AT the Annual General Meeting of the NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION, held at the London Tavern on Thursday the 15th day of March, 1860, Rear-Admiral the Right Hon. Earl of SHREWSBURY and TALBOT, C.B., V.P., in the Chair, the following Report of the Committee was read:—

ANNUAL REPORT.

ONCE more it is the duty of the Committee of Management of the ROYAL NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION to present to its supporters, and to the public, their Annual Statement of the position and progress of the Society, whose affairs it is their privilege to conduct. Once more they have the happiness to report that a blessing has attended their exertions, and that whilst they have steadily and rapidly extended the field of their labours, they have been encouraged by a corresponding increase of public appreciation and support.

Confiding in a continuation of that support, and feeling certain that the Society has now taken its place as one of the most important and permanent Institutions of our land, the Committee have determined on soliciting from the Crown the advantage of a Charter of Incorporation.

The proceedings and status of the Institution may be thus epitomized:—

Life-boats.—Twelve new life-boats have been placed on the coast by the Society during the past year; a portion of them being to supersede old or worn-out boats. They are stationed as follows:—At St. Andrew's, Cullercoats, Whitburn, Great Yarmouth, Exmouth, Fowey, The Lizard, Carmarthen Bay, Rhoscolyn, Ayr, The Skerries, and Wexford.

Others are in course of building for Banff,

North Berwick, Kingsgate, Brooke and Grange in the Isle of Wight, Porthcawl, Silloth, Thurso, Portrush, Newquay (Cornwall), and Tyrella (Dundrum Bay).

The total number of life-boats, including those in course of construction, belonging to the Institution, amounts to one hundred and one. A truly noble fleet. Outnumbered, to be sure, by the Navies of Commerce and of War, but the largest life-saving fleet that the world has yet seen.

During the past year, the life-boats of the ROYAL NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION have, at various points of our coasts, been actively called into operation on sixty-eight occasions. Two hundred and twenty-seven lives have been saved from 40 vessels, including five assisted safely into port. On twenty-eight occasions it happened that when the life-boats had put off in reply to signals of distress, the vessels had either got out of danger, or their crews been rescued by other means. Life-boats' crews also assembled several times to give assistance, but were not required to put off to sea. For these valuable exertions the total sum paid to life-boats' crews was 733*l.* 18*s.* 9*d.* On these occasions, and on those of quarterly exercise, the boats were manned by about 4,000 persons. Nearly all the services took place in stormy weather and heavy seas, and often in the dark hour of the night.

The Committee regret having to report

that a serious accident, attended with loss of life, occurred to one of the Society's life-boats in December last; the Aldborough life-boat having been upset in a very high surf, on proceeding to a vessel in distress, and three of her crew, out of 15, having unhappily perished on the occasion. Much as the Committee regret this unfortunate occurrence, it is a consolation to them that no larger number lost their lives, which must have been the case had not this boat self-righted immediately, and thus enabled the greater portion of her crew to get into her again. Indeed, had not the weather and the water been intensely cold at the time, it was considered probable that no life would have been lost. The crew have also since expressed their continued confidence in their boat, and have stated that in their opinion any boat in the world would have been upset under the same circumstances.

In recording this sad and only interruption to the success and immunity from accident which have so long attended the operations of the Institution, the Committee cannot but be deeply impressed with the fact, that the work which they have undertaken the great responsibility of conducting is, of necessity, a dangerous one; and that, whatever amount of care, diligence, and knowledge they may be able to exert in its prosecution, they may not expect that the results of their labours shall be relieved from that universal law which stamps imperfection on all the works of man.

The Committee nevertheless feel that they have much reason for thankfulness to the Almighty that their labours for the relief of human suffering have met with so great success, and been attended by so little loss.

They likewise entertain a heartfelt sense of the admiration and encouragement which are due to the brave men who so readily and nobly undertake the performance of this hazardous and important work, to the dangers of which they are themselves fully alive.

It is gratifying to find that the little pamphlet which the Committee issued last year on the Management of Boats in Heavy Surfs and Broken Water, has been extensively circulated on the coasts of the

United Kingdom. It has also been approved of by the Lords of the Admiralty, who have ordered its distribution throughout Her Majesty's Fleet; and by the Minister of War, who has directed its circulation in all the Military Libraries at home and abroad. The instructions have also been translated into French, Spanish, and Swedish; and it is not improbable they may be rendered into other foreign languages; and that thus the Institution may indirectly be the means of saving life from drowning over many parts of the globe.

Carriages.—New life-boat carriages have been built during the past year for St. Andrew's, Whitburn, Cullercoats, Great Yarmouth, the Lizard, Carmarthen Bay, Ayr, Skerries, Silloth, and Porthcawl. Whilst several others are being constructed for other life-boats.

Boat-houses.—New boat-houses have been built at Redcar, Fowey, The Lizard, Exmouth, Carmarthen Bay, Barmouth, Rhoscolyn, and Fleetwood, and numerous others are in course of erection.

Local Committees.—The Committee continue to receive the cordial co-operation of their several Branch Committees, which form so important a department of the machinery for the supervision and control of the working establishment of the Institution. They desire to express their deep sense of the same, and especially of the valuable gratuitous labours of the several honorary secretaries, who conduct the correspondence with the central managing body in London.

Shipwrecks.—Notwithstanding the unparalleled exertions that have been made during the past year to save life from shipwrecks, not only by life-boats, but also by other available means, the Committee lament to have to report that the number of wrecks in the seas and on the coasts of the British Isles, and the consequent loss of life therefrom, have been unprecedentedly large; no less than 1646 of our fellow-creatures having met with a watery grave. In the case of two wrecks alone—viz., those

of the *Royal Charter* and the *Pomona*— upwards of 800 persons perished in the darkness of the night, without the possibility of any assistance reaching them.

Lives saved.—It is, however, consoling to find, that the exertions which have been made during the past year to save life from shipwreck have been attended with great and encouraging success, as is shown by the annexed *official return* of the Board of Trade:—

It will be observed that, as usual, a greater number of the lives saved have been rescued by ordinary boats, ships and their boats, luggers, and steamers, than by life-boats. This must always necessarily be so; the largest number of lives saved from collisions and wrecks on outlying sand-banks, being by fishing-smacks and other craft, which are fortunately often at hand. It should also be borne in mind, that the services of a life-boat are usually only called into requisition when it would not be safe for any other kind of vessel to approach the wreck. One illustration may be given on this point:—On the 30th January last the ship *Ann Mitchell*, of Glasgow, was wrecked on Arklow Banks. Several fishing-smacks attempted in vain to approach her. The steamer *Ruby*, bound for Bristol, laid-to for five hours with the laudable view of succouring the crew; but the sea was so very heavy that neither smacks nor steamer could even come within hail of the wreck. The Arklow life-boat, belonging to this Institution, made her appearance. She nobly ran through the heavy breakers, and succeeded in taking off the whole nine men from the wreck.

The total number of persons saved from shipwreck since the first establishment of the NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION, and

for rescuing whom the Committee have granted honorary and pecuniary rewards, is shown in the following list:—

Language fails adequately to describe the amount of happiness which the saving of so many thousands of persons must have conferred. It can only have been fully appreciated by the parties themselves, and by their relatives and friends, whose expressions of gratitude for such important benefits are often of the most feeling character.

