At the Annual General Meeting of the NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION, held at the London Tavern on Thursday the 21st day of March, 1861, Vice-Admiral the Right Honourable the Earl of HARDWICKE in the Chair,

The following Report of the Committee was read:—

ANNUAL REPORT.

FOR several successive years the Committee of the ROYAL NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION have, happily, been able to report its steady progress, and its advancement in public favour. Year by year the field of its operations has extended—its life-saving fleet has been added to—and the greater in proportion to the number of wrecks on our coasts have been the number of lives that have been saved from premature death through its instrumentality.

For the continued success by which their efforts have been crowned the Committee desire to acknowledge their deep gratitude to the Almighty; and they tender their thanks to those persons whose liberality has supplied them with the means that have been instrumental in effecting the same.

The most important fact in the history of the Institution during the past year is, that of its incorporation by Royal Charter, which, in their last Annual Report, the Committee intimated it was proposed to obtain. By that important document the Institution now stands on a solid and enduring basis: it has assumed a greater national importance; and it will reap other contingent advantages, such, for instance, as that of being legally entitled, by the bequests of deceased persons, to possess landed property to the extent of 2,000*l.* per annum. For

the gratuitous preparation of the draft of the Charter of Incorporation the Institution is indebted to Messrs. CLAYTON and SON, of Lancaster Place, Strand, its Honorary Solicitors, to whom the Committee tender their best thanks.

Another important and interesting characteristic of the past year is, that no less than *fourteen* new life-boats have been presented to the Institution during that period by philanthropic individuals.

A detailed list of those noble gifts is given in the Financial Statement, but the Committee cannot refrain from alluding to one of them of an especially interesting character, it being a presentation by two English ladies, in memory of a departed sister. This life-boat, which is stationed at Llandudno, in North Wales, has been appropriately named at their request the *Sisters' Memorial*.

The Committee have the satisfaction to state, that HER MAJESTY THE QUEEN, who since 1837 has been the kind Patronsess of the Society, has, in appreciation of the important and national character of the work of the Institution, become an Annual Subscriber of 50*l.* to its funds.

The proceedings of the Institution during the past year will be related under the several heads, as follows:—

Life-boats.—During the past year the In-

stitution has placed 17 new life-boats on the coast, viz. : at Thurso, Buckie, Banff, and North Berwick, in Scotland. At Newbiggin, Winterton, Walmer, Dungeness, Brooke, and Grange (Isle of Wight); Newquay, Penarth, Porthcawl, Llandudno, and Silloth, in England and Wales; and at Portrush and Tyrella, in Ireland.

Others are in course of construction for Tynemouth, Whitby, Selsey, St. Ives, Llanddwyn, Southport, Irvine, and Campbelltown.

The Institution's life-saving fleet now consists of no less than 110 life-boats, nearly the whole of which are comparatively new, 100 of them having been built within the past ten years, all are in good repair, and in readiness for instantaneous service.

The life-boats of the Institution have undergone their usual periodical exercise, often in the roughest surfs; and they continue to maintain their high character for safety and efficiency.

With the exception of those on the coasts of Norfolk and Suffolk, and one or two others, they have all been inspected and taken afloat by the Inspector of the Society, Captain WARD, R.N., during the past twelve months.

They have in the same period been directly instrumental in saving *two hundred and ten lives* from thirty-four shipwrecks, and have, on forty-six other occasions, gone off to vessels in apparent danger, or which have shown signals of distress, but which have ultimately got out of danger, or whose crews have not needed to be taken off. The whole of these valuable services have been performed without the loss of a single life amongst those who have manned them. On numerous other occasions the crews of life-boats have assembled in stormy weather and kept watch during the night when disasters have been expected.

Although not strictly within the limit of this Report, which extends only to the termination of the year 1860, the Committee feel that it will be gratifying to the supporters of the Institution to know, that since the 1st of January last, the life-boats of the Society have saved no fewer than *one hundred and sixty-two persons*, seventy-eight of which

number were rescued during the destructive gale of the 9th and 10th of February. Nineteen of these were saved by the Carnsore life-boat from the barque *Guyana*, of Glasgow. The cost (300*l.*) of this life-boat and transporting-carriage was presented to the Institution as a Thank-offering, by a lady whose life was saved from drowning by H. A. HAMILTON, Esq., of Balbriggan, on board whose yacht she was when the accident happened.

Life-boat Carriages.—New life-boat carriages have been built during the past year for the life-boats at Thurso, Buckie, Banff, North Berwick, Saltburn, Filey, Winterton, Walmer, Brooke, Grange, Newquay, Penarth, Llandudno, Dungeness, Portrush, and Tyrella. Others are in course of construction for various stations.

Boathouses.—New boat-houses have been erected during the past twelve months at Ayr, Thurso, Buckie, Banff, St. Andrew's, North Berwick, Saltburn, Brooke, Grange, Newquay, Penarth, Porthcawl, Llandudno, Silloth, Portrush, and Tyrella.

Barometers.—The Committee have taken steps to provide the life-boat stations of the Institution, wherever desirable, with standard Barometers, properly fitted up, and the daily indications of which will be registered on a chart or diagram by the side of the instrument. It seems probable that with such powers placed in their hands, the calamities now endured by our fishermen and coasters may, in many instances, be avoided. A good Barometer in a public situation may warn them in time what weather to expect; and they may thus be frequently able to avoid exposing themselves to the terrible consequences of storms, so often at present proving fatal to them. The Committee have received much valuable assistance from Rear-Admiral FITZ-ROY, F.R.S., and JAMES GLAISHER, Esq., F.R.S., of the Royal Observatory, Greenwich, in carrying out this important undertaking. Mr. GLAISHER kindly verifies, by the Greenwich standard, each Barometer supplied to the Institution, which greatly enhances the value of the instrument, and

makes it the standard of the neighbourhood in which it is situated.

Shipwrecks and Loss of Life.—Notwithstanding the almost unparalleled stormy character of the year 1860, the number of shipwrecks attended with loss of life was considerably below the average, and, happily, there was no wholesale sacrifice of human life as in the cases of the *Pomona* and *Royal Charter* in the previous year, when upwards of 800 persons perished from these two ships alone. The total number of wrecks on the coasts of the United Kingdom during the year 1860 was 1379; the average of the last seven years being 1184, whilst the total loss of lives in 1860 was 536, the average for the last seven years being 800.

On the contemplation of so great a sacrifice of human life the thought will arise, Are there no means available, hitherto untried, which might lessen its amount in future years?—Is the country doing its duty to that part of its seafaring population who man our merchant ships, and especially those in our coasting trade?—If these questions cannot be replied to as satisfactorily as could be wished, it is yet to be hoped that the yearly increasing amount of property and number of human lives that are hazarded in our commercial world, will impress on the country generally the importance of the most energetic and systematic efforts being made to reduce the amount of loss, both of life and property, to the smallest practicable limit.

The number of lives saved during the year 1860, as shown by the official returns of the Board of Trade, is as follows:—

Those saved by life-boats have all been rescued under perilous circumstances, and when, in nearly all such cases, they could have been saved by no other means. One example of such services may here be mentioned:—

A few months ago it blew a heavy gale off

Lyme Regis. About eight o'clock at night the alarm was given that a vessel was in distress in the offing. It was pitchy dark; indeed the intense darkness, the strong gale, and the heavy surf on shore, were enough, said the Mayor of the town, to appal any men entering the life-boat. After some short delay, however, the boat was manned by a gallant crew—her coxswain, THOMAS BRADLEY, being early at his post. Tar-barrels were lighted up on shore, and the boat proceeded on her mission of mercy. So truly awful was the night, that nearly every one on shore believed she would never return again. However, after battling with the fury of the storm, and after an absence of about an hour and a half, the life-boat did return, laden with the shipwrecked crew of three men of the smack *Elizabeth Ann* of Lyme Regis. The inhabitants of the town were perfectly amazed at the life-boat's performances, and the daring behaviour of her skilful coxswain and crew.

The total number of persons saved from shipwreck from the establishment of the Institution in 1824 to the end of the year 1860, either by its life-boats, or for which it has granted rewards, is as follows:—

Rewards.—A summary of the cases in which honorary and pecuniary rewards have been voted by the Institution during the past year for saving, or attempting to save, life, will be found in the Appendix to this Report. The total in number and amount is as follows:—16 silver medals, 14 votes of thanks inscribed on vellum, and the sum of 1,111*l.* 12*s.* 4*d.* in pecuniary rewards. Great care has been, as usual, bestowed by the Committee in the investigation of the merits of every case of application for reward for saving life from wrecks. In that important work they have continued to receive the prompt and cordial co-operation of the Commodore Comptroller-General, the late and present Deputy Comptrollers-General, and of the officers of the Coast-guard service. The scale or amount of reward is, as a general rule, made proportionate to the amount of personal risk and exposure incurred by the parties performing the service.

The Committee desire also to acknowledge the valuable assistance received by the Institution from the Mercantile Marine Fund, through Her Majesty's Board of Trade, which enables the Institution to make more liberal pecuniary rewards and payments to its life-boat crews than its means would otherwise allow.

The Committee have reason to know that the best effects are produced by the rewards given by the Institution. Its medals and other honorary awards are much coveted by the coast boatmen and men of the Coast-guard service, and the amount and prompt payment of its pecuniary rewards afford general satisfaction. Its medals are not unfrequently presented at public meetings.

The operations of the Committee may be thus briefly stated:—Since the formation of the Institution it has expended on life-boat establishments 46,350*l.* 8*s.* 3*d.*, and has voted 82 gold and 666 silver medals for distinguished services for saving life, besides pecuniary awards, amounting together to 14,016*l.*

Local Committees.—The Committee desire to acknowledge the cordial co-operation of the local Branch Committees, which constitute so important a portion of the machinery for the supervision of the several

life-boat establishments of the Institution. They have likewise especially to express their sense of the valuable and gratuitous services of the Honorary Secretaries of those Committees, who conduct the correspondence with the central managing body.

