into the Life-boat and brought safely to shore. Expense of service, 12*l.* 18*s.*

Feb. 6.—A messenger having brought information at 1.30 P.M. that a vessel was ashore on the north end of the Long Rock, the crew of the Ballywalter, Co. Down, *Admiral Henry Meynell* Life-boat at once assembled, and crowds of the villagers dragged the boat by road to the scene of the wreck, much difficulty being experienced in getting her to the shore, on account of there being two ditches on the way. The boat was at last launched, but notwithstanding the noble exertions of her crew to battle with the fierce gale blowing from the E.S.E., she was driven ashore with great violence, three of her oars being broken. Owing to the strength of the gale and the violence of the surf great difficulty was experienced in saving the boat. After renewed exertions, however, she was again launched at 3 A.M., and succeeded in rescuing the crew of the vessel, consisting of six men, who had been all night in the rigging. The vessel was the brig *Euphemia Fullerton*, of Londonderry, bound to that port from Maryport with a cargo of coal. She became a total wreck.

The Rev. J. O'REILLY BLACKWOOD, the Honorary Secretary of the Ballywalter Branch of the Institution, went out as usual in the Life-boat, taking charge of her, and rendering valuable assistance. Mr. GEORGE PRIOR, chief officer of H.M. Coastguard at Ballywalter, rendered noble service in wading into the surf and assisting to get the boat launched, and Mr. J. B. GLOVER also rendered valuable aid on the occasion.

The Second Service Clasp of the Institution was awarded to the Rev. J. O'R. BLACKWOOD. The Silver Medal to Mr. PRIOR, and the thanks of the Institution, inscribed on vellum to Mr. GLOVER, in

acknowledgment of their co-operation. Extra rewards were also granted to the crew and launchers of the Life-boat. Total expense of service, 39*l.*

Feb. 7.—Several fishing boats proceeded to sea from Port Isaac, Cornwall, in the morning, the weather being fine and the sea comparatively smooth. At about 11 A.M., however, a tremendous ground sea arose, almost suddenly, and the boats were in great danger, and could not for several hours venture to enter the harbour. The *Richard and Sarah* Life-boat went to their rescue, towed in four of the boats, containing seven men, and accompanied the others in entering the harbour.

Feb. 7.—In answer to a telegram, the Harwich Life-boat *Springwell* was manned at noon and put off to the rescue of the crew of a vessel ashore on the Shipwash Sand, off the Coast of Essex. A strong S.S.E. wind was blowing at the time, and the sea was heavy on the Sands. The tug *Harwich* picked the boat up outside the harbour and towed her to the Sands, where the coxswain first spoke a large screw steamer, the *Sea*, of Aberdeen, and found that she had been lying by the wreck and that the master had made several unsuccessful attempts to rescue the crew who were still on the wreck. The tug then towed the Life-boat to windward so that she could set her sails and reach the wreck. On arriving alongside the vessel, which was found to be the barque *Loreley*, of Memel, bound from Memel to London, with a cargo of timber, the Life-boat anchored, threw her grappling-rope to her, and, with much difficulty and danger owing to floating wreckage, rescued her crew, consisting of eleven men, by means of the rope. The tug then brought the Life-boat back to the harbour, arriving there at about 6 P.M. The vessel was a total wreck, her foremast and mainmast having been carried away, she had lost her boats, and her crew were in an exhausted condition having been in the rigging some hours. Expense of service, 11*l.* 19*s.* 6*d.*

Feb. 7.—The *Charles Dibdin* Life-boat stationed at Tynemouth put off to the disabled brigantine *Hannah and Eleanor*, of Seaham, and some of her crew rendered assistance with the view of saving the vessel.

Feb. 7.—At 4 P.M., signals of distress were observed from the fishing smack

Pioneer, of Lowestoft, which had stranded in Pakefield Gat, Suffolk. The Kessingland No. 1 Life-boat, *Bolton*, was promptly launched and proceeded to the vessel. The tide was flowing at the time and a heavy sea was running. The smack eventually got afloat, and as she was leaking she accepted the assistance of the Life-boat, which accompanied her to Lowestoft.

Feb. 7.—At 6.30 P.M., the fishing smack *Young Alice*, of Scarborough, was endeavouring to enter that harbour during a S.S.E. wind and a very heavy sea, but not having sufficient canvas set she was driven on the beach. The *Lady Leigh* Life-boat promptly went to her assistance and brought ashore her crew, consisting of five men.—Expense of service, 16*l.* 4*s.*

Feb. 10.—At 6 A.M. signals of distress were observed on the north end of the Barnard Sand, off the Coast of Suffolk. The wind at the time was blowing a strong breeze from the S.W. and the sea was rough. The Kessingland No. 2 Life-boat, *St. Michael's, Paddington*, was soon launched through a very heavy surf, and made for the distressed brig, the *Marnhull*, of Weymouth, bound from London to Middlesbrough, with scrap iron. She had sunk on the North end of the Barnard Sand, and her crew of six men had taken refuge in the rigging, from which one of them fell and was unfortunately killed. After eight attempts the Life-boat succeeded in taking off the five survivors and landed them at Lowestoft.—Expense of service, 23*l.*

Feb. 10.—At about 5.50 P.M., the schooner *Teresa*, of Weymouth, bound from Guernsey to London, with granite, was observed to be driving on shore, at Worthing, Sussex. A strong gale of wind from the S. was blowing and the sea was heavy. The crew of the Life-boat *Henry Harris* were immediately summoned, and as it was evident that the vessel could not possibly keep off the lee shore, it was decided to use the Life-boat. Horses had been sent for; but before they arrived the crew and assistants ran the boat and carriage 400 yards over the sands. The vessel was soon reached, and the crew, numbering four men, saved. The schooner drove ashore about half a mile East of Worthing pier and became a total wreck.—Expense of service, 20*l.* 7*s.* 6*d.*

Feb. 11.—Signals of distress were

reported to have been seen in Church Bay, Anglesey, at about 11.15 P.M. The Holyhead Life-boat, *Thomas Fielden*, therefore proceeded to the spot and found the brig *J.B.S.*, of London, at anchor close to the rocks. After consulting with the coxswain, the master decided, if possible, to bring the vessel into harbour. About ten of the Life-boat's crew accordingly went on board the brig and tried to heave up her anchors, but failing in the attempt, the starboard chain parting, some of them returned to the boat leaving four of their number on the vessel. Her sails were then set, her port anchor slipped, and she stood out to the westward, it being hoped that the tempest would moderate. The gale, however, increased, and about 4 A.M. the brig shipped a heavy sea which completely swept her decks, half filled her cabin and strained her considerably. Ultimately she was obliged to run for Barrow-in-Furness as she was leaking badly, the pumps having to be kept going all the time and all hands being nearly exhausted. The vessel was on a voyage from Liverpool to Port Natal with a cargo of coal, and carried a crew of eight men, two of whom were laid up and unable to leave their berths.

Feb. 14.—At 5.30 A.M., the schooner *Don*, of Aberdeen, bound to Sunderland with chalk, stranded on the South Barber Sand during a strong S. wind and a heavy sea. The Caister No. 2 Life-boat *The Godsend*, promptly went to her assistance, and with the help of a steam-tug, eventually succeeded in getting her afloat. She had a crew of five men.

Feb. 17.—It was reported at 2.15 P.M. that a vessel at Newhaven was ashore at the back of the East pier. The *Michael Henry* Life-boat immediately went to her rescue, and found she was the ketch *Thomas and John*, of Fowey, bound from London to Plymouth with cement. She had struck on the bar in running for the harbour in a sinking condition, and as she was full of water and fast going to pieces, her crew of three men were taken into the Life-boat and brought ashore. Expense of service, 7*l.* 10*s.*

COMMITTEE MEETING, March 1st, 1883.

Voted 41*l.* 16*s.* to pay the expenses of the Winterton No. 2. Castletown, Dun-

garvan, Holyhead, Llanddwyn, Southport, Lowestoft, Bembridge, Hayling Island, Ramsey, Anstruther, Caister No. 1, South-end, N.B., Douglas No. 2, Tynemouth No. 1, Aldborough, Harwich, Pakefield No. 1, Broughty Ferry, Falmouth, Maryport, Plymouth, Torquay, Montrose No. 1, Arbroath, Hythe, and Great Yarmouth Life-boats, in either assembling their crews or launching to the aid of vessels, which did not ultimately need their assistance.

The Scarborough Life-boat had also been taken afloat, but her services were not eventually needed.

Voted the Silver Medal of the Institution to Mr. WILLIAM WEBB, late coxswain of the Padstow Life-boat, in recognition of his gallant services in the boat during the past thirteen years.

Also the Silver Medal to Mr. ROBERT FELL, Coxswain of the Ramsey Life-boat, in acknowledgment of his good services; he had been compelled by ill-health and advanced age to resign his office.

Also 10*l.* to two of the crew of the Hayle Life-boat, who were injured on the occasion of the capsizing of that boat on the 16th Nov. last.

March 1.—The s.s. *Barnsley*, of Grimsby, stranded on the Scroby Sand at 7.30 A.M., during a N.N.E. wind. A Caister yawl went to her assistance; but during the time she was lying by the vessel, the Life-boatmen, fearing the sea might increase with the flood-tide, launched the Caister No. 2 Life-boat *Godsend*, proceeded to the vessel, and remained by her until she came off. The steamer was bound from Antwerp to Grimsby with a general cargo, and had a crew of twenty-one persons, and ten passengers on board.

March 5.—During a severe gale of wind from the N. and a heavy sea in Scrabster Roads, the schooner *Hephzibah*, bound from Carnarvon to Newcastle, with slates, and the smack *Annie*, of Port Dinorwic, bound for Wick, showed flare-up lights. The Thurso Life-boat, *Charley Lloyd*, went out at 11 P.M., and brought ashore the crews, consisting of five men from the *Hephzibah* and three men from the *Annie*. At 4 o'clock on the following morning the Life-boat again went out in reply to distress signals, and brought ashore six men from the *Bella*, of Wick; three men from the *William and Martha*; and four men

from the *Governor Loch*, of Inverness.—Expense of service 18*l.* 16*s.*

March 6.—The s.s. *Lynx*, of Cardiff, bound from that port to Portreath, with coal, sprung a leak when off Morthoe Point, near Ilfracombe, and, with the view of saving the lives of the crew, the master ran her on Wollecombe Sands. The coxswain of the *Grace Woodbury* Life-boat, stationed at Morte Bay, on being informed of the occurrence, at once went to Morthoe to ascertain the position of the vessel; but as the weather was moderate it did not appear to be necessary to launch the Life-boat. At 11 A.M. the wind freshened to a strong breeze from the N., and a heavy swell rose. The leak having been temporarily stopped, the master of the steamer requested that the Life-boat might be launched to stand by her. This was accordingly done; but in trying to get the vessel off (six of the Life-boatmen having gone on board to assist), a warp got foul of the propeller, and she had therefore to remain until the next day, her crew of seven men being brought ashore in the Life-boat at 6.30 P.M. The vessel was then leaking very badly, the water having put the fires out before the abandonment took place. At 3.30 P.M. on the following day, at the request of Lloyd's agent and the master, the Life-boat was again launched and made for the stranded vessel. The master now gave up charge to the crew of the boat, and the steamer was eventually floated off at 4.30, the Life-boat accompanying her over the bar to Appledore, one of the Life-boat's crew being in charge as pilot. The vessel was finally anchored in safety in Appledore Pool at 7.30 P.M. The crew of the Life-boat having been exposed so long a time to the violence of the weather, remained at Appledore during the night, and returned with their boat to Morte Bay against a strong wind at 8 A.M., arriving at their station at 2 P.M.

March 6.—During a very severe gale from the N.E. signals of distress were shown by the fishing-yawl *William Clowes*, of Filey, which was at anchor in that bay. As the tide was then close up to the cliffs, it was impossible to launch the Filey Life-boat *Hollon* until 3.30, when she was got off, but grounded. A wave then sent her broadside on, very nearly dashing her against the cliff, which would have soon knocked her to pieces, had not

a large number of men rushed into the water, got the boat stem on, and after half an hour's hard work, succeeded in floating her. She then safely reached the vessel and brought the crew of six men ashore. Several of the men who extricated the Life-boat from her perilous position incurred the greatest risk, and being at times quite immersed, it was wonderful that none of them were drowned, and that the boat was not destroyed.

Three gentlemen, Mr. ALFRED THORNEY, Mr. GEORGE MARR, and Mr. JOHN CAMBRIDGE, rendered valuable assistance on the occasion, for which they received the thanks of the Institution.—Expense of service, 48*l*.

March 6.—At 2.30 P.M. the schooner *Mary Coad*, of Port Isaac, Cornwall, bound from Antwerp to Middlesbrough, which was riding in the Humber about half a mile N.N.W. of the Bull Buoy, was observed flying a signal of distress in the main rigging. The Grimsby Life-boat *Manchester Unity* was launched and proceeded to her assistance. With some difficulty, three of the crew of the Life-boat boarded the vessel and found the captain and crew of four men in an exhausted condition. A steam-tug at this juncture endeavoured to tow the schooner up the river, but failed to do so in consequence of the tow-rope parting. Three more of the Life-boatmen then boarded the vessel, got two tow-ropes out to the tug, and set the reefed stay and boom fore sails, these being the only two available sails. The schooner was thus got under weigh and taken to Grimsby Docks.