Rewards.—In the Appendix will be found a summary of the cases in which honorary and other rewards have been voted by the Institution. During the past year one gold medal, 20 silver medals, 13 votes of thanks, inscribed on vellum, and 1,108l. 15s. 3d. have been granted for saving the lives of 499 persons by life-boats, shore-boats, and other means, on the coasts and outlying banks of the United Kingdom. Many of these services have been of the most gallant and laudable character, performed at imminent risk of life.

The Committee have abundant proofs of the local appreciation of these rewards, and especially of the high esteem in which the Society's medals and other honorary distinctions are held on the coast. No other proof is needed of their beneficial effect as an encouragement to daring exertions in the rescue of shipwrecked persons. In order to enhance the value of the medals of the Institution, they are never granted

except when risk of life is believed to have been incurred; and the most careful investigation is made of every case of application for reward before it is decided on.

On the same principle the bestowal of the gold medal is of very rare occurrence, it being only given for services of an extraordinary and exceptional character.

Of such a nature was deemed the noble and perilous act of JOSEPH RODGERS, the Maltese seaman of the *Royal Charter*, who with a line round him swam through the heavy surf to the rocky shore, when that unfortunate vessel was wrecked on the Anglesey coast in October last, which line was the means of saving many persons, and which, had not the vessel broken up in so short a time, would undoubtedly have been the means of saving most of those on board. The Committee have to acknowledge the cordial and kind assistance which they continue to receive from the Commodore Comptroller-General, the Deputy Comptroller-General, and the officers and men of the Coastguard service, by inquiring into the merits of such services, and by affording their zealous general co-operation on all occasions.

The Committee desire also to acknowledge the valuable assistance received by the Institution from the Mercantile Marine Fund, through Her Majesty's Board of Trade, which enables the Institution to make more liberal pecuniary rewards and payments to its life-boat crews than its limited means would otherwise allow.

The operations of the Committee may be thus briefly stated:—Since the formation of the Institution it has expended on life-boat establishments 36,948*l.* 5*s.* 8*d.*, and has voted 82 gold and 658 silver medals for distinguished services for saving life, besides pecuniary awards, amounting together to 12,759*l.* 15*s.* 3*d.*

Finances.—From the annexed statement of the income and expenditure of the Institution during the past year, it will be seen that the following expenses have been incurred, on either additional new Life-boat stations, or the replacing of old boats, transporting-carriages, and houses, by new ones:—Berwick-on-

As previously stated, the Institution has also granted, during the same period, 1,108*l.* 15*s.* 3*d.*, as awards for saving 499 persons from a large number of shipwrecks on our coasts. This great and national work has, however, only been accomplished by the Society incurring liabilities to the extent of a further sum of 3,834*l.*

The receipts of the Institution, from all sources, amounted last year to 11,652*l.* 11*s.* 6*d.*; and amongst the interesting incidents connected therewith, the Committee gratefully acknowledge the accompanying gifts, specially appropriated at the request of the donors themselves to the cost of the following life-boats:—

In again reviewing, at the close of another year, the extensive operations of the Institution, the Committee feel thankful that the services of its life-boats have been successful

in snatching so many as 227 of their fellow-creatures from a watery grave. It is also most encouraging to them to know that it is steadily progressing in public estimation and national importance. It must surely also be a source of satisfaction to its supporters to find that, not only is the NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION now one of the most important benevolent Societies in our land; but that its operations are known to all the maritime powers of the world. Many of these governments have had life-boats built under the superintendence of the Institution; and some of these boats have already been the means, on the shores of the Black Sea and Australia, of saving a considerable number of lives from various wrecks. Englishmen also resident in distant parts of the globe often send tokens of their approval of its philanthropic labours.

The Committee feel assured that such an Institution as this will not readily be allowed to languish from the want of adequate public support. No Society has a stronger claim on the sympathy of the philanthropist than the NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION, whose life-boats have so often preserved to an otherwise desolate home a husband, father, or brother. The Committee therefore make their present earnest appeal on its behalf, in the full assurance, that those who will extend to it their support, will not only enhance a work of benevolence and mercy, but of national importance, and will thus aid in helping onward the best interests of the cause of humanity in our country.

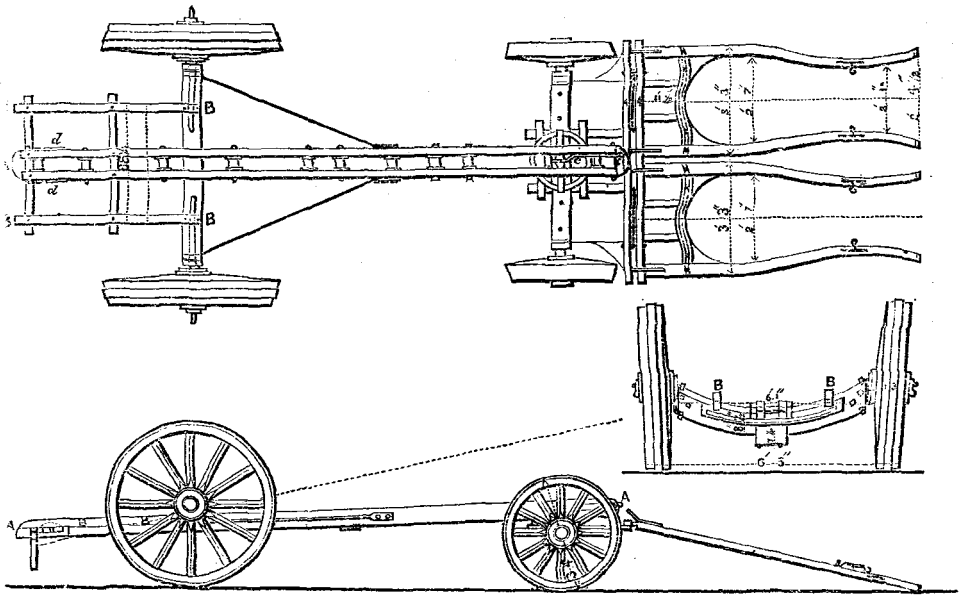

LIFE-BOAT TRANSPORTING-CARRIAGE.

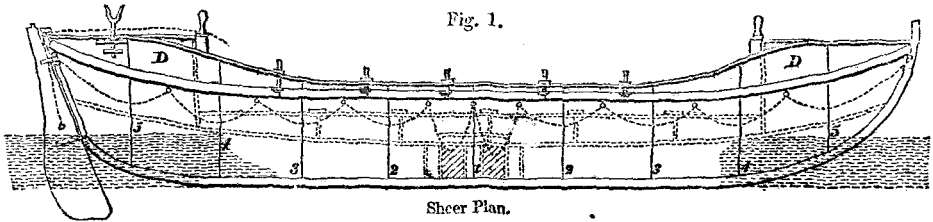


LIFE-BOAT TRANSPORTING-CARRIAGE AS ADOPTED BY THE ROYAL NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION.