Finances.—The total receipts during the year 1860 amounted to 14,027*l.* 11*s.* 2*d.*: of this sum no less than 2,721*l.* was given by individuals to defray the cost of fourteen life-boats as follows:—

The Committee have likewise to express their thanks to Mrs. HARTLEY, of York House, Bideford, for her zealous exertions in collecting this year, in addition to the sum above named, 100*l.* towards the cost of the Tynemouth life-boat establishment.

The following very liberal contributions have also been received during the year: H. S. C., in memory of a deceased husband, 100*l.*, and 50*l.* for barometers for life-boat stations; Mrs. BLYTH, 105*l.*; Mrs. SLATER, 100*l.*; Sir J. W. The following legacies have likewise been left to the Institution since the last Report: Miss E. S. B. PALMER, of St. Ann's Gardens, St. John's Wood, 50*l.*; THOMAS FISHER HEMINGTON, Esq., of Uplyme, Devon, 100*l.*; Captain BOWERBANK, R.N., 100*l.*; Miss ANNA BRAITHWAITE, of Kendal, 10*l.*;

Mrs. ANN E. BARBER, of Warwick, 50*l.*; and J. R. JUDKIN, Esq., of Hackney, 105*l.*

The expenditure during the same period was 13,085*l.* 8*s.* 11*d.*, of which sum 6,834*l.* 17*s.* 4*d.*, were expended on additional life-boats, transporting-carriages, boat-houses, and necessary gear; and 3,056*l.* 3*s.* on the necessary expenses of repairs, painting, refitting, and inspection; 1,266*l.* 15*s.* 10*d.* in payment of services to shipwrecked crews; and 1,664*l.* 10*s.* 2*d.* (including what was paid by the local Branch funds) on coxswains' salaries, and for the quarterly practice of the boats' crews.

For a considerable saving in the item of transport to their stations, of new life-boats and carriages, the Committee have to express their thanks to the several Railway and Steam Packet Companies, who have most liberally conveyed them to all parts of the United Kingdom, almost without exception, free of charge.

The items of receipt and expenditure are detailed in the financial statement annexed to this Report, from which it will also be seen, that the Committee have incurred further liabilities amounting to 4,419*l.* for various life-boat establishments, &c.

Whilst the Committee are, happily, able to report so favourable and encouraging a state of the financial department of the Institution, they feel that, looking at the vicissitudes of the future, and the unforeseen magnitude which the operations of the Society have assumed, they must not for a moment relax their endeavours to enlist that co-operation and pecuniary assistance of all classes of their countrymen, which can alone secure the permanent efficiency of the important work which they have undertaken to superintend. They therefore appeal to the country at large to assist them to maintain, in a state of thorough efficiency, their numerous life-boat establishments.

LIST OF THE REWARDS
 VOTED BY THE ROYAL NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION,
 FROM THE 1ST JANUARY TO THE 31ST DECEMBER, 1860.

Jan. 5, 1860.—Voted the thanks of the Institution, inscribed on vellum, and 1*l.* to SAMUEL DUNN, in acknowledgment of his intrepid and prompt services in rescuing, at considerable risk of life, 4 persons from a bathing-machine, which had become overwhelmed by the flowing tide off Hunstanton, on the Norfolk coast, on the 22nd Sept., 1859.

The barque *Batanga*, of Bristol, was wrecked on the Hook Sands, off Clevedon, near Bristol, on the 12th Oct., 1859. Three fishermen rendered assistance, at some risk of life, to the crew.—Reward, 3*l.*

Voted the Second Service Clasp to Mr. W. H. TREGIDGO, and 8*l.* 5*s.* to his 2 boats' crews, for putting off and rescuing 2 crews, consisting of 11 men,

from the schooner *Union*, of Vannes, and lugger *Anais*, of St. Vaast, which were wrecked during a gale of wind off New Quay, Cornwall, on the 26th Oct., 1859.

Also the Silver Medal and 1*l.* to Mr. JOHN DYER, in acknowledgment of his gallant services in wading into the surf at the peril of his life, and rescuing the master of the schooner *Beverley*, of Goole, which, during a heavy gale of wind, was wrecked under Upton Cliff, near Bude, on the 26th Oct., 1859.

The brig *Golden Grove*, of South Shields, was wrecked on the Holm Sand, Suffolk, during a heavy gale of wind, on the 28th Oct., 1859. A Pakefield yawl put off and rescued, at some risk of life, the crew of 7 men.—Reward, 9*l.* 10*s.*

The French schooner *Amphitrite*, of Dunkirque, was wrecked off Fendower Beach, Falmouth, on the 1st Nov., 1859, during a gale of wind. A boat, manned by 6 men, put off and rescued the crew of 7 men.—Reward, 6*l*.

Voted the Silver Medal of the Institution to C. R. M. TALBOR, Esq., M.P., and Mr. JOHN WILLIAMS, farmer, and 3*l*. to 4 others, in acknowledgment of their intrepid services in wading into the surf, and rescuing some of the crew of the barque *Sunda*, of Jersey, which, during a gale of wind, was wrecked on Cenfig Sands, Porthcawl, on the 2nd Nov., 1859. Mr. TALBOR and Mr. WILLIAMS had very courageously exerted themselves on the occasion, by wading into the surf to the rescue of some of the crew.

The schooner *Ferona*, of Exeter, was wrecked, during a heavy gale of wind, in Yarmouth Roads, on the 5th Nov., 1859. The Institution's small surf life-boat at Yarmouth put off and rescued the crew of 5 men.—Expense of service, 9*l*.

A fishing-boat was upset off Hillswick, Shetland, on the 11th Nov., 1859. Four men put off in a boat and rendered assistance to the crew at considerable inconvenience.—Reward, 2*l*.

The schooner *Ardent*, of Belfast, was wrecked, during cloudy weather and in a heavy surf, off Maryport Pier on the 18th Nov., 1859. A shore-boat, manned by 6 men, put off and rescued the schooner's crew of 16 men.—Reward, 6*l*.

The sloop *Spread Eagle's* boat was capsized on the Dutchman's Bank, Beaumaris Bay, during stormy weather, on the 4th Dec., 1859. Two men put off in a boat and rendered assistance to the crew.—Reward, 1*l*. 10*s*.

Voted the Silver Medal of the Institution to THOMAS BAKER, and the thanks of the Committee, inscribed on vellum, to 6 other men, for their services in rescuing 4 out of 6 of the crew of the schooner *Sentinel*, of Carnarvon, which was wrecked at the back of the Isle of Wight on the 4th Dec. last. Each man had also locally received a money reward. The Institution also presented its thanks to the Rev. J. PELLEW GAZE and Mr. THOMAS WAX, for their valuable services in aiding to launch the boat. Mr. GAZE, whose thanks were inscribed upon vellum, had waded into the surf up to his waist to render assistance in launching the boat on the occasion.

Also the Silver Medal of the Institution and 1*l*. to HENRY BOYD, and 5*l*. to 5 other men, for putting off in a fishing-boat, and rescuing, after three attempts, the crew of 8 men of the brigantine *Water Lily*, of Dublin, which was, in moderate weather but heavy surf, wrecked in Dundrum Bay on the 9th Dec., 1859.

The Lytham life-boat had put off and rescued the crew of 6 men of the brigantine *Robert and Henry*, of Dundalk, which was wrecked on the Horse Bank, during foggy weather, on the 13th Dec., 1859. The life-boat's crew received salvage for that important service.

Voted the Silver Medal to Captain G. A. E. RIDGE, R.N., Inspecting-Commander of the Coast-guard, for wading into the surf, at the risk of his life, to the rescue of one man belonging to a boat manned by 12 persons, who had put off with the

view of rendering assistance to a capsized boat, containing the crew of the Austrian brig *Tikey*, of Trieste, which was wrecked off St. John's Point, Dundrum Bay, on the 14th Dec., 1859.—Reward, 7*l*. 10*s*.

The galliott *Anna*, of Delfzel, was wrecked, during a severe hail-storm off West Scars, Robin Hood's Bay, on the 14th Dec., 1859. Two boats put off, manned by 10 men, and rendered assistance to the vessel's crew.—Reward, 5*l*. to the 10 men, who had also received rewards locally.

The brigantine *Eagle*, of Goole, was wrecked, during hazy weather, off Douglas, Isle of Man, on the 21st Dec., 1859. Four men put off in a boat and saved the master, his wife, and 4 of the crew.—Reward, 4*l*.

Jan. 1.—A brig was observed to be in distress, during hazy weather, on the Whiting Sands, Orford Haven. A boat, manned by 9 men, put off, at risk of life, with the view of saving the crew, who were, however, saved by a fishing-smack before the arrival of the shore-boat.—Reward to boat's crew, 9*l*.

Jan. 24.—The brig *Pallas*, of Shields, was wrecked, during a heavy gale of wind, on Sizewell Bank, Suffolk. The Institution's life-boat at Thorpeness put off and saved 3 out of 7 of the crew.—Expense of service, 6*l*. 6*s*.

Jan. 24.—The schooner *Ann*, of London, was wrecked, during a gale of wind, on the Cutler Sand, Woodbridge. A shore-boat, manned by 7 men, put off with the view of saving the crew; they had, however, been previously rescued by a passing schooner.—Reward, 3*l*. 10*s*.

Jan. 28.—The smack *Dove*, of Seaton, was wrecked, during stormy weather, in Withorn Bay. A shore-boat put off and rescued the crew of 2 men.—Reward, 2*l*. 10*s*. to the boat's crew.