March 6.—The ketch *Mary Tweedlie*, of Berwick, was seen from Holy Island to be running before the wind, under bare poles, at 3 P.M., during a fearful gale of wind from N. to N.E. and a very heavy sea, the whole bar and the sea, as far as the eye could reach, being one mass of broken water. The Holy Island No. 1 Life-boat, *Grace Darling*, was launched, and was more than three hours in reaching the vessel. The crew pulled bravely until almost exhausted; but every time they seemed to be near enough to throw a line on board, a huge wave washed them about a hundred yards astern. This was repeated ten or twelve times before the Life-boat men were able to get a rope fast to the vessel, after which they took two men into the boat by means of the life-

buoy, in a very exhausted and numbed condition. One of the crew had received a blow on the head from a falling spar, at about 12 o'clock, and had died soon afterwards.—Expense of service, 29*l*. 10*s*.

March 6.—At about 5 o'clock in the afternoon a schooner was observed coming from the W. and making for Scrabster Roads. As the sea was very heavy, and the wind was blowing strongly from the N., fears were entertained that she would drive ashore. The Thurso Life-boat *Charley Lloyd* therefore put off and found her to be the *Enigma*, of Port St. Mary, Isle of Man, bound from Runcorn to Arbroath with a cargo of salt. She brought up far out in the roadstead, and her crew, consisting of five men, were landed by the Life-boat.—Expense of service, 9*l*.

March 6.—At about 6.30 P.M., the trawler, *Emerald Isle*, of Whitehaven, which had been beating about in Ramsey Bay, Isle of Man, for about three hours, evidently waiting for water, suddenly made for the harbour mouth, and grounded outside in a very heavy surf. The Ramsey Life-boat, *Two Sisters*, was launched with great promptitude, and brought ashore the vessel's crew consisting of four men. One of the Life-boat men was washed overboard during this service, but was fortunately rescued.—Expense of service, 17*l*. 14*s*.

March 7.—The barquentine *Vicuna*, of Hull, bound from Laurvig, Norway, to Hull, with ice, was observed ashore near Holme Point, near Hunstanton, at 5.15 P.M., during a moderate gale of wind from the N.N.E. and a rough sea. The *Licensed Victualler* Life-boat, stationed at Hunstanton, was taken to Holme Point, distant three miles and a half, over a heavy road, was launched at 6.30, and succeeded in rescuing the vessel's crew, consisting of nine men.—Expense of service, 19*l*. 10*s*.

March 8.—At 3 P.M. a vessel was seen striking on the Flats off Brancaster, Norfolk, and showing signals of distress. The crew of the *Lily Bird* Life-boat mustered, launched their boat as soon as possible, and proceeded to the vessel, by that time aground on the beach at Titchwell. The breakers being very heavy, and the mainmast going over the side to leeward, the Life-boat's anchor was let go to windward, and the boat veered down towards the wreck; but from the nature of the ground, the anchor could not hold.

The crew, therefore, weighed the anchor, and tried again, with a similar result. As it was impossible to go alongside without great risk of staving the boat, they remained as near the vessel as was prudent, until the tide fell and all danger was over. They then landed at Titchwell, afterwards assisting the crew of the barque to do the same about 9 P.M. She proved to be the *Margaret*, of Christiania, bound from Grimstad to Dover with ice.—Expense of service, 18*l.* 12*s.* 6*d.*

March 11.—At about 8.30 P.M., during a violent gale from the N.E., accompanied by thick snow-showers and a very heavy sea, signals of distress were exhibited from the Long Scar Rocks off Seaton Carew. The Life-boat, *Job Hindley*, was at once launched, and proceeded in the direction indicated, but no trace of any wreck could be found. HENRY HOOD, the coxswain, and one of the crew named JOHN FRANKLIN, then determined to land on the reef and make a thorough search for it, as it was impossible to take the Life-boat among the rocks in the darkness. With much difficulty and danger, the sea breaking heavily over them, and the coxswain on one occasion being washed off the rocks, they at last discovered the wreck, and being afterwards joined by another of the Life-boat men, MATTHEW FRANKLIN, they, after many ineffectual attempts, succeeded in throwing the heaving line over the stern. Just as this was accomplished, Hood heard a voice, and seeing some dark object in the surf, he rushed into the sea, and, with the aid of his companions, rescued a man, who proved to be the mate of the vessel, in a most exhausted condition. They then hailed the wreck, and the remaining four men, by means of the communicating line, were got on to the rocks. The rescuers and the rescued now made for the Life-boat; after a perilous journey across the rocks, which were being swept by the sea, they at last reached it, and pulled for the shore, which was made in safety about half an hour after midnight. The wrecked vessel was the schooner *Atlas*, of Drammen, bound thence to Sunderland. She broke up very soon after the crew had been rescued.

Her Majesty the Queen subsequently conferred the decoration of the Albert Medal of the Second Class on HENRY HOOD, in recognition of his most gallant

conduct on this occasion, and the Institution also awarded its Silver Medal to him, and to the two FRANKLINS.—Expense of service, 35*l.* 3*s.*

March 13.—The *Ashtonian* Life-boat, stationed at Cemaes, Anglesey, was launched at 11.15 A.M., a steamer having been seen to run on the Platters Rocks in Skerries Sound. She ultimately foundered near the Victoria buoy, and her crew of six men having taken to their boat, were picked up by the Life-boat and brought to Cemaes. The vessel proved to be the *Annie Hope*, of Leith, bound from Bideford to Northwich with pipe-clay.—Expense of service, 7*l.* 11*s.*

March 18.—The smack *London*, of Jersey, was in great danger off Montrose at 1.30 P.M., having steered too far north while making for that port. The No. 1 Life-boat, *Mincing Lane*, having been launched, took up a position inside the bar, to show the vessel in which direction to steer. The smack, however, was struck by a heavy sea, and jibed, with her head to the N. across the point of the Annat; another sea canted her head again, and she then managed to stand in across the bank towards the Life-boat, and eventually got safely in.—Expense of service, 8*l.* 2*s.* 6*d.*

March 19.—At about 4 A.M. the Montrose No. 1 Life-boat, *Mincing Lane*, was launched to the aid of the smack *Orange Blossom*, of Jersey, which was making for the harbour during a strong gale, accompanied by snowstorms and a very heavy sea. She was keeping much too far north, and was steering to cross the Annat bank. The Life-boat showed the direction in which she should steer, and the vessel was brought safely into port.—Expense of service, 8*l.* 2*s.* 6*d.*

March 19.—The fishing smack *Wellesley*, of Scarborough, while making for the harbour at dead low-water, during a gale of wind from the S.E. and a heavy sea, at 7.30 P.M., took the ground outside the pier and drove on to the beach. The Scarborough Life-boat, *Lady Leigh*, went off to her, took a rope to the pier, remained by her until the water flowed, and then assisted her into the harbour.

March 19.—At about 8 P.M. the schooner *Fides*, of Nyborg, Denmark, bound from Newcastle to Figueira, with a cargo of coal, while riding in Lowestoft roads, began to drive, and at 9 o'clock the cox-

swain of the Life-boat, seeing that the vessel was drifting on to the shore, mustered his crew. The *Samuel Plimsoll* was launched, proceeded to her assistance, and found she was then in 13 feet of water. The Life-boat dropped her anchor, drifted down to the schooner, and put some of the Life-boatmen on board her. The boat then took the tow-rope from the steam-tug *Rainbow* to the vessel, slipped her anchor, and she was towed into the harbour, arriving at 11.30. She struck the ground just as she was taken in tow.

March 20.—At about 5.30 A.M. the Montrose No. 2 Life-boat, *Roman Governor of Caer Hün*, was launched to the assistance of the brig *Eleonore*, of Tonsberg, Norway, which was showing signals of distress. She went ashore about a mile and a half N. of the Life-boat house. On reaching her it was found that she was waterlogged and had been unable to clear the land. Her crew, consisting of seven men, were taken into the Life-boat and brought ashore in safety. The brig subsequently became a total wreck.—Expense of service, 16*l.* 17*s.* 6*d.*

March 20.—At 6 o'clock this morning signal guns were heard from the Goodwin Sands. The Ramsgate Life-boat *Bradford* and steam tug *Vulcan* were at once manned and left the harbour, proceeded to the Sands, and ultimately found the barque *Georgia*, of Fiume, bound from Hamburg to Baltimore with salt and empty barrels, ashore inside the middle buoy on the S.E. part of the Sand. The crew, thirteen in number, who were in their boat were taken on board the Life-boat which then went alongside the vessel, made sail on her, and with the assistance of the tug tried to get her afloat. The pumps were sounded and it was found that she had seven feet of water in her hold, and as there was no chance of saving her the Life-boat and steamer returned to Ramsgate with the rescued crew, arriving in the harbour at 11.40 A.M. 1863

March 30.—It was reported that a barque was ashore on Cymeran Beach, Anglesey, with all hands in the fore rigging, the vessel having sunk, and her mainmast having been carried away during a heavy S.S.W. gale. The Rhosneigir Life-boat, *Thomas Lingham*, went to her assistance, but being disabled by the breaking of several rowing crutches, was compelled to return to the shore, one of

the boat's crew being also washed overboard by a heavy sea, and rescued with some difficulty. The Holyhead Life-boat *Thomas Fielden* was then launched, and at about 11 A.M. was taken in tow by the s.s. *George Elliot* to the N.W. of the South Stack. Here the Life-boat was cast off, and proceeded under canvas until about 12.30 when she fell in with the steam-tug *Challenger*, by which she was towed in the direction of the stranded vessel. Owing, however, to the heavy sea, the tug could not go within a mile of the wreck, and the Life-boat, being obliged to continue her course under oars, made three fruitless attempts to reach the vessel, owing to the broken water and the heavy surf. As the wind was rising, and there was no place to beach the boat, she was obliged to return to Holyhead. Other unsuccessful attempts to reach the vessel were subsequently made by the Rhosneigir Life-boat, but they failed, and endeavours to rescue the shipwrecked men by means of the rocket apparatus also proved unavailing. As the Rhosneigir men were reported to be exhausted by their exertions, it was suggested that the Holyhead crew should proceed to Rhosneigir and try to get to the vessel in that Life-boat. An application was accordingly made to the railway authorities for a special engine, which was at once granted, and the Holyhead crew were thus conveyed to the spot nearest to the wreck. It was now quite dark, and the men had scarcely any knowledge of the position of hidden rocks on that coast, but they nevertheless gallantly took the boat out, succeeded in reaching the wrecked vessel, which was the *Norman Court*, of Greenock, and in rescuing the twenty men who were on board.

The Silver Medal of the Institution was presented to Mr. THOMAS ROBERTS, coxswain of the Holyhead Life-boat, and the thanks of the Institution, inscribed on vellum, with an extra pecuniary reward to each of his crew—4*l.* 5*s.* in all—in consideration of their heroic exertions.

Also the thanks of the Institution, inscribed on vellum, and a binocular glass, to Mr. W. P. ELLIOTT, Honorary Secretary of the Holyhead Branch, in acknowledgment of his valuable co-operation on this occasion.

The thanks of the Institution were presented to W. E. EYRE, Esq., to

Mr. ARTHUR RIDDIFORD, Chief Officer of H.M. Coastguard at Holyhead, and to the London and North-Western Railway Company, through Mr. GUEST, their agent at Holyhead, for valuable assistance rendered by them on the occasion in question.

March 30.—At 5.15 A.M., in reply to signals of distress the Ramsgate Life-boat *Bradford* and steam-tug *Vulcan* proceeded to the East Goodwin Lightship and found that she had been run into by a schooner, and had one of the vessel's crew on board. The man was taken into the Life-boat and brought to Ramsgate.

March 30.—A barque was observed ashore on the west part of the Gunfleet Sand, off the coast of Essex, at about 2 P.M., during a fresh S.W. wind, and with the aid of a telescope it was seen that she was flying signals of distress. The crew of the Clacton-on-Sea Life-boat *Albert Edward* at once mustered, and the boat was promptly launched and proceeded to the sands. After a hard pull against wind and tide, the Life-boat reached the vessel at about 5.30, and found her to be the *Epsilon*, of Swansea, bound for that port from Rotterdam, in ballast. Part of the Life-boat's crew went on board to assist to throw overboard some of the ballast, and the Life-boat went back to Clacton to telegraph for a tug and to the owners of the vessel, after which she returned to the barque, arriving by her at about 11 P.M. About eighty tons of ballast were thrown out, and at about 2.30 A.M. on the following day the vessel was towed off and taken to Harwich, reaching there at about 7 A.M.

COMMITTEE MEETING, April 5th, 1883.

Voted 22*l.* 15*s.* 6*d.* to pay the expenses of the Hauxley, New Brighton No. 2, Broadstairs, Caister Nos. 1 and 2, Saltburn, Scarborough, Brancaster, Hartlepool, West Hartlepool, Seaton Carew, Fraserburgh, Peterhead, Porthdinllaen, Redcar, Montrose No. 1, Filey, Deal, Walmer, Kingsdowne, and Whitelink Bay Life-boats, in assembling their crews or putting off to the aid of vessels which did not eventually need their aid.

The Ramsgate Life-boat had also been taken out, but her services had not been ultimately required.

Voted a binocular glass, bearing a suitable inscription, to Mr. W. H. BELL, late

coxswain of the Howth Life-boat, in acknowledgment of his long and valuable services in assisting to save life from shipwreck.

April 5.—Flares were seen from the Barber Sand, off the Norfolk coast, at about 1 A.M., during a N.N.E. wind and a very heavy sea. The Caister No. 2 Life-boat, the *Godsend*, was launched, proceeded in the direction, and found a vessel on the sand. About this time a flare was seen from the Cross Sand, and as the Scratby Life-boat was seen approaching the fishing-boat, the Life-boat tacked, and at once sailed to the Cross Sand, and fell in with the brig *Spring*, of Guernsey, stranded there. She was bound from Shields for St. Malo, with a cargo of coal, and had nine men on board, who were taken into the Life-boat and safely landed at Great Yarmouth. The vessel became a total wreck.—Expense of service, 18*l.*

April 6.—At 4.30 A.M., during a moderate N.E. wind, signal guns were fired from the *Gull* Lightship. The Ramsgate Life-boat *Bradford* proceeded under sail to the North Sand Head and found a barque ashore on the North-east part of the Sand. The Life-boat let go an anchor, veered close alongside the vessel and advised the master to let go his starboard anchor. The sea was breaking clean over the ship and the wreck of the fore and main masts which had been cut away was lying alongside. The crew, consisting of ten men, were taken into the Life-boat which then waited to see whether the vessel would float at high water; but finding that there was no chance of her doing so, the boat returned to the harbour, arriving at noon. The wrecked vessel proved to be the Dutch barque *Henning*, bound from Frederickstadt to Poole, with a cargo of deals and boards.

