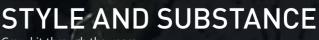

The message is to try not to panic if you find yourself in the water unexpectedly, but to take a moment to float and regain control of your breathing before trying to swim to safety or call for help.

Summer is our lifesavers' busiest season, on the beaches and at stations. We hope you and yours are all set to enjoy your time at the coast – wholeheartedly and safely.

The Arranmore RNLI team has been growing this year, with new recruits to both lifeboat and shore crew.