Feb. 2.—Voted the Second Service Clasp and 1*l*. to DANIEL SHEA, chief boatman of the Coast-guard, and coxswain of the Padstow life-boat; the thanks of the Institution to Mr. W. H. TREGINGO, chief officer of Coast-guard at Newquay, and 1*l*. to JOSEPH KNIGHT, for their services, in assisting, with others, to land the crew of the ship *James Alexander*, of Liverpool, which was wrecked off Padstow during a very heavy gale of wind on the 22nd Jan.

Also the Silver Medal of the Institution to Captain WASEY, R.N., Inspecting-Commander of the Coast-guard, and JOHN FOX, chief boatman of Coast-guard, coxswain of the life-boat, and 27*l*. 2*s*. 6*d*. to pay the expenses of the Fleetwood life-boat in putting off and rescuing, after several attempts, one man of the crew of the schooner *Ann Mitchell*, of Montrose, which was totally wrecked, during a heavy gale of wind off Fleetwood, on the night of the 22nd Jan.

Also 5*l*. to pay the expenses of the same life-boat in putting off and rescuing, after three attempts, the crew of 6 men of the schooner *Jane Roper*, of Ulverstone, which had sunk off Fleetwood during a gale of wind on the 23rd Jan.

The ship *Ann Mitchell*, of Glasgow, was totally wrecked on the 30th Jan., during foggy weather, and in a very heavy sea, on Arklow Banks. The Institution's life-boat at Arklow put off and suc-

ceeded in rescuing 9 of the vessel's crew, and putting them on board the steamer *Ruby*, which took them to Bristol. Captain HENDERSON, master of the *Ruby*, had previously exerted himself very laudably in saving some of the shipwrecked crew. Voted the thanks of the Institution, inscribed on vellum, to Captain HENDERSON, and 8*l.* to pay the expenses of the life-boat.

Also 53*l.* 9*s.* 9*d.* to pay the expenses of the Portmadoc, Llanddwyn, Barmouth, Newbiggin, and Carnsore life-boats, for putting off with the view of rendering assistance to vessels which had signals of distress flying or were supposed to be in distress.

Feb. 9.—A fishing-boat was wrecked off Innishowen Head, Co. Donegal during squally weather. A boat put off and rescued 4 out of 5 of the crew.—Reward, 1*l.*

Feb. 19.—The barque *Niagara*, of Shields, was driven on shore about 2 miles north of Ayr Harbour, during a strong gale of wind. The Institution's life-boat, stationed at Ayr, put off and rescued the crew of 12 men.—Expense of service, 22*l.* 9*s.* 6*d.*

Feb. 20.—A barge was observed to be in distress off Teignmouth, Devon. The life-boat of the Institution at that place put off and saved the crew of 2 men and the barge.—Expense of service, 6*l.* 1*s.* 6*d.*

Feb. 28.—The brig *Zephyr*, of Whitby, was totally wrecked, during a heavy gale of wind, on the Scroby Sands. The Yarmouth large life-boat of the Institution put off and saved, at much risk of life, the crew of 6 men.—Expense of service, 3*l.*

Feb. 28.—The brig *George and James*, of London, grounded, during a very heavy gale of wind, off Winterton, Norfolk. The Institution's life-boat, stationed at Winterton, put off and rescued the crew of 8 men.—Expense of service, 10*l.* 3*s.*

March 1.—Voted the Second Service Clasp to Captain WASSER, R.N., and 4*l.* 14*s.* to pay the expenses of the Fleetwood life-boat, belonging to the Institution, for putting off and rescuing the crew of 4 men of the schooner *Catherine*, of Newry, which was wrecked off Fleetwood during a gale of wind and heavy snow-squalls, on the 19th Feb. last.

Also the Silver Medal of the Institution to Captain T. DAVIES, R.N., and GEORGE MILLIGAN, coxswain of the life-boat, and 24*l.* to 12 men, for putting off in the Yarmouth surf life-boat, and rescuing, during a heavy gale of wind, 5 men from the smack *John Bull*, of that town, which went on shore on the north side of the harbour on the night of the 17th Feb.

Also 52*l.* 9*s.* to pay the expenses of the Fraasburgh, Wicklow, Cahore, and Holyhead life-boats, for putting off, with the view of rendering assistance to vessels which had either signals of distress flying, or were supposed to be in distress.

March 16.—The schooner *Eliza*, of North Shields, was totally wrecked in a heavy sea, off Palling, Norfolk. The life-boat at that place belonging to the Institution, put off and saved the crew of 7 men.—Expense of service, 17*l.* 2*s.*

April 1.—The barque *Oberon*, of Liverpool, was stranded, during a heavy gale of wind, on the Sara-

Badrig, in Cardigan Bay. The Society's life-boat at Portmadoc put off and rescued the crew of 15 men from one of the vessel's boats, to which they had taken, and in which they were found in a most exhausted condition.—Expense of service, 17*l.*

April 2.—A lighter sank on Arklow Bar, during a gale of wind. A boat, manned by 4 men, put off and rescued her crew of 4 men.—Reward, 2*l.*

April 2.—A fishing-boat was capsized off Overstrand, during squally weather. A boat put off and rescued the crew of 4 men.—Reward, 2*l.* 5*s.*

April 5.—Voted 17*l.* 10*s.* to a boat's crew, for putting off and rescuing Mr. W. W. WALKER, late Hon. Secretary of the Dungarvan Branch of the Institution, and 2 boys, whose boat had been capsized off Dungarvan on the 6th April, owing to one of the boys ascending the boat's mast-head. One of the lads, when rescued, was found insensible, but after having been treated in the salvors' boat on its way to the shore for about twenty minutes, according to the method for "Restoring the Apparently Drowned," issued by this Institution, and based on Dr. MARSHALL HALL's plan, he was happily restored to consciousness.

Also 7*l.* to pay the expenses of the Teignmouth life-boat for putting off, with the view of rendering assistance to the crew of the ship *Caroline*, of Charlestown, U. S., which was totally wrecked in Babbicombe Bay during foggy weather, on the 21st March.

Also 8*l.* to two boats' crews, for putting off and rescuing, at some risk of life, the crew of 4 men of the schooner *Hope*, of Gloucester, which was wrecked off Malin Head Coast-guard station, on the coast of Donegal, on the 27th Jan.

Also 2*l.* to 4 men, for wading into the surf and saving, at some risk of life, the crew of 5 men of the schooner *Cezempra*, of Falmouth, which was wrecked on the back of Bude Breakwater, on the 27th Feb.

Also 2*l.* 10*s.* to 4 men, for putting off in their boat to the assistance of the crew of a fishing-boat which had sunk at the entrance of Arklow River, on the 22nd Jan.

The Cullercoats life-boat had put off in a heavy sea, and safely brought to Tynemouth Haven, the fishing-coble *Honor*, of Cullercoats, and her crew of 3 men, which was in distress off that place, on the 8th March.

April 9.—The brigantine *Naney*, of Teignmouth, sunk on the Horse Bank, Lytham, during a heavy gale of wind. The Institution's life-boat at that place put off and rescued the crew of 9 persons.—Expense of service, 6*l.* 10*s.*

April 17.—The brigantine *Little Joe*, of North Shields, sunk, during a heavy gale of wind, off Kessingland. The life-boat at that place put off and saved the crew of 7 men.—Reward, 5*l.*

April 23.—A fishing-boat was capsized during a heavy gale of wind in Dungarvan Bay. A boat put off and rescued 2 out of 6 of the crew.—Reward, 2*l.* 10*s.*

April 24.—The smack *Winder*, of Teignmouth, sunk, during stormy weather, off that place. The Teignmouth life-boat, belonging to the Institution, put off and saved the crew of 2 men.—Expense of service, 11*l.* 8*s.*

May 8.—A boat was capsized on Gweedore Bar, on the coast of Donegal, during a heavy gale of wind. A boat put off and rescued the crew of 2 men.—Reward, 1*l*.

May 11.—The ship *Calcutta*, of Liverpool, was stranded, during foggy weather, on Arklow Bank. The Institution's life-boat at that place put off and remained by the vessel all night.—Expense of service, 14*l*. 5*s*.

May 28.—The barque *Jane Green*, of Sunderland, was totally wrecked, during a gale of wind, on Gold Gush Stones, north of Hartlepool. The crew of 5 men were saved by some men wading into the surf, at the risk of their lives.—Reward, 1*l*. 15*s*.

May 28.—The brig *Scotia*, of Sunderland, and the sloop *Three Brothers*, of Goole, were wrecked, during a very heavy gale of wind, off Lowestoft. The Lowestoft life-boat, in connection with the Institution, put off and rescued the crews, consisting of 11 men.—Expense of service, 12*l*. 10*s*.

June 2.—The brig *Pike*, of Shoreham, grounded off that harbour, during a strong gale of wind. The life-boat stationed at Shoreham put off and rescued the crew of 9 men.—Reward, 8*l*.

June 2.—The Worthing life-boat put off, during a very heavy gale of wind, with the view of saving the crew of the schooner *Plough*, which was wrecked off Worthing.—Reward, 2*l*. 15*s*.

June 3.—The sloop *Charlotte*, of Woodbridge, was wrecked, during a gale of wind, on the rocks off Whitburn. The Institution's life-boat at that place put off and saved the crew of 5 men.—Expense of service, 7*l*. 7*s*. This life-boat is called *The Thomas Wilson*, after one of the benevolent founders of the NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION, and who was subsequently its indefatigable and respected Chairman for nearly thirty years.

June 7.—Voted 13*l*. 10*s*. 6*d*. to pay the expenses of the Brighton life-boat's crew in assisting to save, by means of the boat's gear, in conjunction with the rocket apparatus, ably worked by the Coast-guard, the crews, consisting of 15 men, of the brigs *Transit*, of Shoreham, and *Atlantique*, of Nantes, which were wrecked off Brighton, during a heavy gale of wind, on the night of the 2nd June. Also voted 10*l*. in aid of local subscriptions for the widow of a poor man who had been unfortunately killed by the wheel of the life-boat carriage passing over his body while he was engaged in aiding to draw the life-boat by her outside lifelines on the above occasion.

