At the ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING of the ROYAL NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION, held at Willis's Rooms, King Street, St. James's Square, on Tuesday, 13th day of March, 1883, His Grace THE DUKE OF NORTHUMBERLAND, P.C., D.C.L., *President of the Institution*, in the Chair, the following Report of the Committee was read by the Chief Inspector of Life-boats, in the absence of the Secretary:—

ANNUAL REPORT.

IN rendering their Annual Account to their supporters and the British Public, the Committee have once more to express their grateful thanks for that continued generous pecuniary aid which has enabled them to prosecute successfully the great national work they have undertaken—a work that will ever be needed, so long as British trade and commerce endure.

It might have been hoped that increased skill in navigation, the substitution of steam-colliers for the sailing craft of former years, and increased sobriety among our merchant seamen, would have greatly diminished the number of wrecks and of lives lost, at least on our own coasts. But, whilst those changes may have occasioned some diminution, the increase of collisions on our crowded sea-thoroughfares, and other causes, have made up the average amount, and the courage and capacity of our Life-boat men have been called into requisition as often, if not more frequently, than in previous years.

The transactions of the year will be found summarised under the usual heads. A speciality of the year has, however, been that, at the suggestion of the Chair-

man—EDWARD BIRKBECK, Esq., M.P.—the Committee have once more made an exception to their general rule to confine their attention exclusively to the work of the Institution, and have made another effort to diminish the loss of life amongst that industrious and invaluable class of the population, our coast fishermen, on whom the Institution is often dependent to man its Life-boats.

Some twelve years ago, the Institution was mainly instrumental in the introduction of decked fishing-boats on the East coast of Scotland, which improvement has undoubtedly been the means of saving many lives. And now again the Committee hope to be indirectly the means of saving many more, by inducing all fishermen whose vocation is prosecuted at long distances from the land, to provide themselves with reliable Aneroid Barometers, which, when far at sea, beyond sight of land, shall forewarn them of the approaching storm, and enable them to run for shelter ere overtaken by it.

Through the liberality of the manufacturers of these valuable instruments, who have undertaken to provide them for this special object at a greatly reduced price, the Institution, by offering them to owners

or masters of fishing vessels at only half that amount, has already—through the kind exertions of its Honorary Secretaries—induced the large number of 1050 to purchase them, so that there is great reason to hope they may in future be looked on as an indispensable article of equipment for every long-distance fishing-boat.

Life-boats.—Since the last Annual Report nine new Life-boats have been placed on the coast; four sent to new stations, and the remainder to replace other boats.

The following are the stations to which those Life-boats have been or are about to be sent:—

Seven of the above boats have been supplied with transporting-carriages, and for four of them new boat-houses have been built.

The Life-boats of the Institution have been the means of saving *seven hundred and forty-one* lives during the past year from wrecked or endangered vessels.

In addition to the Life-boat services, 143 lives were saved from shipwreck by shore-boats and other means, for which services rewards were given by the Institution, making a total of 884 lives rescued last year.

With much regret the Committee have once more to report that the brave services of their Life-boat crews during the past year have not been performed without some loss of life, as if to remind their countrymen of the dangerous character of the Life-boat work.

On the night of the 4th of November, the Winchelsea self-righting Life-boat, when running, under sail, to the lee-shore of the Bay, off Rye Harbour, in reply to signals of distress, was struck by a heavy broadside sea and upset. One of her crew, named EDWARD ROBUS, unable to regain her, swam for the shore, and, unfortunately, being in a bad state of health at the time, succumbed, ere he reached it, to the cold and buffeting of the waves.

On the 26th of January last the New Brighton Tubular Life-boat, when proceeding to aid a wrecked crew off Crosby, near the entrance to the Mersey, also in the night, was struck by a very heavy sea, which swept two of her crew overboard, one of whom their boatmates succeeded in rescuing, but the other, named CHARLES FINLEY, was drowned.

Lastly, on the 27th January, the Swansea Life-boat, stationed at the village of Mumbles, when attempting to rescue the crew of the German barque *Admiral Prinz Adalbert*, from her windward side, was thrown violently against her, and swept over successive ridges of rock by heavy seas. On this melancholy occasion no less than four of her crew lost their lives, and the remainder were all more or less seriously injured, the coxswain, JENKIN JENKINS, losing two out of four of his sons who were in the boat, and a third having his leg broken.

In each of the above cases the poor men left a widow and children unprovided for, but the Committee granted to each widow the sum of 200*l.*, or 1,200*l.* in all, towards the local subscriptions raised in behalf of the widows and orphans.

Shipwrecks.—The loss of life from the numerous shipwrecks and collisions during the past year, and particularly during the fearful and frequent gales of last November and December, is sad to contemplate. It is, however, *satisfactory* to find that on such disastrous occasions the exertions of the Life-boats' crews are ever prompt and unceasing.

The number of Life-boats now under the management of the Institution is *Two hundred and seventy-three*, and their services during each month of the year were as follows:—

As in former years, the launches of the Life-boats unattended with positive results have been very frequent. Nevertheless, it is no time for hesitation when the ship's signal of distress is either seen or heard; but on the contrary, it is a period when judgment and promptitude are of the utmost importance.

The Rocket Apparatus belonging to the BOARD OF TRADE, worked so efficiently by the Coast-guard and the Rocket Volunteer Brigades, also saved hundreds of lives in the same period.

The number of lives saved during the fifty-nine years from the establishment of the Institution, to the end of the year 1882, either by its Life-boats or by special exertions for which it has granted rewards, is 29,608, as shown in the annexed Table.

Every one must feel that the saving of so many thousand lives from drowning shows the absolute necessity of maintaining and extending the benevolent work of the NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION, which has thus been productive of such noble results.

Rewards.—A summary is given in the Appendix of the cases in which honorary and other rewards have been voted last year. In that period 11 Silver Medals and Clasps, 19 Votes of Thanks inscribed on vellum, and 3,134/ were granted for saving the lives of 884 persons by Life-boats, shore and fishing boats, and by other means, on the shores and outlying sandbanks of our coasts.

Much time and careful consideration continue to be devoted by the Committee to the granting of these Rewards. Each case is minutely inquired into, in the first instance, through the valuable co-operation of the Officers of Coastguard and Customs, the local Honorary Secretaries of the several Branches, or other responsible persons; and afterwards they are in succession thoroughly considered by the Preparatory Committee, previous to their being sanctioned by the General Committee at their monthly meetings.

The thanks of the Institution are due, and have been respectfully and cordially

conveyed, by His Grace the President, on behalf of the Committee, to H.R.H. the DUKE of EDINBURGH, K.G., the late Admiral Superintendent of Naval Reserves, for his unceasing and valuable co-operation with this Committee during the period he held that important appointment.

The acknowledgments of the Committee are also due to the officers and men of the Coastguard Service, who are ever ready—often at the peril of their own lives—to save life from shipwreck.

Since its establishment the Institution has spent on Life-boat Stations, and other means for saving life from shipwreck on the coasts of the United Kingdom, upwards of 600,000*l.*, and has voted 96 Gold Medals, 962 Silver Medals, and 74,800*l.* in pecuniary rewards for saving life from shipwreck.

Local Committees.—The Committee have the satisfaction of acknowledging the continued valuable and earnest co-operation afforded them by the Local Branch Committees, and especially the Honorary Secretaries, which constitute so essential a portion of the machinery for the supervision and working of the Institution's numerous Life-boat Establishments, and for the collection of funds for their support.

Finances.—The donations, subscriptions, and dividends during the year 1882 have been 43,117*l.* 15*s.* 1*d.* Of this sum 7,615*l.* were special gifts to defray the cost of the following ten Life-boats, and 5,200*l.* to endow four Life-boats:—

During the past year the sum of

11,731*l.* 16*s.* 3*d.* was expended on additional Life-boats, Transporting-carriages, Boat-houses, and necessary gear; 13,193*l.* 5*s.* 3*d.* in repairs, painting, refitting, and sundry charges on Life-boat Establishments, and on the Store-yard at Poplar; and 11,821*l.* 3*s.* 7*d.* in rewards for services to shipwrecked crews, coxswain's salaries, quarterly practice of the Life-boats' crews, and other expenses; making altogether a total expenditure of 36,746*l.* 5*s.* 1*d.*

The items of receipt and expenditure are fully detailed in the financial statement, which has been audited as usual by Mr. LOVELOCK, public accountant.

Having thus rendered a faithful account of the great trust the public has for nearly sixty years confided to them, it is a source of satisfaction to the Committee to conclude by stating that the organisation of the Institution was never more complete and active, than at the present time; and thus they are prompted afresh, and with unshaken confidence, to appeal for continued and increasing support to an Institution which, with God's blessing, has been, and is productive of such manifestly gratifying results in the cause of humanity.

P.S.—Since this Report was read to the Annual Meeting on the 13th March, the Committee have had regretfully to record the death of their late Secretary, Mr. Richard Lewis, who had held that important office, to the great advantage of the Institution, for the long period of Thirty-three years.

By conferring Honorary Rewards in the form of Medals and Votes of Thanks, and also making liberal grants of money to all persons who, at the risk of their own lives, save, or attempt to save, those of others on board vessels wrecked, or in distress, upon any part of the Coasts of the United Kingdom.

The number of lives saved either by the Life-boats of the Institution, or by special exertions for which it has granted rewards, since its formation, is 29,608.

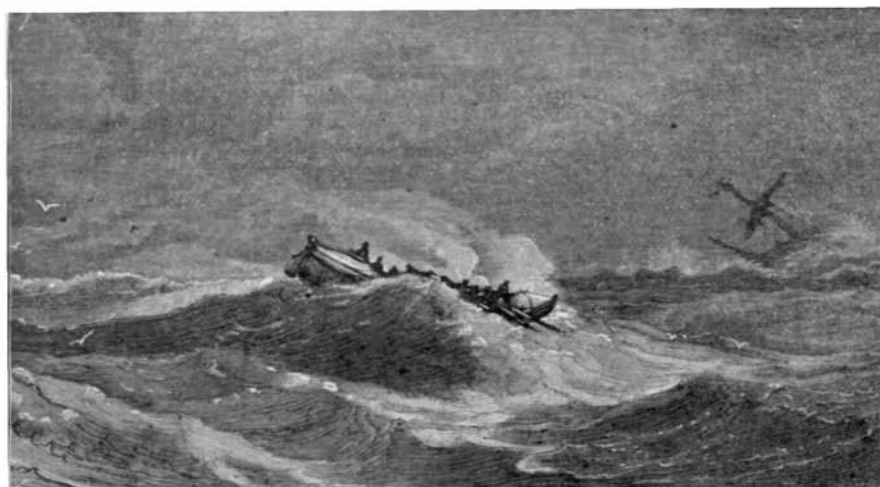

Jan. 1.—The brigantine *Maggie Wood*, of Belfast, bound from that port to Ayr in ballast, stranded on the Barton Rocks, about a mile and a half south of Ayr Harbour, during a gale of wind from the W.N.W. and a heavy sea. As the gale was increasing, it was dangerous for any other than a Life-boat to proceed to the vessel, and the *Glasgow Workman* Life-boat, stationed at Ayr, therefore went off to her with a steam tug from the Harbour. Lines were passed by the Life-boat from the brigantine to the steamer, which was unable to get near her, on account of the shallowness of the water, and the vessel, which had lost her rudder, was towed to Troon, the master's wife being landed by the Life-boat.

Jan. 5.—At about 4 A.M. a rocket was fired from the Wold lightship. The crew of the *Husband* Life-boat, stationed at Winterton, Norfolk, immediately mustered, and the boat was launched. She

went to the lightship, which reported that a light had been seen on the Hasborough Sand. The Life-boat proceeded there, and found the brig *Louisa*, of Stettin, Prussia, bound from Hull to Plymouth with coal, sunk in the sand, her topsail being just out of the water. Fortunately she discovered one of the vessel's boats, having five of the crew and a woman on board; those six persons were taken into the Life-boat and brought safely ashore. The remaining three men of the crew, who had taken to another of the vessel's boats, were picked up by a smack and taken to Great Yarmouth.—Expense of service, 19*l.* 10*s.*

COMMITTEE MEETING, Jan. 5th, 1882.

Voted 84*l.* 14*s.* 1*d.* to pay the expenses of the Whitehaven, Holy Island, Cruden, Milford, Aldborough, and other Life-boats, in assembling their crews or putting

off in reply to signals of distress, with the view of rendering assistance to vessels, which did not ultimately require their services.

Voted also the Silver Medal of the Institution and a copy of the vote inscribed on vellum to Mr. SAMUEL CARR, Chief Officer of H.M. Coastguard at Ring's End, Co. Dublin, and Honorary Secretary of the Poolbeg Branch of the Institution, and to Mr. DANIEL EVANS, coxswain of the Poolbeg Life-boat, in recognition of their general services in the Life-boat, and particularly on the occasion of the wreck of the ship *George H. Oulton*, of St. John's, N.B., during the heavy gale of the 22nd October, 1881.

Also the thanks of the Institution, inscribed on vellum, to Captain JOHN STRANEY, master of the steam-tug *Toiler*, for towing out the Life-boat on the above-mentioned occasion.

Also the Silver Medal and a copy of the vote inscribed on vellum to Mr. JOHN STEELE, in acknowledgment of his brave and valuable services in helping to man the Ayr Life-boat on the occasion of the wreck of the brigantine *J. W. Harris*, of Dublin, during a severe gale on the 22nd November.

Also the thanks of the Institution, inscribed on vellum, to Captain J. BREW, of the *Isle of Man Mail s.s. Mona*, and 5*l.* to his crew, in acknowledgment of their services in towing out the Ramsey Life-boat with the view of assisting another distressed steamer during a gale on the 22nd November.

Jan. 14.—Signals of distress were observed at Cresswell, Northumberland, at 3 A.M., during a S.S.E. wind and a moderate sea, the weather at the time being hazy. The *Old Potter* Life-boat was at once launched, proceeded in the direction in which the signals had been seen, and, after having gone a distance of about three miles, she found the brig *Swift*, of Krageroe, Norway, ashore and labouring heavily. With the assistance of the Life-boat the vessel was got afloat, and on the following day she was towed to Sunderland, to which port she was bound from Krageroe with a cargo of mining timber. She carried a crew of eight men.

Jan. 31.—At 9.30 A.M., during a strong S.E. gale, the galliot *Gateforth*, of Whitehorn, bound from Ayr to Whithorn with coal, was at anchor in Port Logan bay,

and showed a signal for assistance. An open boat, with the coxswain of the Life-boat and three other men, went off to her and got her under way. She, however, missed stays, and went close to the rocks on the north of the harbour. Her anchor was then let go, and as she was in a very dangerous position the Life-boat *Edinburgh and R. M. Ballantyne*, stationed at Port Logan, was launched, under the charge of her second coxswain, proceeded to the vessel, and remained by her until she was taken to a place of safety.

COMMITTEE MEETING, Feb. 2nd, 1882.

Voted 9*2l.* 7*s.* to pay the expenses of the Ballantrae, Harwich, Clacton, Palling No. 2, Castletown, Montrose No. 1, North Berwick, Saltburn, and Rye Life-boats, in putting off to the aid of vessels which did not ultimately need their assistance.

The Ramsgate Life-boat had also been taken out, but her services had not been called into requisition.