April 20.—At noon during calm weather and a heavy sea, three fishing cobsles and a Hartlepool pilot coble, the latter with only one man on board, were observed making for Whitby Harbour. It was considered unsafe for them to enter on account of the heavy seas breaking on the bar, and the Whitby No. 1 Life-boat *Robert and Mary Ellis* was therefore launched and supplied the crews of the cobsles with cork jackets. The fishing boats then succeeded in entering the harbour; but the pilot coble refused the assistance of the Life-boat and

proceeded South under canvas.—Expense of service, 5*l.* 10*s.*

April 21.—At daybreak, the pilots on the look-out at Montrose discovered a schooner stranded on the beach about two miles N. of the harbour. The crew of the No. 1 Life-boat *Mincing Lane* mustered as quickly as possible, launched the Life-boat, pulled over the bar, on which a heavy sea was breaking, and sighted a small boat about a mile away. The Life-boat made for her and rescued six men who were on board. They proved to be the crew of the *Mary*, of Hangesund, Norway, bound from that port for Leith, in ballast. She had parted her anchor and gone ashore. The men had been five hours in their boat, and it is very unlikely that they could ever have reached land in her, as she was only a small skiff with very little free-board.—Expense of service, 16*l.* 12*s.* 6*d.*

April 27.—A signal of distress was observed from a vessel riding heavily, and dragging her anchors, during a stiff breeze from the E.N.E., and a rough sea, at about 6 A.M. The Ramsey, Isle of Man, Life-boat, *Two Sisters*, was promptly launched to her aid, and found her to be the flat *Flora*, of Runcorn, bound from Girvan to Liverpool, with gravel. With the help of the Life-boat the vessel and her crew of three men were brought safely into the harbour at 1 P.M.

April 29.—At about 1.15 P.M., a smackman reported at Ramsgate that he had seen a barque on the North Sand Head of the Goodwin Sands. The Life-boat *Bradford* left the harbour in tow of the harbour steam-tug *Vulcan*, at 1.25, and proceeded to the vessel, which proved to be the *Galera*, of Glasgow, from London to Trinidad with a general cargo. The Life-boat went alongside and her services were accepted by the master, who was the only person on board, the crew being on board a steam-tug. The vessel having several feet of water in her hold, the pumps were set to work, and the tow-ropes of the *Vulcan* and two other tugs were attached. The boat was then sent for the crew of the vessel, but they all refused to return, with the exception of the mate, who again went on board. The *Champion* lugger, now arrived alongside, and her crew were engaged to assist in pumping. The tugs towed until 5 P.M. when the barque came off striking heavily on the Sand. The

Vulcan then cast off, and the other two tugs towed the vessel to London; the Life-boat being in attendance, men being kept on board pumping continually until 5 o'clock the following morning, when she arrived in the West India Dock and was moored in a safe berth, having then three feet of water in her.

COMMITTEE MEETING, May 3rd, 1883.

Voted 67*l.* 18*s.* to pay the expenses of the Broadstairs, Winterton No. 2, Rhosneigir, and Caister No. 2 Life-boats, in putting off in reply to signals of distress; the services of the boats, however, had not been ultimately needed.

The Stonehaven Life-boat had also been taken out, but her services were not eventually called into requisition.

Voted also 20*l.* to the coxswain of the Pakefield Life-boat, in consideration of illness occasioned by being washed out of the Life-boat while out on service on the 14th November last.

May 5.—At 11 P.M. the fishing smack *Falcon*, of Great Yarmouth, grounded on the North Sand close to the entrance to Gorleston harbour, during an E.N.E. wind and a very strong sea. She exhibited flares, and signals were shown by the St. Nicholas lightship. The *Leicester* Life-boat, stationed at Gorleston, went to the smack's assistance, and after four attempts succeeded, with great difficulty, in reaching her and bringing ashore her crew, consisting of seven men. The Life-boat subsequently returned to her, laid out an anchor with 80 fathoms of cable, put nine men on board, got her off, and brought her into harbour.

May 9.—At 1 P.M., while a strong wind was blowing in squalls from the N.E. accompanied by a heavy sea, signals of distress were shown from the fishing yawl *Favourite*, of Wexford, which had stranded on the South side of the bar, while running for that harbour. The Wexford Life-boat *Civil Service*, No. 1, manned by her usual crew of Customs officers and pilots, the coxswain also being an officer of Customs, was immediately launched, and proceeded to render assistance. On arriving alongside, it was found that the vessel was leaking badly and the sea beating heavily over her. The crew,

consisting of six men, were, with much difficulty, taken on board the Life-boat and landed at Rosslare. The vessel became a total wreck twenty minutes afterwards.—Expense of service, 7*l.* 6*s.* 6*d.*

COMMITTEE MEETING, June 7th, 1883.

Voted 35*l.* 10*s.* 6*d.* to pay the expenses of the Milford, Courtmacsherry, New Brighton, and Clacton Life-boats, in launching, with the view of rendering assistance, to distressed vessels.

The Ramsgate Life-boat had also been taken out, but her services were not required.

COMMITTEE MEETING, July 5th, 1883.

Voted 17*l.* 16*s.* to pay the crew of the Tynemouth Life-boat, for watching on several stormy nights during the past year.

Also 10*l.* to one of the crew of the New Brighton No. 2 Life-boat, in consideration of illness caused by being washed out of the boat while out on service on the 26th Jan. last.

July 21.—At 11 o'clock in the morning, during squally weather and a heavy sea, a barque was observed aground on the Hasborough Sand off the Norfolk coast. The Palling No. 2 Life-boat; the *British Workman*, was launched and proceeded to the vessel, which proved to be the *Khedive*, of Hartlepool, bound for Buenos Ayres, with a cargo of coal. With the help of the Life-boat and a yawl the vessel was got off the sand and taken to Yarmouth Roads. She carried a crew of twelve men.

July 21.—A strong wind sprang up from the E.N.E., accompanied by a heavy sea, and several of the Newbiggin fishing boats were compelled to leave Newbiggin Bay and run to Blyth Harbour for shelter. Two of them—the *Charity* and the *Samaritan*—while endeavouring to make the harbour got too far to leeward, and went ashore on the west beach. The Blyth No. 1 Life-boat, the *Salford*, went to their assistance, and brought ashore their crews, numbering eleven men. She also went to another boat, the *Janet Thompson*, which was riding at anchor, and landed her crew of seven men.—Expense of service, 7*l.* 10*s.*

July 29.—At about 8 p.m., the schooner *Hope*, of Ryde, bound from Middlesborough to Sidmouth with a cargo of iron and coal, which was lying less than a mile from the beach at Sidmouth with two anchors down, parted her port cable. A fresh wind from the S.W. was blowing at the time and the weather was gloomy. The master did not consider it prudent to depend on the remaining cable, and he therefore showed signals of distress, in response to which the *Rimington* Life-boat stationed at Sidmouth, went to his assistance and brought ashore the crew of four men. On the following morning, the wind having shifted, and the sea being much smoother, the men returned to their vessel and recovered the anchor.—Expense of service, 16*l.*

COMMITTEE MEETING, Aug. 2nd, 1883.

Voted 25*l.* 0*s.* 9*d.* to pay the expenses of the Llanddwyn, Saltburn, Winterton No. 2, and Dover Life-boats in assembling their crews or putting off to the aid of vessels which did not ultimately require their assistance.

Also the Silver Medal of the Institution and 40*l.* to ROBERT ADAIR on his retirement from the post of coxswain of the Ballywalter Life-boat, in acknowledgment of his long and valuable services in assisting in the boat to save 126 lives from different shipwrecks.

Also 42*l.* 3*s.* 6*d.* as special grants to two men who had been injured while engaged in the Life-boat Service at St. Ives.

Also 10*l.* to Mr. W. BRITTON, late coxswain of the Harwich Life-boat, in recognition of his good services during the time he held that office.

Also 10*l.* to the widow of one of the crew of the Hayle Life-boat, who was injured on the occasion of the capsizing of the Life-boat on the 16th Nov. last.

Aug. 7.—At 11 A.M., during a fresh wind from the N., signals of distress were shown from a vessel on the Hasborough Sands, off the Norfolk coast, in reply to which the Palling No. 2 Life-boat, the *British Workman*, was promptly launched, and found that the vessel was the brigantine *Flora*, of Salcombe, bound from Runcorn to Shields with a cargo

of salt. The Life-boat remained by her until it was seen that she must become a wreck, when the crew of four men, together with two women, were taken into the boat and safely landed at Palling at 6 o'clock on the following morning.—Expense of service, 28*l.* 10*s.*

Aug. 8.—The Montrose No. 2 Life-boat, *Roman Governor of Caer Hŷn*, was launched at about 11.30 A.M. to the assistance of several fishing boats which had been caught in a gale from the S., and were in great danger while making for that port. The Life-boat remained about two and a half hours at the harbour mouth, signalling to the boats in which direction to steer, they being strangers to the port. Some of them had narrow escapes of being lost on the Annat Bank.

At 4 P.M. the wind shifted to the W. and blew a very heavy gale, and two strange boats were then seen making for the harbour. One got inside the buoys; the other hoisted a signal half-mast high, and the first boat then ran back, apparently to the assistance of the other. The Life-boat was again launched and went out with a steam-tug, and both the boats, which were in considerable danger, one having all the tackling of her mast loose, were with much difficulty towed into safety.—Expense of service, 7*l.* 6*s.* 6*d.*

Aug. 9.—The barque *William Miles*, of London, bound from Havre to Swansea in ballast, stranded about half a mile east of Porthcawl, South Wales, during a W.N.W. wind and a rough sea, at mid-night. She exhibited signals of distress, and the Porthcawl Life-boat *Chafyn Grove* was thereupon launched, proceeded to her and brought ashore the master's wife and one man, the others of the crew refusing to leave the vessel. At about 6 A.M. she was seen to be in imminent danger, and the Life-boat therefore again went to her and took off the remainder of her crew, ten in number. The barque ultimately became a total wreck. Expense of service, 17*l.* 10*s.*

Aug. 10.—At 5.45 A.M. it was reported at Fleetwood that a vessel had dragged her anchor and was in distress about 2 miles N.E. of the Wyre Light. The wind was blowing a strong gale from the N.W., and a heavy cross sea was running at the time. The Fleetwood Life-boat *Child of Hale* was launched and proceeded, in tow of the tug *Fylde*, to the vessel, which

was found to be the Norwegian barque *Jenny*, bound to Glasson Dock with a cargo of timber. Her fore and main masts had been cut away, and she was in a dangerous position. She had a Liverpool pilot on board, who was taken off by the Life-boat and landed at Fleetwood, the tug taking charge of the barque and towing her to her destination.—Expense of service, 7*l.* 1*s.*

Aug. 14.—The *Memorial* Life-boat stationed at Tyrella, Co. Down, was launched to-day in reply to a signal shown from the ship *Henry*, of St. John, N.B., during a S. wind and a heavy sea. At the master's request five fishermen who had boarded the vessel and had lost their own boat through the heavy sea were brought ashore in the Life-boat, which afterwards remained by the ship, at the captain's request, for two days and one night, until the wind changed and she was enabled to proceed on her voyage.