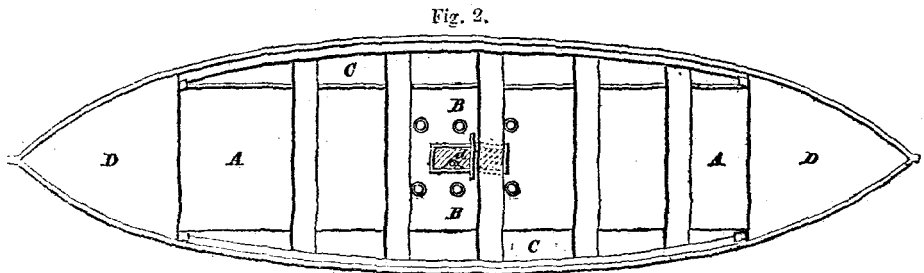
THE carriage consists of a fore and main body. The latter is formed of a keelway A, A, and of side or bilgeways B, B, in rear of the main axle, the boat's weight being entirely on the rollers of the keelway. Its leading characteristic is that, on the withdrawal of the long forelock pin C, the fore and main bodies can be detached from each other. The advantages of this arrangement are that the weight of the boat when she is launched from the rear end forms an inclined plane by elevating the keelway, yet without lifting the fore body off the ground, whilst to replace her on the carriage she can be hauled bow foremost up the fore end or longer incline. The bilgeways B, B, are

needed at the rear end, that the boat may be launched in an upright position with her crew on board; but they are not required at the fore end of the carriage. The boat is hauled off the carriage and launched into the sea by a rope at each end of the boat rove through the sheeve D, having one end hooked to a self-detaching hook at the boat's stern, and the other manned by a few persons on the shore, who thus haul the boat and her crew off the carriage and launch them afloat at once, with their oars in their hands, by which means head-way may be obtained before the breakers have time to beat the boat broadside on to the beach.

Deck Plan.

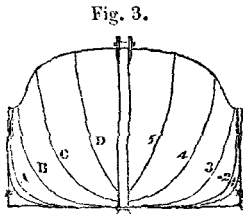

Body Plan.

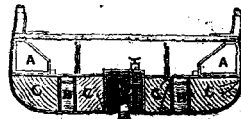

The accompanying figures show the general form, the nature of the fittings, and air-chambers of one of these boats, 30 feet in length and 7 feet 6 inches in breadth. In figs. 1 and 2, the elevation and deck plans, the general exterior form of the boat is shown with the sheer of gunwale, length of keel, and rake or slope of stem and stern-posts. The dotted lines of fig. 1 show the position and dimensions of the air-chambers within board, and of the relieving-tubes. In fig. 2, A represents the deck, B the relieving tubes (6 inches in diameter), C the side air-cases, D the end air-chambers. In fig. 3, the exterior form of transverse sections, at different distances from stem to stern, is shown. Fig. 4 represents a midship transverse section, A being sections of the side air-cases, B the relieving-tubes, bored through solid massive chocks of wood of the same depth as the space between the deck and the boat's floor. C, C, are spaces beneath the deck, filled up, over 6 feet in length, at the midship part of the boat, with solid chocks of light wood, forming a portion of the ballast; d is a section of a small draining-tier, having a pump in it, by which any leakage can be pumped out by one of the crew whilst afloat. The festooned lines in fig. 1 represent exterior life-lines attached round the entire length of the boat, to which persons in the water may cling till they can be got into the boat; the two central lines are festooned lower than the others, to be used as stirrups, so that a person in the water by stepping on them may climb into the boat.

This life-boat possesses in the highest degree all the qualities which it is desirable that a life-boat should possess:—

1. Great lateral stability.
2. Speed against a heavy sea.
3. Facility for launching and for taking the shore.
4. Immediate self-discharge of any water breaking into her.

REWARDS VOTED BY THE ROYAL NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION

FROM THE 1ST JANUARY TO THE 31ST DECEMBER, 1859.

Dec. 12, 1858.—The French lugger *Louise Amelie*, of Nantes, was wrecked, during a gale of wind, in Dundrum Bay. The Institution's life-boat, stationed at Newcastle, put off and rescued the crew of 5 men.—Expense of service, 6*l*.

Dec. 21.—The brig *Black Prince*, of North Shields, was wrecked, during thick weather, on the Holme Sands. A Pakefield yawl put off and rescued the crew of 9 men.—Reward, 10*l*.

Jan. 6.—Reported that the Lytham life-boat had put off, on the 19th Dec., to the assistance of the schooner *E.D.*, off Salcombe, which had a signal of distress flying, during a S.W. gale, and had succeeded in bringing her into port in safety.

Jan. 6.—The schooner *Maria*, of Bilboa, was wrecked, during a heavy storm, off Lerwick, Shetland. 7 men put off in their boat and rescued, at the risk of their lives, the wrecked vessel's crew of 7 men.—Reward, 7*l*.

Jan. 6, 1859.—Voted a reward of 6*l*. to 6 men, for putting off and saving 2 men of the crew of the smack *Catherine Anne*, of Ramsey, which was wrecked during a S.W. gale, off Maryport, on the 7th Oct. last.

Jan. 6.—Also 8*l*. to a fishing-boat's crew, for saving the crew of 3 men of the schooner *Oak*, of Goole, from Goole to Ipswich, which, during a fresh gale and squally weather, was wrecked off Blakeney Harbour, on the 18th Oct. last.

Jan. 6.—Also 2*l*. to 3 men, for saving a man whose boat was capsized off Britannia Pier, Yarmouth, during stormy weather, on the 24th Oct. last.

Jan. 6.—Also 3*l*. 10*s*. to a boat's crew, for putting off and rescuing 1 out of 3 men of the crew of the schooner *Earl Spencer*, of Liverpool, which was wrecked during cloudy weather at the mouth of the Boyne, Drogheda, on the 17th Nov. last.

Jan. 6.—Also a reward of 3*l*. to a boat's crew, for putting off and rescuing 5 out of 6 of the crew of the brig *Sampson*, of Waterford, which was wrecked during hazy weather off Ballinacourty, near Dunganarvan, on the 14th Nov. last.

Jan. 6.—Also 4*l*. to a boat's crew, for going off and saving the crew of 6 men of the schooner *Seaboy*, of Maryport, which was wrecked during a gale of wind off Innisboffin, on the coast of Donegal, on the 30th Nov. last.

Jan. 6.—Also the silver medal of the Institution and 1*l*. to JOHN MOSS, for saving, at the peril of his life, a man from the lugger *Stornoway's* boat, which had been run down off Dungeness, on the 19th Dec. last.

Jan. 6.—Also a reward of 5*l*. 10*s*. to a boat's crew, for going off and saving 2 persons from a boat which was capsized during squally weather, off Glin, Limerick, on the 13th Nov. last.

Jan. 6.—Also 3*l*. to a boat's crew, for putting off and rescuing 3 men from a fishing-boat which went to pieces off Nesting, Shetland, during a gale of wind, on the 27th Aug. last.

Jan. 8.—The French brig *Druide*, of Morlaix, was wrecked, during squally weather, off Blakeney, Norfolk. A boat put off, manned by 20 men, and saved, after much toil and risk, the crew of 8 men.—Reward, 20*l*.

Jan. 9.—The Newbiggin life-boat, belonging to the Institution, put off and rescued 4 persons from the schooner *Betsy* of Sunderland, which was wrecked during a strong gale of wind off Newbigging Point.—Expense of service, 14*l*.