Voted also the Silver Medal of the Institution and a copy of the vote, inscribed on vellum, to Major HENRY SCOTT, Chairman of the Dover Branch, in recognition of his gallant and prompt services in volunteering to take an oar in the Dover Life-boat, and afterwards assisting to rescue five of the crew of the barque *Chin Chin*, of Jersey, which was wrecked off the South Foreland, during a S.W. wind and a heavy sea, on the 9th December, 1881.

Also the Second Service Clasp to Mr. ROBERT WILDS, coxswain of the Deal Life-boat, in recognition of his continued brave services in the boat. The Silver Medal was awarded to him in 1877, and since then he had assisted in the Life-boat to save a large number of lives from various shipwrecks.

Also 5*l.* in aid of a local subscription for the relief of the families of three members of the Saltburn Life-boat crew who had been drowned while out fishing on the 12th January.

Feb. 16—18.—At about 3.45 P.M. it was reported at Fleetwood, Lancashire, that a vessel was ashore on Shell Wharf. The wind was then blowing a fresh gale from the W. and a very heavy cross sea was running. The Fleetwood Life-boat *Child of Hale* proceeded in tow of the steam tug

Relief to the vessel, and found she was the barque *Venus*, of Helsingborg, Sweden, bound to Fleetwood with a cargo of sawn fir-deals. The master's wife, a little boy, a female servant, and nine of the crew were taken into the Life-boat, but the captain and mate refused to leave the vessel. The Life-boat remained alongside for a considerable time and then returned ashore.—Expense of service, 13*l.* 5*s.*

On the following morning the Life-boat, in tow of the tug *Relief*, returned to the vessel, taking back the crew to try again to get her into the harbour, but all attempts to do so failed, and the Life-boat came back to the shore, leaving the crew on board and landing the captain, who was much exhausted.

On the succeeding morning the Life-boat and tug once more went out, and their perseverance was rewarded by the vessel being eventually brought to a safe anchorage.

Feb. 27.—At about 8 A.M. a small vessel was seen riding at anchor in comparatively shallow water, with a signal of distress flying, about five miles E. of Dunbar, N.B. The Life-boat *Wallace*, stationed at Dunbar, put off to her assistance, and found that she was the lighter *Sophia*, of Hull, bound from Newcastle to Dunbar with coal. She was being brought up by a tug on the previous day, when the steamer's shaft broke and the vessel had to be cast adrift. She proceeded under her own sail, but the wind changing during the night and becoming stronger, and the sea being heavy, she was in great danger of being lost. Her crew of three men were taken into the Life-boat and safely landed at Skateraw Harbour.—Expense of service, 10*l.* 1*s.*

March 2.—The *David Hulett* Life-boat, stationed at Lydd, Kent, put off at 4.30 A.M. to the assistance of the brigantine *Concordia*, of Guernsey, which had stranded on the sands about half a mile from the boathouse, and was showing signals of distress. Owing to a flood tide, a strong gale of wind from the W.S.W., and a very heavy sea, the boat fell to leeward of the vessel, whereupon a steam tug which was lying in the bay went to her aid and towed her as near to the wreck as she could with safety. The Life-boat's anchor was then dropped, and she veered down to the vessel, and, after one or two attempts, succeeded in getting a line from her. Pre-

viously to this, four of the shipwrecked crew had got into their boat, which was stove in and full of water when the Life-boat reached her, three of the men being engaged in baling her and the other man using the only oar they had in the boat. These men were first rescued, and after a period of long and anxious labour the Life-boat also succeeded in taking off the master and one of the crew who were still on board. Their rescue was effected just in time, for in ten minutes afterwards the vessel sank.—Expense of service, 22*l.* 10*s.*

COMMITTEE MEETING, March 2nd, 1882.

Voted 85*l.* 16*s.* to pay the expenses of the Ardmore, Queenstown, Dunbar, Maryport, Mevagissey, Padstow, Newhaven, Theddlethorpe, and Aldborough Life-boats, in assembling their crews or putting off in reply to signals of distress exhibited by vessels which did not ultimately require the services of the Life-boats.

March 6.—The s.s. *Kittiwake*, of Carlisle, while leaving Whithorn Harbour, at about 11.15 P.M., during a fresh S. breeze, got her steering gear foul, and stranded on the Screens Rocks. The coxswain of the Isle of Whithorn Life-boat, with the sub-coxswain and two other men, went off to her in the harbour boat and brought ashore two lady-passengers. The sea was not very heavy then, but as it was rising it was thought advisable to take out the Life-boat and remain by the vessel. The Life-boat *Charlie Peck* was accordingly launched at midnight; she soon reached the steamer, and, after remaining some time by her, she eventually brought ashore all those left on board, consisting of seven men.—Expense of service, 13*l.*

March 7.—At 1.30 P.M., a barque was seen to go ashore on the Scroby Sand. A strong S.W. wind was blowing at the time, and there was a heavy sea on the sand. The Caister No. 2 Life-boat *Godsend* proceeded to her, and found she was the *Canmore*, of Dundee, bound from Dunkirk to the Tyne in ballast. The master at once engaged the services of the crew to get the vessel off. The wind and sea ultimately increased very much, and as night came on the Life-boatmen were afraid that if the barque broke up they would be unable to save

the crew with the small boat, and they, therefore, signalled for the large Life-boat the *Covent Garden*, which was at once launched, and went to the vessel. Fortunately, however, with the aid of the Life-boats and a steam tug, the vessel was got off the sands, and proceeded to Yarmouth Roads, the large Life-boat accompanying her. The barque had a crew of fifteen men, a woman and a child being also on board.

March 7.—The smack *Alert*, of Lowestoft, with thirty packages of fish on board, was seen at 8 p.m. with a flare burning on deck, on the Newcome Sands. The wind was blowing strongly from the S.W. and the sea was rough. The Pakefield No. 1 Life-boat, *Two Sisters Mary and Hannah* proceeded to her, and found that her crew were about to leave her, having already put their clothes in their boat. It was, however, decided to try to save the vessel, and a rope having been passed from her to the Life-boat, she was ultimately got off the sands and taken safely into harbour. She had a crew of six men.

March 8.—At about 9.50 a.m. a distressed vessel was seen in Bideford Bay, driving towards the North Tail Sand. A strong W.S.W. wind was blowing, accompanied by a heavy ground sea. In reply to her signals of distress the Appledore No. 2 Life-boat *Mary Ann* was launched, and brought ashore the master, pilot, and crew of two men. She proved to be the smack *Mary Stevens*, of Padstow, bound from Barnstaple to Newport in ballast.—Expense of service, 8*l.* 10*s.*

March 8.—A steamer was observed ashore on the Hasborough Sand at 3 p.m. during a fresh S.W. wind. The Winterton No. 2 Life-boat, the *Husband*, went to her assistance, and found that she was the s.s. *Napier*, of Shields, coal laden. The Life-boat remained by her until 7 p.m., when she fortunately floated off the sand with the flood tide.

March 21.—At about 9 a.m., during a gale from the N.W., the flat *Three Brothers*, of Chester, which was riding at anchor in Cemlyn Bay, Anglesey, exhibited a signal of distress. The *Good Shepherd* Life-boat stationed at Cemlyn at once proceeded to her assistance, and brought the crew of two men safely ashore. During the night the vessel broke from her moorings, and be-

came a total wreck.—Expense of service, 7*l.* 7*s.*

March 21.—During a severe gale of wind from the W., veering to N.E., between 7 and 8 o'clock in the evening, the schooners *Volant*, of Wick, and *Queen*, of Inverness, which were both lying far out in the roadstead at Scrabster, N.B., commenced to drag their anchors and showed flare lights. The *Charley Lloyd* Life-boat stationed at Thurso, put off, and brought ashore four men from each of those vessels. As other craft were lying in the roadstead, the Life-boat was kept afloat during the night, but the gale moderated and they all held to their anchors.—Expense of service, 12*l.* 6*s.*

March 22.—As the s.s. *Robert Watson Boyd*, of North Shields, coal laden for Constantinople, was leaving the Tyne at about 7 a.m. her steering gear broke down, she became unmanageable, and drifted on to the Black Middens, where she stranded. As the tide rose, efforts were made by steam tugs to get her off; but all attempts proved unavailing, and, on account of the increasing sea, the tugs were compelled to leave her. At about 2 p.m. signals of distress were shown from the steamer, whereupon the Tynemouth No. 2 Life-boat, the *Forester*, proceeded to her and brought ashore fourteen men and some nautical instruments. There were about sixty persons on board the vessel, consisting of the crew and several men who had boarded her to assist in getting her afloat, the remainder of whom were safely landed by other Life-boats from Shields.—Expense of service, 6*l.* 10*s.*

March 22.—At about 7.30 a.m., a signal of distress was shown from a vessel at anchor in Fishguard Bay, South Wales, where she had been riding with others during the night. The wind was blowing a strong gale from the N.N.E., at the time, accompanied by a high sea. The gun was fired to assemble the Life-boat crew, and immediately afterwards the signal of distress was hauled down. Thinking the vessel did not then require assistance, the Life-boatmen were dispersing, but this being observed on board the vessel, which was lying just off the boat-house, the distress signal was again hoisted. The Fishguard No. 2 Life-boat *Helen of Foxley* then went off at once, and in ten minutes was alongside the vessel, which proved to be the

Thomas and Sons, of Aberystwith, bound from Carnarvon to Llanelly with slates. The captain and crew of two men wished to be brought ashore, fearing that she would part from her chains and drift on the sands. They were accordingly taken on board the Life-boat and landed at Goodwick Quay.

Just then another vessel was seen to run up a signal for assistance, and the Life-boat without delay proceeded to her. She was the smack *Martha Jane*, of Aberystwith, bound from Bangor to Swansea with slates. The captain and crew of two men also wished to leave their vessel, and were therefore taken into the Life-boat.

On the way back to the shore the schooner *Glanmanai*, of Beaumaris, bound from Portmadoc to Cardiff with slates, also hoisted a signal of distress. The Life-boat went alongside and took off her crew of three men. Both crews were then landed at Goodwick Quay.

As soon as these men had been landed, a fourth vessel—the three-masted schooner *Perseverance*, of Belfast, bound from Larne to Newport with iron ore—hoisted a signal for assistance, and the Life-boat went out a third time and brought the crew, consisting of six men, safely ashore.

As the sea was then too heavy to get the Life-boat up the slipway, and as it was possible that her services might be again required, it was decided to keep her afloat during the ebb tide, and she was anchored off the boat-house with a crew on board. In the evening the gale moderated, and she was taken into Goodwick Quay.—Expense of services, 15*l.* 10*s.*

March 24.—Signals of distress were observed at 7.45 P.M. at Kessingland, Suffolk, from the schooner *J. W. T.*, of Truro, bound from Runcorn to Newcastle with a cargo of rock salt. The Kessingland No. 2, *St. Michael's Paddington*, Life-boat at once proceeded to her assistance, and found that she had stranded on the inner part of the Barnard Sand. She floated again but was in a leaky condition, and the Life-boat therefore remained by her and assisted to take her to North Yarmouth.

March 26.—The ketch *Blue Bell*, of Padstow, lying at anchor off Clovelly, North Devon, showed a signal of distress. A fresh gale from the N. was blowing at the time, and there was a heavy sea.

The Clovelly Life-boat was immediately launched, and on reaching the vessel found that she had lost some of her sails and was riding heavily at her anchors. The crew of three men were anxious to be rescued from their perilous situation, and they were therefore brought ashore in the Life-boat.—Expense of service, 7*l.* 6*s.*

March 26.—At about 1 P.M., the schooner *British Queen*, of Wexford, bound from that port to Porthcawl in ballast, was observed to be in distress off Port Isaac, Cornwall. The wind was blowing a strong gale from the N.N.W., and there was a heavy sea running. The crew of four men were seen to leave the ship about a mile off the shore in their own boat. The *Richard and Sarah* Life-boat was at once launched, and after about an hour's pull rescued the crew when they were within a hundred yards of the cliff, where escape would have been impossible.—Expense of service, 26*l.* 18*s.*

March 26.—At about 2 o'clock in the afternoon, a signal of distress was shown, in Ramsey Bay, Isle of Man, by the schooner *Countess of Caithness*, of Gloucester, bound from Limerick to Port William, N.B., with a cargo of bones. A fresh gale from N. by W. was blowing then, and the sea was rough. The Ramsey Life-boat, *Two Sisters*, at once went to her, and the master asked for help to get his vessel out of her perilous position, as she was then close to the rocks near Manghold Head. Four of the Life-boatmen went on board, and as it was impossible to make Ramsey Harbour she was taken to Douglas, which was reached about 5 P.M. The crew, consisting of three men, were quite exhausted, and the master had had no rest for eight days.

March 29.—At about 7 A.M. a boat containing the captain and three of the crew of the steamer *Liban*, of Nantes, landed at Porthcawl, South Wales, and reported that their vessel had stranded on the Tuskar rocks, during a very thick fog, at 11.30 on the previous night. They also stated that there were eight men still on board in great danger, as she was likely to become a total wreck. The Porthcawl Life-boat *Chafyn Grove* immediately proceeded to the stranded steamer, and brought the eight men safely ashore.—Expense of service, 8*l.* 12*s.* 6*d.*

March 29.—At about 5.15 p.m., during a fresh W. gale and a heavy sea, the coxswain of the Howth, Dublin Bay, Life-boat, being on watch at the Coast-guard Station, observed a small vessel drag her anchors and go ashore on Ireland's Eye Island. She then hoisted a signal of distress, the sea making clean breaches over her. The *Clara Baker* Life-boat was at once launched, and proceeded to her assistance. The Life-boatmen laid out an anchor and tried to heave her off, but failed to do so, and two of the crew were then taken into the Life-boat and brought ashore. She was the lugger *Emerald Isle*, of Howth, laden with gravel.—Expense of service, 7*l.* 15*s.*

April 2.—At 5 a.m. a brig was observed on shore on Baldoyle Bank. The Howth Life-boat was launched, and, with great difficulty, owing to the strong gale which was then blowing from the E. and the heavy sea, reached the vessel, which was then on her beam ends, her crew having taken refuge in the main-topmast rigging, where the sea was washing over them. As the Life-boat was prevented from going alongside by the wreckage which was lying near, and by the heavy sea, she dropped anchor, veered down on the wreck, and ultimately effected a communication by means of the heaving line. A life-buoy was then hauled out, and the crew, consisting of five men, were taken into the Life-boat and brought safely ashore. The wrecked vessel proved to be the *Elizabeth*, of Whitehaven, bound from Liverpool to Dundalk with a cargo of coals.—Expense of service, 8*l.* 3*s.* 6*d.*

April 2.—At half-past seven o'clock in the morning, a galliot was observed to go ashore on the outer ledge of Seaton Sea Rocks off Blyth, Northumberland, during a strong E. wind and a rough sea. As she was in a perilous position, the Blyth Life-boat *Salford* was immediately launched and proceeded to the vessel, which proved to be the *Ebenezer*, of Stavanger, Norway, bound from Hernösand to Blyth in ballast. The Life-boat's anchor was let go, and she veered alongside as near as she could get and then threw a line on board, by means of which five of the crew were hauled into the Life-boat with a life-buoy through the surf, and were brought safely ashore. One of the crew had previously succeeded in reaching the land with the help of a

life-buoy. The vessel's masts fell overboard, and she soon became a total wreck.—Expense of service, 6*l.*

April 3.—At 10 a.m., during a strong wind from the E. and a heavy sea, a vessel was seen stranded at Waxham, Norfolk, and showing signals of distress. The Palling No. 1 Life-boat was promptly launched and went to her aid, and found that she was the brig *Danmark*, of Dragör, bound from Rönne to Rotterdam, with china clay. Her crew of ten men were taken into the Life-boat and safely landed at Palling at about 1 p.m. The brig became a total wreck.—Expense of service, 17*l.* 10*s.*

April 3.—At 11 a.m., the *Bradford* Life-boat, stationed at Ramsgate, proceeded to the East Goodwin Light vessel, which was firing signal guns. The wind was blowing a strong breeze from the E., and there was a thick fog. On arriving at the Lightship, it was found that the master, and crew of five men, of the barque *Europe*, of Bordeaux, had taken refuge there, their vessel having stranded on the North Sand Head. These men were taken into the Life-boat, which then proceeded in search of the barque, and found her in charge of a lugger's crew. The services of the Life-boatmen were engaged to assist in getting the vessel off, but all efforts to do so failed, and she had to be abandoned. She was bound from Gothenburg to Bordeaux with a cargo of boards.