Sept. 1.—The smack *Bacchus*, of Nantes, which had been towed from Ruthleven to Charlestown in ballast, and had anchored in Charlestown Bay, Cornwall, was in great danger owing to the heavy gale which had sprung up from the S. Information of the fact having reached the Mevagissey Life-boat Station, the Life-boat *South Warwickshire* was launched as soon as possible, and having come up with the vessel, took off her crew, consisting of three men, who were landed at Porthpean, the Life-boat encountering heavy seas on her way to the shore. The smack subsequently became a total wreck.—Expense of service, 18*l.* 15*s.*

Sept. 1.—The *Joseph Armstrong* Life-boat, stationed at Cadgwith, Cornwall, put off at 3 P.M., and conducted safely ashore one of the steam fishing-launches belonging to Cadgwith, which had been overtaken by a terrific gale of wind from the S. and a very heavy sea, and was in great danger.—Expense of service, 7*l.* 10*s.*

Sept. 1.—During a heavy gale from the S.S.E. the yacht *Thalia*, which was riding in Swanage Bay, was seen to be rapidly driving towards some dangerous rocks on the north side. The crew of the Swanage Life-boat *Charlotte Mary* were promptly mustered, and at about 8.30 P.M. the boat was launched and proceeded to the yacht, which by this time had been again brought up, and found her crew preparing a signal of distress. The Life-boat accordingly let

go her anchor, and went alongside; she was then hauled off again, and lay at her anchors during the night with a line attached to the vessel, in readiness to render assistance if the cable parted. At daylight the crew of five men were taken into the Life-boat, and brought on land.—Expense of service, 12*l.* 7*s.* 6*d.*

Sept. 2.—At about 3 A.M. during a strong gale from the S. and a heavy sea, the Norwegian barque *Elise* entered Plymouth Sound for shelter, and let go both her anchors. One chain parted immediately, and the vessel drove with the second anchor until she went ashore on a reef close under the Hoe where she began to break up. The Plymouth Life-boat *Clemency* at once went to her assistance, and having dropped anchor to windward, veered down to the wreck. A line was then passed, and the crew of nine men, who had taken shelter in the fore part of the vessel, were hauled through the water into the boat, and taken to Sutton Harbour, where they were landed and housed at the Sailors Home.—Expense of service, 12*l.* 4*s.* 6*d.*

Sept. 2.—On the morning of Sunday, the 2nd September, the wind blew a fresh gale from S.S.E. Several fishing yawls were lying at anchor in Filey Bay, Yorkshire, and, the sea being heavy, their crews were unable to go off to them in their own boats. The use of the *Hollon* Life-boat stationed at Filey, was granted to the men to convey them to the vessels in order to lower their masts so that the boats might ride more easily at anchor.—Expense of service, 2*l.* 8*s.*

Sept. 2.—The barque *Tranmere*, of Liverpool, bound from Hull to Cardiff in ballast, brought up off Selsey Bill, during a gale of wind from the S. and in a very heavy sea, at about noon. A fisherman's galley went out to her, but could not get alongside owing to the heavy sea. At 5 P.M. a signal of distress was shown from the barque, and the Selsey Life-boat *Four Sisters* was thereupon launched, and on reaching her she was found to be striking heavily, and the crew were anxious to be taken ashore, fearing that, as she was already leaking and had lost part of her keel, she would go to pieces. The men, thirteen in number, were accordingly taken into the Life-boat, and landed at Wallend, the very strong wind preventing the boat

returning to her station until the following morning.—Expense of service, 15*l.* 10*s.*

Sept. 2.—About noon a gale was blowing from the S.S.W. at Clacton-on-Sea accompanied by a very heavy sea, and as several vessels were lying off the coast, and riding heavily at their anchors, the crew of the Clacton Life-boat *Albert Edward*, with launchers and horses, were held in readiness should their services be called into requisition. At about 2 P.M. it was seen that the Norwegian barque *Rome*, bound from Finland to London with a cargo of firewood, had cut away her foremast as well as parted her cable and was driving towards the sand. As soon as it was possible to launch the Life-boat she went out through a heavy sea under close-reefed sails, reached the wreck and rescued the crew, consisting of fourteen men, arriving at Clacton with them at 12.40 A.M.—Expense of service, 23*l.* 8*s.*

Sept. 2.—The ketch *Minnie Flossie*, of Milford, while lying at anchor off Clovelly during a fresh gale of wind from the N.W. and squally weather, showed a signal of distress. The Life-boat *Graham Hughes*, stationed at Clovelly, put off to her aid through a rough sea, and found that she was riding heavily at her anchors, and that her crew of three men were anxious to be put ashore. They were accordingly taken into the Life-boat and safely landed. On the following day, the weather having moderated, the crew returned to their vessel.—Expense of service, 10*l.* 9*s.*

Sept. 3.—The Burnham Life-boat *Cheltenham* was launched at 4.30 A.M. on the 3rd September to the assistance of the brigantine *Milo*, of Brixham, which had stranded on the Gore Sands during a heavy gale from the W.N.W. At the request of the master, the Life-boat remained for some time alongside the vessel.—Expense of service, 8*l.* 4*s.*

Sept. 3.—The Padstow Life-boat, the *Arab*, was launched at 2 P.M. to the assistance of the schooner *Maria*, of Granville, bound for that port from Swansea, with a cargo of coal. The schooner had stranded on the Doom Bar, during a strong W. wind and a high sea. The Life-boat brought ashore two men who were on board, three others of the crew having previously landed in their own boat. The vessel afterwards sank and became a total wreck.—Expense of service, 7*l.* 12*s.*

Sept. 4.—At 6 A.M. the *William Birkett* Life-boat stationed at Piel, Lancashire, was launched in reply to signals, to the assistance of the barque *China*, of Porsgrund, Norway. The boat was towed by the steam-tug *Ajax*, and when about two miles outside of the Hipsford buoy, where the vessel was ashore, was cast off and dropped down to her, being thus enabled to take off her crew of ten men. The Life-boat then returned to the tug and was towed to Barrow, where the rescued men were landed. The barque had lost her main and mizen masts and became a total wreck.—Expense of service, 6*l.* 17*s.*

COMMITTEE MEETING, Sept. 6th, 1883.

Voted 147*l.* 4*s.* to pay the expenses of the Redcar, Cemlyn, Cemaes, Tyrella, Newhaven, Fowey, Hastings, Bridlington, Montrose No. 1, Harwich, Southend, (Essex), Dover, Clacton, and Ramsey Life-boats, in assembling their crews, or putting off with the view of rendering assistance to vessels which did not ultimately require the services of the boats.

Also a further grant of 15*l.* to the widow of one of the crew of the Hayle Life-boat, who was injured at the capsizing of the boat on the 16th Nov. last.

Also the Silver Medal of the Institution to GEORGE STROWGER, coxswain of the Kessingland Life-boats, in recognition of his gallant services in those boats since the establishment of the station.

Sept. 6.—The schooner *John Royle*, of Chester, was reported to have sunk on "Cartmell Wharf," Morecambe Bay, during a strong W.N.W. gale and a heavy sea. At 11.45 A.M. the *William Birkett* Life-boat stationed at Piel, went to her assistance, and found the master, his wife, and two seamen clinging to the rigging, in a very exhausted condition. They were promptly helped into the Life-boat, and landed at Barrow, the harbour tug *Ajax* assisting the Life-boat in effecting this rescue.—Expense of service, 8*l.* 7*s.*

Sept. 11.—The Holy Island No. 1 Life-boat, *Grace Darling*, saved the fishing-boat *Nancy*, which had struck on the Rigg while returning to Holy Island during a gale of wind from the N.E. The seas were beginning to break over her, and

she would probably have broken up in a short time, and her crew of five men lost, had it not been for the timely arrival of the Life-boat.—Expense of service, 14*l.* 10*s.*

Sept. 19.—The Caister No. 1 Life-boat *Covent Garden* put off and remained alongside the stranded steamer *Isis*, of Newcastle, as the vessel had a large number of men on board who were discharging the cargo. The boat also rendered assistance in conveying some of the men to a tug; she remained in attendance on the vessel until she floated on the following evening. The Winterton No. 2 Life-boat, the *Husband*, also went to the aid of the vessel at about 4 P.M., and remained by her until the morning of the 24th September.

Sept. 24.—During a strong gale from the S.W., and a rough sea, it was reported at Eastbourne that a large vessel was ashore near Bexhill Coastguard Station. The *William and Mary* Life-boat, stationed at Eastbourne, was taken to the spot, when it was found that the barque *Isabella*, of Drammen, Norway, bound from Fredrickstadt to Honfleur with a cargo of battens and boards, had missed stays, and had been driven on the rocks. The boat's anchor was let go, and she veered down to the vessel, from the stern of which the crew of eight men dropped into the Life-boat, and were at once landed at Bexhill. When the boat arrived, the sea was breaking heavily over the wreck, her foremast was gone, and only her main and mizen lower-masts were standing; her bowsprit had also been carried away.—Expense of service, 22*l.* 3*s.* 4*d.*

Sept. 26.—The schooner *Slaney*, of Wexford, bound to Newport, Mon., in ballast, having showed a signal of distress during a strong gale, the Milford Haven Life-boat *Katharine* put off to the vessel, and found that her crew did not wish to leave her, but preferred to wait until a tug arrived. The Life-boat, however, remained by her about an hour, and the vessel getting nearer and nearer to the rocks, and the sea increasing in force, three of the men were, at their own request, taken into the Life-boat. The vessel then parted her cable and went on the rocks. The Captain and the mate, who were still on the wreck, were happily got safely to land, through the assistance of men on shore. There was no chance

of saving the vessel, which became a total wreck, and the Life-boat therefore returned ashore with the three men she had rescued.—Expense of service, 6*l.* 10*s.*

Sept. 26.—At about 4.30 p.m. a small screw steamer, the *Bavington*, of Maryport, was observed to be making for that port. The wind was blowing a strong gale from the W. by S.W., accompanied by a very rough sea, and fears were entertained for the vessel's safety as she was shipping much water. In trying to round the pier she struck the ground heavily and became unmanageable. The Maryport Life-boat, *Henry Niason No. 1*, put off to her assistance without delay, and with considerable trouble rescued the crew, consisting of five men.—Expense of service, 8*l.* 5*s.*

Sept. 26.—At about 6.45 p.m., during a gale from the S.S.E. with a heavy sea and much rain, a steamer was attempting to run for Montrose Harbour, but was driven to leeward. She subsequently kept a more southerly course, but became unmanageable owing to the wind and sea, and about 7 o'clock, it being then dark, she struck the outer end of the Annat Bank. The Life-boat crew were summoned, and the No. 1 boat *Mincing Lane* was launched, and found the vessel to be the s.s. *Ennismore*, of Peterhead, bound from that port to Amble in ballast, with a crew of ten men. With considerable difficulty the men were taken into the Life-boat and brought to land in safety at about 8 o'clock. The Life-boatmen afterwards assisted to get the vessel afloat.—Expense of service, 16*l.* 5*s.*

Sept. 27.—At 9 a.m. a mounted messenger brought information to the Ramsey, Isle of Man, Life-boat Station, that a dismasted vessel was showing signals of distress about a mile from the shore. The Life-boat *Two Sisters* was promptly launched and proceeded to the vessel, which proved to be the Norwegian barque *Hereward*, bound from Norway to Liverpool with timber. Her foremast had been cut away, and had carried away her main and mizen topmasts, &c. The crew would not leave the vessel, but requested the Life-boat to send a telegram to the ship's agent at Liverpool for a tug, which was accordingly done.

Sept. 29.—The Caister No. 2 Life-boat, the *Godsend*, was launched at 1 a.m. to the aid of the schooner *Marquis*, of Angle-

sea, which had stranded on the north end of the Barber Sand during a strong wind from the S.S.W. With the help of the Life-boat crew the vessel was got afloat and taken into Yarmouth harbour. She was on a voyage from Newry to Newcastle with a cargo of stone, and carried a crew of four men.

Sept. 29.—At 8.30 a.m. it was reported at Groomsport, Ireland, that two vessels were dragging their anchors and were likely to be driven ashore at Bangor Point. A heavy gale was blowing from the N.E. and the sea was broken and heavy at the time. The Life-boat *Florence* put off and rescued the crew of six men from the schooner *Miss Pritchard*, of Carnarvon, and three men from the schooner *William Henry*, of Carnarvon. The seamen's effects were also brought to land by the Life-boat. Fortunately the vessels held to their anchors about half a cable's length from the rocks and rode out the gale in safety.—Expense of service, 12*l.* 16*s.* 6*d.*

Sept. 30.—At about half-past four o'clock in the morning the Coastguard watchman at Ballywalter, Co. Down, observed a dim light in the direction of the Skull Martin Rock. The Coastguard galley was immediately manned and went off to render assistance. It was found that the vessel was the barque *Cuyuni*, of Glasgow, bound from that port to Demerara with a general cargo. The sea proved to be too rough and heavy for the galley, and as the wind was freshening and the sea was getting heavier it was considered best to return to shore in order to obtain the services of the Life-boat. On landing it was seen that signals of distress were still shown by the vessel, and all haste was therefore made in assembling the crew of the *Admiral Henry Meynell* Life-boat and in getting that boat launched. On reaching the vessel she took off some of the crew and brought them ashore, the master and other officers refusing to leave the ship. No sooner, however, had the Life-boat landed than the vessel again showed signals, and the Life-boat returned to her. The remainder of those on board, fourteen in number, were then rescued, and the vessel afterwards became a total wreck.—Expense of service, 11*l.* 3*s.*

Sept. 30.—A vessel was seen with signals of distress about 5 miles E. of Skegness, Lincolnshire. The crew of the

Herbert Ingram Life-boat were at once summoned, and the Life-boat having been launched made for the vessel, which was found to be the sloop *Good Intent*, of King's Lynn, bound to that port from Seaham with coal. She had lost her main boom and her sails had been blown away. At the Master's request the Life-boat accompanied the sloop to Lynn Roads. She had two men on board.

Sept. 30.—Signals of distress were seen in the outer harbour at Holyhead at 10 P.M. during stormy weather and a rough sea. The *Thomas Fielden* Life-boat was launched, proceeded outside Salt Island, and found the brigantine *Wonder*, of Swansea, dragging her anchors and nearly ashore. Some of the Life-boatmen went on board the vessel, got canvas on her, hove up the starboard anchor, slipped the port one, and ran the vessel into the old harbour, mooring her alongside the quay. She was bound to Newcastle-on-Tyne with a cargo of salt, and carried a crew of six men.

Oct. 3.—At 3 P.M. a large barque was seen ashore on the West Gunfleet Sands, and with the aid of a powerful telescope a signal of distress was made out. The crew of the *Albert Edward* Life-boat, stationed at Clacton-on-Sea, were at once summoned, and the boat was soon launched and went to the aid of the vessel, which proved to be the *Danmark*, of Dragor, bound from Sundswall to Chatham, timber-laden, with a crew of twelve men. A gale of wind was blowing from the N., accompanied by a rough sea, and as the vessel had a heavy list to starboard, the master engaged the services of the Life-boat's crew to throw the deck cargo overboard, which they continued to do until 1 o'clock on the following morning. The steam-tug *Bristol* then towed the barque afloat, and took her to the Swin Middle Light, but owing to the force of the gale, it was impossible to take her further; she was, therefore, anchored until 6 A.M., when the tow-line was again made fast, and she was taken to Chatham, arriving there at 12.30 P.M., the Life-boatmen keeping her pumps going all day. The Life-boat was afterwards towed back to its station.

COMMITTEE MEETING, Oct. 4th, 1883.