Jan. 10.—The brig *Nancies*, of Irvine, was

wrecked off Troon, during blowing weather. 4 out of 5 of the crew were saved, after some difficulty, by a fishing-boat.—Reward, 4*l*.

Feb. 2.—The schooner *Richmond*, of Middlesborough, was wrecked during a S.W. gale off Kingsdown, Walmer. A boat promptly put off and rescued 1 out of 6 of the crew.—Reward, 2*l*. 10*s*.

Feb. 3.—Voted the silver medal of the Institution to JOHN RUDDOCK, boatman of Filey, in testimony of his general valuable and gallant services in saving life from wrecks on different occasions in the Filey life-boat and in other boats.

Feb. 6.—The sloop *St. Anne*, of Galway, was wrecked, during stormy weather, off Rinnmore Point, Galway. 2 men put off in a boat and rescued the sloop's crew of 2 men.—Reward, 1*l*.

March 3.—Voted the silver medal of the Institution to Mr. JOHN RIDGE, and 11*l*. to several other men, for going off in shore-boats and saving, at considerable risk of life, 18 out of 31 men from the steamer *Czar*, of Hull, which sank on the Vroge Rocks, Lizard Point, during a S.W. gale, on the 22nd Jan. last.

March 3.—Also the thanks of the Society, inscribed on vellum, to Capt. J. B. WILLOUGHBY, R.N., Inspecting Commander of the Coastguard, in acknowledgment of his valuable services at the stranding of the barque *Aurora*, off Rottingdean, on the 9th Feb. last, and of his zealous exertions in promoting the establishment of several life-boats on the coast.

March 3.—Also the thanks of the Institution, inscribed on vellum, to Mr. J. R. JONES, and 2*l*. 10*s*. to 5 other men, in consideration of their intrepid conduct in putting off in a boat and rescuing the crew of 5 men of the schooner *Eliza Pickering*, of Hull, which was wrecked off Cymyrron, near Holyhead, on the 18th Jan. last.

March 3.—Also the thanks of the Institution, inscribed on vellum, to Mr. KENNETH MURRAY, and 5*l*. 10*s*. to several other men, for putting off and aiding to bring on shore 5 men from the brigantine *Miney Harley*, of Cork, which was found disabled off the Butt of Lewis, during hazy weather, on the 28th Dec., 1858. Some of the brigantine's crew had previously perished from famine, and the captain died soon after he had been brought on shore.

March 3.—The flat *Margaret*, of Preston, sank off Mochras Head, Cardigan Bay, during a dense fog. Four boats put off and rescued the crew of 3 men.—Reward, 14*l*.

March 7.—The schooner *Ebenezer*, of Beaumaris, was wrecked on the north side of Irvine Bar during a gale of wind. The Irvine life-boat put off and rescued the crew of 4 men.—Reward, 6*l*.

March 11.—The Society's life-boat at Holyhead put off and assisted to bring into a port of safety the schooner *Scotia*, of Carnarvon, which, during a heavy gale of wind, was observed to be in distress off the Clipera Rocks.—Expense of service, 6*l*. 10*s*.

March 11.—The schooner *Caroline*, of Fowey, was wrecked during stormy weather on Northam Burrows, Bideford. The Institution's life-boat, at Appledore, put off and rescued the crew of 5 men.—Expenses of service, 4*l*.

March 12.—The schooner *Clifton*, of Gloucester, was wrecked, during a heavy gale of wind, off Bideford. Several attempts were made by the Institution's life-boats at Bideford to save the

wreck's crew, but for a long time the violence of the storm and sea baffled their efforts. Ultimately, however, after much toil and risk, 2 of the wreck's crew were saved by one of the life-boats.—Expense of services, 37*l*.

March 20.—The schooner *Blue Jacket*, of Bangor, was wrecked during stormy weather on the Latton Sands, off Beaumaris. A boat, manned by 5 men, put off and rescued 2 out of 5 of the crew.—Reward, 2*l*. 10*s*.

March 29.—The Cullercoats life-boat, which belongs to this Institution, put off and rescued in a heavy sea, the crew of 4 men of a fishing-boat which was disabled off Cullercoats. The life-boat's crew declined to receive any reward for their services to their fellow fishermen.

April 1.—A boat was capsized off Castletownsend, Cork. A boat's crew put off and rescued, after some difficulty, 3 out of 4 of the crew.—Reward, 1*l*. 10*s*.

April 2.—The brig *Velocity*, of Sunderland, was wrecked during stormy weather on Sizewell Bank, Suffolk. The Institution's life-boat, stationed at Thorpness, put off and saved the crew of 8 men.—Expense of service, 11*l*. 10*s*.

April 7.—Voted the silver medal of the Institution to DANIEL SHEA, coxswain of the Society's life-boat at Padstow, and 7*l*. to his crew, for going off and rescuing the crew of 7 men of the brigantine *Gonsalve*, of Nantes, which during a heavy gale of wind was wrecked on Doon Bar Sand, Padstow, on the 8th March.—Also 8*l*. to the crew of the same life-boat for saving the crew of 4 men and a pilot from the schooner *Frederick William*, of Ipswich, which was also wrecked on Doon Bar Sand, Padstow, on the 15th *idem*.

April 7.—Also 110*l*. 10*s*. 6*d*. to pay the expenses of the Newhaven, Brighton, Teignmouth, Penmon, Fishguard, Portmadoc, Rhyll, Aldborough, and Arklow life-boats, for putting off to vessels which had signals of distress flying, but which did not afterwards require the boats' services.

April 15.—The sloop *Liberal*, of Wisbeach, was wrecked during stormy weather on the Goodwin Sands. The Institution's life-boat, at Walmer, put off and rescued 1 out of 4 of the crew. Expense of service, 13*l*. 10*s*.

April 24.—The barque *Alecto*, of Frederickstadt, was wrecked off Winterton during a gale of wind. The Institution's new life-boat at Winterton put off and saved the crew of 9 men.—Expense of service, 24*l*. 15*s*.

April 27.—The French lugger *Boncalis*, of Bayonne, was wrecked about 4 miles off Blackrocks, Dundalk Bay. A boat, manned by 4 men, put off and attempted to rescue, at great risk of life, the lugger's crew of 5 men. They were subsequently taken off the wreck in finer weather by the same boat's crew, accompanied by Mr. McDERMOTT and a French lad.—Reward, 4*l*. to the boat's crew.

April 27.—The schooner *Amelia*, of Salcombe, was wrecked during a gale of wind off Cardiff. A boat, manned by 5 Coastguard-men, put off and rescued, at considerable risk of life, the crew of 4 men.—Reward, 5*l*.

May 5.—Voted the silver medal of the Society to ALEXANDER BAIN, seaman, in testimony of his intrepid services in wading into the surf, at the peril of his life, and conveying a line on board the French barque *Azalea*, of Nantes, by which means her crew of 3 hands were rescued. The vessel had gone on the rocks off Skerries, Dublin, during a gale of wind on the 28th April.

May 5.—Also 4*l*. to a boat's crew of 4 men for putting off in a boat and saving 2 women who had been left on a rock off Sellerna, on the coast of Donegal, on the 10th March.

May 5.—Also the thanks of the Institution, inscribed on vellum, to WILLIAM SHANNON and JOHN

GEORGE, of Shields, for wading into the surf, at the risk of their lives, to the rescue of the crew of the schooner *Sir William Curtis*, which during a gale of wind went on the rocks off Tynemouth on the 14th March.