April 4.—One of the beach punts belonging to Southwold was engaged in shipping pilots during a strong breeze, and at 1.30 a.m., the wind having freshened to a gale, and a heavy sea breaking on the shoals, signals of distress were shown by the boat. The Southwold Life-boat *London Coal Exchange* was thereupon launched, and brought the three men who were in the punt safely ashore.—Expense of service, 10*l.* 10*s.*

COMMITTEE MEETING, April 6th, 1882.

Voted 22*l.* 17*s.* 11*d.* to pay the expenses of the Life-boats at Fishguard, Harwich, Berwick-on-Tweed, Winterton, Braunton, Lytham, Cardigan, Hastings, Southwold, Margate, Kingsgate, Seaton Carew, Tynemouth, Port Isaac, and Ilfracombe, in assembling their crews or going out to the aid of vessels in distress.

Voted the Silver Medal of the Institution, and a copy of the vote, to Mr. RICHARD HEADON, Coxswain of the Clovelly Life-boat, who had been out in the Life-boat on all occasions when she had been afloat on service, and had assisted to save thirty-four lives, during the past twelve years.

Also 10*l.* in aid of the family of EDWARD GULLEY, late Coxswain of the Courtown Life-boat, who had died suddenly, leaving a widow and a family of young children. He had been connected with the Life-boat as first and second coxswain for fifteen years, and during that period he had assisted in the boat to save many lives.

Also 10*l.* in aid of the widows and families of two men—members of the crew of the Hope Cove Life-boat—who had been drowned by the capsizing of their fishing-boat on the 17th February.

April 13.—A flag of distress was seen flying from the fishing smack *Belle*, of Blyth, in the Coquet Roads, Northumberland, at 3.30 P.M., during stormy weather, the wind blowing very strong from the E.S.E., and a high sea running at the time. The Life-boat *Algernon and Eleanor*, stationed at Hauxley, went to her assistance, and brought ashore her crew of six men. The vessel was bound from North Shields for the fishing grounds, in ballast.—Expense of service, 9*l.* 15*s.*

April 15.—At 7.30 A.M. the s.s. *Consent*, of Sunderland, coal laden from South Shields to Genoa, stranded on the Cross Sand off the coast of Norfolk. A yawl was launched, and on arriving at the steamer the master engaged her services to assist to get the vessel off. A larger yawl afterwards went to the steamer at about 9 o'clock, when the wind began to freshen and the sea was becoming heavy. The first yawl then returned ashore, in tow of a steam-tug, for the Caister Life-boat *Covent Garden*, which was launched and towed to the vessel, reaching her at about noon. The wind and sea still increasing, at 4.45 the sea broke over the ship, when most of the crew and several of the beachmen left her and got into the Life-boat, expecting every minute that the steamer would become a total wreck. Eventually, however, with the aid of two steam-tugs, and anchors and hawsers, which had been laid out by the beachmen, the vessel was got off the Sand and

taken to Yarmouth Harbour, the Life-boat accompanying her.

April 15.—At about 8.30 A.M. a brigantine was seen approaching Arbroath, N.B. As she was showing a signal of distress the *People's Journal* No. 2 Life-boat was launched and proceeded to her aid. She proved to be the *Expedit*, of Porsgrund, Norway, laden with small coal. The Master reported that she had four feet of water in her hold, had lost her main rigging, and was quite unmanageable. The crew, who had been constantly at the pumps four days without food, were quite exhausted, and refused further duty. The men, numbering six in all, were taken into the Life-boat and safely landed. The vessel afterwards drove ashore about a mile and a half westward of the harbour.—Expense of service, 7*l.* 8*s.*

April 25.—At 6 P.M. it was reported at Harwich that a schooner was ashore on the Cork Sand. The Life-boat *Springwell* was immediately launched, and arrived at the Sand at about 8 P.M. The stranded vessel proved to be the *Henrietta*, of London, bound from that port to Newcastle with a cargo of gunpowder and burnt ore. As she was not leaking, her crew did not wish to leave her, and the Life-boat therefore remained near her during the night. Ultimately the schooner showed signal lights, as she was rapidly filling with water, and the Life-boat therefore went alongside her as soon as there was sufficient water on the Sand to permit her to do so, took off the crew, consisting of four men, and landed them at Harwich at about 6.30 on the following morning.—Expense of service, 15*l.* 2*s.* 6*d.*

April 29.—A terrible gale was experienced this day at St. Ives, Cornwall. The wind, which was from N.W., blew from about 11 A.M. until 3 o'clock in the afternoon with tremendous fury, lashing the sea into foam, and causing the spray to form a fog so dense that nothing could be distinguished beyond a quarter of a mile from the shore. A large proportion of the St. Ives fleet of over one hundred mackerel boats was out, and had been absent for some days. One steamer broke from her moorings and went ashore at Gwythian, under the Black Cliff; another and a schooner—the *Ellen Vere*—rode out the storm, but they appeared to be in such imminent danger that the Life-boat *Exeter*, stationed at St. Ives, was taken down to

the water's edge, so as to be in readiness should her services be called into requisition. Some of the absent fishing luggers returned home, but two others arrived late, at nearly low water, and had to anchor outside the ridge, on which the sea was breaking with such fury that none of the gigs could venture outside. The Life-boat therefore proceeded to the aid of the luggers, the *Quick* and the *Gyles*—taking off fresh crews to them, and bringing ashore the fourteen men who were on board the boats. The men were in a very exhausted and benumbed condition when the Life-boat reached them.

April 29.—During the same severe gale the s.s. *Drumhendry*, of Glasgow, bound from Ballydonegan Bay, Co. Cork, to Hayle, with dynamite and other explosives, in attempting to come into Hayle at about 2 P.M., was driven on the beach east of the bar. As soon as it was seen that the lives of her crew were in danger, the Life-boat *Isis* proceeded through a very heavy sea to her assistance, and brought ashore two of the men, the remainder being helped to land by means of a rope.—Expense of service, 11*l.* 10*s.*

April 29.—At 3 P.M., just before high water, the yacht *Formosa*, of Carmarthen, started with four men on board to try to save some drowning cattle, which had strayed on to the Cefn Sidan Sand in Carmarthen Bay, and had been carried away by the rising tide. A light N.N.W. wind was blowing at the time, and the sea was smooth. At 3.30, when the boat was off the mouth of Lougharne River, a storm suddenly rose from the N.W. All sail was lowered, and she came to anchor, but in a few minutes the cable parted and she drifted towards the opposite shore, which she struck soon afterwards. Meanwhile, she had been watched from the Ferryside Life-boat Station, and the Life-boat *City of Manchester* put off to her, and found that she had been stove in and was full of water, a heavy sea breaking over her. Two of the men on board her were taken into the Life-boat, and the other two men came ashore when the tide had receded.—Expense of service, 8*l.* 13*s.*

April 29.—During a very strong gale of wind from the S.S.W., accompanied by a heavy sea, at about 4 P.M. a sloop made for Clacton-on-Sea, and sought shelter under the pier, but the water being shallow she grounded, and showed a signal

of distress. The Life-boat *Albert Edward* was manned, and promptly went to the aid of the vessel, being veered down by means of a rope from the pier. The sea broke heavily over the boat, constantly filling her; but at length, after a hard struggle, she reached the wreck and saved the crew of five men. The Life-boat was several times in danger of being upset, and much bravery and skill were shown by the coxswain and crew. Two of the Life-boat men were washed overboard while reshipping the boat's rudder, which had been damaged, but they were happily rescued. The service was witnessed by a large number of persons, and on the Life-boat reaching the pier with the shipwrecked men, she was received with much cheering. The stranded sloop proved to be the *Nordstiernen*, of Haugesund, bound from that port to London, with herrings.—Expense of service, 13*l.* 13*s.*

April 29.—At 8 P.M. three oyster skiffs—the *Gertrude*, *Gladstone*, and *Shah*—were observed from the shore to be in distress off the Mumbles Head, near Swansea. The force of the gale had carried away their spars and canvas; the anchors were let go, but would not hold, and the boats were being rapidly driven in the direction of the Scarweather Sands, which are situated in the Bristol Channel, about seven and a half miles S.S.E. from the Mumbles Head. The Swansea Life-boat *Wolverhampton* proceeded to the assistance of the boats; put a number of men on each, and with the aid of jury-masts and rigging, one of them was brought into harbour. In the other two cases additional anchors were taken out and the boats were securely moored. Each of the skiffs carried a crew of three men, who would no doubt have perished had the boats been allowed to drift on to the sands.

May 2.—The smack *Boconnoc*, of Padstow, in attempting to proceed to sea, from Bude, Cornwall, the wind being very light and there being a considerable ground sea, drifted to the north side of the entrance to the harbour. The master, seeing his danger, let go the anchor to prevent the vessel drifting on the rocks, but it would not hold. As the sea was continually breaking around the smack, no ordinary boat could have reached her, and the Bude Life-boat *Elizabeth Moore Garden* therefore proceeded to her assist-

ance, and succeeded in getting her safely back into the harbour. She carried a crew of three men.

COMMITTEE MEETING, May 4th, 1882.

Voted 64*l.* 8*s.* to pay the expenses of the Broadstairs, Chapel, Montrose No. 1, Tynemouth No. 1, Thorpe, Swanage, and Padstow Life-boats in assembling their crews or putting off to the aid of vessels which did not eventually need their assistance.

The Ramsgate and Winterton No. 2 Life-boats had also been taken out, in readiness to render service to ships which were seen to be in distress.

May 15.—The Newbiggin Life-boat *William Hopkinson of Brighouse*, towed safely ashore a fishing coble which had been upset by a sudden squall. Her crew had happily been rescued by another fishing boat.

COMMITTEE MEETING, June 1st, 1882.

Voted 46*l.* 16*s.* to pay the expenses of the Rye, Winchelsea, Weymouth, Palling No. 2, New Quay (Cornwall), Ardmore, and Kingsdowne Life-boats, in assembling their crews, or putting off to the aid of vessels which did not ultimately require their assistance.

June 1.—The brigantine *Otto*, of Hoganas, Sweden, from Gefle to Poole with a cargo of timber, was taken in tow by a steam-tug about 9 A.M., and while crossing Poole Bar, the wind blowing from the E., accompanied by a heavy sea, the tow-rope parted, and before another rope could be got out, she drove to leeward, and struck on the Milkmaid Bank Shoal in Studland Bay, and lost her rudder. Two tugs endeavoured to get her off, but were unsuccessful, and she continued to drive further on the shoal, the sea at times breaking over her. The crew remained on board her, without danger, until about 10 P.M., when the wind, veering to the E.S.E., and blowing a heavy gale, it was thought that the vessel would go to pieces, in which case her crew would be lost. The *Boys' Own* No. 2 Life-boat stationed at Poole, accordingly went out to her assistance, and reached her about midnight, when it was found that the sea was breaking over the ship, and that the crew were crying for assistance. With great difficulty

the master and crew of eight men were taken into the Life-boat and brought safely ashore. In jumping from the wreck one man fell between the ship and the boat, but he was happily rescued by the Life-boat men.—Expense of service, 13*l.* 10*s.*

June 1.—At 10 P.M. a vessel was seen to get on the Middle Cross Sand and make signals of distress. The Caister No. 1 Life-boat *Covent Garden* was at once launched and proceeded to the Sand. On arriving there the boat's anchor was let go, and she veered down towards the vessel, but there was not sufficient water to enable the boat to reach her; she then shifted to other positions, but with the same result, the high seas breaking heavily over the boat, which struck the ground at each trial. She then anchored as close as possible until the flood tide made, when she wore down to the vessel and took off the crew of six men, hauling them through the water with a line. The master declined to leave the vessel. The Life-boat then got clear of the breaking sea but remained near at hand. At about 4 A.M. the Winterton No. 2 Life-boat *Husband* arrived at the scene of the wreck, having been summoned by signals from the Cockle Lightship. On account of the heavy sea then running, she dared not haul close to the brig, but made springs fast to her cable and sheered abreast of the vessel's jibboom. The heaving-line was then thrown to the master, who made it fast to his waist, dropped into the sea, and was hauled on board the Life-boat. The vessel proved to be the *Aglæe*, of St. Servan, with a cargo of timber.—Expense of services, 44*l.* 10*s.*

June 2.—The yacht *Spider*, of Ramsgate, brought up at 11.30 P.M. on the 2nd June, about a mile off Camber, Sussex. The wind was blowing strongly from the E.N.E., and the vessel was lying too near the shore, so that on the tide ebbing, she struck the ground, parted her chain, and drove ashore, where she almost dried at low water. On the tide flowing, the *Mary Stanford* Life-boat went to her assistance, some of the Life-boatmen went on board the yacht to assist at the pumps, as she was leaking badly, and the vessel and nine persons on board were taken into the harbour.

June 14.—At 1 A.M., during a moderate W.S.W. wind and overcast weather,

signal guns and rockets were observed from the Gull Lightship, and a flare was also seen in the direction of the Goodwin Sands. The Ramsgate Harbour Life-boat *Bradford* and the *Vulcan* steam-tug were got ready and went out with all despatch. They proceeded round the South Sand Head, and found a brigantine on the sand. The Life-boat sailed alongside the vessel, and the master at once engaged the services of the Life-boatmen to get her off. They then clewed up and stowed her sails, and took out an anchor and chain over the sands for about thirty fathoms. On the tide flowing, the chain was hove taut, sail was made, and the vessel floated off. She proved to be the *Swift*, of Rye, bound from Caen to Seaham, in ballast, with a crew of five hands.

COMMITTEE MEETING, July 6th, 1882.

Voted 17*l.* 5*s.* to pay the expenses of the Lydd (Dungeness) Life-boat in putting off with the view of rendering assistance to a stranded vessel, at midnight on the 30th May. After remaining out some hours her services were not after all required, and she then put into West Bay for shelter, the wind and sea having very much increased.

Aug. 2.—The barque *Erminia* was driven past Workington in a W.N.W. gale. The master was ashore, and was unable to get back to the vessel. She ultimately struck upon the banks and carried away her rudder, whereupon the mate made signals for assistance. The master then went off to her in a steam-tug, but could not get on board his vessel. He then returned to the shore, and asked that the Maryport Life-boat might be allowed to put him and eight men on board the barque, which request was acceded to, as no other boat could have lived in the heavy sea then running.