Voted 272l. 8s. to pay the expenses of the Newquay (Cornwall), St. David's, Margate, Newhaven, Cahore, Ardrossan, Harwich, Penzance, North Sunderland, Broadstairs, Deal, Winterton No. 2, Frasersburgh, Swanage, Newcastle (Co. Down), Rye, Chapel, and Fleetwood Life-boats, in assembling their crews or putting off in reply to signals of distress shown by vessels not ultimately requiring assistance.

Oct. 4.—At about 10 o'clock, in a N.E. gale and heavy sea, the crew of the Wells, Norfolk, Life-boat, *Charlotte Nicholls*, assembled in response to a vessel's signals of distress, when the boat was promptly launched, and found the schooner *Emma*, of Jersey, stranded on the East Bar. Her sails had been torn to ribbons, her bulwarks washed away, and the heavy seas were breaking completely over her. Her crew of five persons, one of whom was a boy, nearly dead with cold, were taken into the Life-boat and safely landed at Wells.—Expense of service, 16l. 5s.

Oct. 5.—The steam-tug *Rover* came to the New Brighton stage at about 6 P.M. for the Life-boat, as there was a ship in distress on the Little Barbo Bank. The *Stuart Hay* Life-boat was at once manned, taken in tow by the tug, and proceeded to the vessel. On arriving to windward the Life-boat attempted to get near her, but missed her through the very heavy sea and the darkness. The tug then went in search of the boat, but did not find her for about two hours, and it was with extreme difficulty that she ultimately got alongside the wreck. The captain, his wife, and the crew of seventeen men and two pilots had taken refuge in the rigging, the woman being lashed to the top of the mizen-mast. They were all taken into the Life-boat, and the crew were put on board the *Rover* and conveyed to Liverpool landing-stage; while the master and his wife were landed at New Brighton by the Life-boat. The ship was the *Nuncio*, of Yarmouth, N.S., bound from Liverpool to New Orleans with a cargo of salt. She left the Canada dock in tow of a steam-tug at about 2 o'clock in the afternoon. The wind was blowing hard at the time, and during the evening the hawser parted

and she was driven on the Little Burbo Bank, where she remained fast. At first her position was not considered unsafe, and the tug left her; but afterwards the captain was obliged to signal for assistance. The vessel subsequently became a total wreck.—Expense of service, 13*l*.

Oct. 14.—At 9 o'clock in the morning a messenger arrived at Withernsea from Sandy le Mere, two miles distant, and stated that a vessel was ashore there, too far off for the rocket apparatus to reach her, that the sea was getting up rapidly, and that the master wished the Life-boat to stand by him, in order to assist to get out a heavy warp. The Withernsea Life-boat thereupon proceeded to the spot, and remained by the ship until she got off at high water. She proved to be the three-mast schooner *Tony Krowmann*, of Portmadoc, Wales, bound from Dantzic to Bordeaux with molasses. She had a crew of eight men.

Oct. 15.—About 10 p.m. a gale of wind from the S. sprang up at Bridlington, and there being at sea five open fishing-boats, belonging to the port, which in consequence of the heavy sea could not make the harbour without great danger, the *John Abbott* Life-boat was launched so as to be able to render assistance if necessary. Two of the boats managed to enter the harbour, leaving the others at sea; whereupon the Life-boat was launched and was held in readiness until about 3 a.m., when one of the boats being seen the Life-boat at once proceeded towards her and brought her safely into harbour.—Expense of service, 19*l*. 10*s*.

Oct. 17.—The fishing yawl *Daring*, of Ballycotton, Co. Cork, was overtaken by a sudden gale from the W.N.W. while lifting her nets in the bay at about 11.30 a.m. The crew were unable to pull against the wind and broke five oars in trying to do so. Seeing that they were in imminent danger the *Oliver Goldsmith* Life-boat was promptly launched from Ballycotton and succeeded in reaching them in time to save the boat and her crew of six men.—Expense of service, 6*l*. 6*s*.

Oct. 20.—At about 3 a.m. large flares were seen in the direction of the Middle Cross Sand off the Norfolk Coast, and guns and rockets were fired by the Cockle and St. Nicholas lightships. The Caister No. 1 Life-boat *Covent Garden* was

launched, and found the barque *Arab*, in ballast from London to Newcastle with a crew of fifteen men, lying to in the centre of the Middle Cross Sand. The Life-boat let go her anchor, veered down, and with great difficulty boarded her. The master requested the Life-boatmen to try to get the vessel off, and this having been successfully accomplished, a steam-tug was engaged to tow her into Yarmouth harbour. The wind was blowing fresh from the S.W. by W. and there was a nasty sea on the sand.

Oct. 22.—The Ramsgate Life-boat *Bradford*, in tow of the harbour steam-tug *Aid*, and the Broadstairs Life-boat *Samuel Morrison Collins*, proceeded to the Goodwin Sands in reply to signals of distress. The ship *Wilhelmina*, of Hamburg, bound from Hamburg to Iquique with a general cargo, was found ashore on the North Sand Head. The crew of the Ramsgate Life-boat went on board the vessel to assist in getting her off; the sails were stowed, and men were also engaged from other boats to assist to lighten her; after which several ineffectual attempts were made by steam-tugs to float her. At about 5 o'clock on the following morning the wind increased to a fresh gale, the sea began to rise, and preparations were made to leave the vessel if necessary. At 9 o'clock the Broadstairs Life-boat took ashore twenty-two of the men. A large quantity of the cargo, chiefly iron, was thrown overboard during the fore part of the day by those who remained on board; and at 3.30 p.m. two tugs again attached their tow-ropes to her, sail was made on the ship, an anchor which had been previously laid out was hove on, and as the tide flowed the vessel came off, striking heavily, and was towed to Gravesend, where she was safely moored by the salvors at about 3 o'clock on the morning of the 24th.—Expense of service, 31*l*. 10*s*.

Oct. 25.—The schooner *Magdalena*, of Inverness, bound from Sunderland to Dingwall with coal, was struck by a sudden squall off Burgh Head and her sails being carried away she went into Lossiemouth bay and dropped anchor. At 8 a.m. she showed signals of distress, in reply to which the *Bristol and Clifton* Life-boat stationed at Lossiemouth was launched, and brought ashore her crew of four men and their effects. The wind was then blowing a strong gale from the

W.N.W. accompanied by a heavy sea. Towards the afternoon the gale abated, and a fishing-boat went off and took ropes from the harbour to the vessel, by means of which she was hauled into safety.—Expense of service, 7*l.* 18*s.*

Oct. 25.—At 8.30 A.M. the schooner *Eclipse*, of Dundee, bound from Sunderland to Little Ferry with coal, showed signals of distress while riding in the bay at Fraserburgh, Scotland. The *Cosmo and Charles* Life-boat proceeded to her assistance, found that she had parted one of her cables and that the crew, consisting of four men, wished to be brought ashore, as the wind was blowing a gale from the W.N.W. and the sea was rough. They were accordingly taken into the boat and safely landed. The vessel drove ashore on the sands south of Fraserburgh about half an hour after the men had been rescued.—Expense of service, 10*l.* 10*s.* 6*d.*

COMMITTEE MEETING, Nov. 1st, 1883.

Voted 93*l.* 11*s.* to pay the expenses of the Winchelsea, Braunton, Appledore, Saltburn, Grimsby, Cromer, Harwich, Littlehaven, Sunderland No. 1, Clacton, Wexford No. 1, and Peterhead Life-boats, in assembling their crews or putting off to the aid of vessels which did not eventually require their assistance.

The Gourdon Life-boat had also been launched, with the view of assisting a fishing-boat in distress.

Also the thanks of the Committee, inscribed on vellum, to Mr. JOHN HUTCHINS, Chief Officer of H.M. Coastguard at Maryport, in recognition of his general valuable services in saving life from shipwreck, and particularly for taking command of the Maryport Life-boat, in the absence of the coxswains, and assisting to rescue the crew of five men of the steamer *Bavington*, of Maryport, which was wrecked off that port during a S.E. gale and heavy sea on the 26th September.

Nov. 5.—The *Charles Biggs* Life-boat stationed at Lytham, Lancashire, was launched at 12.30 P.M. in reply to signals of distress shown by the flat *Evelina*, of Runcorn, bound from Douglas, Isle of Man, to Runcorn with a cargo of railway iron. The vessel was anchored near the

edge of a sandbank and was in imminent danger, the wind blowing a gale from the W.N.W. The Life-boat brought ashore her crew of three men and a boy. The same night she again went off to the vessel, remained by her all night and brought her into port on the following morning.—Expense of service, 7*l.* 2*s.*

Nov. 6.—At daybreak the Clacton-on-Sea Life-boat, *Albert Edward*, was launched to the assistance of a ship on the West Gunfleet Sands, which was found to be the brigantine *Estafette*, of Faversham, bound from the Tyne to Whitstable with coal. She was leaking badly, and the master had made all preparations for leaving her; but after some consultation it was agreed that the Life-boatmen, assisted by some smacksmen, should try to get her afloat. After much pumping, and throwing overboard part of the cargo, the vessel floated off the sands at high water, and was taken to Sheerness, the pumps being kept going all the time, and placed on the mud. She had a crew of nine men.

Nov. 7-8.—At 12.30 A.M. the Ramsgate Life-boat *Bradford*, and steam-tug *Aid*, proceeded to the Kentish Knock Sand, the master of a fishing-smack having reported that there was a vessel ashore there. The wind was blowing moderately from the W.N.W., and the weather was misty. The Life-boat spoke the Lightship, and was informed that a vessel had been burning a flare W.N.W. of her. Shortly afterwards the captain and crew of the barque *Duchess*, of Shields, came alongside and were taken into the Life-boat. The captain stated that his vessel went ashore at 8 P.M., and that they had left her full of water. The Life-boat went round the sands, saw the barque, and put the master and some of the Life-boat's crew on board. She then went to a schooner, and to the brigs *Julia*, of Folkestone, and *Cornucopia*, of Whitby, and found them all full of water and abandoned. The crew of the last-named vessel were afterwards rescued from their boat and taken on board the tug. A vessel then being seen drifting near the Long Sand, the Life-boat got alongside of her, and found she was the schooner *International*, of London, abandoned. A crew was accordingly put on board her, and the *Aid* towed her to Ramsgate harbour. The Life-boat subsequently returned to the

Duchess, where she found the Ramsgate steam-tug *Vulcan* and the Broadstairs Life-boat in attendance. The vessel's crew were then put on board, her sails were set, and with the help of the steamer she was eventually extricated from her perilous position and taken to the North Foreland, where she was anchored, being steered there by the Life-boat, her own rudder having become disabled.

On the following day, at 1.30 P.M., the steamers *Vulcan* and *Aid* again proceeded to the *Duchess*, and with much difficulty, as she again grounded twice, brought her into Ramsgate harbour. She was bound from Gothenburg to Newport with a cargo of pit props, and carried a crew of ten men.

Nov. 12.—Flares were seen in the direction of Hendon Beach, Sunderland, at 5.30 P.M. The Sunderland No. 4 Life-boat, *John Foulston*, was launched, proceeded to the spot, and found that the brig *Tagus*, of Aberdeen, bound from that port to Sunderland in ballast, had stranded on the beach. The wind was blowing from the N.N.W., the weather was very foggy, and the sea heavy. The master and crew did not wish to leave the vessel, but requested the Life-boat to remain by them, which she did, until the brig was towed off by a steam-tug.—Expense of service, 15*l.* 16*s.*

Nov. 16.—A vessel was observed with two jibs set and signals of distress flying in her main rigging, about a mile from the shore at Chapel, Lincolnshire, during a very strong breeze from the S. by E. and a heavy sea. The *Landseer* Life-boat put off to her assistance, and found she was the ketch *Annie*, of Goole, bound from Goole to London with a cargo of stone. Her rudder had been carried away by the gale during the previous night, and she then became unmanageable. With the assistance of the Life-boat the vessel and her crew of three men were taken safely to Grimsby.

Nov. 18.—The Caister No. 1 Life-boat, *Covent Garden*, was launched at 1 A.M., in reply to large flares which had been observed in the direction of the North Scroby Sand, when the barge *Garson*, of Wisbeach, was discovered riding at anchor with all the appearances of sinking. The crew of four men were taken into the Life-boat, which remained by the vessel for some time, but the wind and sea

becoming so strong that it was considered dangerous for the boat to stay by her any longer, she proceeded to Yarmouth and landed the men at the Britannia pier. The barge was afterwards towed into Yarmouth Harbour, the gale having abated.—Expense of service, 25*l.*

Nov. 22.—The *Admiral Butcher* Life-boat, stationed at Tralee Bay, co. Kerry, proceeded to the barque *Ostendea*, and brought ashore the master, for the purpose of procuring assistance and a tug to tow the vessel to Limerick for repairs, she having lost her rudder three days previously, and several of her head sails, besides being in a leaky condition.