Also 7*l*. 16*s*. to pay the expenses of the Yarmouth, Cahore, Rhyll, and Lowestoft life-boats, for putting off with the view of rendering assistance to vessels which were in distress during the gales of May and June.

The Filey life-boat had gone off and safely brought to land the fishing-yawl, *Charles Wesley*, which, with 9 others, had drifted out to sea, during a terrific storm, on the 28th May last.

July 5.—Voted the Silver Medal of the Institution and 1*l*. to Gunner CHARLES LEESE, and 2*l*. to Corporals D. BANNISTER and ALLAN KAY, of the Coast Brigade Royal Artillery, in acknowledgment of their gallant conduct in aiding to rescue the crews of the brig *Annie*, of Shoreham, and schooner

Woodside, of Shields, which were wrecked between Blatchington and Newhaven, on the Sussex coast, during the heavy gale of the 2nd June. The humanity of LEESE had been very conspicuous on the occasion, in saving, at the peril of his life, a lad twelve years of age from a watery grave.

Also the thanks of the Institution to F. R. TOTTELL, Esq., Mayor of Seaford, for his valuable services on the occasion of the before-mentioned wrecks.

The brig *Ann*, of Blyth, was stranded and dismasted on the 11th June, during a gale of wind, at the mouth of the river Alne. The Institution's life-boat at Alnmouth had put off and rescued the crew of 8 men. The crew had only been taken off a few minutes before the wreck's mast fell, fortunately clear of the life-boat. Voted 10*l*. to a poor man named EXLEY, who had been seriously injured by the carriage of the boat passing over him, while engaged in aiding to launch her on the above occasion.—Expense of service, 5*l*. 2*s*.

Also 1*l*. to some men for rescuing 2 men from a boat which was capsized by a heavy sea, on the 8th May, off Gweedore Bar, on the coast of Donegal.

The Newhaven life-boat had gone off on two occasions, and assisted, by putting some of her crew on board, to bring into harbour two vessels in distress off that place, during the heavy gales of the 2nd and 3rd June.

July 29.—CORNELIUS KENNEDY, fisherman of Rutland, County Donegal, rescued, in his curragh, at some risk of life, 2 out of 3 persons whose boat had capsized off Daurus Head, on the coast of Donegal.—Reward, 1*l*.

Aug. 2.—Voted the thanks of the Committee, inscribed on vellum, to Mr. ALEXANDER GOULD, captain-pilot of the port of Aberdeen, in testimony of his highly meritorious and valuable services, in assisting, in the Aberdeen life-boat, and by other means, in saving life from several vessels wrecked off that port during the last three years.

Also a reward of 4*l*. to a boat's crew, for going off and saving, at considerable risk of life, 3 persons from a boat which had been capsized, in a heavy surf, on Thurso Bar, Caithness, on the 2nd April.

Aug. 26.—A boat, manned by 6 men, had gone off, and rescued 2 men from the sloop *Britannia*, of Preston, which had sunk during a gale of wind, between Southport and Formby. The boat was conveyed a distance of four miles on the Southport life-boat carriage, which was at the time engaged in rescuing the crew of the sloop *Hope*.—Reward, 3*l*., and 1*l*. to pay for horse-hire on the occasion.

Aug. 26.—The sloop *Hope*, of Dublin, went to pieces, during a gale of wind, on the Horse Bank, Lytham. The Southport life-boat, in connection with the Institution, had put off and rescued the crew of 3 men.—Expense of service, 7*l*. 10*s*.

Aug. 28.—The schooner *Emily*, of North Shields, was totally wrecked, during a strong gale of wind on the Holm Sand Head. A Pakefield yawl had put off and rescued, after repeated attempts, the crew of 4 men.—Reward, 14*l*.

Sept. 6.—Voted 13*l*. to pay the expenses of the Lyme Regis life-boat, belonging to the Institution,

in putting off a distance of 15 miles to the assistance of the crew of the schooner *Ceres*, of Bridport, which was in distress, during a gale of wind, off Abbotsbury, on the 19th Aug. Some of the life-boat's crew were put on board the vessel, which was afterwards brought safely into Bridport Harbour.

Sept. 19.—The smack *John James*, of Port St. Mary, Isle of Man, stranded in Dundalk Bay, during foggy weather. The Institution's life-boat at Dundalk put off and rendered assistance to the smack.—Expense of service, 5*l.* 7*s.*

Sept. 22.—A boat was capsized off Deal, during squally weather and in a heavy sea. Another boat put off from the shore and saved 1 out of the 4 persons capsized.—Reward, 3*l.*

Oct. 3.—The new life-boat of the Institution, at St. Andrew's, in conjunction with a steam-tug, had gone off and rendered important services to some fishing-boats which were in great distress during a heavy gale. About 15*l.* were collected on the occasion in aid of the life-boat, and the crews of the fishing-boats afterwards forwarded, with expressions of much gratitude, 3*l.* towards its support.

Oct. 4.—The lugger *Diana*, of Deal, had gone off, during a heavy gale of wind, and rescued the crew of 10 men of the brig *Poseidon*, of Arendal, Norway, which was stranded on the south end of the Goodwin Sands, early on the morning of the 25th of Sept. The rigging of the wreck had fouled the mast of the lugger, and had it not been for the promptitude of THOMAS TROTT, in jumping on board the wreck to cut away the gear, the lugger must have been upset.—Voted the Silver Medal to THOMAS TROTT, and a reward of 16*l.* to the lugger's crew.

Oct. 9.—The schooner *Druid*, of Aberystwith, was stranded, during stormy weather, on Bideford Bar. The Appledore life-boat, belonging to the Institution, had put off and saved the crew of 3 men, and 2 hovellers.—Expense of service, 5*l.* 4*s.*

Oct. 15.—The schooner *Letitia*, of Liverpool, was wrecked, during stormy weather, on the south end of the Newcome Sand, Suffolk. A fishing-yawl put off and saved the crew of 5 men.—Reward, 5*l.*

Oct. 18.—A boy was capsized from a boat in Thurso Bay. A man put off in a boat and was the means of saving him with some difficulty.—Reward, 10*s.*

Oct. 19.—A boat was capsized in Bantry Bay, Ireland, during stormy weather. A shore-boat put off and saved 2 out of the 6 persons capsized.—Reward, 3*l.*

Oct. 20.—The Fleetwood life-boat, commanded by Captain WASEY, R.N., and manned by 11 men, had gone off and rescued the crew of 15 men and a pilot from the barque *Vermont*, of Halifax, Nova Scotia, which, during a heavy gale of wind, had stranded on Barnett's Bank, three miles from Fleetwood.—Reward, Third Service Clasp to Captain WASEY, R.N., in acknowledgment of his intrepid conduct on the occasion, and 10*l.* 3*s.* 6*d.* to pay the expenses of the life-boat.

Nov. 1.—Voted 12*l.* to pay the expenses of the Barmouth life-boat in putting off, during a gale of wind, to the assistance of the crew of the

schooner *William Keith*, of Carnarvon, which was observed in a very perilous position on the North Bar at Barmouth, on the 26th Oct. The crew of the schooner declined to leave her, but the master's wife and child were brought on shore in the life-boat. The boat again returned to the vessel, and remained by her until eight o'clock at night.

Also 69*l.* 11*s.* to pay the expenses of the Caister, Fraserburgh, Portmadoc, Tyrella, Silloth, Holyhead, Yarmouth, and Margate life-boats, for putting off with the view of rendering assistance to vessels which were observed to have signals of distress during the gale of the 3rd Oct.

Voted 11*l.* 15*s.* to the crews of the life-boats stationed at Ayr, Boulmer, Seaton Carew, Rye, and Teignmouth, for assembling with the view of going off to the rescue of shipwrecked crews.

Nov. 10.—The schooner *Admiral Hood*, of Rochester, sunk, during thick and stormy weather, on the North Sand, near Yarmouth. The Institution's new surf life-boat at that place put off and saved the crew of 6 men.—Expense of service, 16*l.* 10*s.*

Nov. 10.—The brig *Flying Fish*, of Whitby, was totally wrecked, during a heavy gale of wind, with heavy sea and rain, off the Coast-guard watch-house, Filey. The Institution's life-boat at that place put off and saved the crew of 5 men. This vessel was 77 years old, and the captain, who was also the owner of the brig, had spent 50 years on board of her.—Expense of service, 9*l.* 9*s.*

Nov. 14.—The smack *Elizabeth Ann*, of Lyme Regis, went on shore at the back of the harbour of that place, during a heavy gale of wind. The Mayor of Lyme Regis (ROBERT HILLMAN, Esq.) thus refers to this very gallant service:—"I was summoned to the harbour on Wednesday night by a message from* the coxswain of the life-boat, saying a vessel was in great danger at the back of the harbour's mouth, having failed to make it. On reaching the Cobb I found that it was blowing a perfect gale from the S.W., and so dark that no object could be seen a few yards off. After some difficulty in launching the life-boat, chiefly owing to the intense darkness, and also in procuring a complete crew (for the weather was bad enough to appal any one), the boat went in search of the vessel; and after an absence of about an hour and a half, returned with the crew (3 in number), leaving the vessel in a sinking state, and she subsequently drifted on shore. She proved to be a smack, belonging to this port, laden with culm, and partially disabled by the loss of her boom. The extent of the gale, the heavy sea, and intense darkness, were quite sufficient to deter men from entering the boat; nevertheless the conduct of BRADLEY, the coxswain, and some others of the crew, was most gallant; they would have gone to sea two-thirds manned if we had permitted them, although probably they would have drifted to leeward, and have lost their lives, with the boat, on the rocks, between this and Charmouth. I hope, as the present mayor of the borough, and as hon. secretary of this branch of the ROYAL NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION, I may be permitted to express the gratification the

people here felt at the boat's good success; for the lives of the smack's crew would most probably have been lost but for the aid of the life-boat. This is the second time within the last three or four months that our life-boat has done good service."—Reward, the thanks of the Institution to Captain FORSYTH, R.N., and 22*l.* 10*s.* 10*d.* to pay the expenses of the life-boat.