COMMITTEE MEETING, Aug. 3rd, 1882.

Voted the Silver Medal of the Institution to Mr. RICHARD ROBERTS, assistant-coxswain of the North Deal Life-boat, in acknowledgment of his general gallant services in the Life-boat, in assisting to save a large number of lives during the past seventeen years.

Aug. 9.—A rocket from the Lizard signal station was heard about 8 A.M., a screw

steamer having gone on shore there. For some time the fog hid her, but when she was seen clearly, and found to be full of people, the Life-boat *Anna Maria* proceeded to her assistance and took off twenty-seven persons. The remainder of those on board were saved by other boats and a steam-tug. The vessel was the North German Lloyd's mail s.s. *Mosel*, of Bremen, bound from that port to New York, with seven hundred passengers, a crew of one hundred persons, and a cargo of railway iron, specie, and general cargo. She ultimately became a total wreck.—Expense of service, 9*l.* 18*s.* 6*d.*

Aug. 15.—At 7.30 P.M. a signal of distress was seen flying from a vessel about three miles S.E. of the Ballinacourty Lighthouse, and signals were also shown by the coastguard at Helwick, to attract attention to her. The Life-boat *Christopher Ludlow*, stationed at Dungarvan, was promptly manned, and proceeded to the vessel, which proved to be the brigantine *Ariel*, of Youghal, bound from Cardiff to Youghal with coal. She was dragging her anchors, and had lost part of her sails. The Life-boat brought ashore the master and crew of six men, leaving the vessel in a sinking condition.—Expense of service, 15*l.* 10*s.*

Aug. 21.—The schooner *Ocean Child*, of Belfast, which had anchored in Skerries Roads, off Portrush, Co. Antrim, through stress of weather, was overtaken by a gale from the W.N.W., accompanied by a heavy sea, and as she was dragging her anchor she hoisted signals of distress. The *John Whitaker* Life-boat went to her assistance, and took off her crew, consisting of three men. The Life-boat also proceeded to the ketch *Happy Return*, of Padstow, bound from Teignmouth to Ballyshannon with clay. This vessel was also dragging her anchors, and showing a signal of distress. The master, his wife—who was in a very weak, in fact almost dying, condition—and the crew of two men were also taken into the Life-boat and brought safely ashore.—Expense of service, 7*l.* 19*s.* 6*d.*

Aug. 21.—At 5.30 A.M. it was reported at Blackpool, Lancashire, that a vessel was drifting shorewards before a stiff gale from the W. The coxswain of the *Robert William* Life-boat lost no time in assembling his crew and taking the boat two miles along the shore opposite to

where the vessel struck. The Life-boat was then launched and proceeded to her aid. On the way she passed a capsized boat, and it was feared that some of the crew had endeavoured to reach the shore in her and had been lost; but such, happily, proved not to have been the case, as it was afterwards found that the boat had capsized as soon as she had been lowered into the water. The shipwrecked men were very eager to be taken off the vessel, and they were soon brought safely ashore in the Life-boat. The vessel proved to be the barque *Arethusa*, of Liverpool, bound from Liverpool to Quebec, with a cargo of coal. She carried a crew of ten men.—Expense of service, 11l. 11s.

Aug. 23.—Early in the morning the dandy *Hope*, of St. Ives, bound from Run-corn to Penryn with coal, having dragged her anchor and parted her chain, struck on the Dutchman Sandbank, opposite to Penmon, Anglesey, and hoisted a signal of distress. The Penmon Life-boat *Christopher Brown* at once went to her assistance, and after remaining by her for some time, put five men on board, and, with great difficulty, owing to the state of the tide and the quantity of water in her hold, brought her safely into Friars Roads, the men having to work at the pumps all the way. She carried a crew of three men.

Aug. 29.—At about 9 A.M. a telegram was received at Newhaven from Brighton stating that a vessel with her foremast gone and flying a signal of distress had passed that town and was drifting towards Newhaven. The *Michael Henry* Life-boat stationed at Newhaven proceeded to her, in tow of a steam-tug, and found she was the schooner *Catherine and Alice*, of Nevin, from Dieppe with flint stones. She had a crew of five men, and the master's wife was also on board. The tug took her in tow to Eastbourne; the Life-boat, at the master's request, accompanying her, as she was in a very leaky condition.—Expense of service, 29l. 4s.

Sept. 1.—About 11 o'clock in the morning the Peterhead Life-boat *People's Journal*, No. 1 proceeded a short distance from the mouth of the North Harbour, and remained there to render assistance if necessary to several fishing-boats which had proceeded to sea on the previous day and were running for the harbour, having been overtaken by a strong N.E. wind and a heavy sea. At

about half-past twelve the fishing-boat *Bon Accord*, of Portknockie, with six men on board, was making for the North Harbour, and was about forty yards from its mouth, when a sea struck her on the starboard quarter and drove her on the rocks at the back of Port Henry Pier. The Life-boat immediately proceeded to her assistance, and took a hawser ashore to endeavour to pull her off. Shortly afterwards a signal was made by some of the crew, and the Life-boat again went to her and took three of them ashore. When the tide rose the fishing-boat floated, and was hauled round the pier into the harbour.—Expense of service, 7l. 4s.

Sept. 1.—A ship's life-boat full of people came ashore at Wicklow, Ireland, at 9 A.M., and the officer in charge reported that she was from the s.s. *Lake Nepigon*, of Montreal, which had stranded on Arklow Bank, and that five other boats full of people had left the ship and were at sea. The Wicklow Life-boat *Robert T. Garden* was launched, and went in search of the boats; the wind was then blowing a gale from the S.S.W., the weather was very thick, and there was a heavy sea running. After about an hour the Life-boat fell in with the five boats, took on board the crews—consisting of thirty-two persons—of two of them, and took a third boat—with twenty people in her—in tow. A vessel was then sighted to windward, and the Life-boat signalled her; whereupon she bore down upon them, took the people out of the remaining two boats, and made for Kingstown. The Life-boat steered for Greystones, where the fifty-two persons were safely landed. The steamer was on a voyage from Liverpool to Montreal, with pig-iron and a general cargo, and had one hundred and fifty-four persons on board.—Expense of service, 16l. 6s. 10d.

COMMITTEE MEETING, Sept. 7th, 1882.

Voted 110l. 5s. to pay the expenses of the Walmer, Lizard, Ballywalter, Caister No. 1, Swansea, Fleetwood, New Brighton No. 2, and Arklow Life-boats in putting off in reply to signals of distress shown by vessels which did not ultimately require the aid of the Life-boats.

Also the Silver Medal of the Institution to Mr. RICHARD STOKES, in acknowledg-

ment of his long and gallant services while serving as coxswain of the Poole Life-boat, during which period he had assisted in saving a large number of lives from shipwrecks.

Also the thanks of the Institution, inscribed on vellum, to Captain W. E. CARVER, 4th Battalion Royal Inniskilling Fusiliers, and to Captain FREDERICK WATT, in acknowledgment of their valuable services in each taking an oar in the Portrush Life-boat, and assisting to save seven persons from the schooner *Ocean Child*, of Belfast, and ketch *Happy Return*, of Padstow, during a gale of wind from the W.N.W. on the 21st August.

Sept. 13.—At 4 A.M. flares were seen in the direction of the Middle Cross Sand. The Caister Life-boat *Covent Garden* was launched, and proceeded over the sands through the breakers, in the direction in which the lights had been last seen; but no vessel could be found. After searching in various directions, during which time a quantity of wreckage and some fishermen's bowls were found, a steamer, about a mile distant, was seen to ease steam and proceed to the westward. It was presumed that she had seen some men in the water and was going to their rescue. The Life-boat thereupon made sail and steered for the steamer. On arriving it was found that she had a large boat out picking up some men off a long spar, with a quantity of bowls attached. By the time the Life-boat got quite close they had picked all of the men up but one, and he was speedily saved.

The rescued men—two of whom were in a very exhausted condition—were taken on board the steamer, which then took the Life-boat in tow as far as Yarmouth Harbour, when the men were transferred to the boat and safely landed. Eight of the shipwrecked crew were rescued, but unfortunately ten others were drowned before help could reach them. The wrecked vessel proved to be the dandy *Reine des Anges*, of Boulogne, bound from the North Sea to Boulogne with fish.—Expense of service, 27l. 5s. 3d.

Sept. 20.—At about 8.30 A.M., during a strong wind from the E.N.E. and a heavy sea, the Danish schooner *William* was observed to be making for Whitby Harbour, when she became embayed, and was obliged to anchor in a very dangerous position. At about 11 A.M. she showed

signals of distress, in response to which the Life-boat, *Robert and Mary Ellis*, proceeded to her aid, and remained by her about two hours, when the master decided to send a telegram for the services of a steam-tug, which message the Life-boat brought ashore.—Expense of service, 9l.

Sept. 30.—A small sloop, which proved to be the *Fanny*, of Fishguard, was observed at 1 P.M. to be showing a signal of distress while at anchor, about a mile to the N.W. of Dinas Head. The wind was blowing a moderate gale from the S.S.W. at the time, with a moderate sea. The Fishguard No. 1 Life-boat, *Helen of Foxley* proceeded to her assistance, and found that she was quite disabled, having lost her mainsail and foresail. Eight of the Life-boatmen went on board the vessel, and, after some difficulty, they succeeded in beaching her. She carried a crew of two men, and had a cargo of culm.—Expense of service, 7l. 15s.

Oct. 1.—At 5.30 P.M. the schooner *Centenary*, of Liverpool, showed signals of distress as she was driving very near to the rocks in Skerries Roads off Portrush. The wind was then blowing a strong gale from the S.S.W. with heavy squalls. The *John Whitaker* Life-boat stationed at Portrush was launched with all despatch, and brought the master, his wife, and the crew of two men, safely ashore.—Expense of service, 14l. 17s. 6d.

Oct. 1.—At about one o'clock in the afternoon, the brigantine *Eugenie Auguste*, of Castletown, was labouring heavily and dragging her anchors in Derby Haven Bay, during a heavy gale of wind from the S.W. She was carefully watched from Castletown, in case she should require any assistance, and after a short time was seen to hoist a flag of distress. The Life-boat was at once taken on her transporting carriage to Derby Haven Bay, where she was launched, and proceeded to the vessel. It was found that the crew, consisting of five men, were desirous to be extricated from their perilous situation, and accordingly they were brought ashore in the Life-boat. Before leaving the vessel the master, on the recommendation of the coxswain of the Life-boat, ran out more chain, and secured it round the mast. Happily the vessel rode out the gale, and the crew having been placed on board again, she was brought safely into harbour.—Expense of service, 9l. 9s.

COMMITTEE MEETING, Oct. 5th, 1882.

Voted 52*l.* 2*s.* to pay the expenses of the Caister, Brighton, and Mullion Life-boats in putting off in reply to signals from vessels in distress, when their services were not ultimately needed.

Oct. 13.—At 9.30 p.m. signals of distress were seen on Goswick Sands, Northumberland. The *Grace Darling* Life-boat, stationed at Holy Island, was launched, and found the *Preston*, a large screw steamer, of West Hartlepool, ashore there. At the master's request the Life-boat remained by her for a considerable time, and also rendered assistance in laying out an anchor.

Oct. 15.—In the afternoon, during a S.S.E. wind and a heavy sea, a barque—which proved to be the *Fortuna*, of Arendal, Norway—came in sight off Buchanness, and as she was showing a flag of distress the Peterhead Life-boat *People's Journal* No. 1 was launched and proceeded to her assistance. There was some difficulty in getting alongside, as the vessel, which had lost her sails, was rolling very heavily; but eventually the whole of the crew, consisting of ten men, were taken on board the Life-boat and brought safely into Peterhead Harbour. During the night the barque's cables parted, and she drove ashore about five miles north of Peterhead and became a wreck.—Expense of service, 10*l.* 13*s.*

Oct. 19.—Intelligence was received at Ballywalter, Co. Down, at 1.30 a.m., that a vessel was ashore in the vicinity of Table Rock. A fierce gale was then blowing from the S.E., with much rain, and the sea was very heavy, with tremendous surf breaking on the rocks. The crew of the *Admiral Henry Meynell* Life-boat assembled, and the boat was taken along the beach on her carriage until she arrived opposite the vessel's lights, when she was launched, and was fortunately successful in rescuing the shipwrecked crew, consisting of nine men. The vessel was found to be the brig *St. George*, of and from Maryport, bound to Doboï, Turkey, in ballast.—Expense of service, 20*l.* 17*s.*

Oct. 24.—The schooner *Rambler*, of Folkestone, was seen to be running for the shore at Aldborough with a flag of distress in her rigging, during a heavy gale of wind from S.S.W., and a very rough sea. She struck on the shoal and began

to break up, which compelled the crew to take to the rigging. The Life-boat *George Hounsfeld* put off, and with great difficulty saved four men. One of the crew—a boy—had unfortunately been drowned before the Life-boat arrived. Shortly after the men had been rescued the vessel's masts went by the board.—Expense of service, 15*l.* 5*s.*

Oct. 24.—During a strong gale of wind from the S.W., and a heavy sea, at 11.30 a.m., the brig *August*, of Griefswold, Prussia, signalled for assistance, off Southend, Essex, having lost her masts and anchors. The *Boys of England* Life-boat put off to her aid, and assisted to bring her into a safe position. She was bound from London to Newcastle in ballast, and had a crew of seven men.

Oct. 24.—In the afternoon the fishing-smack *Sisters*, of Gorleston, was making for the harbour on the ebb tide, the wind at the time blowing a very heavy gale from the S.S.W., right out of the river. A rope was thrown from the vessel to some men on the pier, but it broke, and she drifted to the north side of the harbour, when nine of her crew climbed on the north pier, leaving one hand—a lad—on board. The boat was then blown out to sea, but was brought up by the anchor, which had fortunately been let go after the boy had paid out all the chain.

The Gorleston Life-boat *Leicester* took out a rope to the vessel, by means of which she was towed into safety, the boy being brought ashore in the Life-boat.

Oct. 24.—At 3.15 p.m., during a gale of wind from the W.S.W. and a heavy sea, signals of distress were shown by the *Gull Light* vessel. The *Ramsgate* Life-boat *Bradford* was manned, and went out in tow of the harbour steam-tug *Aid*. They spoke the *Gull Light* ship, and having ascertained that there was a vessel ashore on the S.E. part of the Goodwin Sands, they at once steered in that direction. On arriving at the sand the Life-boat was slipped from the tug, and having let go her anchor, she was veered down to the vessel, which was found to be the yacht *Arab*, of Poole. She had nine persons on board, all of whom were taken into the Life-boat, which then made for the steamer, and was towed back to Ramsgate Harbour, arriving at 7 p.m. The yacht became a total wreck.

Oct. 28.—At 1 a.m., during a gale

from the E.N.E. and a very heavy sea, it was reported that the barge *John*, of Faversham, was ashore opposite Birchington, and that men could be seen in the rigging. The *Quiver* Life-boat, stationed at Margate, was launched, proceeded to the vessel, and rescued her crew of two men, who were in a very weak condition, having been in the rigging since 1 o'clock on the previous day. Their vessel became a total wreck.—Expense of service, 16l. 9s. 6d.