June 2.—Also the thanks of the Institution, inscribed on vellum, to Capt. ELLISON and Mr. McLELLAN; and 2*l*. to 4 other men for their services in rescuing 10 of the crew of the brig *William Sortie*, of Glasgow, which was wrecked off Barra, Western Islands, on the 26th Jan. last.

June 22.—The lugger *Bretagne*, of Havre, went on the Goodwin Sands during hazy weather. The lugger *Neptune's* crew rendered some valuable assistance to the wrecked men.—Reward, 1*l*. 10*s*.

July 23.—The Arklow life-boat put off with the view of rendering assistance to the barque *Fairy Queen*, of Glasgow, which went on the Arklow Bank during a dense fog.—Expense of service, 7*l*. 6*s*. 6*d*.

Aug. 1.—The Walmer life-boat put off with the view of rendering assistance to the crew of a vessel which was observed to be in a dismantled state on the Goodwin Sands; but no person was found on the wreck.—Expense of service, 6*l*. 10*s*.

Aug. 30.—The Institution's life-boat, at Fleetwood, put off with the view of rendering assistance to the ship *Sir Colin Campbell*, of Belfast, which was in distress during a heavy gale of wind off Fleetwood.—Expense of service, 4*l*. 10*s*.

Aug. 30.—The Norwegian brig *Opreisingen*, of Arendal, was stranded in Castletown Bay during a gale of wind at midnight. The life-boat belonging to the Institution, stationed at Castletown, put off and saved 3 of the crew.—Expense of service, 11*l*. 10*s*.

Sept. 1.—Voted 5*l*. to 2 men and a lad for swimming off and rescuing 2 priests, who with their servants had been capsized from their boat during a squall of wind of Roundstone, on the coast of Galway, on the 3rd August.

Sept. 1.—Also 4*l*. to 2 pilots for rendering assistance to the crews of 8 men of two ships' boats, which were in a perilous position off the Holmes, in the Bristol Channel, on the 3rd August last.

Sept. 6.—The brig *Fame*, of Shields, was wrecked on the Shipwash Sands, near Harwich, during hazy weather. A smack's crew of 5 men saved the crew of 7 men.—Reward, 5*l*.

Sept. 14.—The Dover life-boat, belonging to the Society, put off with the view of saving the crew of the schooner *Dove*, of Seaton, which was totally wrecked off Dover, during a strong gale of wind. The vessel's crew had, however, been previously rescued by the rocket apparatus.—Expense of service, 4*l*. 12*s*.

Sept. 16.—The Boulmer life-boat put off with the view of rendering assistance to a fishing-coble, which was observed to be in distress off that place during squally weather.—Expense of service, 6*l*. 8*s*.

Sept. 17.—The Institution's life-boat at Bridlington, put off and rescued, during a heavy gale of wind, the crew of 6 men of the brig *Eagle* of Sunderland, which went on shore near the North Pier, Bridlington.—Expense of service, 16*l*.

Sept. 24.—Six persons were capsized from their boat off Mevagissey Harbour. A boat manned by 5 men put off and rescued 2 out of the 6 men.—Reward, 2*l*. 10*s*.

Oct. 6.—Voted the silver medal of the Society to JOHN CRAGIE, coxswain of the Southwold life-boat; second-service clasp to B. HERRINGTON; and 31*l*. 14*s*. 6*d*. to pay the expenses of the life-boat in putting off and rescuing the crew of 9 men and the captain's wife, of the Prussian brig *Lucinde*, of Memel, which was wrecked during a strong gale and very heavy sea off Misner Haven, Suffolk, on the 17th Sept. last.

Oct. 6.—Also 6*l.* 10*s.* to pay the expenses of the Cahore life-boat, for putting off with the view of rendering assistance to a vessel that was supposed to be in distress.

Oct. 6.—Voted the thanks of the Institution to Capt. TUDOR, R.N., for putting off, with 15 others, in the Wick new life-boat, and rescuing the crew of 7 men of the schooner *Huntress*, which was stranded during a gale of wind off Wick, on the 6th Sept. last.

Oct. 24.—The smack *Endeavour* of Portmadoc, was wrecked during a gale of wind off Aberdovey. The life-boat of the Institution at the latter place put off and rescued the crew of 4 men.—Reward, 9*l.*

Oct. 25.—The steamer *Mary Ann*, of West Hartlepool, struck on the *Northern Belle* off Broadstairs, and afterwards went down during a heavy gale of wind. The Margate lugger *Queen*, after many gallant attempts, rescued the crew of 4 men. Reward, 20*l.*

Oct. 25.—The schooner *Elizabeth*, of Rochester, and the brig *Paragon*, of Stockton, were wrecked during a gale of wind on Yarmouth Beach. A boat's crew of 6 men put off and rescued the 2 masters of the vessels, their crews having reached the land in their own boats.—Reward, 6*l.*

Oct. 25.—The schooner *Kingston*, of Cork, was wrecked under Penarth Head during a gale of wind. Two men rendered valuable assistance by wading into the surf to the rescue of the crew. Reward, 2*l.*

Oct. 25.—The sloop *George and Mary* of Hull was wrecked during a heavy gale of wind off Filey. The Society's life-boat stationed at that place put off and rescued the crew of 3 men.—Expense of service, 15*l.* 13*s.*

Oct. 26.—The schooner *Esther Anne*, of Ulverstone, was wrecked during a very heavy gale of wind, near Redwharf Bay, Anglesey. A fishing-boat's crew rescued, after four attempts, the crew of 4 men, who were very much exhausted, having been in the rigging eleven hours.—Reward, 12*l.*

Oct. 26.—The schooner *Silva*, of Glasgow, was wrecked on Corton Sands during a heavy gale of wind. The Pakefield life-boat, in connexion with this Institution, put off with the view of rendering assistance to the vessel.—Expenses, 14*l.* 10*s.* The Lowestoft life-boat had approached the above wreck at the same time. The schooner's crew of 4 hands were taken on board by her, and afterwards safely landed.—Expense of service, 14*l.* 10*s.*

Oct. 26.—The Lowestoft life-boat put off again and rescued the crew of 5 men of the schooner *Lord Douglas*, of Dundee, which was wrecked off Corton Beach during a heavy gale of wind. While returning to the shore with the wrecked crew on board, the violence of the gale had split the boat's foresail, which compelled the crew to run on Corton Beach, where the rescued men were safely placed. After having procured another sail, and partly changed the boat's crew, she again proceeded off to the rescue of the crew of the schooner *Silva*, as detailed above. Expense of service, 14*l.* 10*s.*

Oct. 26.—The schooner *Majestic*, of Dundee, was wrecked on Spittal Point during stormy weather. The life-boat of the Institution, stationed at Berwick, put off and rescued the crew of 5 hands.—Expense of service, 8*l.* 10*s.*

Oct. 26.—The schooner *Oriental*, of Lancaster, was wrecked during a gale of wind off the Voryd Telegraph Station, Rhyl. The Society's tubular life-boat at Rhyl put off and rescued the crew of 6 men.—Expense of service, 8*l.*