Nov. 23.—The schooner *Susan and Isabella*, of Dundee, canted her cargo, during a gale of wind, in the Coquet Roads, on the Northumberland coast. The Society's life-boat at Hauxley went off and saved the crew of 5 men.—Expense of service, 10*l.* 18*s.*

Nov. 23.—The schooner *Rose*, of Lynn, went ashore north of Newbiggin during a gale of wind. The Institution's life-boat, stationed at that place, put off and rescued the crew of 3 men.—Expense of service, 14*l.* 4*s.* 6*d.*

Dec. 2.—The brig *Prodroma*, of Stockton, was totally wrecked on the North Gase Sand, during stormy weather. The Institution's life-boat at Middlesboro' put off and rescued the crew of 11 men.—Expense of service, 14*l.*

Dec. 6.—Voted the Second Service Clasp to Captain TUDOR, R.N., in acknowledgment of his intrepid and prompt services in taking command of a ship's boat, manned by 9 men, and saving 2 persons, at much risk of life, from the *Martha*, of Wick, which, during a heavy gale of wind, was wrecked near that place, on the 20th Nov. Captain TUDOR had received, for previous gallant services in a life-boat, the Silver Medal of the Institution.

Also the thanks of the Institution, inscribed on vellum, and 1*l.* to Mr. SAMUEL CLARKE, pilot of Teignmouth, for his general valuable services in the life-boat belonging to the Institution in that

town, and particularly for his prompt and very laudable exertions in assisting to save the crew of a fishing-boat which had capsized on Teignmouth Bar, during squally weather and heavy sea on the 10th Nov.—Reward to the 5 other men who had put off with CLARKE in the boat, 2*l.* 10*s.*

Also 128*l.* 15*s.* 6*d.* to pay the expenses of the Seaton Carew, Palling, Yarmouth, Boulmer, Walmer, Teignmouth, Dungeness, Arklow, Padstow, and Cahore life-boats, for putting off with the view of rendering assistance to vessels which were in distress during the gale of November; but which had either got out of danger, or had their crews saved by other means.

Also 3*l.* to three pilots of Pill, near Bristol, for rescuing, at some risk of life, while out at sea, 3 Frenchmen, belonging to the schooner *Jeune Honoré*, who had fallen overboard with the foremast of their vessel, which had been in collision with an Austrian ship, between Lavernock Point and West Cardiff, on the 14th Oct.

Dec. 16.—The brig *Eliza*, of Middlesborough, was wrecked on the bar of the Tees, during stormy weather and a strong sea. The Institution's life-boat at Seaton Carew put off and saved the crew of 7 men.—Expense of service, 8*l.* 19*s.*

Dec. 20.—The Danish schooner *Freia*, was wrecked, during a gale of wind, on the Dogger Bank, Wexford. The life-boat of the Institution at Rosslare Fort put off, in tow of a steam-tug, and saved the schooner's crew of 6 men.—Expense of service, 7*l.* 5*s.*

Dec. 30.—The brig *Gloucester*, of South Shields, was wrecked, during a gale of wind with sleet, in Filey Bay. The Institution's life-boat at that place went off and saved the crew of 7 men.—Expense of service, 8*l.* 4*s.* 6*d.*

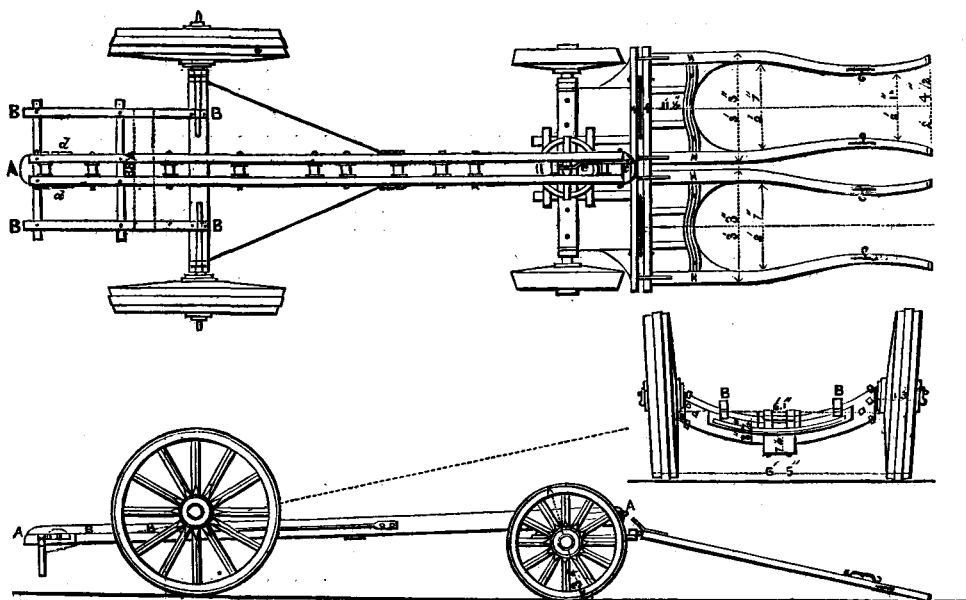

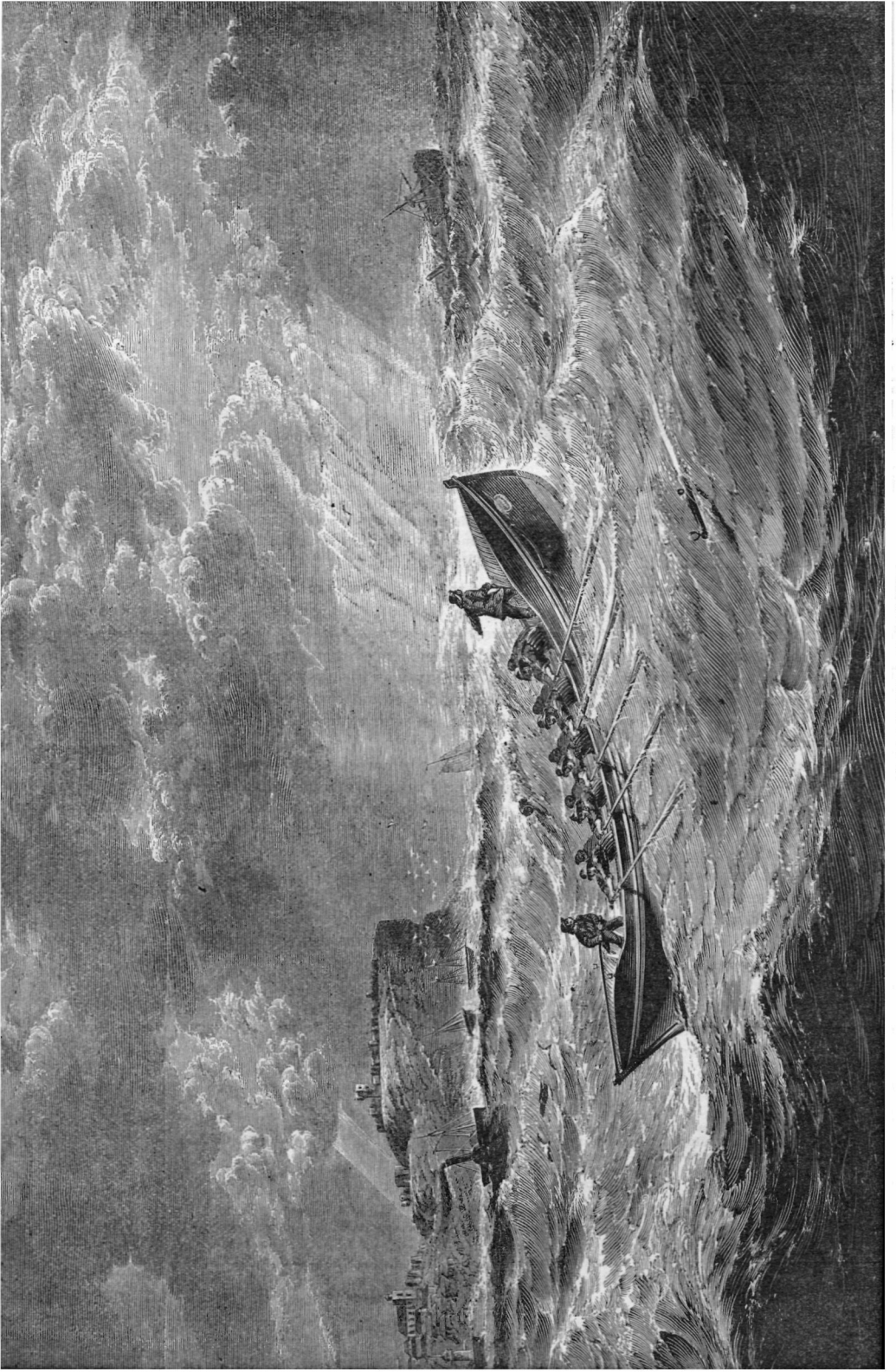
LIFE-BOAT TRANSPORTING-CARRIAGE.



LIFE-BOAT TRANSPORTING-CARRIAGE AS ADOPTED BY THE ROYAL NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION.