Oct. 28.—In the evening, a flare was seen in the direction of the Brake Sand, off Ramsgate. A fresh gale of wind was then blowing from the N.N.E. with rain, and there was a heavy sea on the sand. The Life-boat *Bradford* was at once got ready, left the harbour under sail, and proceeded direct to the vessel, which proved to be the schooner *Beachill*, of Shoreham. The Life-boat saved the four men on board, three men, who had taken to their boat before the Life-boat arrived, having unfortunately been drowned.

Oct 28—29.—During a heavy gale from the N.E., several shipwrecks, with loss of life, took place off Lowestoft. At about 11 p.m. the *Samuel Plimsoll* Life-boat, after much regrettable delay and difficulty, was launched and proceeded to three vessels which were ashore at the back of the south pier, and succeeded in rescuing seventeen men, viz., eight men from the brig *Mornington*, of Colchester; eight from the brig *Susannah Dixon*, of Whitby; and one man from the brig *Iris*, of Whitby.—Expense of service, 24l.

At about 7 o'clock on the following morning flares were shown by a vessel in distress in Corton Roads. The wind was blowing from the N.E., and the sea was rough at the time. The Lowestoft Life-boat proceeded to her assistance, and found she was the ketch *Evening Star*, of Hull. With the aid of a tug, the vessel, which had been partly dismasted, was brought into Lowestoft Harbour. She had a crew of three men.

Nov. 1.—About 2 p.m. it was reported at Cardigan, that the smack *Ellen*, of Milford, which had during the day come up from the westward, and had brought up outside the bar, had hoisted a flag for assistance, and that she was riding very heavily, and, in fact, going right under the heavy seas. The crew of the Cardigan Life-boat *John Stuart* were sum-

moned, and proceeded to the Station, but by the time they reached the boat-house the wind had veered round to the W., and as the vessel then had a little shelter, the flag was hauled down. The Life-boat crew, however, remained and watched the ship, as the weather was still very threatening. Soon afterwards the wind changed, and blew a strong gale from the N.N.W., and the sea rose exceedingly high. The ship was then on a lee shore. She commenced to drag her anchors and drift towards the bar, and her crew then hoisted the flag again for assistance. As darkness was coming on, the Life-boat was launched, and, after a heavy pull of nearly an hour's duration, she reached the smack, took off her crew of three men, and brought them safely to land.—Expense of service, 10l. 8s.

COMMITTEE MEETING, Nov. 2nd, 1882.

Voted 367l. 3s. to pay the expenses of the Lowestoft, Upgang, Palling, Exmouth, Dover, Padstow, Caister, Kirkcudbright, Rhyl, Pakefield, Torquay, St. Ives, Littlehaven, Ilfracombe, Hayle, Deal, Margate, Harwich, Hayling Island, and Clacton Life-boats, in assembling their crews, or putting off in reply to signals of distress shown by vessels not eventually requiring the services of the Life-boats.

Also a binocular glass, bearing a suitable inscription, and 10l. 10s., to Mr. JOSHUA HEATH, who had been compelled by ill-health to resign the post of Coxswain of the Fowey Life-boat, which office he had held for more than twenty years.

Decided that the thanks of the Institution be conveyed to the Rev. J. O'REILLY BLACKWOOD, Honorary Secretary of the Ballywalter Branch, for his continued valuable co-operation, and especially for assisting to rescue the crew of nine men of the stranded brig *St George*, of Maryport, on the 19th October.

Nov. 4.—During a strong gale from the W.S.W. and a heavy sea, the s.s. *Matin*, of Sunderland, was driven ashore off Camber. The Rye Life-boat *Mary Stanford* went to her assistance, and, after great exertions, succeeded in getting alongside, and rescued fourteen men. After landing, it was found that some men still remained on board, and the Life-boat again went off to her, and

brought two men safely ashore.—Expense of service, 29*l.* 12*s.*

Nov. 5.—About 9 P.M. during a W.N.W. gale, it was reported at Torquay that signals of distress were being shown by a barque in the offing. The *Mary Brundret* Life-boat was launched, and on coming up to the vessel, about eleven miles from the shore, she was found to be the barque *Eden*, of Liverpool. She was in a leaky condition, part of the cargo and provisions had been thrown overboard, and her crew were in a most exhausted condition. The captain and crew expressed themselves much relieved by the presence of the Life-boat, and as the gale had somewhat abated, the master requested the Life-boatmen to assist to get the vessel into port. Some of the crew then went on board to help in working the ship, the pumps having to be kept going during the night and the following day. Eventually the ship, which carried a crew of seventeen men, was taken safely into Dartmouth Harbour, about 4 o'clock in the afternoon.

Nov. 5.—At about 9.40 P.M., signals of distress were shown by the s.s. *Rydal Hall*, of Liverpool, which had stranded on the Cliperæ Rocks during a gale of wind and a heavy sea. The Holyhead Life-boat *Thomas Fielden* put two pilots on board, who took charge of the vessel; the Life-boat then remained by her, and, with the assistance of four steam-tugs, she was got afloat.

Nov. 9.—At 6 A.M., it was reported that the fishing lugger *Steamboat*, of Arklow, which had proceeded to sea on the previous evening, had been overtaken by a heavy N.N.W. gale, which had sprung up at midnight; when she was about six miles E. of Arklow, and that she had lost her mast. She had been taken in tow by a larger boat, and brought in shore as far as the other boat was able to take her, and had then dropped anchor. The *Out Pensioner* Life-boat stationed at Arklow, proceeded to her assistance, placed six men in her, and took her crew of four men, who were much exhausted, into the Life-boat. A jury-mast was then fitted, and the boat was brought safely ashore. Expense of service, 5*l.*

Nov. 10.—In the evening a mounted messenger arrived at Cardigan, and reported that a vessel was riding at anchor outside the bar, and making signals for the Life-boat. The wind was blowing

a gale from the N.N.W. The crew of the Cardigan Life-boat *John Stuart* were mustered, and the boat at once proceeded to the vessel, which proved to be the brig *Wellington*, of Aberystwyth. She was labouring very heavily, and as there was no sign of the storm abating, it was feared that she would founder or part her cables, and drive on the bar, where there would be no chance of saving life. Her crew of ten men and a pilot were accordingly taken into the Life-boat, and brought safely ashore. Expense of service, 14*l.* 8*s.*

Nov. 12.—At midnight it was reported that a vessel had gone on the Long Rock. The Ballywalter Life-boat's crew were summoned, and the boat proceeded to the vessel and brought ashore her crew of three men. She proved to be the schooner *John and Ann*, of Runcorn, from Port Dinorwic to Belfast, with slates. The night was at times very dark, with most violent and thick hail and rain, a strong wind from the S.E. was blowing, and it was bitterly cold.—Expense of service, 13*l.* 11*s.*

Nov. 13.—The Ramsgate Life-boat and steam-tug proceeded out at 6.15 A.M. to the aid of the barque *Mina*, of Kalmar, Sweden, which had gone ashore on the Brake Sand during a fresh E.S.E. wind and a somewhat heavy sea. On arriving near the vessel the Life-boat was slipped, and proceeded alongside. Four of her crew went on board to try to save the vessel, but they were unable to do so as she was striking heavily on the sand, and was filling with water. The crew of ten men were then taken into the Life-boat and brought safely to Ramsgate.

Nov. 13.—The *Four Sisters* Life-boat stationed at Selsey, Sussex, was launched about 5 P.M. to the aid of the barque *Saraca*, of Glasgow, which had stranded on the Outer Owers during a moderate gale of wind from the E. and a very heavy sea. The vessel was ultimately got afloat, and the Life-boat accompanied her to Portsmouth.

Nov. 14.—At 9 A.M. the Lowestoft Life-boat proceeded, in tow of a steam-tug, to the assistance of the Norwegian barque *Burthon*, which had gone on the Holme Sand. On reaching the vessel she was found to be breaking up. The Life-boat boarded her, and, with much difficulty, succeeded in saving the crew, consisting of eight men, and brought them safely to Lowestoft, in a very exhausted state. The wind was blowing a

gale from the E.N.E., and there was a very heavy sea. Very soon after the men were rescued, the vessel became a total wreck.—Expense of service, 16*l*.

Nov. 14.—At 2.30 P.M., the Lowestoft Life-boat proceeded to the brig *Harkaway*, of Shoreham, which was riding to the southward of the harbour with a flag for assistance. The Life-boat helped to get a rope from her to a tug, and slipped her anchors, and she was then towed safely into Lowestoft Harbour. The boat then went to the brigantine *Wilhelmina*, of Exeter, and assisted in slipping her anchors, after which she also was towed into the harbour. The wind was blowing a strong gale from the E.N.E., accompanied by a very heavy sea.

Nov. 15.—The Lowestoft Life-boat went out before daybreak, during a strong E.N.E. wind and a heavy sea, to the schooner *Jane*, of Faversham, which was showing flares in the South Roads, and brought ashore the master's son and one of the crew.—Expense of service, 25*l*. 10*s*.

Nov. 16.—At about 5 o'clock this morning, during a fresh gale from the N.N.E., the look-out man at the Coast-guard Station observed that two out of fifteen vessels which were at anchor in Fishguard Bay were burning blue lights, as signals of distress. He immediately informed the coxswain of the Life-boat *Helen of Fowley*; the crew were summoned, and the boat was launched, proceeded to the schooner *Iona*, of Padstow, and as the master and crew—five in all—wished to leave the vessel, they were taken into the Life-boat. The Life-boat then went to the schooner *Mary*, of St. Ives, and took off her crew of five men; then to the schooner *Rose*, of Carnarvon, and rescued her crew of three men, and afterwards to the smack *Gander*, of Cardigan, and took off her crew of three men. These sixteen men were landed at Goodwick Quay. Signals were then shown from some of the other vessels, which were in exposed and dangerous positions, and the Life-boat went out four times and took off the crews, numbering in all thirty men, from the schooners *Elizabeth*, of Aberystwyth; *Victoria*, of Beaumaris; *Charles*, and *Jane Anwyl*, of Carnarvon, and smack *Mary Ann Jane*, of Carnarvon; schooners *Istwyth*, of Carnarvon, and *Korkinour*, of Beaumaris; and smacks *Commerce*, *Ocean*, *Rapid*, and *Margaret*, of Cardigan. Forty-

six men were thus brought ashore by the Life-boat, all being safely landed by 11 A.M.—Expense of services, 30*l*. 16*s*.

Nov. 18.—The brigantine *Jean Anderson*, of Dundalk, bound from Ardrossan to Dundalk with coal, was seen ashore on the east side of Dundalk Bar with a signal for assistance flying. The wind was blowing from the S., the weather was stormy, and the sea was running high. The Giles' Quay Life-boat *James Thomas* put off to her assistance, and remained by her for about four hours, when, at the request of the crew, they were taken into the Life-boat and landed at Dundalk Quay. They numbered six men.—Expense of service, 12*l*. 7*s*. 6*d*.

Nov. 18.—At 8 A.M., while a strong wind was blowing from the S., signals of distress were observed flying from a vessel which had grounded on the south side of Wexford Bar. The Wexford No. 1 Life-boat *Ethel Eveleen* immediately put off, in tow of the steam-tug *Ruby*, and, after proceeding for about two hours through a very heavy sea, the tug's hawser was slipped and the boat ran in under oars. On arriving alongside, the ship was found to be full of water, the sea sweeping right across her. She proved to be the *America*, of Quebec, bound from that port to Wexford. Her crew, consisting of eight hands, after much difficulty, succeeded in getting on board the Life-boat, and were safely landed at Wexford.—Expense of service, 16*l*. 10*s*.

Nov. 18.—The barque *Nimrod*, of Liverpool, was seen to be burning flares on the Holm Sand at 7.30 P.M., during a gale of wind from the S. and a high sea. The Pakefield No. 1 Life-boat *Two Sisters*, *Mary* and *Hannah*, was launched, proceeded to the vessel, and rescued her crew, consisting of seventeen men and a pilot. The barque, which was bound from Grimsby to Valparaiso with coal, became a total wreck.—Expense of service, 24*l*.

November 20.—At about 7 P.M., during a strong gale from the N.W., signals of distress were seen in the direction of Wexford Bar. The Wexford No. 1 Life-boat *Ethel Eveleen* was promptly manned, and proceeded to the spot, and found that the fishing yawl *Dazzler*, of Wexford, had stranded while returning to the harbour from the fishing-ground; the sea was beating heavily over her, and she was filling with water. Her crew, consisting of six men, were taken into the Life-boat,

which was then towed back to her station by the steam-tug *Ruby*.—Expense of service, 16s. 10s.

Nov. 25.—The smack *Conqueror*, of Newburgh, in attempting to enter that port at midnight on the 24th November, went ashore at the south side of the entrance. A small steam-tug went to her assistance, but could not reach her, owing to the heavy sea, until after she had stranded. She then succeeded in getting a rope from the smack, but had to throw it off to save herself from also being driven ashore. The crew of the Newburgh Life-boat *Alexander Charles and William Aird* were then summoned, the boat was launched, and succeeded in rescuing the vessel's crew, consisting of two men. The smack became a total wreck.—Expense of service, 12l.

Nov. 28.—During a strong N.W. wind and a very heavy sea, a brig was seen riding in broken water near the Goodwin Light vessel, with a flag flying at her main gaff. The Ramsgate Life-boat *Bradford* was manned, and left the harbour at 8 A.M. under sail, proceeded towards the vessel, and when about six cables distant saw her list to starboard and sink. The Life-boat made for the wreck, and ultimately succeeded in rescuing three of the crew from the maintop. Four men had unfortunately been drowned. The Life-boat was then towed back to Ramsgate. The wrecked vessel proved to be the brig *Percy*, of Riga, from Sunderland to Southampton with coal.

Nov. 28.—At about 7.35 P.M. signals from the North Sand Head and Gull Lightships were seen, and the Ramsgate Life-boat and steam-tug proceeded through the Cudd Channel to the North Sand Head. They saw a flare from a vessel on the sand, and on the Life-boat getting alongside she found it was the ketch *Harriet*, of Goole, bound from Hartlepool to Poole with coal. The Life-boatmen having been requested to assist to get the vessel off, some of them went on board, let go her anchor, and made sail. The boat then remained by her until the rising tide caused the sea to break over the vessel and boat, when it was thought prudent to take off those on board the former. The master, his wife and three children, and the crew of three men were therefore taken into the Life-boat and put on board the tug.

During this time the schooner *Venus*, of Exeter, bound from Shields to Teignmouth with coal, also ran on the sand. The crew took to their boat and boarded the steamer. With some of the Life-boat crew they afterwards returned to their vessel, and with the assistance of the steamer she was taken into Ramsgate Harbour.

The Life-boat again proceeded to the ketch, which fortunately floated with the rising tide, and some of the Life-boatmen then boarded her, made sail, and stood in towards the land. The steamer came out again, and, taking her in tow, got her safely into Ramsgate Harbour at 4.15 A.M.

Nov. 30.—A vessel, which proved to be the billiboy *Amity*, of Goole, missed stays and went ashore at Eccles, during squally weather and a heavy swell, at 2 o'clock in the morning. She burnt flares for assistance, in response to which the Palling No. 1 Life-boat, the *Heyland*, was promptly launched, and proceeded to her. With the assistance of the Life-boat the vessel was got out of her dangerous position, and proceeded on her voyage apparently without having received any material damage.