Oct. 26.—The Institution's life-boat at Redcar put off during a gale of wind, and rescued 2 men from a pilot-cable, which was in great danger, off Redcar.—Expense of service, 13*l.* 17*s.*

Oct. 29.—The schooner *Diligence*, of Whitby,

was wrecked during stormy weather off that place. A number of persons assisted, by means of cliff-ladders, in saving the crew of 3 men. A boat's crew also put off with the view of saving the crew of the said vessel.—Reward, 7*l.*

Oct. 31.—The French schooner *La Jeune Mathilde*, of Caen, was wrecked near the Lowestoft South Pier Head during a heavy gale. The Pakefield life-boat put off with the view of rendering assistance; but, owing to the shallowness of the water, the life-boat was unable to get near the vessel, and being in danger of having their boat destroyed by the heavy seas, the crew were compelled to run into the harbour for safety. The vessel's crew of 5 men were afterwards saved by a punt manned by 6 of the life-boat's crew.—Reward, 12*l.*

Nov. 1.—The smack *Bruce*, of Milford, was wrecked during a heavy gale of wind near Tenby. The Institution's life-boat stationed at that place put off, manned by Lieut. the Hon. R. F. BOWLE, R.N., and a crew of 12 men, and rescued the smack's crew of 3 men.—Expense of service, 11*l.* 1*s.*

Nov. 1.—The smack *Peace*, of Brixham, was wrecked during a heavy gale of wind off Lundy Island. A pilot-boat rescued, at some risk of life, the crew of 3 men.—Reward, 8*l.*

Nov. 2.—The brig *North Eske*, of Sunderland, was wrecked during a hurricane on Braunton Sands. The Braunton life-boat put off and rescued, after much difficulty, the crew of 6 men. Expense of service, 10*l.* 2*s.* 6*d.*

Nov. 2.—The schooner *Anton*, of Denmark, was wrecked on some rocks off Whitburn. The Whitburn life-boat, which belongs to the Institution, put off with the view of rescuing the crew of 6 men, but they had previously been taken off by the Whitburn old life-boat.—Expense of service, 12*l.* 12*s.*

Nov. 3.—Voted the gold medal of the Institution and 5*l.* to JOSEPH RODGERS, a Maltese seaman, in acknowledgment of his heroic conduct in swimming ashore with a line from the steam-ship *Royal Charter*, whereby several lives were saved, on the occasion of the unfortunate wreck of that vessel, during a very heavy gale of wind, on the Anglesey coast on the night of the 25th Oct. last. At the time the sea was breaking with frightful violence on the rocks; and had the vessel herself been able to resist the force of the waves, his daring effort to help his fellows in distress would, without doubt, have been gloriously rewarded by the safe deliverance of most if not all of those 490 persons who sailed with him in the ship.

It was, however, decreed otherwise, as the ship broke up before more than 25 persons had been able to avail themselves of the means of rescue afforded them by the intrepidity of the brave man whose act we are recording. Nevertheless, that act is as deserving of admiration as if it had been the means of saving all on board. The extreme risk attending its performance may not have struck every one, yet it would be impossible to exaggerate it. It is known to every person conversant with the effects of a broken sea on the shore, that even if that shore be of smooth sand or shingle, the force of the falling waves is so great, and their retreating force so almost equally dangerous, as to overcome in most cases the power and skill of the strongest and most skilful swimmers. How much more is the danger enhanced when the infuriated surges dash themselves and all that they bear upon them, with headlong violence, on the sharp and serrated edges of the adamant rock! Yet still more must the risk be increased when all around is darkness; when broken spars and pieces of wreck are interspersed amongst the waves; and when the temperature of the water is so low as to

chill the blood and half quench the vital energies of the most vigorous frame. All these sources of danger must have presented themselves to RODGERS; yet he heeded them not. True, he was personally interested in reaching the shore, but he could not have thought that the probability of doing so was increased by his carrying a line from the ship, and he might well have paused ere plunging into the deep, to reflect if the chances of his own destruction did not greatly predominate over those of his reaching the shore alive. And no doubt he would have so reflected, and would have acted on that reflection, had he not yielded himself up to that impulse of a feeling and generous nature which at such a moment will absorb every other, and which, banishing self from the mind, will think only of the object to be effected.

Such was the act of JOSEPH RODGERS, the Maltese seaman of the *Royal Charter*.

Nov. 3.—Voted a reward of 3*l.* to 3 men for their assistance to 2 persons who were observed to be in a dangerous position in their boat, off Stonehaven, during blowing weather.

Nov. 6.—The Berwick life-boat put off during a gale of wind and rescued the crew, consisting of 6 men, of the brig *New Atley*, of Aberdeen, which was wrecked off Berwick on that day.—Reward, 6*l.* 10*s.*

Nov. 6.—The Pakefield life-boat went off, during a heavy gale of wind, to the assistance of the steamer *Enchantress*, of Hull, which went on Brille Bar, off that place, and succeeded in bringing the vessel and her crew of 14 hands safely into harbour.—The life-boat's crew were paid by the owners for their services.

Nov. 8.—The schooner *Fame*, of Maldon, came into collision with another vessel off Caister, near Yarmouth. A boat's crew of 6 men rescued the schooner's crew.—Reward, 6*l.*

Nov. 19.—The barque *Ohio*, of Stettin, was wrecked in Castletown Bay during a heavy gale of wind. The Castletown life-boat, belonging to this Institution, put off and rescued the crew of 4 men.—Expense of service, 12*l.*

Nov. 25.—The brig *Cuba*, of Whitby, was totally wrecked opposite Winterton Light, at midnight. The Society's life-boat at Winterton put off in the morning and rescued 1 of the crew.—Expense of service, 11*l.* 0*s.* 6*d.*

Nov. 26.—The Prussian brig *Fortuna*, of Memel, was stranded on the East Scarr Rocks, off Redcar, in a heavy sea. The Redcar life-boat put off and rescued the crew of 11 hands.—Expense of service, 25*l.* 15*s.*

Dec. 1.—Voted the silver medal of the Institution to R. HOOK, FRANCIS SMITH, JAMES BUTCHER, RICHARD BUTCHER, WILLIAM ROSE, ALFRED MEWSE, and THOMAS LIFFEN, for their general gallant services in the Lowestoft life-boat in saving life from shipwrecks, and particularly for putting off in that boat, and rescuing, during a heavy gale of wind, the crew of 14 men of the steamer *Shamrock*, of Dublin, which was totally wrecked on the south end of the Holm Sands, on the 1st Nov. last. Also 2*4*l.** to pay the expense of the service of the boat on that occasion.

Dec. 1.—Voted the silver medal to Lieut. the Hon. R. F. BOYLE, R.N.; the second-service clasp to ROBERT PARROTT, coxswain; and 12*l.* 16*s.* to pay the expenses of the Tenby life-boat for putting off to the assistance of the brig *Policy*, of Sunderland, which was wrecked during a heavy gale with squalls of hail on the Monkstone Rocks, near Tenby, on the night of the 6th Nov. last. While in the act of saving the shipwrecked crew, the cable of the life-boat parted, which compelled her to return to the shore. The men were afterwards saved by the crew of the life-boat by means of the rocket apparatus.