Nov. 25.—Intelligence was received this day at the Eastbourne Life-boat Station that a large foreign barque was riding at her anchors off Beachy Head Lighthouse, in a very dangerous position, with a signal of distress flying. With as little delay as possible, the crew of the *William and Mary* Life-boat were mustered, and the boat, mounted on its transporting carriage, started for Birling Gap, drawn by seven horses. The route taken was through Meads, where three additional horses were procured, and with this extra power she speedily mounted the hill, and crossed the downs to Birling Gap, a distance altogether of five miles. There the boat was obliged to be taken off her carriage, as the Gap had to be widened to admit even of the passage of the boat, and the incline was very sharp. The lower part of the Gap had been washed away by the sea, but this difficulty was overcome by using some long pieces of timber which were fortunately on the spot. Under the superintendence of the coxswain the boat was, by great exertions, got safely down to the beach, and was launched at 1.15. The wind was blowing a gale from the S.S.W., and a tremendous sea was rolling in. At about 2 o'clock, after a very hard struggle against the head sea, the midship oars being double-banked, the vessel was reached; she was then opposite the Gap, about a mile from shore, labouring heavily in the seas with two anchors down, sails torn, and spars carried away. A storm of rain then came on, and the vessel and Life-boat were hidden from the view of the spectators who lined the cliffs. After a period of suspense, the Life-boat was seen making for the shore, and in gallant style she

took the beach almost close to the spot from whence she had started, and landed the rescued crew of eleven men. The Life-boat had anchored as close as possible to the vessel, and the crew were then hauled into her. The poor fellows, who were in a very exhausted state, one of them having sustained a fracture of the ribs, were taken to the Coastguard Station, where they received every attention from the Chief Officer and the Coastguardmen. The Life-boat was got up the Gap with considerable difficulty, and arrived back at her station about 7.30. The distressed vessel was the barque *New Brunswick*, of Brevig, 480 tons, bound from Quebec to West Hartlepool, with a cargo of deals. Subsequently, on the weather moderating, the ship and cargo were taken safely to Newhaven by the tug and Life-boat from there.—Expense of service, 35l. 15s. 4d.

COMMITTEE MEETING, Dec. 6th, 1883.

Voted 240l. 4s. 6d. to pay the expenses of the Sheringham, Peterhead, Cruden, Tenby, St. Anne's, Aldborough, Thorpe, Harwich, Holyhead, Walmer, Caister No. 1, Winterton No. 2, Tralee, Skegness, Irvine, Newhaven, and New Romney Life-boats, in assembling their crews or putting off in reply to signals of distress.

The Ramsgate Life-boat had also been taken out, but her services had not been required.

Dec. 6.—At 7.30 A.M. a sudden gale from the N.E. sprang up at Aldborough, Suffolk, accompanied by a very rough sea. The fleet of fishing-boats was out, and two of the boats were unable to cross the shoals. The coxswain of the Life-boat was also at sea at the time, but, reaching the shore with difficulty, immediately assembled the crew of the *George Hounsfield* Life-boat, went off to the assistance of the two boats, and brought safely ashore their crews, numbering six men.—Expense of service, 17l. 10s.

Dec. 6.—In consequence of a telegram from Margate that the Tongue Lightship was firing for assistance, the Ramsgate Life-boat *Bradford* and steam-tug *Vulcan* left the harbour at midnight, during a fresh gale from the E.N.E., with snow and a high sea. They spoke the Lightship at 3 A.M., and were informed that the crew of a wrecked vessel were on

board. The Life-boat went alongside and took off the crew, consisting of twenty-four men, of the s.s. *Boadicea*, of Shields, coal laden from Shields for Savona, which had stranded on the Shingles Sand. The tug and Life-boat then returned to Ramsgate, arriving in the harbour at 7 o'clock.

Dec. 7.—Signals of distress were seen on the north part of the Barber Sand, off the Norfolk coast, at 7 A.M., during a fresh N.E. wind and a heavy sea. The Cockle Lightship was also firing guns and rockets. The Caister No. 1 Life-boat *Covent Garden* was launched, and found the barque *Zelos*, of Grimstad, laden with deals, ashore on the sands. The boat went alongside, and with difficulty took off the crew of ten men; a rope was then made fast to the vessel, and the boat veered clear of the breakers and dropped her anchor. She rode about three-quarters of an hour, when the sea, which was breaking over the vessel, forced her over the sand clear of the breakers. The boat was then hauled to her, and a rope was taken to a steam-tug. The barque was subsequently towed to Harwich full of water. Before the Life-boat reached her, one of her own boats had been launched, into which all the crew got, with the exception of the master; but the sea was found to be so heavy that they all went on board again. Soon afterwards the painter parted, and the boat floated away and was driven ashore bottom upwards.

Dec. 11.—Signals of distress were seen in Holyhead Bay at 8.30 P.M., during a very heavy gale from the W.N.W. The *Thomas Fielden* Life-boat put off, and found the schooner *Dorothy and Mary*, of Carnarvon, coal laden from Newcastle to Dublin, dragging her anchors near the Clipera buoy. The crew of four men were taken into the Life-boat and safely landed. The schooner became a total wreck.—Expense of service, 30l. 5s.

Dec. 11.—At 11.30 P.M. it was reported at Kingstown, Ireland, that some fishermen were in danger on board a wreck on the North Bull Sands. It appeared that a number of open boats were fishing near the spot when a heavy W. gale suddenly broke upon them. Some of them succeeded in reaching the land, but four were driven on shore and lost. Their crews took refuge on the wreck in question, but as the sea was washing over them they were in great danger. The

Hector Life-boat promptly went out from Kingstown to their aid, and succeeded in rescuing six men who were in a very exhausted condition.—Expense of service, 14l. 15s.

Dec. 12.—On the night of the 11th December, while the wind was blowing a gale from the N.N.W., the schooner *Lady Stuart*, of Chester, was lying to off Point Lynas under reefed sails, and eventually drifted with the flood-tide and gale to opposite Orme's Head. At about 7 o'clock on the following morning she ran for Chester Bar. When off Rhyl she shipped a heavy sea, which washed away her bulwarks, hatches, and main boom, and smashed the companion skylight and her boat to pieces. She was then found to be in a sinking state, and was steered for the Foryd, when she shipped other heavy seas, and her crew of five men were compelled to take to the rigging, and the vessel was then driven at the mercy of the storm, and ran stern on to the Rhyl promenade pier. Three of the crew jumped on to the pier, but the captain and his son remained on board the schooner, which was driven through the pier and went ashore to the eastward, where she sunk. The master and his son were fortunately saved by the Rhyl No. 2 Life-boat, *Jane Dalton*, which promptly put off to the help of the shipwrecked crew as soon as their perilous position was observed.—Expense of service, 13l. 10s. 3d.

Dec. 12.—At about 4.30 A.M., during a gale from the N.E., which for its violence was said to be the worst experienced on the coast of Aberdeenshire since the one when the Tay bridge disaster took place, the schooner *Baroness Strathspey*, of and from Portsoy for Sunderland in ballast, came into Fraserburgh Bay and was driven on to the sands about half a mile south of that port. The *Cosmo* and *Charles* Life-boat stationed at Fraserburgh put off to her assistance and succeeded in rescuing two of her crew, the other three men having been saved by the rocket apparatus.—Expense of service, 15l. 1s.

Dec. 12.—During a fresh gale from the N.W. and a heavy sea, the man on the look out at Skegness, Lincolnshire, observed that signals of distress were flying on board a vessel in the offing. The Life-boat *Herbert Ingram* put off to her, and found that she was the s.s. *Victoria* of Goole, bound from Seaham to Blakeney with

flagstones and coal. The Life-boat dropped her anchor to windward of the steamer, bore down to her, and, after several attempts, hove a grapnel on board. The master and crew of three men were then taken into the boat. The vessel had sprung a leak, and sank just as the Life-boat was landing at Brancaster.—Expense 39l. 9s. 6d.

Dec. 12.—The *Manchester Unity* Life-boat stationed at Grimsby was launched this morning to the assistance of the schooner *Margaret* of Carnarvon, which was ashore on the Trinity Sands with a signal of distress in her rigging. The Life-boat took off the vessel's crew of four men and brought them ashore. The wind was blowing a strong gale from the N.W. and the sea was heavy.—Expense of service, 6l. 10s.

Dec. 12.—The schooner *London*, of Hastings, bound from Hartlepool to Rye with coal, was seen making for Scarborough harbour, with only her fore staysail set, and with a signal of distress flying, at 9 A.M. during a heavy gale from the N. The Scarborough Life-boat, *Lady Leigh*, put off to her assistance, placed three men on board, and wore the vessel, which was fast drifting into broken water, with her head to sea. It was intended to take her to Filey Bay, and to run her ashore on the soft sand there; but she would not stay, and having lost all her anchors, it became necessary to abandon her. The crew of five men were then landed in the Life-boat and the vessel drove ashore about a mile south of Filey.—Expense of service, 19l. 16s. 9d.

Dec. 12.—The schooner *Swift*, of Rye, bound to that port from Seaham with coal, was seen off Lowestoft with a flag of distress during a gale from the N.W. and a heavy sea. The *Samuel Plimsoll* Life-boat, stationed at Lowestoft, thereupon went to her assistance. She had lost both her anchors and her sails had been blown to ribbons. A Yarmouth tug had tried to take her to a place of safety, but her tow-ropes had parted twice, and the mate—the master being disabled—requested the Life-boat to remain by her. The crew of the schooner were too exhausted to work the vessel, some of the Life-boatmen therefore boarded her and rendered assistance. Eventually, with the aid of a steamer, the schooner and the Life-boat were taken into Lowestoft harbour.

Dec. 13.—At 8 A.M. a large barque, which proved to be the *Mermaid*, of Cardiff, bound from Quebec to Liverpool with a cargo of timber, was seen at anchor just clear of the banks lying at the mouth of the Ribble, and displaying signals of distress. The Lytham Life-boat *Charles Biggs* was launched without delay, and was towed by the steam-tug *Friend of All Nations* as far to windward as the tug could safely go. The Life-boat then rowed a distance of two miles against wind and tide to the distressed vessel. After pulling for some time, the Life-boat fortunately fell in with the vessel's two boats containing the crew of the barque numbering twenty-one men, together with the master's two daughters. They were all taken into the Life-boat and brought ashore. A strong W.S.W. gale was blowing at the time, the sea was very heavy, and in all probability the ship's boats would have been swamped if they had attempted to reach the shore in such a storm. The barque had become unmanageable, having lost her sails and rudder.—Expense of service, 10*l.* 2*s.*

Dec. 14.—The steamer *Castle Craig*, of Liverpool, stranded on Brooke Ledge, Isle of Wight, during thick weather and a heavy sea. At about 4 A.M., her signals of distress being observed, the crew of the *George and Anne* Life-boat, stationed at Brooke, were summoned, and the boat went to the assistance of the stranded vessel. Much difficulty and danger were incurred in laying near the vessel so as to take the crew off, but eventually this was safely accomplished, and in two trips the boat brought ashore thirty-one men. The steamer was on a voyage from Odessa to Antwerp with a cargo of grain, oilcake and feathers.—Expense of service, 31*l.* 4*s.*

Dec. 15.—The s.s. *Skelligs*, of Glasgow, bound to Liverpool with a general cargo, was leaving Portrush Harbour during a strong breeze from the W. and a very high sea, when she failed to answer her helm, and was driven on to the sand about 50 yards S.W. of the South pier. The Portrush Life-boat *John Whitaker* put off to her assistance, and took hawsers from the vessel to the pier, which prevented her from going broadside on to the sand, and enabled her to get off when the tide rose. She had a crew of sixteen men.

Dec. 17.—The Caister No. 1 Life-boat, *Covent Garden*, was launched at 2.15 A.M.,

in reply to signals of distress, during a strong N.N.E. wind and a very heavy sea. She found the brig *Clara*, of Dublin, bound from Liverpool to the Tyne with a cargo of salt, had lost her main topmast and was waterlogged with seven feet of water in her hold. Some of the Life-boatmen boarded her, and, with the assistance of a steam-tug, took her into Lowestoft harbour. She carried a crew of seven men.

Dec. 17.—In response to three guns fired from the Corton lightship the Lowestoft Life-boat, *Samuel Plimsoll*, was launched at about 9 A.M., and was towed out by the tug *Rainbow*. The wind was blowing half a gale from the N.E. accompanied by a heavy sea. Owing to the mist at sea no vessel could be seen until the lightship was approached, when the trawler *Magic*, of Hull, was found disabled, having all her sails split; she had lost her mizen-mast, her anchor was gone, the sea was making a clean sweep of her deck and she was fast driving on to the sands, where she would undoubtedly have been wrecked. At the request of the master some of the Life-boat crew got on board, and the tug took both the vessel and the Life-boat in tow and brought them into Lowestoft Harbour, arriving there at about 11.30 A.M. The trawler had a crew of five men.

Dec. 24.—At about 7 P.M. a signal of distress was shown from the Tuskar Rock, off the coast of Wexford. The *Iris* Life-boat, stationed at Carnsore, proceeded there and found a wrecked vessel, which was hailed, but no answer was received. The Life-boatmen then communicated with the Lighthouse keepers, and were told that the crew of the vessel were all safe on the rock, and that it was impossible for them to make a landing during the night. The coxswain asked if he should remain by until the morning, and did so at their request. At daybreak an attempt was made to take the men off; but the sea was too heavy to admit of this being done. Shortly afterwards the tug *Ruby* of Wexford, having a whale-boat in tow, came up, and by the united efforts of both crews, all the men were got off safely with the exception of one, who remained to take charge of the captain's property. The wrecked ship was the *White Star*, of Liverpool, bound from Calcutta to Liverpool with a cargo of jute, and having a crew of thirty men.

Dec. 28.—At 3 P.M. the Italian barque *Marina Benvenuto*, bound from Liverpool to Cardiff in ballast, was observed ashore on the Arklow bank. The wind was blowing from the S.W., the weather was hazy, and the sea smooth. Just as she was reported to be in distress her boat was seen to be coming ashore. On its arrival the master requested the services of the Arklow Life-boat, and the *Out-Pensioner* Life-boat accordingly went to the vessel and placed twelve men on board, who rendered every assistance. About 6.40 P.M. the barque floated and was taken to Kingstown.