Dec. 1.—The *Godsend* Life-boat, stationed at Caister, Norfolk, was launched at 6.30 P.M., and rendered some assistance to the schooner *Brothers*, of Harwich, which had stranded on the Middle Barber Sand. The vessel ultimately floated, and was accompanied by a yawl to Yarmouth Harbour.

Dec. 3.—At 7 A.M. intelligence was received that a large vessel was ashore in Druridge Bay, Northumberland. The crew of the *Algernon and Eleanor* Life-boat, of Hauxley, were at once called together, horses were sent for, and the Life-boat with great difficulty, as the tide was at nearly high water and the sands were very soft, was taken by land to the scene of the wreck. She was then launched, and proceeded to the vessel, which was found to be the s.s. *Amulet*, of and from Rotterdam to Leith, with a general cargo. The boat remained for some time by the steamer, and landed the stewardess and a passenger. The captain and crew (nineteen men in all) remained on board for a time; but as the wind and sea increased, they were ultimately taken off by the Life-boat.—Expense of service, 17l.

Dec. 4.—On the morning of the 4th December, the Holy Island Life-boat, *Grace Darling*, brought safely to land

a fishing coble and her crew of four men, who had been caught in a gale from the E.S.E., and were in much peril.

Dec. 4.—A sudden gale from the E.N.E. sprang up this morning, just as the fishing-boats belonging to Newbiggin, Northumberland, had reached the fishing-ground. As the sea rose very high, only one boat attempted to shoot any lines; all the others ran for the bay. At about 8 o'clock the sea was breaking off Newbiggin Point, and seeing the danger to which the boats were exposed in making the bay, the Life-boat *William Hopkinson of Brighouse* was launched. All the boats were safely landed by 11.30, with the exception of the one which shot her lines; she did not reach the bay until 1.30 P.M., when all hopes of her safety had been given up. Amid great excitement she was safely run ashore, attended by the Life-boat, which had been out five and a half hours, her crew being drenched and exhausted by their long exertions.—Expense of service, 8*l.* 10*s.*

Dec. 4.—During a severe gale from the E.S.E. and a heavy sea, at 1.20 P.M., the barque *Rheinland*, of Hamburg, was being towed into Tyne Harbour by the steam-tug *Skylark*. On arriving within the piers the tow-line broke, and the barque stranded off the Battery Point, the seas breaking over her. The alarm guns were fired, and the Tynemouth No. 2 Life-boat, the *Forester*, was launched, with some difficulty. After being several times filled, she reached the wreck and took off two of the crew, the remainder being rescued by a Shields Life-boat.—Expense of service, 12*l.* 10*s.*

At about 11 P.M. the alarm guns were fired, on account of the danger to another vessel, which, however, disappeared before any assistance could reach her. The *Forester* Life-boat went to the supposed position of the wrecked vessel, and fell in with the schooner *Argo*, of Copenhagen, which was in great danger of being wrecked on the south pier. The Life-boatmen warned the captain of his perilous position, and piloted him safely into harbour.—Expense of service, 14*l.*

Dec. 5.—The brigantine *Hoppet*, of Hel-singborg, Sweden, was observed from Seaton Carew to be making for the land, during a terrific gale of wind from the E., with snow showers and a very heavy sea. The vessel ultimately stranded opposite

Seaton low lighthouse, whereupon the Life-boat *Job Hindley* was launched, proceeded to the wreck, and took her crew of seven men safely ashore.—Expense of service, 14*l.* 4*s.* 6*d.*

Dec 5.—The schooner *Anapira*, of Newburgh, was observed about seven miles E.N.E. of Hartlepool, while a most severe gale was raging, accompanied by sleet showers and a heavy sea. At 2.30 she was seen to put before the wind and run for the port. The Hartlepool No. 3 Life-boat, *John Clay Barlow*, was manned and held in readiness, as it was considered very doubtful, owing to the extreme violence of the gale, whether she would get safely in. She reached the Bay at about 3.40 P.M., and being struck by a heavy wave, broached to and struck the ground on the Beacon Shoal. The Life-boat immediately proceeded to her, and brought her crew, consisting of five men, to shore. After the crew had left the ship, she, contrary to expectation, drove into deeper water, and as there appeared a chance of saving her, the Hartlepool No. 2 Life-boat *Charles Ingleby*, proceeded to her and put four men on board; the No. 3 Life-boat also put four men on her. Sail was then made, and, with the assistance of two steamers, she was got into harbour.

Dec. 5.—Shortly after 4 o'clock in the afternoon a signal of distress was seen flying from a schooner at anchor in Fish-guard Bay. The No. 2 Life-boat, *Helen of Foxley*, was launched, and proceeded to the vessel, which proved to be the *Llaethliw*, of Newquay. She was riding heavily, and as the gale had been steadily increasing all day, with a heavy sea, and there was every prospect of a stormy night, the crew of four men wished to be brought ashore, and they were therefore taken into the Life-boat. There were also another schooner, the *John Stoward*, and the brigantine *Xanthus*, both belonging to Aberystwyth, at anchor in the bay, and they also signalled for the Life-boat. The boat therefore proceeded to them, took off the crews of four men from the schooner and six men from the brigantine, and landed them all at Goodwick Quay.—Expense of service, 8*l.* 5*s.*

Dec. 6.—At daylight the Norwegian barque *Carolina* was seen at anchor about two miles from the shore, at Sheringham, Norfolk, with spars hanging overboard. She showed signals, in response to which

the *Duncan* Life-boat, and the Beachmen's Life-boat *Augusta*, put off, and assisted her, and eventually accompanied her to Grimsby.

Dec. 6.—At 11.45 A.M., during a strong gale from the E.N.E. and a heavy sea, with snow, the brig *Star of Hope* of Newcastle, became embayed between Whitby and Uppang Rocks. She then ran for the beach, and stranded about two hundred and fifty yards north of the West Pier. The Whitby No. 1 Life-boat, *Robert and Mary Ellis*, was at once launched, gallantly pulled through the heavy sea, and in about twenty minutes from the time of the vessel stranding, her crew, consisting of six men, were safely landed.—Expense of service, 14*l*.

Dec. 6.—At about 2.30 P.M., the lugger *Ecuveuil*, of Gravelines, in ballast, which had lost her mainmast, was driven ashore on the North Sands, Hartlepool, during a storm from the E.N.E. and a very high sea. The Hartlepool No. 1 Life-boat *Charles Mather*, proceeded to her assistance, and brought ashore the crew, consisting of five men.—Expense of service, 10*l*. 5*s*.

Dec. 6.—The schooner *Laura Ann*, of Faversham, was in a dangerous position at the entrance to the Humber. The Grimsby Life-boat, *Manchester Unity*, proceeded to her assistance, and helped the crew to get up her anchors, after which she was towed into port by a steam-tug.

COMMITTEE MEETING, Dec. 7th, 1882.

Voted 44*l*. 16*s*. to pay the expenses of the Winchelsea, Irvine, Gorleston, Lowestoft, Drogheda, Harwich, Bridlington, Hornsea, St. David's, Porthoustock, Cemaes, Clacton, Cresswell, Cullercoats, Donna Nook, Fishguard, Holy Island, and Broadstairs Life-boats, in assembling their crews, or putting off in reply to signals of distress shown by vessels which did not ultimately require the assistance of the boats.

Also the thanks of the Institution to Captain GOLDWYER, Honorary Secretary of the Littlehaven (St. Bride's) Branch, for going out in the Life-boat stationed there and steering the boat, with the view of rendering assistance to two vessels which were apparently in dangerous positions, during a N.W. wind and a rough sea, on the 16th November.

Also the thanks of the Institution, in-

scribed on vellum, and a framed photograph of the Life-boat, to Captain R. W. MASSINGHAM, Harbour Master for the Great Eastern Railway Company at Lowestoft, in acknowledgment of his long and valuable co-operation on behalf of the Life-boat service in rendering the assistance of the harbour steam-tugs in towing the Life-boats, and frequently proceeding himself in the steamers, whereby he had contributed to the rescue of several shipwrecked crews.

Also 5*l*. to the crew of a small steamer named the *Imperial*, used for harbour work at Lowestoft, for going out in a heavy sea on the 14th November, under the instructions of Captain MASSINGHAM, the Harbour Master, and calling in one of the larger steamers belonging to the port. The Life-boat was then enabled to be towed to the wreck of the Norwegian barque *Burthon*, which had gone ashore on the Holme Sand, and saved the shipwrecked crew of eight men about a quarter of an hour before the vessel became a total wreck.

Dec. 7.—At about 3 o'clock this morning the coxswain of the Hartlepool No. 3 Life-boat the *John Clay Barlow*, noticed a sail some short distance from the shore, which he took to be a ship with her side lights washed away. While he was trying to make it out a flare was set up from the vessel, which enabled him to see that it was a ship with torn sails driving ashore. A violent gale was blowing from the E.N.E. at the time, and the sea was very high indeed. He at once got the crew of the Life-boat together, and the boat was launched. Before reaching her a rocket had been thrown over her from the Middleton shore, where she had struck. The Life-boat went alongside and took off the crew, consisting of seven men. The vessel sank, but, being timber laden, she afterwards got off the sands, and on the following morning at daylight, the sea having gone down very much, the Life-boat, at the request of the master, put the crew on board again. She was the *Edmund*, a Danish three-mast schooner, bound for London with a cargo of poles and battens.—Expense of service, 13*l*.

Dec. 7.—About 10 P.M. the coxswain of the Hartlepool No. 3 Life-boat observed a signal light from a vessel in the bay, apparently making for West

Hartlepool. The ship suddenly altered her course, and ran straight on to Middleton Sands. The crew of the Life-boat were assembled and the boat put off, and with much difficulty reached her. Some steam-tugs attempted to effect communication with her, but failed. The crew of the vessel—the brig *John*, of and for Hartlepool from London in ballast—called out that they wished to leave her, and they were therefore taken into the Life-boat. They were in a very exhausted condition. The vessel sank immediately afterwards, and became a total wreck. She had a crew of seven men.—Expense of service, 13*l*.

Dec. 7.—The brig *Catherina Regina*, of Riga, went ashore in Druridge Bay, Northumberland, during very stormy weather. On information of the occurrence being received at the Hauxley Life-boat Station, the Life-boat *Algernon and Eleanor* was conveyed on her carriage to the scene of the wreck. She was then launched, through a very heavy surf, and with great difficulty and danger proceeded to the vessel, which was found to have lost both her masts, and took off her crew of eight men. She then remained by her half an hour, waiting for the master and his wife, but they positively refused to quit the ship. They were subsequently taken off by the rocket apparatus. The brig became a total wreck. Expense of service, 18*l*.

Dec. 8. At 10 o'clock in the morning the schooner *Etoile du Marin*, of and for Dunkirk from Leith, with coal, was approaching Scarborough harbour during a strong gale from the E., and a very heavy sea, and as it was feared that she might not succeed in making it in safety, the Life-boat *Lady Leigh* was launched, and put a pilot on board. Several fishing-vessels were also making for the harbour, and the Life-boat therefore remained afloat until 4 P.M., when all the craft had got in safely.—Expense of service, 9*l*. 2*s*.

Dec. 8.—A vessel was observed in the offing making direct for Saltburn, while a tremendous sea was running, and the wind was blowing a gale from the E.N.E. The Saltburn Life-boat *Charles and Ann* was launched, and proceeded to the vessel, which by that time had struck opposite old Saltburn, and brought ashore her crew, consisting of five men, all of

them being Germans. The wrecked vessel proved to be the *Libra*, of Bockzetelerfehn, bound to Hamburg, with guano.—Expense of service, 12*l*.

Dec. 8.—The schooner *Star*, of St. Agnes, in attempting to come into Hayle, during a strong wind from the N.E. and a heavy sea, struck and grounded west of the bar. The Hayle Life-boat *Isis* quickly proceeded to her, and took off her crew of three men, whom she safely landed.—Expense of service, 10*l*. 10*s*.

Dec. 9.—The barque *Ross*, of Arendal, Norway, having encountered the full fury of a gale in the North Sea for a whole week, during which period her crew had suffered great privations, determined to seek a place of refuge, so as to give them rest. The lights were, however, mistaken, and instead of anchoring in the Firth of Forth, as intended, she was, at daybreak on the 9th December, near Amble, with breakers all round her. Signals of distress were shown, in response to which the Hauxley Life-boat *Algernon and Eleanor*, went to her assistance, and brought ashore her crew of ten men.

Dec. 15.—The Danish brigantine *Andreas*, on her passage from Dunkirk to the Tyne, in ballast, ran ashore on Roker Rocks, North Blyth, during thick weather, at 5 o'clock in the morning. The Blyth No. 2 Life-boat, *Tom and Marion*, put off to her assistance and rescued her crew, consisting of eight men. The vessel became a total wreck.—Expense of service, 12*l*. 2*s*.

Dec. 13.—At 4.30 A.M. rockets and large flares were seen in the direction of the Cross Sand, off the Norfolk coast; the Cockle Lightship was also firing guns and rockets. As the wind was blowing from the S.E., and it was ebb tide, it was impossible for the Caister Life-boat to sail to the sand, and a message was therefore sent to Great Yarmouth for a steam-tug, which arrived and towed the No. 2 Life-boat, the *Godsend*, to the sand, where a steamer and a schooner were found stranded. The steam-tug went to the schooner and towed her off, and the Life-boat proceeded to the aid of the steamer. The No. 1 Life-boat, the *Covent Garden*, afterwards came up, and with the assistance of the two Life-boats the steamer was got afloat. She proved to be the *Bradley*, of Liverpool, from Bilbao to

Sunderland with iron ore. She had a crew of fifteen men.

Dec. 18.—A vessel was seen in distress at the south end of Ramsey Island, Pembroke-shire, at 8 A.M. The *Augusta* Life-boat, stationed at St. David's, put off to her, and pulled across the sound through a heavy sea. The vessel had then floated to the northward. The surrounding rocks were examined, but none of the crew could be found. A shore boat, with a crew of five men, also put off to the vessel, boarded her, and found her to be a derelict. The Life-boat shortly afterwards came up, and both crews, with the aid of a steam-tug, took the vessel into Milford Haven, where she arrived at about noon on the following day. She was the Norwegian barque *Storjohann*, bound from Bordeaux to Cardiff with timber.

Dec. 18.—At 12.30 A.M. the smack *Alicia* brought news to Ramsgate, of a vessel having gone ashore on the Kentish Knock Sand. The Life-boat *Bradford* at once proceeded, in tow of the harbour steamer *Vulcan*, through the Cudd Channel, and steered straight for the Kentish Knock Sands, which are about twenty-five miles distant from Ramsgate. On nearing the Lightship, signals were shown from her, and a vessel was seen showing a flare abreast of the middle buoy. The Life-boat was got into a good position, slipped from the tug, sailed towards the wreck through a very heavy sea, and with some difficulty succeeded in taking off her crew, numbering thirteen men. The sea was breaking right over the vessel, which proved to be the barque *Egmont*, of South Shields, and her

foremast, mainmast, and mizen topmast were lying alongside.

Dec. 19.—At about 8.30 A.M. the schooner *Vigilant*, of Dundee, was seen approaching Arbroath, N.B., in a heavy sea. At about 11 o'clock she was getting close to the rocks, apparently making for the harbour. The tide at the time being half ebb, and there being little water on the bar, it was thought impossible for her to clear the land on either tack, and the Life-boat *People's Journal No. 2* put off to her assistance. On getting alongside, the Life-boatmen advised the master to let go both anchors, the vessel being within three hundred yards of the rocks eastward of the harbour. Two of the Life-boat's crew were put on board, at the request of the master, and the boat kept in attendance until the following tide, when the anchors were recovered, and the vessel was towed into harbour.