THE carriage consists of a fore and main body. The latter is formed of a keelway A, A, and of side or bilgeways B, B, in rear of the main axle, the boat's weight being entirely on the rollers of the keelway. Its leading characteristic is that, on the withdrawal of the long forelock pin C, the fore and main bodies can be detached from each other. The advantages of this arrangement are that the weight of the boat when she is launched from the rear end forms an inclined plane by elevating the keelway, yet without lifting the fore body off the ground, whilst to replace her on the carriage she can be hauled bow foremost up the fore end or longer incline. The bilgeways B, B, are

needed at the rear end, that the boat may be launched in an upright position with her crew on board; but they are not required at the fore end of the carriage. The boat is hauled off the carriage and launched into the sea by a rope at each end of the boat rove through the sheave D, having one end hooked to a self-detaching hook at the boat's stern, and the other manned by a few persons on the shore, who thus haul the boat and her crew off the carriage and launch them afloat at once, with their oars in their hands, by which means head-way may be obtained before the breakers have time to beat the boat broadside on to the beach.

THIS Medal appears to have been one of the *chef d'œuvres* of the late eminent engraver, WM. WYON, Esq., R.A. The bust of GEORGE THE FOURTH is the best of all the good heads of this Sovereign that have been engraved by Mr. WYON; it combines, with great dignity, a peculiar animation and benevolence of expression, in character with the nature of the Institution of which His Majesty was the first Patron, and in the formation of which His Majesty and other members of the Royal Family took considerable interest.

The Reverse, representing the Life-boat, in which there are three Sailors, rescuing a fourth from the sea, is a work of superlative merit. Two of the Sailors are steadying the boat, while the other, stooping, draws in the Shipwrecked Sailor, whose figure is given so as to show the form in the most natural and beautiful manner; and the expression thrown into his countenance looking up to his preserver is unrivalled by anything that we have ever seen, while the easy flowing lines of this sailor are finely contrasted by those of his companions: the whole displaying the most perfect knowledge of the human frame, the finest taste to arrange it, and a command of the graver to embody to us what the artist's bright genius had shadowed out to himself.

But there is another pleasing motive for our admiration of this beautiful Medal, as the figure who is so humanely extending his relief to the drowning Mariner is a portrait of the Artist himself.

The following is a LIST of the GOLD and SILVER MEDALS that have been voted by the Committee of this Institution, since its establishment in 1824, to persons whose humane and intrepid exertions in saving Life from Shipwreck have been deemed sufficiently conspicuous to merit that honourable distinction. The Cases will be found recorded in detail in the several Annual Reports of the Institution.

For the Preservation of Life from Shipwreck.

Charter of Incorporation.

Victoria, by the grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Queen, Defender of the Faith, To all to whom these Presents shall come Greeting.

Whereas the late SIR WILLIAM HILLARY, Baronet; the late MR. THOMAS WILSON, Member of Parliament, and others of Our loving subjects, did, in the year 1824, establish a Society by the name of "THE ROYAL NATIONAL INSTITUTION FOR THE PRESERVATION OF LIFE FROM SHIPWRECK," and which title was altered in 1854, and the said Society is now designated "THE ROYAL NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION, for the Preservation of Life from Shipwreck," and of which Society We have become Patron.

And whereas it has been represented to Us, that the same Society has since its establishment sedulously pursued such its proposed object by establishing efficient Life-boats on the points of the Coasts of the United Kingdom most exposed to Shipwreck, and organizing and training crews ready to man the Boats at all times in case of Wreck, and by granting pecuniary Rewards to the persons who man the Life-boats or otherwise assist in saving life from Shipwreck, and by conferring Honorary Gold and Silver Medals for distinguished Gallantry in such service.

And whereas the same Society is supported by Annual Subscriptions and Donations, and other Contributions to its Funds, and has a funded property of £14,114. 1s. 7d. £3 per Cent. Reduced Bank Annuities.

And whereas in order to secure the property of the said Society, to extend its operations, and to place it on a more permanent basis, We have been besought to grant to ALGERNON PERCY DUKE OF NORTHUMBERLAND, Knight of the most Noble Order of the Garter, and a Vice-Admiral in Our Royal Navy, President; The Vice-Chancellor SIR WILLIAM PAGE WOOD, Knight, Vice-President; THOMAS BARING, Member of Parliament, Chairman; THOMAS CHAPMAN, Deputy-Chairman; SIR EDWARD GEORGE LAMBERT PERROTT, Baronet; JOHN BUNCE BONNEMAISON M'HARDY, a Rear-Admiral in Our Royal Navy; JOHN WASHINGTON, Captain in Our Royal Navy, and Hydrographer of the Admiralty; MONTAGUE GORE; WILLIAM HENRY HARTON; and GEORGE PALMER,* Governors of the said Society, and to those who now are or shall hereafter become Governors of the said Society, Our Royal Charter of Incorporation, for the purposes aforesaid: Now know ye that We, being desirous of encouraging a design so laudable and benevolent, of Our especial grace, certain knowledge, and mere motion, have willed, granted, and declared and *Do* by these Presents for Us, Our Heirs, and Successors, will, grant, and declare that the said ALGERNON PERCY DUKE OF NORTHUMBERLAND, Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, a Vice-Admiral in Our Royal Navy; The Vice-Chancellor SIR WILLIAM PAGE WOOD; THOMAS BARING; THOMAS CHAPMAN; SIR EDWARD GEORGE LAMBERT PERROTT, Baronet; JOHN BUNCE BONNEMAISON M'HARDY; JOHN WASHINGTON; MONTAGUE GORE; WILLIAM HENRY HARTON; and GEORGE PALMER, and such other of Our loving subjects as now are or shall hereafter become Governors of the said Society, according to such Regulations or

* The foregoing are the names of those Governors of the Institution whose names were appended to the Petition to Her Majesty in Council to grant it a Charter of Incorporation.

Bye-Laws as shall be hereafter framed or enacted ; and their successors shall, for ever hereafter be, by virtue of these Presents, one body politic and corporate by the name of " THE ROYAL NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION, for the Preservation of Life from Shipwreck," and for the purposes aforesaid, and by the name aforesaid, shall have perpetual succession and a Common Seal, with full power and authority to alter, vary, break, and renew the same at their discretion : and by the same name to sue and be sued, implead and be impleaded, answer and be answered unto, in every Court of Us, Our Heirs and Successors, and be for ever able and capable in the Law to purchase, receive, possess, hold, and enjoy to them and their successors, any goods and chattels whatsoever, and as well those now belonging to the said Society as those which may be hereafter acquired, and also to be able and capable in the Law (notwithstanding the Statutes of Mortmain) to take, purchase, hold, and enjoy to them and their successors, a Hall or House, and any such messuages, lands, tenements, or hereditaments whatsoever as may be necessary for carrying out the purposes of the Society, and as well those now belonging to the said Society as those which may be hereafter acquired, the yearly value of which, including the site of the said Hall or House, shall not exceed in the whole the sum of £2000, computing the same respectively at the rack-rent which might have been had or gotten for the same respectively at the time of the purchase or acquisition thereof ; and to act in all the concerns of the said body politic and corporate as effectually, to all intents and purposes, as any other of our liege subjects, or any other body politic or corporate in Our said Kingdom, not being under any disability, might do in their respective concerns.

And We do hereby grant our especial licence and authority unto all and every person and persons, bodies politic and corporate, otherwise competent, to grant, sell, alien, and convey in Mortmain unto and to the use of the said body politic and corporate, and their successors, any messuages, lands, tenements, or hereditaments, not exceeding such annual value as aforesaid.

And Our will and pleasure is, and we further grant and declare that there shall be a General Meeting or General Meetings of the Governors of the said Society, to be held from time to time as hereinafter mentioned, and that there shall be a Committee of Management to direct and manage the concerns of the said body politic and corporate, and that the General Meetings and the Committee of Management shall have the entire direction and management of the same in the manner and subject to the regulations hereinafter mentioned.

And We do hereby also will, grant, and declare, that there shall be a President, Vice-Presidents, a Treasurer, Secretary, and Inspector of Life-boats of the said body politic and corporate, and that the Committee of Management shall consist of the President, Vice-Presidents, and Treasurer, and not more than 40, nor less than 15 other Governors of the said Society.

And We do hereby further will and declare that the said ALGERNON PERCY DUKE OF NORTHUMBERLAND shall be the first President of the said body politic and corporate and the other persons now being the Vice-Presidents, and Treasurer, together with those of the Governors now constituting the Committee of Management, shall be the first Members of the Committee of Management, and shall continue such until the election of officers shall be made in pursuance of these Presents.

And We do hereby further will and declare that RICHARD LEWIS shall be the first Secretary of the said body politic and corporate, and JOHN ROSS WARD, Captain of Our Royal Navy, shall be the first Inspector of Life-boats of the said body politic and corporate, subject in each case to the power of removal hereinafter given to the Committee of Management.

And We do hereby further will and declare that it shall be lawful for the Governors of the said body politic and corporate hereby established, to hold General Meetings for the purposes hereinafter mentioned, namely, That the President, Vice-Presidents, and the Treasurer, and other members of the Committee of Management, shall be chosen at such General Meeting, and that the General Meeting shall from time to time make and establish such Bye-Laws, and vary and alter or revoke the same as they shall deem to be useful and necessary for the regulation of the said body politic and corporate, and for fixing the number of the Presidents, Vice-Presidents, and Officers, and for the management of the proceedings and the estates, goods, and business of the said body politic and corporate, so that such Bye-Laws be not repugnant to these Presents or to the Laws and Statutes of this Our Realm, and shall and may also enter into any resolution, and make any regulation respecting the affairs of the said body politic and corporate that may be necessary and proper,

And We do further will and declare that a General Meeting shall be held at least once between the 1st day of January in every year and the 1st day of January in the year next ensuing; and all General Meetings shall take place at such time as may be fixed by the said Committee of Management, and that the present Regulations of the said Society, so far as they are not inconsistent with these Presents, shall continue in force until the same shall be altered by a General Meeting.