Dec. 31.—Voted 352*l.* 16*s.* 8*d.* to pay the expenses of the Life-boats at Maryport, Southport, Caister, St. Anne's, Poolbeg, Ramsey, Brancaster, Blackpool, Margate, Kirkcudbright, Donna Nook, Brightstone Grange, Moray Firth, Saltburn, Ramsgate, Llanaelhaiarn, Kingsdowne, Palling, Grimsby, Porthdinllaen, Wexford, Penmon, Courtown, and Girvan, in assembling their crews or putting off in reply to signals of distress shown by vessels not ultimately needing assistance.

SHORE-BOAT SERVICES REWARDED BY THE ROYAL NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION IN 1883.

Jan. 4.—Voted 3*l.* to three fishermen for putting off in a boat and saving at some risk, the crew, consisting of four men, of the Norwegian schooner *Johanna*, which was wrecked on Carrig Rock, off the coast of Fifeshire, during a whole gale from the N.E. on the 7th December.

Also 3*l.* to three men for putting off in a boat from Southend, Essex, and assisting to save eight persons from the schooner *Hero*, which stranded off Southend, during a S.W. wind and a very rough sea, on the 24th of October.

Jan. 9.—Six men put off in a boat and towed safely ashore at Berehaven, Co. Cork, a boat containing the crew of five men of the brigantine *Commodore*, of Dublin, which had misstayed at the entrance to the harbour, and became a total wreck, during a fresh gale of wind from the E.N.E. to E.S.E.—Reward, 3*l.*

Jan. 23.—Two men who were in a boat fishing in Plymouth Sound rescued two other men, whose boat had been run into by a sloop in the Sound during a strong S.W. wind. Reward, 1*l.*

Jan. 24.—The crews of two cobsles belonging to Redcar, Yorkshire, put off, during a fresh gale, and saved the crew of four men of the schooner *Jim Crow*, of Yarmouth, bound from Shields to Yarmouth with a cargo of coal, which had struck on the Saltscar Rocks, and became a total wreck.—Reward, 7*l.* 10*s.*

Jan. 24.—The crews of two other Redcar cobsles rescued the crew, numbering three men, of the schooner *Norfolk Tar*, of King's Lynn, bound from Wisbeach to Lynn, with wheat, which was totally wrecked at Redcar during the gale. Reward, 4*l.* 4*s.*

Jan. 28.—Six men put off from Cley, Norfolk, in a boat, and rescued the crew of five men of the schooner *Johanne*, of Faaborg, Denmark, who had taken to their boat, their vessel being in a leaky condition, during a whole gale from the W.—Reward, 4*l.* 10*s.*

Feb. 1.—Voted 10*l.* to five men for putting off in a boat from Carrick-a-Raide Island, Co. An-

trim, and rescuing, at much risk of life, the crew of four men of a fishing yawl, which was in danger of being wrecked, during a gale from the N.W., on the 2nd August.

Also 3*l.* to three men, for putting off in a boat and saving another man, whose boat had been capsized off Eyeries, Co. Cork, during a N.N.E. wind and high surf, on the 26th October.

Also 5*l.* to several men who waded into the surf and rescued, by means of a line and a hawser, the master, his wife and three children, and the crew, consisting of three men, of the ketch *Q. E. D.*, of Dartmouth, which was totally wrecked off Lowestoft, during a whole gale from the N.E., on the 28th October.

Also 2*l.* to four men for saving four men from the boat of the ship *Rose of Sharon*, of Shields, which, when returning from the shore to that vessel, had been caught in a sudden gale from the N.W., and had been driven out into the Bristol Channel on the 26th November.

Also 2*l.* to the crew of a boat for rescuing three men who had been working on board the s.s. *Troubadour*, of Liverpool, which had stranded off Drogheda, Ireland, and were in some peril during a gale of wind from the S.W. on the 29th December.

Feb. 1.—Three men put off in a boat and saved at some risk, four out of five persons from a rowing-boat which had been capsized off Worthing by a heavy surf.—Reward, 3*l.*

Feb. 2.—Three men put off in a boat from Shoreham and saved the crew of six men of the fishing smack *Louisa*, of that port, which had sunk in the harbour during a whole gale of wind from the S. Reward, 3*l.*

Feb. 7.—Four fishermen saved, by means of life-belts and lines, three of the crew of the schooner *Savant*, of Beaumaris, which was wrecked at Crail during a strong N.E. gale and a heavy sea. Reward, 2*l.*

Feb. 12.—Eleven men put off in a boat and rescued the crews, numbering in all thirty-five men, of five fishing-boats, which were in danger

in Ackergill Bay, during a gale and a heavy sea. Reward, 5l. 10s.

Feb. 23.—Four men belonging to North Sunderland saved the crew of five men and the master, his wife and child, from the boat of the schooner *Parkinson*, of Barrow, which had been wrecked on the Knavestone Rock, Farne Islands, during a fresh N.W. breeze and a moderate sea. Reward, 1l.

March 1.—Voted the Second Service Clasp to Mr. WILLIAM NORSWORTHY, Chief Officer of H.M. Coastguard at Carnarvon, and 4l. to four other men, for putting off in a boat, at great risk—the boat being driven back four times—and saving the crew, consisting of one man and a boy, from the barge *Neptune*, of Carnarvon, which had dragged her anchor and stranded on a sandbank off Carnarvon, during a storm from the W.N.W. on the night of the 25th January.

March 4.—Five men put off in a boat and rescued three soldiers who had been surrounded by the tide on "North Wharf," Fleetwood. Reward, 1l. 5s.

March 24.—The crew of a Winterton yawl brought ashore the crew of ten men of the Norwegian schooner *Oriente*, who had taken refuge on the Wold Lightship, during a fresh wind from the W.N.W. Reward, 6l.

April 14.—During a strong gale of wind from the N.W. and a high sea, the fishing smack *Jessie*, of Lerwick, was returning to port when her mainmast was carried away and she sustained other damage. She was then between the headlands of Monsa and Bressa Head in a helpless condition, and the boat and her crew were in great danger. On the accident being observed by the master and crew of the fishing-boat *Good Design*, of Cellardyke, which was some distance from her, they at once proceeded to her, and saved the disabled smack and her crew of five men.—Reward, 7l.

April 28.—A fisherman put off in a boat to the rescue of several persons, whose boat, named the *Mary*, of Errislannin, had capsized off Clifden Quay during fine weather.—Reward, 1l.

May 1.—The crew of a yawl belonging to Scratby, Norfolk, put off and saved one man from the boat *Three Sisters*, of Scratby, which had been upset during a fresh wind from the N.N.E.—Reward, 5l.

May 7.—Four men saved five other men from a fishing-boat which had been swamped off Innishowen Head, Co. Donegal, during a gale of wind from the N.E.—Reward, 4l.

May 7.—Some men put off and saved four persons from a boat which had been capsized off Bulls-mouth, Co. Mayo, during a strong breeze from the N.E.—Reward, 2l. 5s.

May 9.—The mate and a seaman of the schooner *W. S. Flower* put off in a small boat from that vessel during squally weather, and saved four men from a sailing boat which had capsized and sunk off Brownsea Castle, Dorset.—Reward, 2l.

May 16.—One of the crew of the Poole Life-boat rescued four men from a boat which had been caught in a squall and capsized in Poole Harbour.—Reward, 1l.

May 19.—Five men put off in a boat from

Fleetwood, and saved two soldiers who had taken refuge on a wreck, having been surrounded by the tide while attempting to walk ashore from the North Wharf.—Reward, 2l. 10s.

May 21.—Eleven men saved, at some risk, three other men whose canoe had been filled by the sea and capsized off the Blasket Island, Co. Kerry, during a moderate N.E. wind.—Reward, 5l. 10s.

June 7.—Voted the Silver Medal of the Institution to Mr. W. H. ARNOLD, Chief Boatman in charge of H.M. Coastguard at Sandown, Isle of Wight, in acknowledgment of his gallant services in putting off, through a heavy sea, in the station boat with five other men, and saving, at considerable risk, five of the crew of the brigantine *Jeune Gustave*, of Brest, which was totally wrecked off Red Cliff, Sandown Bay, during a strong S.W. gale on the evening of the 10th February.

July 4.—Two men saved a man from a canoe which had been capsized between Barna and Furlough, Co. Galway, during a N.E. wind.—Reward, 1l.

July 9.—Three men put off in a coastguard boat from Chapel, Lincolnshire, and saved a man from a boat belonging to Skegness, which had been capsized off Chapel during a strong S. wind.—Reward, 1l. 1s.

July 20.—Thirteen men put off in the yawl *Glance*, of Caister, Norfolk, and saved the crew, consisting of five men, of the fishing smack, *Zero*, of Grimsby, which was totally wrecked on the Middle Cross Sand during a N.W. wind.—Reward, 10l.

Aug. 9.—Six men of Ballycastle, Co. Antrim, put off in the Coastguard whale Lifeboat, and saved the crew of four men of the schooner *J. E. Furlong*, of Dublin, which had dragged her anchors in Ballycastle Bay, during a fresh gale from the W.N.W. and a heavy sea.—Reward, 3l.

Aug. 28.—The crew of a boat saved three men from a sailing boat which had capsized on Drogheda bar during squally weather.—Reward, 1l. 10s.

Sept. 1.—Three men saved a boat containing three men which was drifting out to sea off Porthdiullaen, North Wales.—Reward, 15s.

Sept. 1.—Four men of Penmon, Anglesey, waded into the sea and saved, by means of lines, the crew of two men of the smack *Darlíng*, of Beaumaris, which had stranded on the rocks close to the Menai lighthouse during a strong S.E. gale.—Reward, 4l.

Sept. 2.—Six men put off in a boat from Southend, Essex, and saved the crew of two men from the barge *Mary*, of Rochester, which had sunk off Southend during a gale from the S.—Reward, 3l. The crew of another boat also put off with the view of rescuing the shipwrecked men.—Reward, 1l. 5s.

Sept. 24.—A man and his daughter saved two men whose boat had been capsized off Burton Port, co. Donegal, during squally weather.—Reward, 1l. The cost, amounting to 17s. 6d., of repairing the boat used by the salvors, which was damaged in rendering this service, was also defrayed by the Institution.

Sept. 26.—Six men put off twice in a fishing yawl, at considerable risk, and saved the crews

of ten men from the schooner *Clare*, of Carnarvon, and smack *Robina*, of Dublin, which were in distress in Peel Bay, Isle of Man, during a very heavy gale.—Reward, 4*l.* 10*s.*

Sept. 26.—Four men of Fleetwood, Lancashire, rescued, by means of a cart and by wading into the water, the crew of five men and the master's wife, from the schooner *Thornton*, of Fleetwood, which became a total wreck on Barnard Wharf during a W. gale.—Reward, 4*l.*

Sept. 30.—Eight men put off in a coble from Holy Island and rescued the crew of three men and a boy from a small screw steamer, the *Kenilworth*, of Middlesbrough, which was wrecked on False Emanuel Head during squally weather and a very heavy sea.—Reward, 6*l.*

Oct. 5.—The crew of the fishing-boat *Happy Return*, of Walmer, rescued Capt. DREVAR, whose boat had been capsized while he was endeavouring to cross the Channel from Dover to Calais.—Reward, 4*l.*

Oct. 10.—At night signal rockets were observed in St. Bride's Bay, and as it was supposed that they had been fired by a distressed vessel, some men put off in a boat from St.

Bride's Bay to render assistance had it been required.—Reward, 2*l.* 5*s.*

Nov. 1.—Voted the thanks of the Committee, inscribed on vellum, and 1*l.* each, to EDWARD CRASKE, ROBERT BISHOP, and JOHN HENRY DAVIS, for going into the water with lines, and assisting to save the crew of five men of the schooner *Alpha*, of Faversham, which was wrecked off Cromer, Norfolk, during a heavy gale from the N.N.W. on the 4th October.

Nov. 6.—The crew of the smack *Tyro*, of Aldborough, brought ashore the crew of seven men of the brig *Thankful*, of Shields, who had taken to their boat, as their vessel was sinking off Thorpeness, during a gale from the S. by E.—Reward, 5*l.*

Nov. 19.—Four men put off in a boat, in tow of a steam-tug, and saved the stranded fishing-boat *Harriet*, of Fleetwood, having one man on board, which was in distress off Fleetwood during a strong breeze from the W.N.W.—Reward, 2*l.*

Nov. 21.—Three men put off in a boat and saved two men from a canoe which had capsized in Stokes' Channel, Poole Harbour, during a strong N.W. breeze.—Reward, 15*s.*

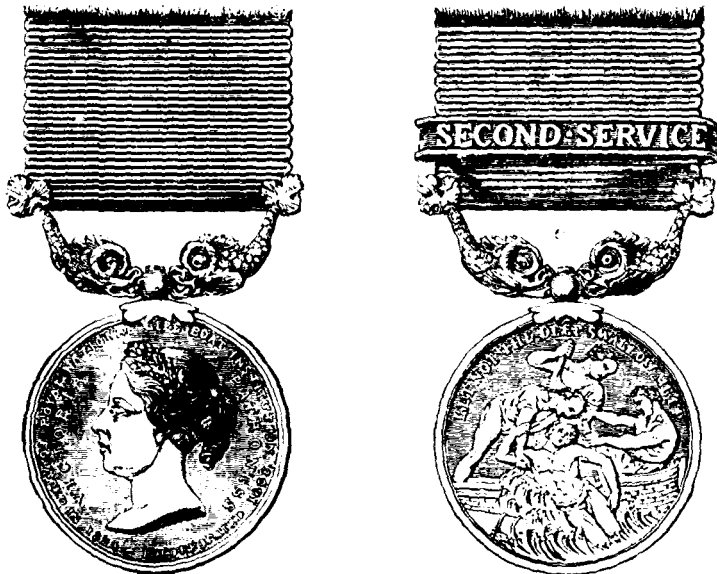

Reverse.—Three sailors in a Life-boat,—one of whom is in the act of rescuing an exhausted mariner from the waves on a fragment of the wreck. “W. WYON, Mint.” Inscription, “Let not the deep swallow me up.”