Dec. 20.—The tug *Irvine*, of Irvine, was proceeding to Ayr to tow a vessel to Irvine Harbour, during a strong S.W. gale and a heavy sea. She grounded on the centre of the bar, and showed signals of distress, in response to which the *Isabella Frew* Life-boat stationed at Irvine, promptly went off, and brought ashore her crew of four men.

Dec. 31.—Voted 274l. 6s. 6d. to pay the expenses of the Life-boats at Rye, Winchelsea, Grimsby, West Hartlepool, Fraserburgh, Hornsea, Holy Island, Hartlepool, Saltburn, Lowestoft, Whitby, Robin Hood's Bay, Tynemouth, Berwick, Salcombe, Douglas, Broughty Ferry, Harwich, Newcastle, (Dundrum) Montrose, Mundesley, and St. David's, in going out to the aid of vessels in distress.

SHORE-BOAT SERVICES REWARDED BY THE ROYAL NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION IN 1882.

Jan. 3.—Five men put off in a boat at great risk and rescued eight men whose boat had been driven away from Island Crone, Co. Donegal, by a sudden gale of wind from the S.W., on the 2nd January, leaving them on the island—which is uninhabitable—where they had to remain without any shelter during the night, until rescued at about 10 o'clock on the following morning.—Reward, 10l.

Jan. 3.—The chief boatman and five Coast-guard men put off in a boat from Dymchurch, Kent, Coastguard Station, and saved the crew of four men of the sloop *Theodor*, of Copen-

hagen. That vessel had parted from her anchors and had stranded off Dymchurch, during a gale of wind from the S.W. and her crew had taken to their boat and were drifting out to sea.—Reward, 5l.

Jan. 5.—Voted the thanks of the Institution to Mr. GEORGE BROWN, of Portaferry, Co. Down, together with 5l. to himself and four men, for putting off in a boat and, at some risk, saving the crew of three men from the schooner *Jane*, of Carrickfergus, which was wrecked near Portaferry, during a strong gale from the E.S.E., on the 20th October.

Also 6*l.* to six men for putting off in a coble from Boulmer, Northumberland, and rescuing the crew of seven men from the fishing lugger *Useful*, of Cellardyke, which, while returning to Anstruther from fishing off Great Yarmouth, had become unmanageable and had partly sunk on Boulmer South Steel, during very rough weather on the 19th November.

Also 5*l.* 10*s.* to eleven men for assisting to save two of the crew of the wrecked barque *Admiral P. Lordenskjold*, of Krageroe, Norway, which was wrecked on Saunton Sands, Devon, during a strong N.W. gale, on the 20th December.

Also 5*l.* to five men for putting off in a fishing boat, and, at some risk, saving the crew of four men of the schooner *Fire Winner*, of Christiansand, which had been run ashore at Burntisland, as she was leaking very badly and was gradually sinking, her pumps having become choked, during a strong gale from the E., on the 23rd October.

Also 5*l.* to five men for putting off in the Coastguard boat at Leestone, Co. Down, with the view of rendering assistance to a steam dredger belonging to Dublin, which was in distress off Ballymartin during a gale of wind from the S.W. and a heavy sea, on the 1st November.

Also 4*l.* to four men for saving two men from a canoe which had sunk off Portlaoisy, Co. Mayo, while out fishing, during a strong gale of wind from the S.W., on the evening of the 21st Nov.

Also 4*l.* to seven men for putting off in a fishing yawl from Methil, Fife, at some risk, and saving one of the crew of the brig *Scio*, of South Shields, which was wrecked near Methil Harbour, during a fresh gale from the S.W., with a heavy sea, on the 27th November.

Jan 6.—Eight men put off in a boat, at risk of life, and rescued the crew of two men of the schooner *Scotia*, of Carnarvon, bound to that port from Belfast, which had parted from her cables and had stranded in Port Erin Bay, Isle of Man, during a strong W. gale and a heavy sea.—Reward, 8*l.*

Jan. 10.—The crew of a yawl belonging to Mundesley, Norfolk, took off from the Hasborough lightship the crew of six men of the brig *Princess*, of Whitby, which, while on a voyage from Seaham to Rochester, with a cargo of coal, had been totally wrecked on the Hasborough Sands, and afterwards landed them at Great Yarmouth.—Reward, 5*l.*

Feb. 2.—Voted the Silver Medal of the Institution, a copy of the vote inscribed on vellum, and 1*l.* each to Mr. WILLIAM NOSWORTHY, chief officer of H.M. Coastguard at Carnarvon, and to police constable HENRY EVANS, of Carnarvon, for putting off in an open boat, and, at great risk, saving five of the crew of the brigantine *Fritz von Gadon*, of Barth, Germany, which had capsized off Carnarvon during a whole gale from the W.S.W. on the 28th November.

Also 1*l.* to the owner of the boat used on this occasion in consideration of injury which it had sustained.

Also the Silver Medal and a copy of the vote inscribed on vellum to Mr. PETER MURDOCK, of Glendrishaig, Ayrshire, and 3*l.* to three of his men, for saving, at considerable risk of life, by

means of ropes, two of the crew of the schooner *Cirrasian*, of Dundalk, which had become unmanageable and was totally wrecked at Glendrishaig during a N.W. gale on the 21st December.

Also 1*l.* 10*s.* to three men for putting off in a boat from Sennen Cove, Cornwall, and bringing safely to land a boat containing the crew of fourteen men of the Austrian barque *Malaleel*, which, while on a voyage from Bordeaux to Cardiff with a cargo of pit wood, had been totally wrecked on the Shark's Fin, near Longships, Cornwall, on the night of the 8th December.

Also 5*l.* to three men for putting off in a boat, and, at some risk, saving the crew of five men of the smack *Espeigle*, of St. Mulo, which had lost her sails, had her rudder damaged, and had been driven ashore at Breen Down, Burnham Bay, during a fresh gale from the N.W. on the 18th December.

Also thanks to Mr. CHAPMAN, farmer, of Breen Down, who rendered good service on the last-named occasion in lending horses to transport the boat, and who afterwards took the rescued men into his house, gave them refreshment, and dried their clothes.

Feb. 18.—Three men put off in a boat from Whitton, Lincolnshire, and at some risk saved the crew of two men from the rigging of the keel *Henry*, of Doncaster, which had sunk on Whitton Sand, in the River Humber, during a fresh gale from the W.N.W.—Reward, 3*l.*

March 1.—The Life-boat *Refuge*, of Gorleston, Suffolk, rescued, at very great risk, one man from the s.s. *Livadia*, of Shields, which, while on a voyage from Shields to Alexandria with a cargo of coal, had been totally wrecked on the Cross Sand during a strong E. gale and thick weather. The steamer had a crew of twenty-three men, twenty-two of whom were unfortunately drowned before the arrival of the Life-boat.—Reward, 20*l.*

March 9.—A boat's crew saved four men from another fishing-boat, from Annagassan, Co. Louth, which had been struck by a squall and had capsized in Dundalk Bay.—Reward, 2*l.*

March 25.—Four men belonging to Deal rescued the crew, consisting of five men, of the fishing-boat *Alice*, of Dover, which had been swamped by a heavy sea and was in a sinking condition during a sudden gale from the N.N.W.—Reward, 2*l.*

April 6.—Voted 3*l.* to six men for putting off in a boat at some risk, and endeavouring to save the crew of six men of a fishing-lugger of North Yell, which was seen to capsize near that place during a severe gale from the N.N.W. on the 21st July. The men, however, were unfortunately drowned before help could reach them.

April 18.—Two fishermen of Arbroath put off in a boat and rescued a man from a small fishing trawler—the *Welcome Home*, of Montrose—which had gone on the rocks at the harbour bar, Arbroath, and was breaking up, during a fresh S.E. breeze and a strong swell on the 18th April.—Reward, 1*l.*

April 2.—Five men residing at Seaford, Sussex, put off in a boat and saved three men from the boat *Little Dick*, of Newhaven, which had been capsized off Seaford, during squally weather.—Reward, 2*l.*

April 29.—Ten men belonging to Stennis, Shetland, put off in a boat, at some risk, and rescued the crew of the sloop *Haabet*, of Mandal, Norway, which was leaking badly and had her pumps choked during very unsettled weather. The vessel ultimately struck on the rocks and became a total wreck.—Reward, 5*l*.

May 4.—Voted the thanks of the Institution to Mr. ROBERT THOS. DUNSEATH, of Belfast, and 1*l*. to two boys for putting off in a small boat from Holywood, co. Down, and rescuing two men and a boy from a boat which had been struck by a heavy sea, and had capsized during a gale of wind from the W.S.W. on the 19th March.

May 20.—Two men saved two persons from a boat which had been capsized off Port Isaac, Cornwall, during a moderate breeze from the S.E. by E. The salvors were in a boat in the harbour when the accident occurred, and immediately pulled towards the two men, who were swimming towards the shore, and took them into their boat.—Reward, 10*s*.

June 7.—Two men belonging to Greencastle, Co. Londonderry, put off in a boat and rescued a man from a small boat which was drifting out to sea off Greencastle during squally weather.—Reward, 10*s*.

June 9.—Four men put off in a small sailing-boat and saved four other men from a vessel which had been dismasted off Orme's Head during a strong breeze from the N.W.—Reward, 1*l*.

June 16.—Nine men put off in two boats and saved four persons whose boat had sunk in Achill Sound, Co. Mayo, during a fresh S.W. breeze.—Reward, 2*l*. 5*s*.

June 27.—A lad saved another boy, who had fallen overboard from a boat belonging to a small yacht off Youghal, Co. Cork, during a gentle N. breeze. On observing the accident the salvor, who was on board the yacht, hauled the boat up to the vessel; got into it, sculled towards the sinking lad, and at some risk fortunately succeeded in rescuing him.—Reward, 10*s*.

July 8.—Two men put off in a boat, and saved three children who, while wandering under the cliffs between Ramsgate and Broadstairs, had been overtaken by the tide.—Reward, 1*l*.

July 12.—Seven men put off in a fishing-boat, and saved the crew of three men of the ketch *Foam*, of Leith, who had taken to their boat, their vessel having been totally wrecked at Bounds Cliff, in Port Isaac Bay, during a moderate gale from the N.N.W.—Reward, 3*l*. 10*s*.

July 14.—Four men rescued the crew of two men from the rigging of the smack *Tartar*, of Watchet, which had sprung a leak and had been run ashore on Minehead Ridge during a strong S.W. breeze at midnight.—Reward, 1*l*.

July 21.—Two men put off in a boat and saved another man whose boat had sunk at Rhyd, North Wales, during squally weather.—Reward, 10*s*.

Aug. 29.—Twelve men put off in a yawl from Scratby, and, with much difficulty, saved the crew, consisting of seven men, of the brigantine *Jane and Jessie*, of Whitehaven, bound for Shetland, with bricks and building materials, which had stranded on the Outer Barber Sand during a strong N.W. by W. wind.—Reward, 12*l*.

Sept. 12.—Three men put off in a boat and

saved two other men from a small pleasure-boat named the *Hawk*, of Port Stewart, Co. Londonderry, which had been struck by a squall, and capsized in Port Stewart Bay on the 12th September. The boat sank at once; but the two men fortunately got hold of three oars, by which they were enabled to keep themselves afloat until they were rescued.—Reward, 1*l*.

Oct. 15.—Four men promptly rescued four other men, whose boat had capsized and sunk in Rosmuck Bay, Co. Galway, whilst they were cruising about, waiting to take part in a regatta, during a fresh N.W. wind.—Reward, 1*l*.

Oct. 16.—The Chief Boatman in charge of H.M. Coastguard, at Burntisland, and eight other men forming the crews of the *Coastguard* Life-whale-boat and the steam-tug *Alliance*, of Burntisland, went out, at some risk, with the view of rescuing five men who had been reported to have been left on board the s.s. *Vulcan*, of Middlesbrough, which had been wrecked on Seafield Vows Rocks, near Kirkcaldy, during a fresh gale of wind from the S.E. On reaching the vessel it was found that only her mast was out of water, and nothing could be seen of those who had been left on board her.—Reward, 9*l*.

Oct. 24.—Seven men put off in a boat, which was hauled off by the rocket apparatus whip, and saved the crew, numbering seven men, from the lugger *Meridian*, of Peterhead, which had stranded on Yarmouth beach during a whole gale of wind from the S.E., at about eleven o'clock in the morning.—Reward, 3*l*. 10*s*.

Oct. 28.—The crew, consisting of twenty men, of the *Refuge* Life-boat, of Gorleston, Suffolk, saved the crew of five men of the schooner *Sceptre*, of Sunderland, which was totally wrecked on the Corton Sands, during a heavy E.N.E. gale.—Reward, 20*l*.

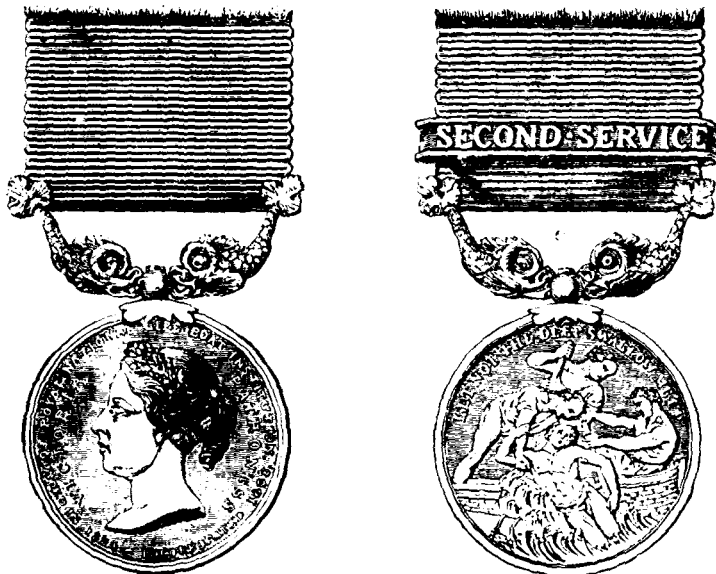
Oct. 30.—Some Coastguardmen at Jury's Gap Station, Sussex, and others, saved, at much risk, three of the crew of the ketch *St. Marie Joseph*, of St. Valery, which was totally wrecked off Jury's Gap, in a fresh gale of wind from the W.S.W. and a heavy sea.—Reward, 12*l*. 5*s*.

Nov. 2.—Three men saved the crew of three men of the sloop *Alliance*, which had sprung a leak, and had foundered off Sheringham, Norfolk, during a gale of wind from the S.S.W., compelling her crew to take to their boat.—Reward, 1*l*.

Nov. 13.—Six men put off in a boat and rescued the crew, consisting of two men, from the rigging of the smack *Charles Phillips*, of Watchet, bound from Newport to Lynmouth with coal, which was totally wrecked in Porlock Bay, Somersetshire, during a fresh gale of wind from the E.S.E.—Reward, 6*l*.

Dec. 7.—Voted the Silver Medal of the Institution and 2*l*. to Mr. GEO. EDWARD HALL, Master of the fishing-boat *Trial*, of Lowestoft, for going along a hawser from the shore, at great risk, and bringing safely to land one of the crew of the schooner *Prosper*, of Carnarvon, which had stranded off Lowestoft, during a heavy N.E. gale, on the night of the 28th October. The master and two of the crew had managed to reach the land by means of the hawser, but the other man was unable to do so, being totally incapacitated by illness.