Dec. 1.—Voted the thanks of the Institution to the Rev. O. LLOYD WILLIAMS, and 6*l.* to pay the expenses of the Barmouth life-boat in putting off and rendering important assistance to the American ship *Troy*, cotton laden, which had grounded during hazy weather on Sarn Badrig Causeway. The life-boat's crew also received salvage, for this service.

Dec. 1.—Voted the silver medal and 1*l.* to PETER SMITH, chief boatman of the Lydd Coast-guard station, and 5*l.* to his crew of 5 men, for saving the master and some of the crew of the Norwegian brig *Caroline*, which was wrecked, during a heavy gale of wind off Lydd, on the 25th Oct. last.

Dec. 1.—Also the silver medal and 3*l.* to CHARLES MITCHELL, and 15*l.* to two boats' crews, for putting off at great risk on three occasions, and rescuing the crew of 4 men of the sloop *Busy*, of New Quay, which, during a very heavy gale of wind, was wrecked off Port Isaac on the 25th October last. MITCHELL displayed on these occasions undaunted courage and perseverance.

Dec. 1.—Also the silver medal to JAMES THOMAS, and the thanks of the Institution, inscribed on vellum, to F. KENDLE, F. WHEELER, and H. WHEELER, in acknowledgment of their highly meritorious services in assisting with others to rescue, by wading into the surf the crew of 6 men of the schooner *Lelia*, of London, which was wrecked during a gale of wind on Rocken End, Isle of Wight, on the 1st Nov. last. They had, in addition, received a local reward. THOMAS particularly distinguished himself on the occasion by his gallantry. The thanks of the Institution were also voted to JOSEPH WALLIS, Esq., chief officer of coast-guard, and to his men for their valuable services at the wreck.

Dec. 1.—The new surf life-boat at Yarmouth, belonging to this Institution, put off and saved the brig *John*, of Shields, and her crew of 7 men, which was in distress off Yarmouth on the 25th Oct. last. The same life-boat put off during a gale of wind, and rescued the crew of 5 men of the schooner *Ferona*, of Exeter, which was wrecked off Yarmouth on the 5th Nov. last. The owners had paid the life-boat's crew for both services.

Dec. 1.—Voted 18*l.* to a Bacton yawl's crew of 18 men, for putting off and rescuing 4 out of 5 of the crew of a fishing-smack which was wrecked on the Hasborough Sand off Bacton on the 27th Nov. last. The poor men had been in the rigging without food or drink sixty hours, before they were rescued from the mast of their sunken vessel. For three nights and two days they held on this uncertain support—about eight feet above the raging sea—without food and almost without clothing. One of the men took off his shirt and held it out as a signal of distress till it was blown from his feeble grasp. This is a case of most remarkable endurance. It was but a small vessel, a smack with four hands; the fourth, a boy, climbed the mast with the others and held on till the second day, when he became exhausted, and relaxing his hold, slipped down into the sea. One of the men went down after him, seized him and dragged him up the mast again, but there was nothing to which to lash him, and no cross-trees or spars on which to rest, so that during the night, when almost senseless with cold and fatigue, the poor boy slipped down again, and was lost in the darkness. On Sunday they were tantalized with the hope of immediate succour. A vessel saw their signals and heard their cries, and sent a boat to their relief; but, after buffeting with the wind and tide, they had the mortification to see her give up the attempt and return to the vessel. Then it was that black despair took possession of

them, and they gave themselves up for lost; but clinging to their frail support for an hour or two longer, they heard a gun fire. This gave them fresh courage, for they took it to be a signal, as in fact it was, that their case was known, and an attempt would be made to save them. The vessel stood in and communicated with the shore, and a boat put off to search for them; but they were such a speck on the ocean, that, night coming on, they could not be seen, and the boat returned to shore. For the third night, therefore, they had still to cling on, expecting every moment that the mast would go over and bury them in the deep. On the Monday morning the Bacton boat made another attempt, fell in with them at ten o'clock, and landed them at Palling, more dead than alive, whence, as soon as they could be moved, they were brought to the Yarmouth Sailors' Home, their swollen limbs, benumbed frames, and ghastly countenances testifying to the sufferings they had undergone. At this Home the poor men remained several weeks, receiving every attention from the officers of the establishment.

Dec. 1.—Voted the thanks of the Institution, inscribed on vellum, and 2*l.*, to GEORGE RAY, and 4*l.* to four others, for putting off in a boat and rescuing the crew of 9 men of the barque *Batanga*, of Bristol, which was wrecked on the Hook Sands, Bristol Channel, during a hurricane, on the 4th Nov. last.

Dec. 3.—The brigantine *Countess*, of Ipswich, was wrecked on Sizewell Bank in a gale of wind. The Society's life-boat, stationed at Aldborough, put off with the view of rescuing the crew, but on arriving at the wreck, it was found that the crew had reached the shore in their own boat.—Expense of service, 15*l.* 4*s.*

Dec. 4.—The brig *Tikey*, of Trieste, was wrecked during a strong gale of wind on the Cow and Calf Rocks, Dundrum Bay. The Society's life-boat at Newcastle put off, but found the wreck abandoned; her crew having left her in their own boat, which, on nearing the shore, was capsize, and 6 out of 15 of her crew perished.—Expense of service, 4*l.* 9*s.*

Dec. 4.—The steamer *Cygnets*, of Cardigan, was stranded during stormy weather on Bideford Bar. The life-boat belonging to this Institution put off, but the crew would not leave their vessel, and she fortunately got off the bar with the next tide.—Expense of service, 4*l.* 15*s.*

Dec. 5.—The sloop *Barbara*, from Amlwch to

Liverpool, was wrecked on Salthouse Bank, Lytham, during a gale of wind. The Institution's life-boat at Lytham put off, but found the vessel deserted, her crew having reached the land, after four hours' exposure, in their own boat.—Expense of service, 6*l.* 10*s.*

Dec. 10.—The brig *Henry Morton*, of Sunderland, was wrecked in rough weather, on the south end of Blackwater Bank. The Society's life-boat, at Cahore, put off and took the captain and 3 of the crew from the Blackwater light-ship, which they had reached in one of the ship's boats. The captain's wife and child and the remainder of the crew, in all 17 persons, reached the shore in two of the wreck's boats.—Expense of service, 13*l.* 8*s.*

Dec. 11.—The ship *Sonmouth*, of Liverpool, was wrecked, during hazy weather, on the south end of Blackwater Bank. The Society's life-boat, at Cahore, put off and took the captain and 3 of the crew from the Blackwater light-ship, which they had reached in one of the ship's boats. The captain's wife and child and the remainder of the crew, in all 17 persons, reached the shore in two of the wreck's boats.—Expense of service, 13*l.* 8*s.*

Dec. 13.—The sloop *Sybil*, of Goole, was wrecked, during snow squalls, off Thorpness. The Thorpness life-boat put off, and rescued the crew of 3 men.—Expense of service paid by owners.

Dec. 17.—The schooner *Olive Branch*, of Colchester, was wrecked, in a heavy surf, on the Brig Rocks, Filey. The Institution's life-boat at Filey put off, and towed the ship's boat, with the crew of 7 men, safely to land.—Expense of service, 13*l.* 18*s.*

Dec. 21.—The Aldborough life-boat put off, during a strong gale of wind from S.W., with the view of rendering assistance to the brig *Unity*, of Whitby, which was in distress off that place, but her services were not required. The life-boat herself was unfortunately upset, and 3 of her crew perished from the extreme cold, the ground being covered with snow at the time.—Reward, 31*l.* 15*s.*, and 75*l.* to the widows of the poor men who perished on the occasion.