And We further will, grant, and declare that, notwithstanding anything herein contained, the Committee of Management shall have the sole management of the income and funds of the said body politic and corporate, and the power to appoint and remove the Secretary and Life-boat Inspector, and such other officers, attendants, and servants as the Committee of Management shall think necessary or useful, as also the entire management and superintendence of all the other affairs of the said Society, and shall and may, but not inconsistently with or contrary to the provisions of this Our Charter or any existing Bye-Law or Laws, or the Laws and Statutes of this Our Realm, do all such acts and deeds as shall appear to them necessary for carrying into effect the objects and views of the said body politic and corporate.

Provided always, and We do will and declare that the Committee of Management shall, from time to time, and at least once in each year, render to a General Meeting a full account of their proceedings, and that every Governor of the Society may, at all reasonable times, to be fixed by the said Council, see and examine the accounts of the receipts and payments of the said body politic and corporate.

And We do further will, grant, and declare, that no sale, mortgage, incumbrance, or other disposition of any messuages, lands, tenements, or hereditaments belonging to the said body politic and corporate, shall be made except with the approbation and concurrence of a General Meeting.

And We do further will and declare that it shall be lawful for the Committee of Management of the said Society, with the approbation and concurrence of a General Meeting, from time to time, to appoint any persons to be Trustees of any part of the property of the said body politic and corporate, and to make, or direct to be made, any Conveyance or transfer to such Trustees.

In Witness whereof We have caused these our Letters to be made Patent. Witness Ourselves, at our Palace at Westminster, this 24th day of April, in the Twenty-third year of Our Reign.

BYE-LAWS
OF THE
Royal National Life-boat Institution.

I. The Annual General Meeting prescribed by the Charter shall be held on the 4th day of March, or as soon after as may be convenient, and the same and all other General Meetings shall be held at such time and place as the Committee of Management shall appoint.

II. A Special General Meeting of the Governors of the Institution may, at any time, be called by the Committee of Management.

III. Notice of every Annual Meeting, and of every Special General Meeting, shall be given by advertisement in three of the daily newspapers published in London ten days at least before the day for holding the same. And in case of a Special General Meeting, the object of it shall be stated in the Notice.

IV. Every Annual and every Special General Meeting shall have power to adjourn to a future day.

V. A statement of the receipts and disbursements of the Society for the preceding year shall be made out by the Committee of Management, and signed by the Secretary and by the Auditor, and shall be left in the Office for the inspection of the Governors for six days prior to the day appointed for the Annual General Meeting, and such account shall be submitted by the Committee of Management to the Meeting.

VI. At every Annual Meeting an election of the President, Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, and Committee of Management, and of an Auditor, shall take place; but the President, Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, Committee of Management, and Auditor, shall be considered as in office, not only until the Meeting shall break up or adjourn, but until others shall be respectively elected in their place.

VII. No other business shall be transacted at a Special General Meeting than the business for which it shall have been expressly called, and no other business shall be transacted at any adjourned Meeting than the business left unfinished at the Meeting from which such adjournment took place.

VIII. At the Annual General Meetings, the order of business shall be as follows:—

1. The Chair shall be taken by the President, if he shall be present, and if not, then by some other person to be chosen by the Committee.

2. The President, or Chairman shall then state the names of the persons proposed to fill the offices of President, Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, Committee of Management, and Auditor for the year ensuing, and if no other persons shall have been named, the persons so proposed shall be deemed and declared to be elected.

3. The election shall be determined by a show of hands, unless a ballot shall be demanded by any ten Governors present; in which case the same shall take place immediately, and the President, Vice-President, or Chairman shall ap-

point two or more scrutineers among the Governors present to superintend the ballot during its progress, and to report the result to the Meeting.

4. No ballot shall be kept open for more than two hours.

5. Immediately after the elections have taken place, or the ballot shall have commenced, the report of the receipts and disbursements of the Society, as signed by the Auditor, shall be read, and submitted to the Meeting for approval.

6. The Committee of Management shall then present a Report of their proceedings for the past year, and particularly (in all cases in which they may have voted a reward) a statement of the number of persons who may have been saved from shipwreck, with the names of the vessels to which they belonged; also a list of the persons to whom medals or rewards may have been voted, with the particulars of the services they rendered; also the particulars of the cases, if any, in which the Committee may have voted assistance to the wives or families of persons who may have perished in an attempt to save the lives of others. Also a return of all the Life-boats belonging to, or established by, or in connection with the Institution, their actual state and condition, and that of the Boat-houses, Carriages, and Stores appertaining to them.

7. Any business which the Committee of Management shall think proper to introduce shall then be entered upon and discussed, and the opinion of the Meeting shall, if necessary, be taken thereon.

8. After all business introduced by the Committee of Management shall have been disposed of, it shall be competent for any Governor to make any proposition which may legally be entertained at such Meeting, and to give any notice he may think fit of a proposition to be considered at a future Meeting.

9. In case the Meeting shall be adjourned, the business to be transacted at the adjourned Meeting shall be specified previously to the adjournment taking place, and shall be entered on the Minutes, and no business shall be transacted at the adjourned Meeting which shall not have been so specified and entered.

10. In all cases of dispute, or doubt, or difficulty, an appeal shall be made to the President, or Chairman, and his decision thereon shall be final and conclusive.

IX. At the Special General Meetings, the order of the proceedings shall be as follows:—

1. The Chair shall be taken as directed for the Annual General Meetings.

2. The object for which the Meeting has been called shall then be stated by the President, or Chairman.

3. The business to be transacted shall be taken in the order stated in the Notice calling the Meeting.

4. All elections, ballots, and debates, shall be conducted in the same manner as at the Annual General Meetings.

X. At all adjourned Meetings the business to be transacted shall be taken in the order in which it shall have been entered on the Minutes of the Meeting from which the adjournment took place.

XI. No motion by any Governor for the repeal or alteration of any existing bye-law, or for the enactment of any new bye-law, shall be entertained at any General Meeting, unless the same shall have been previously approved by the Committee of Management, or unless notice in writing of such motion shall have been given at some previous General Meeting by the Governor intending to move the same; or unless notice in writing containing the substance of the intended alteration shall have been given to the Committee of Management, by the Governor intending to move the same twenty-one days at least before the day on which such General Meeting shall be held.

XII. If the repeal or alteration of any existing bye-laws, or the enactment of any new bye-law, shall be proposed by the Committee of Management, such repeal or alteration, or such new bye-law, if carried at the Meeting at which it shall have been proposed, shall be binding without confirmation; but if proposed by any Governor, the same shall not be binding unless it shall be confirmed at a subsequent General Meeting, to be held for the purpose, at a distance of not less than three weeks from the preceding General Meeting, which Meeting shall appoint the time for holding the second Meeting.

XIII. Notice of any motion for the repeal or alteration of any existing bye-law, or the enactment of any new bye-law, whether originating with the Committee of Management or otherwise, shall be given by advertisement in three of the daily newspapers published in London ten days at least before the Meeting at which such motion is intended to be made; and if it shall be necessary to confirm such repeal or alteration, or such new bye-law, a similar notice thereof shall be given.

XIV. Minutes of the proceedings at every General Meeting shall be entered in a book, to be provided for that purpose, and signed by the person in the Chair.

XV. In case any irregularity shall occur in the convening or holding of any General Meeting, or in any election or other proceedings at any such Meeting, and the same shall not be publicly noticed and objected to at such Meeting, all proceedings of such Meeting shall be of the same force and validity as if no such irregularity had occurred; but if any irregularity shall be publicly noticed and objected to, the Meeting shall decide thereon, and such decision shall be final and conclusive.

XVI. The President, Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, and Committee of Management, shall be chosen from among the Governors of the Institution. The Auditor shall be a professional Ac-

countant, and his remuneration shall be fixed by the Committee of Management.

XVII. The Committee of Management shall consist of forty Members, but shall be competent to act until reduced by any means below the number of fifteen.

XVIII. The President, Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, Committee of Management, and Auditor going out of office on the day of the Annual Meeting, shall be immediately re-eligible.

XIX. The name of every person intended to be proposed by any Governor as President or Vice-President of the Institution, or Treasurer, or as a Member of the Committee of Management, or Auditor shall be transmitted in writing to the Secretary seven days at least before the day of election, and a list of the persons so proposed, together with the name of the Governor proposing each such person, shall be fixed up in the Office of the Institution six days before the Meeting, and no person shall be capable of being elected President or Vice-President of the Society, or Treasurer, or a Member of the Committee of Management, or Auditor, whose name shall not have been so transmitted.

XX. The Committee of Management may make such regulations, not inconsistent with the charter or bye-laws, as may appear to them expedient for conducting the proceedings of their own Meetings.

XXI. The Committee of Management shall pay to the Secretary, Inspector of Life-boats, and all other officers, clerks, attendants, and servants of the Institution, such salaries and wages, or make them such recompense as they shall from time to time think proper.

XXII. The Committee of Management shall have the custody of the common seal of the Society. The funded property of the Institution shall be invested, either in the name of the Institution, in its corporate capacity, or in the names of three Trustees to be appointed by the Committee of Management, as the Committee of Management shall, from time to time, think fit; and if the investment shall be made in the names of Trustees, the order of the Committee of Management shall be their sufficient discharge in all cases.

XXIII. Minutes of the proceedings of every Meeting of the Committee of Management shall be taken by the Secretary, or in case of his absence by some other person whom the President, Vice-President, or Chairman shall appoint for the occasion, which Minutes shall afterwards be copied fairly into a minute-book, to be kept for that purpose, and, after having been read, shall be signed by the President, Vice-President, or Chairman of that or the next succeeding Meeting.