MEDAL OF THE ROYAL NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION,
 FOR THE PRESERVATION OF LIFE FROM SHIPWRECK.

THE beautiful obverse of this medal, executed by L. C. WYON, Esq., represents the bust of QUEEN VICTORIA, Her Majesty's locks gracefully waving and gathered in a knot behind, from which issues a wreath of oak clustering over the forehead. This life-like portrait of the QUEEN, in high relief, conveys a truly pleasing and faithful likeness of HER MAJESTY at that period (1862), combining the dignity of aspect and benevolence which have always characterised the Queen throughout her long and prosperous reign.

The reverse, representing the Life-boat, in which there are three Seamen, rescuing a fourth from the sea, is a work of great merit. Two of the men are steadying the boat, while the other, stooping, draws in the Shipwrecked Sailor, whose figure is given so as to show the form in the most natural manner; and the expression thrown into his countenance looking up to his preserver is supplicating in the extreme, while the easy flowing lines of this sailor are finely contrasted by those of his companions: the whole displaying a perfect knowledge of the human frame, and a command of the graver to embody what he had shadowed out to himself.

But there is another pleasing motive for admiration of this beautiful Medal, as the figure who is so humanely extending his relief to the drowning Mariner is a portrait of the Artist, the late WILLIAM WYON, Esq., R.A., himself.

The following is a LIST of the GOLD and SILVER MEDALS that have been voted by the Committee of the Institution, since its establishment in 1824, to persons whose humane and intrepid exertions in saving Life from Shipwreck on our Coasts have been deemed sufficiently conspicuous to merit that honourable distinction. The Cases will be found recorded in detail in the several Annual Reports of the Institution.

The total number of Medals granted by the Institution up to the present time is 1,058, 96 of which were in Gold, and 962 in Silver.

THE LIFE-BELT IN USE BY THE CREWS OF THE LIFE-BOATS OF THE NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION.



The requisite qualities of a life-boatman's life-belt are—

1. Sufficient extra buoyancy to support a man heavily clothed, with his head and shoulders above the water, and to enable him to support another person besides himself.

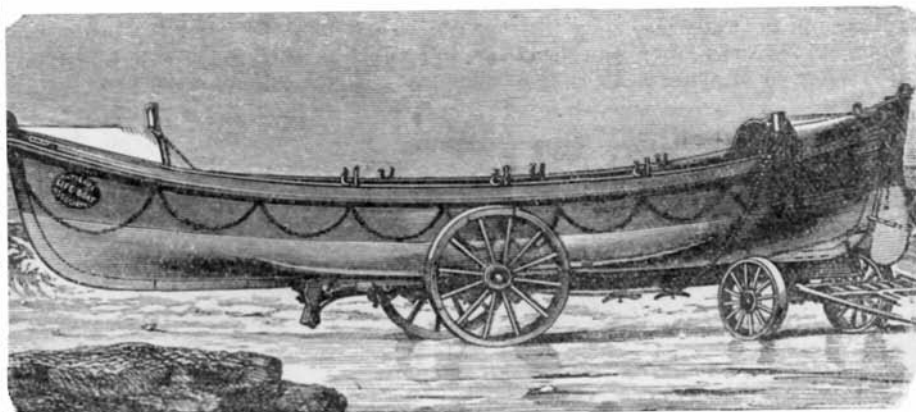
2. Perfect flexibility, so as to readily conform to the shape of the wearer.

3. A division into two zones, an upper and lower, so that between the two it may be secured tightly round the waist; for in no other manner can it be confined sufficiently close and secure round the body without such pressure over the chest and ribs as to materially affect the free action of the lungs, impede the muscular movement of the chest and arms, and thereby diminish the power of endurance of fatigue, which, in rowing-boats, is a matter of vital importance.

4. Strength, durability, and non-liability to injury.

The cork life-belt of the NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION possesses the first two qualities in a greater degree than any other life-belt, and the third one exclusively. (*Vide* annexed figure.)

THE LIFE-BOAT STATION.



THE following brief description and diagrams illustrative of a complete Life-boat Establishment, including the House for the protection of the boat, will serve to convey an idea of the general character of one of the 273 Life-boat Stations of the NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION.

It will be seen that it is a work of a costly nature, and that not only in the first instance, but that a large permanent expense is entailed in keeping the whole machinery in an efficient state, in the re-supply of any part of it which may be destroyed or worn out, in the exercise of the boats' crews, in launching and working the boats, and in remunerating them for their services in saving their fellow-creatures. Yet, looking to the vast importance of the result effected, and the responsibility of calling on men to risk their lives in effecting the same, it is felt that few if any persons will be found who will consider that expense to be incurred in vain.

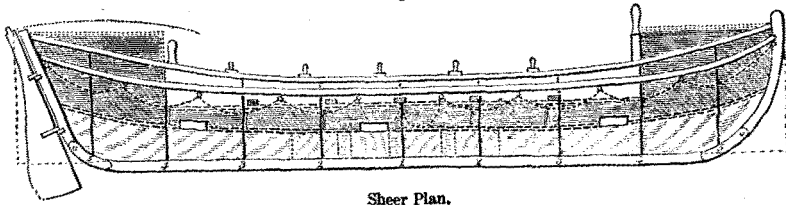
THE LIFE-BOAT.

(See Diagrams on next page.)

The following figures show the general form, the nature of the fittings and air-chambers of one of these boats, 33 feet in length and 8 feet in breadth. In figs. 1 and 2, the elevation and deck plans, the general exterior form of the boat is shown with the sheer of gunwale, length of keel, and rake of stem and stern-posts. The dotted lines of fig. 1 show the position and dimensions of the air-chambers within board, the relieving-tubes, and ballast. In fig 2, A represents the deck, B the relieving-tubes (6 inches in diameter), C the side air-cases, D the end air-chambers, E ballast, F scuttles to admit of a free current of air under the water-tight deck, G scuttle for air, and to receive pump. In fig. 3, the exterior form of transverse sections, at different distances from stem to stern, is shown. Fig. 4 represents a

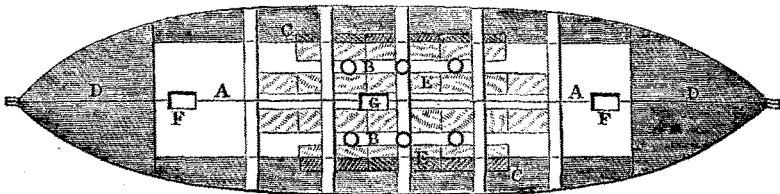
midship transverse section, A being sections of the side air-cases, B the relieving-tubes, of the same depth as the space between the deck and the boat's floor. c, c, c, c, are spaces beneath the deck, placed longitudinally, at the midship part of the boat, with cases packed with cork, forming a portion of the ballast; *d* scuttle for ventilation, having a pump fixed in it, by which any leakage beneath the deck can be pumped out by one of the crew whilst afloat. The festooned lines in fig. 1 represent exterior life-lines attached round the entire length of the boat, to which persons in the water may cling till they can be got into the boat; the two central lines are festooned lower than the others, to be used as stirrups, so that a person in the water, by stepping on them, may climb into the boat without assistance.

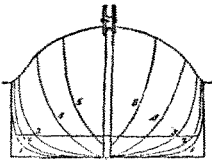
Sheer Plan.

Midship Section.

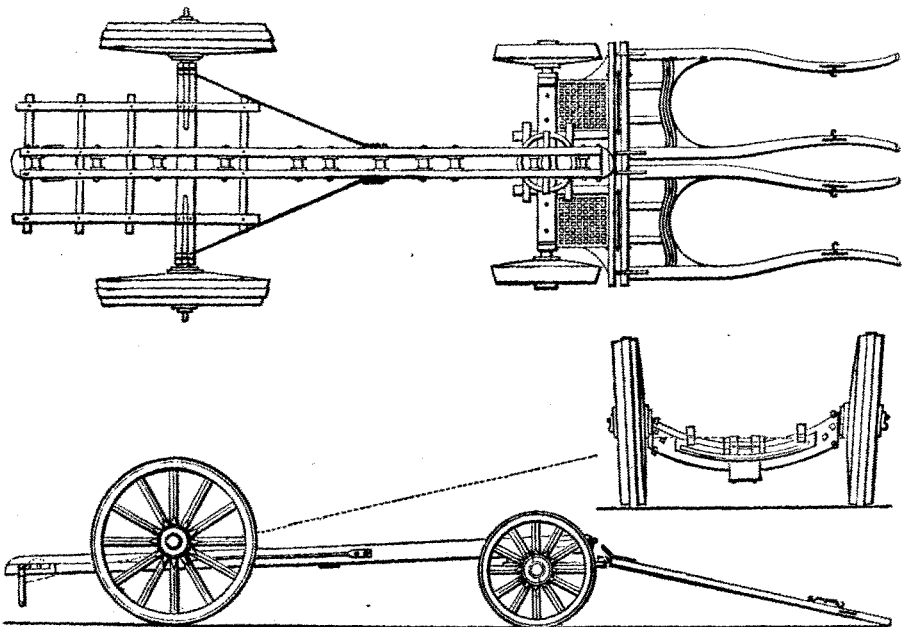
This Life-boat possesses in the highest degree all the qualities which it is desirable that a Life-boat should possess:—

1. Great lateral stability, or resistance to upsetting.
2. Speed against a heavy sea.
3. Facility for launching and taking the shore.
4. Immediate self-discharge of any water breaking into her.
5. The important advantage of self-righting if upset.
6. Strength.
7. Stowage room for a large number of passengers.

THE LIFE-BOAT TRANSPORTING-CARRIAGE.

The Life-boat transporting-carriage is a very important auxiliary to the boat. Every Life-boat, except a few of the larger size, is provided with a carriage, on which she is kept in the boat-house ready for immediate transportation to the most favourable position for launching to a wreck. A Life-boat is thus made available for a greater extent of coast than she otherwise would be; and even when launched from abreast of the boat-house, can be much quicker conveyed to the water's edge than she could be if not on a carriage. In addition to this ordinary use, a carriage is of immense service in launching a boat from a beach, to that extent, indeed, that one can be readily launched from a carriage through a high surf, when without one she could not be got off the beach.

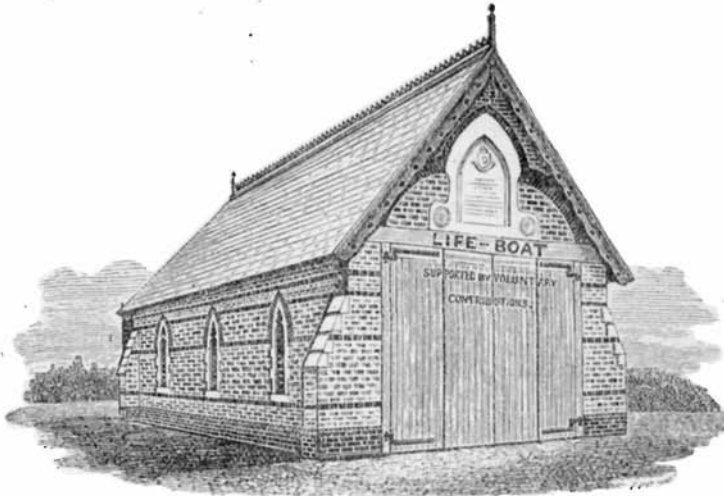
The carriage consists of a fore and main body. The latter is formed of a keelway, and of side or bilgeways attached to the keelway, and resting on the main axle, the



boat's weight being entirely on the rollers of the keelway. Its leading characteristic is that, on the withdrawal of a forelock pin, the fore and main bodies can be detached from each other. The advantages of this arrangement are that, whilst on the one hand the weight of the boat when she is launched from the rear end forms an inclined plane by elevating the keelway and fore-carriage; on the other hand, to replace her on the carriage she can be hauled bow foremost up the fore end or longer incline, by disconnecting the fore-carriage, and letting the end of the keelway rest on the ground, thus forming an inclined plane up which the boat is easily drawn. The bilgeways are needed at the rear end, that the boat may be launched in an upright position, with her crew on board, but they are not required at the fore end of the carriage.

A very full equipment of stores is supplied to the Life-boats of the Institution—such as cork life-belts, anchors and cables, grapnels and lines, life-buoys, lanterns, rockets, and many other articles, together with portable or launching-skids.

THE LIFE-BOAT HOUSE.



The boats of the NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION, and all belonging to them, are kept in roomy and substantial boat-houses, under lock and key, in charge of paid coxswains, under the general superintendence of local honorary committees of residents in the several localities. Each boat has its appointed coxswain at a salary of 8*l.*, and an assistant at 2*l.* a year. The crew consists, in addition, of a bowman, and as many boatmen as the boat pulls oars. The members of the volunteer crews are registered, and wherever practicable, at least double the number of men required are entered on the register. Such men are mostly resident boatmen, fishermen, or Coastguardmen. On every occasion of going afloat to save life, the coxswain and each of the crew receive alike from the funds of the Institution (whether successful or not) 10*s.*, if by day, and 1*l.*, if by night; and 4*s.* each for every time of going afloat for exercise.

A reward of 7*s.* is given to the man who first brings intelligence of a wreck at such a distance along the coast as not to be in sight of the Coastguard Station or other look-out.

A flag hoisted by day, and the firing of a carronade (or other alarm signal) by night, are the well-known signals for calling the crew together.

On boarding wrecks, the preservation of life is the sole consideration. Should any goods or merchandise be brought into the Life-boat, contrary to the coxswain's remonstrance, he is authorised to throw them overboard.

The expense of a Life-boat Station averages 1,000*l.*, and is made up as follows:—

Life-boat and her equipment, including Life-belts for the Crew,

The average Annual Expense of maintaining a Life-boat Station is 70*l.*

Such is a brief summary of the chief of the Regulations under which the Life-boats are worked. How faithfully and with what result they are carried out let the journals of each Life-boat Station and the annals of the Institution tell.

The NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION has now 273 Life-boats under its charge. Every one of these has been specially presented to it, and they save every year from 600 to 700 shipwrecked sailors. Altogether, the Institution has contributed to the saving of 29,608 lives.

Despite, however, this fleet of 273 Life-boats, and of 30 others locally provided and supported, and despite the numerous rocket and mortar stations on our coast, there remains the melancholy fact that an average of 700 lives are lost annually on and around our own shores alone, proclaiming solemnly, though silently, that, for humanity's sake, and for the national credit, no exertions should be spared in providing every possible means for the conveyance of succour to the shipwrecked.

The Institution needs a permanent income of about 40,000*l.* to maintain its great Life-saving Fleet; and the Committee feel assured that it will never lack it so long as it maintains its boats in the state of thorough efficiency that they are in at the present time, and manned as they are on every emergency by as fearless and noble a class of men as ever our Nelsons and Collingwoods led to battle to uphold our country's honour and glory.

The number of lives saved either by the Life-boats of the Institution, or by special exertions for which it has granted rewards, since its formation, is 29,603; for which services 98 Gold Medals, 962 Silver Medals and £72,600 in cash have been granted as rewards.

The average expense of a Life-boat Station is £1,000. Its cost for a 10-oared boat is made up as follows:—