Dec. 21.—The brigantine *Hannah Jane*, of London, was stranded on the Horse Bank, Lytham, during a violent gale of wind. The Institution's life-boat at Lytham put off, and rescued the crew of 7 men.—Expense of service, 7*l.*

Dec. 30.—The ship *Britannia*, of Bath, United States, was stranded about 4 miles off Barmouth during a gale of wind. The Institution's life-boat put off, and succeeded in rescuing 13 men of the crew and 1 woman.—Expense of service, 12*l.* 2*s.* 6*d.*

THIS Medal appears to have been one of the *chef d'œuvres* of the late eminent engraver, WM. WYON, Esq., R.A. The bust of GEORGE THE FOURTH is the best of all the good heads of this Sovereign that have been engraved by Mr. WYON; it combines, with great dignity, a peculiar animation and benevolence of expression, in character with the nature of the Institution of which His Majesty was the first Patron, and in the formation of which His Majesty and other members of the Royal Family took considerable interest.

The Reverse, representing the Life-boat, in which there are three Sailors, rescuing a fourth from the sea, is a work of superlative merit. Two of the Sailors are steadying the boat, while the other, stooping, draws in the Shipwrecked Sailor, whose figure is given so as to show the form in the most natural and beautiful manner; and the expression thrown into his countenance looking up to his preserver is unrivalled by anything that we have ever seen, while the easy flowing lines of this sailor are finely contrasted by those of his companions: the whole displaying the most perfect knowledge of the human frame, the finest taste to arrange it, and a command of the graver to embody to us what the artist's bright genius had shadowed out to himself.

But there is another pleasing motive for our admiration of this beautiful Medal, as the figure who is so humanely extending his relief to the drowning Mariner is a portrait of the Artist himself.

The following is a LIST of the GOLD and SILVER MEDALS that have been voted by the Committee of this Institution, since its establishment in 1824, to persons whose humane and intrepid exertions in saving Lives from Shipwreck have been deemed sufficiently conspicuous to merit that honourable distinction. The Cases will be found recorded in detail in the several Annual Reports of the Institution.

ROYAL NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION,

For the Preservation of Life from Shipwreck.

THE object of this Institution, as declared in its title, is to afford assistance to every Shipwrecked Person around the coasts of the United Kingdom.

The chief means by which it hopes to carry this object into effect are—

By the establishment of efficient Life-boats on the points of the coast most exposed to Shipwreck, and organizing and training Crews ready to man the boats at all times, in case of wreck.

By granting Pecuniary Rewards to persons who go off in Life-boats, or otherwise assist in saving life from wreck; and by conferring Honorary Gold and Silver Medals for distinguished gallantry in such service.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1. The Institution shall consist of a Patron and Vice-Patrons, President, Vice-Presidents, and Governors; Committee of Management, Sub-Committees, Treasurer, Trustees, Auditors, Secretary, and Inspector.

2. Donors of ten guineas at one time are entitled to be Life-Governors of the Institution, and Subscribers of one guinea annually to be Governors during the period of their subscriptions; each of these will be entitled at a General Meeting to . . . 1 Vote.

Donors of twenty guineas, or subscribers of two guineas annually, to have each . . . 2 Votes.

Donors of thirty guineas, or Subscribers of three guineas annually, each . . . 3 Votes.

Donors of fifty guineas, or Subscribers of five guineas annually, each . . . 4 Votes.

Donors of one hundred guineas, or Subscribers of ten guineas annually, each . . . 6 Votes.

Donors of twenty-five guineas, or upwards, to be eligible to be elected Vice-Presidents.

All annual subscriptions, whenever paid, shall be deemed subscriptions for the then current year, ending on the 31st December next.

3. The affairs of the Institution shall be administered by a General Committee of Management, to consist of not less than ten Governors, who shall elect their own Chairman and Deputy-Chairman. The President and Vice-Presidents shall be ex-officio members of the Committee, and take the chair when present.

4. Three members of the Committee to be a quorum, except on all questions involving an outlay exceeding one hundred pounds, when the quorum shall be five. All questions in Committees to be determined by the majority of members present, including the Chairman; and in the case of the members dividing equally, the Chairman to have the casting vote.

5. The Committee of Management shall meet from time to time at least once in every month, to receive and consider the Reports of the Sub-Committees, and if sanctioned, to give the necessary instructions for their recommendations being carried into effect, as well as for conducting the general affairs of the Institution.

6. The Committee, at any meeting at which five members may be present, or any twenty Governors of the Institution, shall have power to call an extraordinary General Meeting, on giving fourteen days' notice to the Secretary, and in three of the public papers, stating the object for which it is convened.

7. The Committee to have power to make regulations for their own government. All the officers of the Institution to be appointed by them, to receive their instructions from them, and hold their situations at their pleasure.

8. Drafts upon the Treasurer or Bankers to be signed, and all bills from the country to be accepted, by two members of the Committee, or any two of the Trustees of the Institution, such drafts to be countersigned by the Secretary.

9. All investments in the public funds to be made in the names of three Trustees, and all Exchequer bills which may be purchased shall be deposited at the Bankers', subject to the control of two members of Committee, one of whom to be a Trustee.

10. Whenever it shall appear that the balance at the Bankers' exceeds the sum of 300L., unless there is likely to be some immediate call for it, such excess shall be invested in Government securities. *The Bankers' book shall be laid upon the table at each meeting of Committee, and the balance reported and entered in the Minutes.* No debts to be contracted, or payments made,

exceeding 5l. but by the authority of the Committee.

11. The Committee of Management shall have power to fill up all vacancies that may occur by death or resignation, or to add to their number by the election of any new member whom they may deem eligible, such election to take place at the meeting next after that at which he may have been proposed.

12. The Committee shall keep a full record of all its transactions and proceedings. It shall be the duty of the Secretary to keep a minute-book of the meetings of the General Committee and of the Sub-Committees, a précis-book, a letter-book, a list of subscribers, and the accounts of the Institution.

13. The Committee shall convene a General Meeting of the Subscribers to the Institution on the 4th day of March, or as soon after as may be convenient, in each year, and shall lay before such meeting (in all cases in which the Institution

has voted a reward) a statement of the number of persons who may have been saved from shipwreck, with the names of the vessels to which they belonged; also a list of the names of all persons to whom medals or rewards may have been voted, with the particulars of the services they rendered.

The names, also, and circumstances of any persons who may have unfortunately perished in an attempt to save the lives of others, with the particulars of the assistance afforded to their wives and families. Also an account of the receipts, disbursements, and funds of the Institution for the past year, Audited by a Public Accountant.

Also a return of all the life-boats belonging to, or established by, or in connexion with, the Institution, their actual state and condition, and that of the boat-houses, carriages, and stores appertaining to them.

14. The rules of the Institution not to be changed, except by the resolution of a General Meeting specially convened, confirmed by a subsequent extraordinary or Annual General Meeting.

FORM OF BEQUEST OF MONEY, STOCK, OR OTHER PERSONAL ESTATE.