THE beautiful obverse of this medal, executed by L. C. WYON, Esq., represents the bust of QUEEN VICTORIA, Her Majesty's locks gracefully waving and gathered in a knot behind, from which issues a wreath of oak clustering over the forehead. This life-like portrait of the QUEEN, in high relief, conveys a truly pleasing and faithful likeness of HER MAJESTY at that period (1862), combining the dignity of aspect and benevolence which have always characterised the Queen throughout her long and prosperous reign.

The reverse, representing the Life-boat, in which there are three Seamen, rescuing a fourth from the sea, is a work of great merit. Two of the men are steadying the boat, while the other, stooping, draws in the Shipwrecked Sailor, whose figure is given so as to show the form in the most natural manner; and the expression thrown into his countenance looking up to his preserver is supplicating in the extreme, while the easy flowing lines of this sailor are finely contrasted by those of his companions: the whole displaying a perfect knowledge of the human frame, and a command of the graver to embody what he had shadowed out to himself.

But there is another pleasing motive for admiration of this beautiful Medal, as the figure who is so humanely extending his relief to the drowning Mariner is a portrait of the Artist, the late WILLIAM WYON, Esq., R.A., himself.

The following is a LIST of the GOLD and SILVER MEDALS that have been voted by the Committee of the Institution since its establishment in 1821, to persons whose humane and intrepid exertions in saving Life from Shipwreck on our Coasts have been deemed sufficiently conspicuous to merit that honourable distinction. The Cases will be found recorded in detail in the several Annual Reports of the Institution.

The total number of Medals granted by the Institution up to the present time is 1,063, 97 of which were in Gold, and 966 in Silver.

THE LIFE-BELT IN USE BY THE CREWS OF THE LIFE-BOATS OF THE NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION.



The requisite qualities of a life-boatman's life-belt are—

1. Sufficient extra buoyancy to support a man heavily clothed, with his head and shoulders above the water, and to enable him to support another person besides himself.

2. Perfect flexibility, so as to readily conform to the shape of the wearer.

3. A division into two zones, an upper and lower, so that between the two it may be secured tightly round the waist; for in no other manner can it be confined sufficiently close and secure round the body without such pressure over the chest and ribs as to materially affect the free action of the lungs, impede the muscular movement of the chest and arms, and thereby diminish the power of endurance of fatigue, which, in rowing-boats, is a matter of vital importance.

4. Strength, durability, and non-liability to injury

The cork life-belt of the NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION possesses the first two qualities in a greater degree than any other life-belt, and the third one exclusively. (*Vide* annexed figure.)

THE LIFE-BOAT STATION.



THE following brief description and diagrams illustrative of a complete Life-boat Establishment, including the House for the protection of the boat, will serve to convey an idea of the general character of one of the 274 Life-boat Stations of the NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION.

It will be seen that it is a work of a costly nature, and that not only in the first instance, but that a large permanent expense is entailed in keeping the whole machinery in an efficient state, in the re-supply of any part of it which may be destroyed or worn out, in the exercise of the boats' crews, in launching and working the boats, and in remunerating them for their services in saving their fellow-creatures. Yet, looking to the vast importance of the result effected, and the responsibility of calling on men to risk their lives in effecting the same, it is felt that few if any persons will be found who will that expense to be incurred in vain.

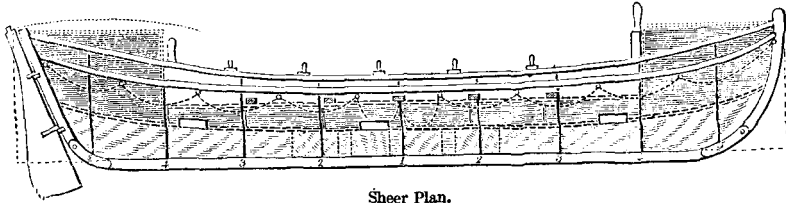
THE LIFE-BOAT.

(See Diagrams on next page.)

The following figures show the general form, the nature of the fittings and air-chambers of one of these boats, 33 feet in length and 8 feet in breadth. In figs. 1 and 2, the elevation and deck plans, the general exterior form of the boat is shown with the sheer of gunwale, length of keel, and rake of stem and stern-posts. The dotted lines of fig. 1 show the position and dimensions of the air-chambers within board, the relieving-tubes, and ballast. In fig 2, A represents the deck, B the relieving-tubes (6 inches in diameter), C the side air-cases, D the end air-chambers, E ballast, F scuttles to admit of a free current of air under the water-tight deck, G scuttle for air, and to receive pump. In fig. 3, the exterior form of transverse sections, at different distances from stem to stern, is shown. Fig. 4 represents a

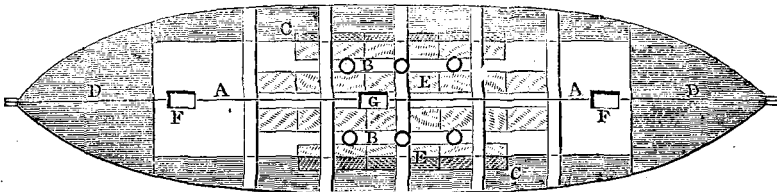
midship transverse section, A being sections of the side air-cases, B the relieving-tubes, of the same depth as the space between the deck and the boat's floor. C, C, C, C, are spaces beneath the deck, placed longitudinally, at the midship part of the boat, with cases packed with cork, forming a portion of the ballast; *d* scuttle for ventilation, having a pump fixed in it, by which any leakage beneath the deck can be pumped out by one of the crew whilst afloat. The festooned lines in fig. 1 represent exterior life-lines attached round the entire length of the boat, to which persons in the water may cling till they can be got into the boat; the two central lines are festooned lower than the others, to be used as stirrups, so that a person in the water, by stepping on them, may climb into the boat without assistance.

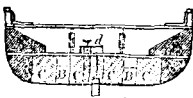
Sheer Plan.

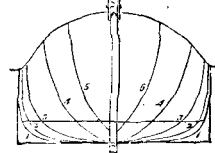
Deck Plan.

Midship Section.

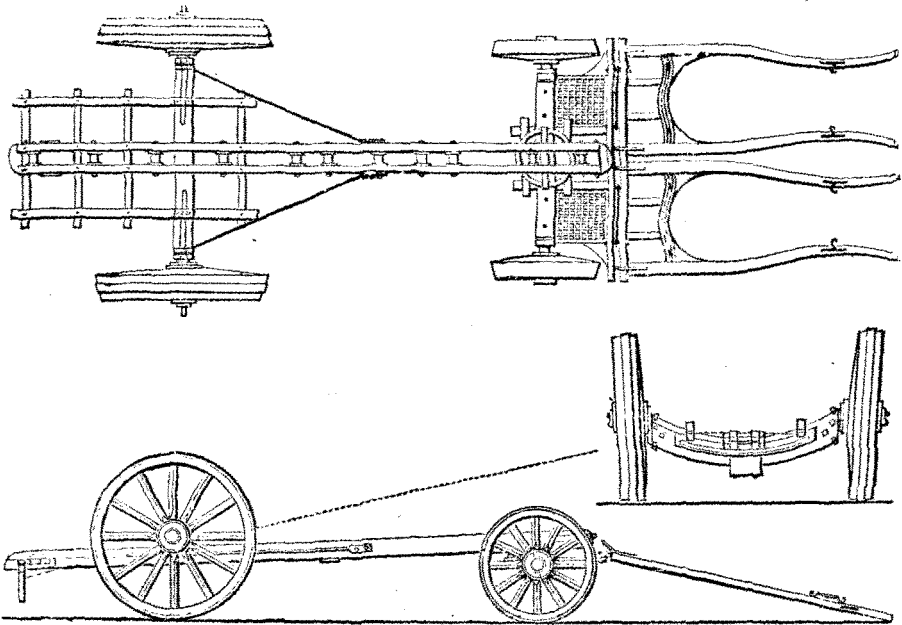
This Life-boat possesses in the highest degree all the qualities which it is desirable that a Life-boat should possess:—

1. Great lateral stability, or resistance to upsetting.
2. Speed against a heavy sea.
3. Facility for launching and taking the shore.
4. Immediate self-discharge of any water breaking into her.
5. The important advantage of self-righting if upset.
6. Strength.
7. Stowage room for a large number of passengers.

THE LIFE-BOAT TRANSPORTING-CARRIAGE.

The Life-boat transporting-carriage is a very important auxiliary to the boat. Every Life-boat, except a few of the larger size, is provided with a carriage, on which she is kept in the boat-house ready for immediate transportation to the most favourable position for launching to a wreck. A Life-boat is thus made available for a greater extent of coast than she otherwise would be; and even when launched from abreast of the boat-house, can be much quicker conveyed to the water's edge than she could be if not on a carriage. In addition to this ordinary use, a carriage is of immense service in launching a boat from a beach, to that extent, indeed, that one can be readily launched from a carriage through a high surf, when without one she could not be got off the beach.

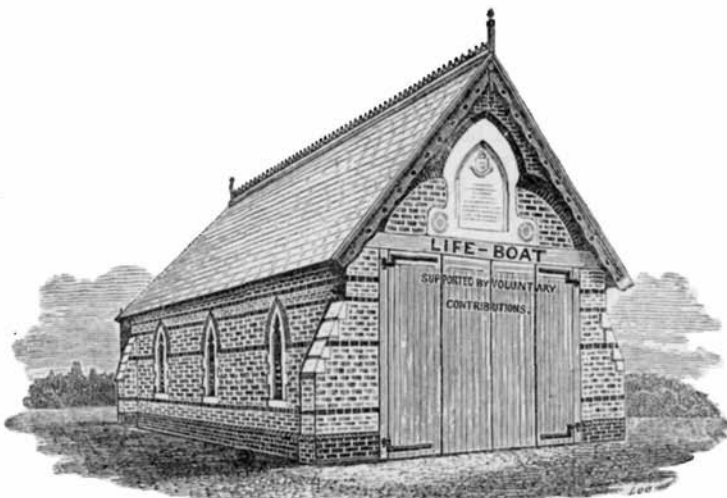
The carriage consists of a fore and main body. The latter is formed of a keelway, and of side or bilgeways attached to the keelway, and resting on the main axle, the



boat's weight being entirely on the rollers of the keelway. Its leading characteristic is that, on the withdrawal of a forelock pin, the fore and main bodies can be detached from each other. The advantages of this arrangement are that, whilst on the one hand the weight of the boat when she is launched from the rear end forms an inclined plane by elevating the keelway and fore-carriage; on the other hand, to replace her on the carriage she can be hauled bow foremost up the fore end or longer incline, by disconnecting the fore-carriage, and letting the end of the keelway rest on the ground, thus forming an inclined plane up which the boat is easily drawn. The bilgeways are needed at the rear end, that the boat may be launched in an upright position, with her crew on board, but they are not required at the fore end of the carriage.

A very full equipment of stores is supplied to the Life-boats of the Institution—such as cork life-belts, anchors and cables, grapnels and lines, life-buoys, lanterns, rockets, and many other articles, together with portable or launching-skids.

THE LIFE-BOAT HOUSE.



The boats of the NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION, and all belonging to them, are kept in roomy and substantial boat-houses, under lock and key, in charge of paid coxswains, under the general superintendence of local honorary committees of residents in the several localities. Each boat has its appointed coxswain at a salary of 8*l.*, and an assistant at 2*l.* a year. The crew consists, in addition, of a bowman, and as many boatmen as the boat pulls oars. The members of the volunteer crews are registered, and wherever practicable, at least double the number of men required are entered on the register. Such men are mostly resident boatmen, fishermen, or Coastguardmen. On every occasion of going afloat to save life, the coxswain and each of the crew receive alike from the funds of the Institution (whether successful or not) 10*s.*, if by day, and 1*l.*, if by night; and 4*s.* each for every time of going afloat for exercise.

A reward of 7*s.* is given to the man who first brings intelligence of a wreck at such a distance along the coast as not to be in sight of the Coastguard Station or other look-out.

A flag hoisted by day, and the firing of a carronade (or other alarm signal) by night, are the well-known signals for calling the crew together.

On boarding wrecks, the preservation of life is the sole consideration. Should any goods or merchandise be brought into the Life-boat, contrary to the coxswain's remonstrance, he is authorised to throw them overboard.

The expense of a Life-boat Station averages 1,000*l.*, and is made up as follows:—

Life-boat and her equipment, including Life-belts for the Crew,	
Skids, and Transporting-carriage	£650
Boat-house (average cost)	350
Total	£1,000

The average Annual Expense of maintaining a Life-boat Station is 70*l.*

Such is a brief summary of the chief of the Regulations under which the Life-boats are worked. How faithfully and with what result they are carried out let the journals of each Life-boat Station and the annals of the Institution tell.

The NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION has now 274 Life-boats under its charge. Every one of these has been specially presented to it, and they save every year from 600 to 700 shipwrecked sailors. Altogether, the Institution has contributed to the saving of 30,563 lives.

Despite, however, this fleet of 274 Life-boats, and of 30 others locally provided and supported, and despite the numerous rocket and mortar stations on our coast, there remains the melancholy fact that an average of 700 lives are lost annually on and around our own shores alone, proclaiming solemnly, though silently, that, for humanity's sake, and for the national credit, no exertions should be spared in providing every possible means for the conveyance of succour to the shipwrecked.

The Institution needs a permanent income of about 40,000*l.* to maintain its great Life-saving Fleet; and the Committee feel assured that it will never lack it so long as it maintains its boats in the state of thorough efficiency that they are in at the present time, and manned as they are on every emergency by as fearless and noble a class of men as ever Nelson or Collingwood led to battle to uphold our country's honour and glory.