XXIV. If any vacancy shall occur in the office of Auditor by death or resignation, or by any other cause than that of going out of office on the day of the Annual Meeting, such vacancy shall be filled up by the election of a new Auditor at a Special General Meeting, to be called for that purpose by the Committee of Management within the space of three calendar months next after such vacancy shall occur, unless the Annual Meeting shall be held within that period, and in that case

the new Auditor shall be appointed by the Committee of Management.

XXV. The Governors of the Institution shall consist of the persons who shall have subscribed to the funds either in one sum of ten guineas or upwards, or by an annual payment of one guinea or upwards, and of such other persons as shall be elected to be Governors by a General Meeting, as having rendered essential service to the Institution.

XXVI. Donors of ten guineas and Annual Subscribers of one guinea, to be entitled at all General Meetings to one vote each.

Donors of twenty guineas and Annual Subscribers of two guineas, to two votes each.

Donors of thirty guineas and Annual Subscribers of three guineas, to three votes each.

Donors of fifty guineas and Annual Subscribers of five guineas, to four votes each.

Donors of a hundred guineas and upwards and Annual Subscribers of ten guineas and upwards, to six votes each.

Governors selected in respect of essential services to the Institution shall be entitled to one vote each.

XXVII. No person claiming to be a Governor, in respect of an annual subscription, shall be entitled to vote at any General Meeting unless he shall have paid his subscription for the current year.

Royal National Life-boat Institution.

LIFE-BOAT REGULATIONS.

THE following Regulations are intended for the guidance of the Local Committee to be formed at each place at which a Life-boat is stationed by the NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION, and to whose care and control the Life-boat, her Crew, and everything connected with her management and maintenance, will be intrusted.

The Local Committee to consist, if practicable, of not less than five persons usually resident—one of them to be a sailor. The Inspecting-Commander of Coast-guard of the Division, or in his absence the nearest Coast-guard Officer to the spot, to be *ex officio* a Member of the Local Committee.

1. The Life-boat's Crew to consist of a Coxswain-Superintendent, a second Coxswain, a Bowman, and as many Boatmen in addition as the Boat pulls oars.

2. For every Boat, at least double the number of men required (if they can be found at or near the spot) should be enrolled to form the permanent working Boat's Crew.*

3. Such List to consist of Sailors and Fishermen who are usually resident, and (with permission of the Comptroller-General) of any Coast-guard Men of the station who may volunteer for the service.

4. The Salary of the Coxswain-Superintendent shall be 8*l.* a-year. On every occasion of going afloat to save life, the Coxswain and each of the crew shall receive alike, 10*s.* by day, 1*l.* by night; and for every time of going afloat for exercise, 3*s.* in smooth weather, 5*s.* in rough weather. In the absence of the Coxswain, the second Coxswain will take charge of the Boat.

5. In the event of money being received by the Life-boat for salvage of property, or similar service, a proportion equal to *two shares* shall be reserved by the Local Committee towards the maintenance and repair of the Boat, the remainder

* This rule may at some places require to be waived.

shall be divided into equal shares amongst the Coxswain and Crew. If, however, salvage be paid for the preservation of life, no portion shall be reserved for the boat.*

6. If local subscriptions be raised to reward any special act of gallantry or exertion, the Institution recommends that the whole of the money be paid to the Crew, divided into shares and appointed as above.

7. As at each Life-boat station there will be a Local Committee, the Coxswain will act under their immediate directions, and the Boat, except in case of Wreck, is never to be taken afloat without their sanction.

8. As the efficiency of a Life-boat depends on the good training and discipline of her Crew, the strictest attention must be paid by them to the directions of the Coxswain on all occasions connected with the service. The Boat shall be taken afloat for exercise, fully manned, once during each quarter, giving the preference to *blowing weather*.

9. The Local Committee at each Station is requested to make a Quarterly Report to the Institution, as to the behaviour of the Boat during exercise, pointing out any defect that may require to be remedied, and offering any suggestion that may conduce to the efficiency of the service. Also generally to report on the state and condition of the Boat, the Carriage, the Boat-house, and all the Life-boat Gear. Should occasion for immediate repairs arise, the Local Committee is autho-

* Although the 459th Section of the Merchant Shipping Act 1854, enacts—That salvage in respect of the preservation of the lives of any persons belonging to any ship shall be payable by the owners of the ship in priority to all other claims for salvage; yet, since the life-boat's crew are in every case entitled to a fixed remuneration from the NATIONAL LIFE-BOAT INSTITUTION, it is most desirable that no demand shall be made by them on the owners of a wrecked vessel, except the services rendered have been of an extraordinary character, the amount of property saved from the wreck be of considerable value, and the sanction of the Central Committee be previously obtained.

rized to make them to the extent of 5*l.*; more extensive repairs to be referred, with an estimate, to the Parent Institution.

10. The Boat is to be kept on her carriage in the Boat-house, with all her gear in her ready for use, except matches, rockets, and perishable articles which may require to be secured from damp.

11. There are to be three keys to the Boat-house kept in different places, with the *address of each painted on the door*; one in possession of the Coxswain, and the others as the Local Committee may decide.

12. Immediately on intimation of a Wreck, or of a vessel in distress, the Coxswain is to use his utmost exertions to assemble his Crew, launch his Boat, and proceed to her assistance: and in the event of a sufficient number of his crew not being present, he is to select the best volunteers he can get on the spot, who shall be paid the same as the enrolled boatmen.

13. If a Wreck occur at some distance from the station, so as to require the Boat to be transported along the coast, the Coxswain is to send to procure sufficient horses (which, by the Wreck and Salvage Act, any Magistrate, Constable, or Revenue Officer, may demand the use of), attach them to the carriage, and lose no time in making the best of his way with the crew to the scene of Wreck.

14. A reward of 7*s.* to be given to the man who first brings intelligence of a Wreck at such a distance along the coast as not to be in sight from the Coast-guard, or other Look-out.

15. A signal shall be agreed on by which the Life-boat Crew can be called together when required. A flag hoisted at the Watch-house is recommended by day, and the firing of the mortar (or other alarm signal) at the Coast-guard Station twice (quick) by night.

16. On approaching a Wreck, the Coxswain will use his judgment, according to the circumstances of the case, whether he will board the Wreck end on, either on the bow, on the quarter, or on the broadside; or whether he will go to windward, drop his anchor, and veer down to the wreck; or if he will lay her alongside. The greatest caution, however, is recommended in this latter case, and it is not to be resorted to when any other mode of boarding a Wreck can be adopted.

17. On boarding Wrecks, the Preservation of Life is to be the Coxswain's *sole consideration*, and he is on no account to take in any goods, merchandize, luggage, or other articles, which may endanger the safety of his boat, and the lives of those intrusted to his charge. And should any be brought in contrary to his remonstrance, he is fully authorized to throw them overboard.

18. In the event of any men being brought

ashore from a Wreck, the Coxswain shall give immediate notice to the Local Agent (if any) of the Shipwrecked Fishermen and Mariners' Benevolent Society, in order that he may take the steps prescribed by the Regulations of that Society for their respective destinations.

19. No one besides the Crew, namely, the Coxswain, the second Coxswain, the Bowman, and one Boatman for each oar, is on any account to be allowed to go out in the Life-boat when going to a Wreck, except with the express sanction of the Local Committee.

20. The Life-boat is not to be used for taking off an anchor; nor for the purpose of Salvage; nor for taking off stores, a pilot, or orders to a ship; so as to interfere with private enterprise, (except in cases of emergency, with the especial sanction of the Local Committee,) but to be reserved for cases involving risk of Life.

21. The Coxswain is to see generally to the efficiency of the Boat for service: when the weather appears threatening at sunset, he shall have the sand removed from the Boat-house door, the wheels of the carriage greased, the ways (if any) ready for laying, a breaker of fresh water, hand-rockets (if supplied), and all other gear placed in the Boat ready for use at a minute's warning.

22. The Coxswain will enter in a Journal according to a Form (with which he will be supplied), all services performed by his Boat, stating the time of launching, time of reaching the Wreck, the vessel's name, whither bound, number of persons rescued, &c., a copy of which, on each occasion of Wreck, is to be forwarded, by the Local Committee, to the Secretary of the Institution in London.

23. The full Instructions of the Institution for restoring suspended animation to be posted in each Boat-house; and a copy of the Abstract to be kept with the Boat's small stores, and taken off in the Boat, so as to be at all times at hand.

24. On returning from service, the Boat is not to be left in the surf on the beach, but is to be as soon as possible got on her carriage, and placed in the Boat-house. On the first fine day after use, the Boat is to be drawn out, to dry up any wet that may remain about her, and any damage is to be immediately made good.

25. The Coxswain will be held responsible for the efficiency and general good order of the Boat-house, the Boat, and her gear. And it is hoped that a sense of the trust confided to them in the cause of humanity will lead the Coxswain and Crew to be most careful on these points, and to distinguish themselves by the readiness and seaman-like manner in which their Boat is handled.

To build, station, and maintain in repair, Life-boats of the most perfect description; to furnish them with all necessary Appurtenances, including Houses to preserve them in, and Carriages for their conveyance to the spots where their Services are called for; and further, to provide, through the instrumentality of Local Committees, for their proper Management, and the occasional Exercise of their Crews.

To confer Honorary Rewards in the form of Medals and Votes of Thanks, and also to grant Pecuniary Remuneration to all persons who, at the risk of their own lives, save, or attempt to save, those of others on board vessels wrecked, or in distress, upon any part of the coast of the United Kingdom.

As an index of the necessity for the provision of such a machinery as the above, it may be stated—that the average loss of lives from shipwreck annually on the shores of the United Kingdom is between 700 and 800: 536 having thus perished last year.
